

#### **Federal Court Holds Negative Reference Violated Settlement Agreement**

A particular concern of any departing employee is what the former employer is going to say in response to a reference check by a potential employer. Because of this concern, severance and other settlement agreements typically state what the former employer will disclose in response to a reference check. Due to concerns of liability for making a statement that could prevent a former employee from obtaining future employment, many employers have a policy which provides that only basic information will be disclosed in response to a reference check. This is typi-



cally referred to as a neutral reference policy, where the employer will confirm only that the former employee worked for

and job title. Recently, the Seventh Circuit Court of Appeals found that an employer violated a settlement agreement between the former employee and employer where the settlement agreement provided that the employer agreed to provide information confirming only that the plaintiff had worked there, the dates of her employment, and her last position. In that case, the plaintiff filed suit against her former employer alleging breach of the settlement agreement since the former employer disclosed to the plaintiff's job consultant that plaintiff had sued the employer for employment discrimination several times. Based on this information, the job consultant removed the former employer from the plaintiff's resume which left a 20-year gap in her work experience. Because the plaintiff expected that the reference from her former employer as provided for in


the company, the dates of employment the settlement agreement would make her a more competitive candidate in gaining future employment, the Court held the negative information disclosed by her former employer could impair her ability to find employment.

You Are What You Eat: Foods That Have Your Eyes in Sight

We've all heard the term "heart-healthy" diet, but what about an eye-healthy diet? Studies conducted by accredited organizations such as the Yale New Havens Teachers Institute found that in the same way that a well-balanced diet increases the life of our heart, a diet rich in certain vitamins and minerals also helps maintain and improve the long-term health of our eyes. By incorporating the right types of foods into our diet, we can actually reduce our risk of developing diseases such as cataracts, glaucoma and blindness.

The most commonly cited vitamins necessary for good eye health are vitamins A and C. Vitamin A's active form, retinol, in part makes up the pigment of our eyes. It is especially important for good vision in dimly lit settings, such as nighttime driving. Deficiencies in vitamin A can cause a disorder in the retina that not only causes dry eye, but also a disease called night blindness or nyctalopia. Night blindness is characterized by an inability to adapt to low-lit settings. The risk of developing such conditions can be reduced, however, by eating sources of food high in vitamin A like liver, carrots, spinach, broccoli leaves, sweet potatoes and kale, among others.

An equally important vitamin in terms of our ocular health is vitamin C. Vitamin C is found in very high concentrations in the clear gel layer of our eye, also known as the vitreous humor. 

racts and glaucoma, both of which blur our vision. Good sources of vitamin C include citrus fruits such as grape fruit or oranges, brussels sprouts, strawberries, cantaloupe and cauliflower.

Other nutrients to look out for are the minerals lutein and zeavanthin. Lutein and zeavanthin are found in the eyes, where they act like antioxidants protecting us from harmful particles. Some studies even state that one of the two minerals acts as a natural pair of sunglasses, guarding our eyes from the damaging effects of sun exposure. These minerals can be found in dark fruits and vegetables such as spinach, dark green lettuce, prunes, grapes, peppers, kiwi, melon and others.

#### **Healthy Pregnancy**

Many women become more interested in their health once they find out that they are pregnant. However, the foundation for a healthy pregnancy begins before conception. All women, who are thinking about becoming pregnant, should see their health care provider to gain some insights into nutrition, vitamin supplements, exercise and laboratory testing, which can ensure a successful pregnancy.

Women who are planning pregnancy and who are pregnant should choose a well-balanced diet to get the essential nutrients they need each day. Women need several servings of protein-rich foods (meats, poultry, fish and eggs), grains, calcium-rich foods, vegetables and fruits per day. Women also need adequate fluid intake; eight or more 8-ounce servings per day. Women who are vegetarian may need to take additional supplements. The recommended weight gain in pregnancy is normally between 25 to 35 pounds. Women who are underweight may need to gain a little more and women, who are overweight, should limit weight gain to 15 to 20 pounds.

Women often have questions concerning the safety of certain foods in pregnancy. Caffeine can be consumed in moderation, as studies have not shown that it causes birth defects. Artificial sweeteners, such as aspartame and Splenda, are also acceptable. Certain fish, such as swordfish, should be avoided because of high sense of well-being. They may also have mercury levels.



A prenatal vitamin, which contains folic acid, is essential to a healthy pregnancy. Many studies have shown that folic acid reduces the risk of a baby developing a type of birth defect called a neural tube

Unhealthy behaviors, such as smoking, alcohol or drug use, should ideally be addressed before conception. Pregnant women are advised to avoid alcohol because this has been linked to learning disabilities and birth defects in babies. Smoking can lead to poor fetal growth, preterm birth and sudden infant death syndrome.

Most women can continue to exercise in pregnancy. In fact, this may benefit the health of both the mother and the fetus. Women who maintain a fitness program have decreased weight gain and fat deposition during pregnancy and an improved

"It's one of the most rewarding volunteer experiences I've ever had," said Bill Muench of Crystal Lake. He and his wife Jeanette have recently begun traveling to Dixon Correctional Center to assist with the Storybook Project. In the past year, 4,209 children experienced the joy of receiving a new book and hearing their incarcerated parents' voices reading to them -again and again if they wanted. In 13 jails and prisons in Illinois, volunteers work with the parents who read and record the books on cassette tapes


"After one of the parents read the book he had chosen from the wonderful collection, he asked if he could say a prayer for his child on the tape. I have to admit that I was close to tears after that," Bill added. "I really encourage people to get involved in this worthwhile project," said Jeanette, who is active in Church Women United (CWU) of the Barrington Area that supports the Storybook Project with volunteers and cassette tapes. "It just takes part of a Saturday, and you can do it once a month or once a year," she emphasized.

Mary Anderson of Barrington also volunteers to help keep children connected with their incarcerated parents. For about 13 years, she has driven children and their caregivers to visit mothers, usually at Dwight or Kankakee correctional centers. "There is almost nothing that I do that can compare with sharing the excitement of little ones as we drive to visit their moms. Just the trip from their homes in Chicago to the prisons is an adventure. Some of these kids have never been outside of the cement and busyness of the city, and are all eyes as we drive through farmland and open spaces. And, of course, seeing their moms is their ultimate joy.'

Both the Storybook Project and the Connections Visits are among the volunteer opportunities of Lutheran Social Services of Illinois Prisoner and Family Ministries. 





#### What's New in Botox? by Gary S. Churchill, MD

#### 2008 Greater Chicago Prostate Cancer Run, Walk 'n Roll Sept. 14



Runners, walkers, strollers and weekend were told they had breast cancer—they athletes alike are invited to participate in the fourth annual Greater Chicago Prostate Cancer Run, Walk 'n Roll on Sept. 14 from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Lower Hutchinson Field (Columbus and Balbo) in Chicago's Grant Park. The event benefits prostate cancer programs and services developed by Us TOO International and Wellness Place—two cancer organizations that have joined forces in an effort to increase awareness, education and support to combat prostate cancer.

"Today, a man confronted with prostate cancer faces much of the same obstacles that women faced years ago when they

don't know where to turn," said Myrna D. Porter, RN, LCSW, event chairperson and co-founder of Wellness Place. "This event is helping us communicate the urgent message that treatment options are available and that support and information is accessible through organizations like Us TOO International and Wellness Place," she added. Porter, a breast cancer survivor, said she was surprised by the lack of uniform agreement regarding treatment when her husband was diagnosed with prostate cancer six years ago. According to the American Cancer Society, over 232,000 men are diagnosed with prostate

#### **Protect Your Ash Trees**

our area. This invasive beetle is responsible for killing approximately 50 million ash trees in neighboring states. Confirmed cases of EAB infestation have been detected in many of our neighboring towns. If you have ash trees, taking a proactive approach to protect them now could save you the high cost of removal and replace-

Background-EAB is native to Asia and is believed to have hitchhiked here in wood packing crates. Young EAB's feed inside ash trees, disrupting the tree's ability to transport vital water and nutrients, ultimately killing the tree.

Symptoms—Visual signs of EAB infestation usually go unnoticed for 1 to 3 years and once they are apparent it is usually too late to save the tree. Visual signs can be yellowing of foliage, thinning of canopy, shoots sprouting from the trunk, branch dieback, and death.

Invasiveness-EAB spread so fast through Michigan that it left 40 million dead ash trees in its path in just six years. On July 1, a single tree was discovered in Algonquin, Ill. that was infested with EAB. Within one month, 42 trees in three different nearby areas were destroyed, as they were found to be infested as well. Officials believe that the first ash tree was infested for approximately five years before EAB was noticed. Although there have been no confirmed cases in Barrington, experts believe EAB is probably al-

Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) has arrived in ready here and trees have just not shown any symptoms yet.

Recent Breakthroughs-Luckily for Illinois residents, a chemical control known as TREEage was approved for use this April. TREEage has proven to be highly effective at controlling EAB when it is injected into the trunk of the tree. Studies at Michigan State University found that injections of TREEage were 99 to 100 percent effective on EAB. Single treatments of TREEage were also found to give longterm protection, lasting approximately two years inside the tree.

Take Action Now-Don't make the mistake and wait until your ash trees start to show symptoms, as it will probably be too late to save the tree. The Illinois Department of Agriculture and many municipalities have the right to force private homeowners to cut down their ash trees at their own expense if they find EAB or suspect that a tree has EAB.

What Can You Do?—Call Tree Care by Turf Care to have your ash trees protected with TREEage. Tree Care by Turf Care is located in Barrington and is one of the first companies the Village of Barrington approved for TREEage injections. Their team of ISA Certified Arborists are experts in dealing with EAB. They have injected over 200 trees in Barrington for EAB in just the last three months.
