



### Kinetosaurs: Putting Some Teeth into Art and Science



With its menacing horns and bony head plate, Triceratops looks ready to attack. This 23-foot-long Kinetosaur shows visitors how real Triceratops might have used their built-in weapons to scare off predators and defend their herd. John Payne and The Children's Museum of Indianapolis developed Kinetosaurs—dinosaur sculptures modeled after scientific research and then put into motion to show how dinosaurs might have moved. The exhibition is complete with learning stations that offer a host of opportunities to apply dino-insights to anatomy, art, engineering and life sciences.

Has Sue finally met her match?

Sue—the world's largest, most complete T. rex fossil—is a Chicago icon, the pride of The Field Museum, the real thing. But don't you sometimes wish, as you gaze at those 67-million-year-old bones, that she could, well, ...come to life?

Your wish is granted! Sculptor John Payne has created a 44-foot-long T. rex, along with a small army of other life-size dinosaurs, as moving, clanking, roaring creatures of salvaged steel. They're Kinetosaurs, and they're inhabiting The Field Museum from March 23 to July 8.

And here's the coolest part: You can make them move!

#### **Dynamic Dinosaurs!**

What's a kinetosaur? They're dinosaur skeleton sculptures. They're kinetic. And they're a heck of a good time.

This is your chance to ponder how dinosaurs might have looked in motion millions of years ago, not on a movie screen but up close and personal. These giant skeletons are built with uncanny anatomical accuracy. It's not hard to imagine them grazing in prehistoric vegetation. hunting for prey or defending themselves from predators.

Visitors and gallery assistants activate the sculptures through an ingenious system of wires and pulleys, rings and levers. Imagine the thrill of a dino-smitten child who brings the dinosaurs to life, making giant heads turn and mouths open wide, causing feet to stomp and tails to swing.

shows John Payne in his studio, constructing and talking about these mighty creatures. Hammering away with a ball-peen, using a tree stump for an anvil, Payne constructs the enormous marionettes from tons of salvaged scrap metal and discarded industrial parts. The tail of the giant T. rex was originally a utility pole that he chopped up into vertebrae; the springs

that open its 100-pound jaw came from a garage door opener; and the hip sockets of the 20-foot-long Utahraptor began as trailer hitches.

Kinetosaurs puts to work our knowledge of how kids learn: not just by looking and reading but by touching, hearing, moving and, most of all, doing. Using light, sound, touch and inspired artistry, Kinetosaurs involves and helps visitors appreciate dinosaurs not just as museum fossils but as living, breathing animals.


Of course, there's fascinating science behind it all. Around the sculptures, interactive displays and computer simulations link the realms of art and science through shared concepts such as shape, line, movement, sound, texture and color. For example, visitors can learn about balance by putting together assorted parts to create a dinosaur that won't fall over. They can test different instruments to discover what the shape of a horn tells us about the sounds an animal might have made. And they can color a Utahraptor to blend with its surroundings and help it hide from a hungry T. rex.

Throughout the exhibition, smaller sculptures by Charlie McCrady flesh out the dinosaurs and help us imagine their appearance, while backdrops by Jan Sovak recreate the ancient Cretaceous landscape. Kinetosaurs was created by The Children's Museum of Indianapolis. Sculptures are by John Payne of Payne Studios, Asheville, NC, 1998, 1999.





### **Gallery Locates Out-of-Print Works** by Bateman, Other Artists


Finding a 20-year-old, never-framed, out-of-print work by Robert Bateman is like finding buried treasure to Scott Teasdale, owner of Woodland Art Gallery and Frame Shoppe. Finding six is especially uncommon.

"It's an extremely rare find," says Teasdale, whose gallery boasts the largest inventory of Bateman limited edition prints in the Midwest.

Teasdale, who is a nationallyknown expert when it comes to locating sold-out works on the sec-

ondary market, is referring to his recent acquisition of a half-dozen out-of-print works by Bateman from the early 1980s. One work is an artist's proof of Chapel Doors, published in 1980 and is in 'pristine condition' according to Teasdale. He estimates that only 20 artist's proofs were published, all signed by the artist but not numbered as they are today.

Although Bateman usually chooses nature as the subject for his paintings, Chapel Doors is an excellent example of his interest in recording the remnants of our roots and a time when craftsmanship and care were more important than today. He focused on the doors of a rural church that showed the economy and simplicity of the pioneer spirit, but the finish in the molding and care in detail show the re-

spect for the quality of work found in our forefathers. Chapel Doors is now on display at the gallery and is available museum-mounted, custom matted and master framed along with the other recent and rare acquisitions of Bateman works.


### **BAAC Gallery Presents** "A View with a Hue"

### Orthodontic Extractions Are Becoming a Thing of the Past





The most common skin types treated are hypersensitive, environmentally damaged, hyperpigmented, acne prone or active acne. The solution will be applied and left on the face anywhere from 30 seconds to two minutes and followed by a cold water rinse. Most patients claim they feel a light tingle or a light burning sensation which subsides once the cold water rinse is applied.

• Step Three—The final step consists of extracting any blackheads or whiteheads. At this point in the treatment, the extractions are easier because the pores are free of any skin blocking their way out. Once the extractions are complete, a smoothing moisturizer along with a sunblock is applied.

### Poor Report Cards—What to do?

While January marks the beginning of the poor report card: new year, it is also the halfway point in your child's school year. The skills developed during the first half of the year will be your child's foundation for the more difficult work ahead. Shortly, schools will be distributing midyear report cards.

Report card day brings stress to many families. If you and your child are unhappy about a report card, what should you do? When you look at your child's report card and performance record, the most important things to evaluate are these: Is your child doing his or her best? Is he or she achieving his or her highest

According to Dr. Raymond Huntington, founder and president of Huntington Learning Centers, "Parents know their own children. If you believe your child could be doing better than his or her grades show, you owe it to your child to remedy the situation."

"More than current grades are at stake," Huntington continues, "If grades are mediocre or poor, it means your child is not gaining valuable skills. This can come back to haunt your child later. The skills children learn in school are like building blocks. If a skill is not learned adequately, future skills will suffer. When a child tries to build advanced skills on a shaky foundation of knowledge, there is likely to be trouble ahead."

Mediocre or poor grades can result from a variety of problems. Dr. Huntington offers the following suggestions for what to do when a child brings home a

- 1. Examine the situation realistically. It's important to remember that every drop in grades indicates that valuable skills are being missed. An effort should be made to learn and reinforce those missing skills. While this is being done, it's also important to identify and remedy the basic problem, so it does not continue to hurt your child's education.
- 2. What is really the problem? Is there a behavior problem? Sometimes, bright students get bad grades for behavior related activities. Does your child hand in homework? Is it correct and on time? Is your child bored with schoolwork, and so is not paying enough attention? These are not excuses; they are symptoms of different problems. You must identify the problem before you can remedy it.
- 3. Talk with your child. Why does your child think he or she got poor grades? Does he or she take the situation seriously? How does he or she plan to do better? It is important that your child knows you take the situation seriously. Work with your child to develop a plan that will help him to achieve better grades. Let your child know that you are supportive and that you believe in his or
- 4. Talk with your child's teacher or counselor. Your child's teacher or counselor is a professional educator. What are his or her observations? What does he or she recommend?

It is important to remember that the difficulty that caused these poor grades may

• Follow a healthy diet and reduce your intake of cholesterol and fat. Our bodies manufacture a cholesterol from dietary fat. Saturated fat increases clotting, raises ("good" cholesterol). Saturated fats are found in animal foods, coconuts, cocoa,

margarine and palm and coconut oils. Cholesterol only occurs in the animal kingdom; if you're a strict vegetarian, you won't ingest any. By replacing animal protein with soy protein, you can significantly decrease your total cholesterol.

- Stop smoking. Cigarette smoking injures the arterial lining, constricts coronary arteries, lowers HDL cholesterol and increases the formation of blood clots. Alkalizing foods such as spinach, beets, greens, figs, raisins and almonds can help you gradually wean yourself from smoking by keeping nicotine circulating in your blood longer.
- Manage stress. Stress leads to high blood pressure which significantly increases your risk of heart attack. Although stress is an unavoidable part of life, the ideal response is to respond to difficult situations quickly and then relax. Try to laugh more. Join a yoga class or simply take a long walk.
- In addition to a healthy diet, the following supplements have been shown to be effective in maintaining a healthy cardiovascular system: Folic Acid, Vitamins B6 and B12, Carotene, Vitamin C, Vitamin E, Chromium and Coenzyme Q10. Also Garlic, Onion, Ginger, Cayenne and Hawthorn have long been associated with cardiovascular benefits.

Remember, it's never too late to care for your heart, even if you already have arteriosclerosis or have suffered a heart attack. By taking the time to practice healthier habits, you'll be paving the way for a healthier heart.


### REMODELING 2001...STORY #2

A brand new house with a big kitchen is a dream that most of us share. For Palatine's Joseph and Laura Quinn and their two teenaged children it was a dream soon to come true. To provide the Country French influence the Quinns wanted, Ross used Crystal's touras assemblies—special rope moldings that are integrated into the base and wall cabinets to accent special areas. Ross incorporated several special open cabinets and kept the top of the cabinets about a foot from the ceiling to provide

maximum display area. An impressive 3-piece crown molding tops the upper cabinets Crystal's special beadgroove paneling was used on exposed cabinet sides. This paneling with it's wider spacing has a more European feeling than the usual beadboard paneling seen so often today. The refrigerator and dishwasher were given wood fronts to match the cabinets, totally integrating them into the kitchen. The cooktop is set off by a beautifully detailed maple hood. A combination of Corian and granite was used for the countertops. The striking checkerboard floor is ceramic tile.


## Open House Planned as Bob Lee Send-Off



> All plans should place your residence and all other structures on the property in their proper location—a survey is required to do this-and drawn to scale. The diameter of each circle represents a tree's or shrub's spread. Architects/designers

usually have a style of drawing that helps you differentiate the different types of plants used, i.e. deciduous, evergreen and groundcovers. And always keep in mind "the right plant for the right location". A plant's mature size must always be considered so you don't have a too large or too small a plant for a given area.

#### **Plant Materials**

All plants are not created equal. In your design, try to pay attention to variety in the texture, color and size of your plant materials. A good mix of heights give a landscape dimension, while large groupings of the same plant can help create variety in texture and color throughout all seasons. Also, once the choice of plants is made, ensure that they are adapted to our climate. We recommend materials that

have been grown in Northern Illinois/ Wisconsin nurseries. Many lawn and garden centers sell bulk plant materials with undersized root systems to accommodate volume shipping. Many of these same plants often come from the South, allowing them to be more prone to disease and unable to handle our winters. Another consideration is plant size. Professional nursery stock is larger and helps create a more pleasing look during the first season before the plants are established.

Ask lots of questions: Where do your plants come from?, Are you primarily in the maintenance business?, Can you help me with grading and drainage?, Are your designers licensed Architects?, etc.
