




## Medieval Magic Raises Funds for Homeless Women and Children



## The Art of Jewelry Creation



## **Evaluating Workplace Harassment**

In evaluating whether an actionable claim for workplace harassment exits, the starting point of the analysis is establishing whether the conduct is prohibited by the state and federal laws against discrimination. The most common form of legally impermissible harassment is known as "hostile work environment harassment." Hostile work environment harassment is defined as an intimidating or offensive working environment which unreasonably interferes with an individual's ability to perform their work.

More than two years ago, the U.S. Supreme Court decided extremely important cases which helped define the legal liability of an employer for the conduct of its managers and workers in creating a hostile work environment. In those opinions, the Court addressed the importance of having a well-defined policy against harassment which is distributed throughout the work force. Such a policy can aid employees by instructing them to voice complaints regarding unwelcome conduct without the fear of retaliation. Also, the policy can help protect the employer from legal action in certain circumstances when an employee fails to bring a claim of harassment to its attention.



If you believe that you are being subjected to harassment or that your employment rights are being violated, I encourage you not to delay in receiving information regarding your legal rights. ## What Age is Best for Certain Procedures?

Patients often ask at what age it is best to get certain procedures done. This will vary from patient to patient, but there are some general guidelines that apply in most cases. pharmaceutical companies have over the types of medicines we take, over the FDA's rulings and even over the headlines that we read.

As reported in a recent USA Today article, more than half of the experts hired to advise the government on the safety and effectiveness of medicine have financial relationships with the pharmaceutical companies that will be helped or hurt by their decisions.

Federal law generally prohibits the FDA from using experts with financial conflicts of interest, but the FDA has waived that restriction more than 800 times since 1998. The conflicts of interest typically include stock ownership, consulting fees or research grants.

According to a recent issue of Dr. Julian Whitaker's Health & Healing Newsletter, "There is no greater testament to the heavy-handed dominance of allopathic medicine and the pharmaceutical industry in the country than the fact that herbal medicine is relegated to the fringes of our culture-branded by conventional physicians as an unproven remnant of our primitive past...'

But for a different picture, just look at these facts:

- More than ¾ of the world's population today relies on herbs as their primary source of medicine.
- In a 1999 survey, almost half of all Americans used herbal supplements.
- $\bullet$  25% of all "proven" prescription drugs contain compounds originally derived from plants.

While herbal medicine has much to support it, keep in mind that herbs, unlike vitamins and minerals, should be used only for specific health concerns. Also, people with certain medical conditions should avoid specific herbs. Women who are pregnant or nursing should only use them under the guidance of their health practitioner. Herb-drug interactions are often the source of some finding's concerns. In most cases, the culprit is the drug, not the herb, as they are much more pharmacologically active.

When it comes to comparing herbal remedies to prescription drugs, very little media attention is paid to the more than 100,000 deaths and millions of hospital-

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
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## Cyclist Bob Lee Pedals into His Future by Way of "A Ride With a Reason"


## REMODELING 2001...STORY #1

As an experienced designer working in a traditionally-oriented area like Barrington, Debbie Vinopal of Barrington Kitchen & Bath Studio, recently completed a project that allowed her to spread her creative wings a bit. Andrew Kezeli approached her with plans for a major remodeling to expand the home he had recently purchased in Barrington Hills. Mr. Kezeli, who loves to cook, wanted to include a new kitchen in the project. He envisioned a clean-lined contemporary looking space designed to provide maximum efficiency. He also wanted to open up the room to the new stepped down eating area which was built to take advantage of the view.

Debbie, a certified interior designer and member of ASID, recommended using Crystal cabinets in a simple framed door design in a Natural finish on Birch wood. Birch is similar in color and grain pattern to Maple but is a bit less expensive. When used with Crystal's Quest cabinet series it provides excellent value while still offering the famous Crystal lifetime-limited warranty.


Debbie's plan for Mr. Kezeli incorporated an L-shaped main work area with a stainless steel cooktop and warming drawer on one leg An under-mounted sink on the peninsula leg faces out into the new eating space, taking advantage of the wonderful rear yard views. Ingeniously, to mask any mess on the counter from the view of the table, Debbie raised a portion of the counter behind the sink on simple columns and rounded the black granite top, providing a combination snack bar/serving counter. She incorporated a similar detail into the kitchen's island-again using the Absolute Black granite to provide contrast with the Yellow Classic granite used on the rest of the countertops. The same granite was used as a full-height backsplash, adding luxurious contrast to the simplicity of the cabinetry.

Also, worth noting is the TV cabinet topped with a lighted display area behind an arched door, and the arched top bookcase over the message center. Debbie says, "I used the arches here and on the accent countertops to contrast with the straight lines of the cabinets and moldings. Controlled design elements like that add a lot of personality! We wanted the kitchen to be interesting and make a statement without being so avant garde as to discourage future buyers if the house is put on the market."


