The New Field of Esthetic Skin Care

Street Photography Since the 1970s


The Art Institute of Chicago is currently presenting the exhibition The Sidewalk Never Ends: Street Photography Since the 1970s now through April 28, 2002.

In 1994, the institute mounted an exhibition entitled Bystander: A History of Street Photography which traced the development of this genre from the 19th century through the 1970s. The Sidewalk Never Ends updates the progress of this type of photography in the last 25 years. Photographers who take pictures of everyday life in the street have always been representative of what the instantaneous medium of photography is in its essence. The most recent generation of the genre's practitioners can be found in places as disparate as Liverpool, England (Tom Wood); Havana, Cuba (Ernesto Bazan); rural Spain (Cristobal Hara); and Chicago, Illinois (Tom Arndt). As in the past, wherever they may be from, many of the most gifted street photographers end up in New York, because the density of life on the street there seems the ultimate challenge. The sampler of recent street photography that this exhibition contains also includes New Yorkers Tom Roma, Melanie Einzig, Jeff Mermelstein and others whose work shows that this genre is alive and vital as it has ever been to photography in general.





Mercury Revisited

By now, most of you have read articles or seen television programs regarding the safety of silver/mercury or amalgam fillings. Programs like 60 Minutes and 20/20 bring in patients that claim they have been harmed by this type of filling. The shows allow a brief discussion with an American Dental Association spokesperson and then turn the tables against the ADA by implying they "have something to hide." Nothing could be farther from the truth.

The ADA board is made up of dentists, and their primary responsibility is to the patients. They have very strict research guidelines that they apply to any new products making claims about dental health. Before they give their "ADA Seal of Approval," all of these strict guidelines must be met. The same guidelines also apply to research concerning public safety. The ADA has not seen any credible research indicating a direct correlation between amalgam fillings and diseases like Alzheimer's or Parkinson's. They have seen credible research indicating there is no correlation. If there truly were a correlation, why would the ADA want to keep it from the public? All the dentists that support the ADA would certainly benefit if it were true. Could you imagine the lines of people waiting to get in to see the den-

sensitivity and how they were cured after the removal of their amalgam fillings. The dentists claim that the state regulators are creating a sort of "gag" order and it is a violation of their First Amendment rights. How about the rights of the patient? Do they deserve to have someone with a "Chicken Little" mentality telling him or her to go through long and expensive procedures only because they read something somewhere that these fillings might cause a problem?

When presented with the option of restoring a tooth, our office recommends porcelain or gold. The reasoning behind this choice has to do with quality, not fear. We certainly do not recommend the removal of any stable, old amalgam fillings for the sole purpose of preventing possible future complications. Until we have credible research that proves otherwise, scaring a patient into removing all of their amalgam filings only promotes the entrepreneurial spirit of the dentist and does not promote what's in the best interest of the patient's health.







Sales' current body of work employs the use of hand-dyed and stitched thermoplastic fiber. The forms are built from the center outward, with each layer denoting passage of time, surface injuries and decay. Distorted text is applied to the sculptures in the form of heat transfers that speak of memories, past and present.

Clare Verstegen makes her home in Tempe, Ariz. Her screen prints on canvas reflect her interest in the use of patterns to create a visual image simultaneously filled with simplicity and complexity, while a symmetrical format reinforces her attempt to create balance in life's unpredictable journeys.

This exhibition is curated by Sandra Clark, an artist and educator in fine fiber art. Her most recent work has been exhibited in SOFA, Chicago; The Museum of Contemporary Art, Chicago; and the American Craft Museum, N.Y., as well other shows, exhibitions and private collections. 

Oral Habits—How Do They Affect Our Teeth?

There are many oral habits both children and adults may have that can either affect how their teeth develop or how they fit together. One of the most common oral habits in children is thumb and/or finger sucking. Thumb sucking is a relaxing comfort. But if it goes on past the age of 5, it can lead to crooked teeth, speech impediments and difficulty learning in school. If a thumb- or finger-sucking habit continues, it can constrict the width of the palate and/or move the front teeth out of position. The palate may even take the shape of the finger, thus making it too narrow to accommodate all the permanent teeth that need to come in.

Fortunately, by the age of 5, many children have the developmental skills needed to quit: an understanding of cause and effect, an ability to practice self-control, and a grasp of time. Since thumb lovers rely on their habit when life is unsettling, pick a time to quit when everything is on an even keel. If you work weekdays, start on a Saturday so you'll be around. It is important to motivate your child by emphasizing the positives: a nicer smile, more grown up way of behaving and easier to speak clearly. Remember to provide encouraging feedback and little rewards for progress made. If a child cannot break this habit on their own, an orthodontist can ability to get their finger in the palate.

Another oral habit that may be present in both children and adults is tongue thrusting. This is a habit in which the tongue thrusts forward and pushes against the front teeth instead of resting on the palate behind the front teeth when a person swallows. Tongue thrusting not only pushes the front teeth out, but it may also force the teeth apart, creating an open-bite or overjet. An orthodontist, through the use of a functional orthopedic appliance, can address the correction of this habit. In some patients, their treatment may be done in conjunction with a myofunctional therapist who can help them retrain their tongue to swallow correctly.

Spread the Risks

Diversification is one of the best ways to help reduce possible devastating effects of holding all investments in one or a few asset classes. William Allen and Debra Schoendorf, financial consultants with Salomon Smith Barney in Barrington, discuss asset allocation and diversifi-

The purpose of asset allocation is to help you optimize the mix of investments to produce the desired returns with the least amount of fluctuation in your overall portfolio. By diversifying, you may increase the probability that if the performance of one investment type is disappointing, others are holding steady or outperforming.

Most assets fall under three broad categories: stocks, bonds and cash equivalents. On a long-term historical basis, stocks have provided the highest returns but also the most price fluctuations. Cash equivalents (CDs, savings accounts, etc.) have historically offered the lowest returns with the fewest price fluctuations. Bonds have generally fallen somewhere between these two.

Under these broad categories lie numerous asset classes. Most stocks can be identified as either "value" (those perceived as priced below their true worth)

or "growth" (those expected to grow faster than average). Stocks can be further segregated into large-, small- and midsized. Bonds can be classified by maturity -short-, intermediate- or long-term-and by type of issuer-corporate, U.S. treasuries, mortgage-backed or municipal. Stocks and bonds can also be categorized on whether they have been issued by U.S. or foreign entities.

These asset classes have distinct patterns regarding their historical returns and risks. By combining asset classes with differing patterns, you may be able to achieve returns that fluctuate less than any single asset class. This can increase the compounding effect over time, possibly leading to substantially higher total

Enforceable Employment Contracts and Promises by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

A legally enforceable contract is one in which the parties to an agreement provide something of value to the other. To create an employment contract, the employer must make a specific offer, and there must be an acceptance of those terms by the employee. A written contract is the most easily recognized employment agreement and usually contains specific terms and conditions regarding the employment relationship such as salary, responsibilities and duration. Other written documents may also be considered a contract, such as employer handbooks, policy manuals, letters of agreement or letters reflecting a job offer. To determine whether such writings are deemed enforceable contracts, the facts and circumstances of a particular case must be examined. However, an employer may effectively prevent enforcement of such a writing as a contract if the document contains a disclaimer specifically stating that the document does not change the employment at will relationship.

As such, to limit an employer's right to terminate the employee at will, the document must contain language which shows the employer and employee did not intend an employment at will relationship, such as a termination for cause only provision. In addition to written agreements, promises made by an employer may also be enforceable under certain circumstances, such as where the employer made a promise to take some specific action that Professional Women.

A determination of whether there is an enforceable contract or promise requires a legal analysis of the documents and facts and circumstances surrounding the employment relationship. "Our kitchen isn't that old but it's just not working for us. The island counter is too small and I absolutely hate seeing the side of our big refrigerator from the front hall." These were the thoughts Kathy Civik expressed to Barrington Kitchen & Bath Studio's designer Kaye Hathaway at their first meeting. Kathy and her husband Ken built their house overlooking Bangs Lake in Wauconda about 15 years ago. "Pickled" finishes and Southwestern colors were the rage then and that's what they put into their house. But, Kathy's taste had changed over the years, and she now wanted a more traditional feeling.

Kave, who's both a certified kitchen designer and a certified interior designer worked with the Civik's to create the kitchen that Kathy had been dreaming of. Ken and Kathy's original idea was to build an arched opening to enclose their new commercial range. Kaye drew them a sketch of the kitchen with the arch and the couple realized that it ate up a lot of storage space. So instead the range was enclosed by bringing cabinets, one with a pullout spice rack and another with dividers for baking pans, down to the counter top and building a beaded-board range hood between them. That really set the focal point for the kitchen! The new built-in refrigerator was moved away from the kitchen entry and replaced with glass fronted cabinets. These lighted cabinets provide display space for special china and give visitors an inviting first view of the new kitchen.

The desk area in the original kitchen was much larger than the family needed. Kaye suggested building a walk-in pantry with a curtained glass door to provide storage for bulky items. That left enough room for a smaller desk which was given a furniture look with a carved onlay and special moldings. The island, which had housed the cooktop and a raised seating area, has now become a baking and food prep center. Three specially designed carved posts support the eating bar, which

Art Associates Visit Chicago Area Landmarks

A bronze monument, The Great Northern Migration by Alison Saar, stands at 24st Street and King Drive, the entrance to Bronzeville. This 1996 sculpture symbolizes the difficult journey African-Americans made to escape poverty and oppression in the South while hoping for a better life in Chicago. A man faces north and stands atop a mound of worn-out shoes. His briefcase is filled with dreams.

Chicago's black population grew from 44,000 in 1910 to 234,000 in 1930. Bronzeville became a cultural, musical, religious and educational mecca, much like New York's Harlem did, in the 1920s. Today, several buildings have received landmark status, and the neighborhood is undergoing a facelift. Developers are rebuilding homes and building middle-class residential areas. A \$10 million investment restored King Drive, including new park benches and public artwork. The "Walk of Fame" consists of 91 bronze plaques highlighting people who lived in Bronze-

On Tuesday, May 14, the Barrington Community Associates of the Art Institute of Chicago will visit this area south of McCormick Place between 31st and 47th streets, State Street and Lake Michigan.

Following a driving tour of area landmarks, including Unity Hall (1887) and the Victory Monument (begun in 1926), a stop will be made at Pilgrim Baptist Church. Built between 1890 and 1891 for Chicago's oldest Jewish congregation, it became a Baptist church in 1926. This Adler and Sullivan building has a magnificent arched doorway, opulent interior with a tunnelvaulted ceiling and ornamental balcony, and art glass windows designed by Healy and Millet. It is the birthplace of gospel

The tour continues to the First Church of Deliverance with its distinctive 1930s modern-architectural style and murals painted by Chicago artist Fred Jones.

A visit to the DuSable Museum of African-American history will show the culture and history of African-Americans and their contributions to the nation. Founded in 1961 and named for Chicago's first permanent settler, Jean Baptiste Point Du- Charles Sebastyan by April 29 at 1-847-Sable, the museum began in the home of 359-4061.

Dr. Margaret Burroughs. In 1973, it moved to its present building on the eastern edge of Washington Park.

The tour will also drive through the Kenwood neighborhood to see the headquarters of Operation Push, former home of Muhammed Ali and current residence of Louis Farrakhan.

The tour leader is Bill Hinchliff. He holds degrees from Yale and Georgetown and has been teaching adult-education courses on Chicago architecture, history and literature for over 20 years. As a docent for the Chicago Architecture Foundation since 1976, he has led bike, bus, boat and foot tours of Chicago. He has written articles on Chicago and contributed to the highly acclaimed American Institute of Architects Guide to Chicago.

Bidding a Landscape Job-Price Shouldn't Be Your Only Consideration

OK, so you need professional landscaping help. You've talked to three different companies, and they've all given you bids. The designs are different, the prices are different-how do you decide which to use? What needs to be considered?

First of all, buying a service/product such as landscaping is not like buying a computer where you can compare products easily. With landscaping, you should consider: 1) design; 2) comfort with contractor; 3) price; 4) quality of materials used; 4) experience; and 5) referrals.

Design Concept

Let's face it. If the price is great but the design doesn't reflect what you want or need, what good is it? The best landscape design/build firms are dedicated to a professional, quality design which should consider soil, site and sun as well as lifestyle requirements. The skeleton if you will. The better the design fits your needs, the happier you will be.

Comfort Level with the Contractor

This is a difficult one. Dealing with a con-

tractor may, in some cases, last over many seasons. So working with someone should be pleasant and not a source of undue stress. Questions you might ask yourself are: How comfortable are you in dealing with this particular contractor? Does he/ she seem knowledgeable? Is this someone I can trust? Do they seem to understand what I'm looking for?

Price and Quality-Plant Materials

These two elements must be considered together. When it comes to plant materials, all are not created equal. If you compare the price of the same plant from two different sources and there's a big difference, there's probably a good reason. What nursery are they coming from? Are they bare-root or balled-and-burlapped? When were they dug? What part of the country were they grown? All these issues as well as size and type of plant affect the

Bare-root plants are purchased during the dormant season and are cheaper to grow and ship. They are not inferior, but

they do need more initial care and may take a year or two to catch up in size to their balled-and-burlapped counterparts.

Balled-and-burlapped plants are dug so that a ball of soil surrounds the roots. The ball is wrapped in burlap and then tied for transporting. This is a more expensive process, but the plants tend to be healthier and larger. Most balled-and-burlapped plants are supplied by wholesale nurseries and grown locally.

Price and Quality-Hardscapes

When considering hardscapes such as brickwork and retaining walls, it's easier to price compare because you're talking square footage. Keep in mind, though, the materials being used. Starting with concrete on the low end, prices per square foot escalate with the type of material, from more affordable brick pavers through custom bluestone or granite. All of these materials can be installed on a granular ents. base or mortared.

Experience


There are basically two types of landscape businesses—lawn maintenance and design/build companies. While there is overlap in both, ask where their emphasis is and how long they've been in business.
