Children's Dental Emergencies

For most children, spring and summer means playing outdoors after a long indoor school year. Unfortunately, their pent up energy occasionally results in accidents involving their mouth and teeth.

If an accident occurs, there are a few simple procedures parents should follow to avert more serious complications or even tooth loss:

• If an orthodontic appliance breaks or becomes loose, do not ignore it. Place wax or even moistened cotton over the irritated area and see your orthodontist as soon as is convenient.

• Should a piece of orthodontic wire, a stick or any other foreign body become lodged in your child's cheek or gum, take them to your dentist or a hospital emergency room. Do not try to dislodge it

• Bleeding from a cut in the cheek, lip or tongue caused by the teeth is usually stopped by pressure with a moist, clean cloth. If bleeding persists or if the injury seems large enough to warrant stitches, see your oral surgeon or hospital emer-



gency room immediately.

· Dislodged teeth need to be seen by a dentist within 30 minutes. For first aid, gently rinse the tooth under running water and replace it in the socket. A cup of milk or a cup of cool water is a second choice to carry the tooth to your dentist. Your dentist should evaluate broken or displaced teeth; hospitals rarely have the equipment or a dentist available for such emergencies

Typically, an employer is not subjected to a claim of "wrongful discharge" or liability when an employee voluntarily quits. However, where an employee's working conditions are so intolerable that a reasonable person would be compelled to resign, an action for "constructive discharge"

When an employee involuntarily resigns in order to escape intolerable and illegal employment requirements to which he or she is subjected because of race, color, religion, sex or national origin, the employer has committed a constructive discharge in violation of Title VII. An action for constructive discharge can also be stated under the Age Discrimination in Employment Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act and most other federal statutes.





What Age is Best for Certain Procedures?

by Gary S. Churchill, MD

Patients often ask at what age it is best to get certain procedures done. This will vary from patient to patient, but there are some general guidelines that apply in most cases. Ultimately, only the patient along with their surgeon can determine if a certain procedure is right for them or if the timing is appropriate.

Eyelid Rejuvenation

Most people will notice the aging process first around their eyes. Some puffiness beneath the eyelids, especially in the morning, will get more and more noticeable. This can create a tired look even when the person is well rested. Although some people will notice this in their twenties, this usually becomes more apparent in the thirties and forties. Although both upper and lower eyelids may age simultaneously, some people will notice only one or the other aging sooner.

Fine lines will begin to appear around the eyes in the late twenties or early thirties. These can be treated with light chemical peeling or the newer glycolic acid creams at home

Facial Rejuvenation— **Facelifting**

Facial rejuvenation involves a number of different procedures. The most common is facelifting. Facelifting improves jowling and looseness of the neck through incisions around the ears. This procedure is rarely done on patients in their thirties. Most patients are in their forties and older. It is common to perform facelifting at the same time as eyelid rejuvenation.

Facial Rejuvenation-Forehead Lifting

A forehead lift allows the brows to be elevated as well as the frown lines smoothed. This is done through an incision behind the hairline. Although some patients may have low lying brows in their thirties, most do not seek forehead lifting until their forties. It is common to perform forehead lifting along with a facelift.

Chemical peeling is designed to smooth the skin. A number of new light and medium depth chemical peels have become available for younger patients with early, fine lines. Patients in their twenties may undergo light chemical peeling. The more sun damage there has been to the skin, the deeper the lines will be and the deeper the chemical peel needed to affect them.

Rhinoplasty

Rhinoplasty or nasal recontouring is commonly performed on teenagers and young adults though older patients are candidates as well. The younger patients typically seek a smaller, more attractive nose than the one they were born with. Older patients, however, may notice signs of aging in the appearance of their noses. The tip of the nose tends to droop with age. Simply elevating the tip will give the aging patient a younger look.

Our Philosophy

The decision to undergo any surgical procedure is not taken lightly. Only a fully informed patient can make such a decision. The best time to undergo a particular procedure is when that procedure will result in a noticeable improvement in whatever features are undesirable to the patient. If no change will be apparent, it may be best to wait. These issues are addressed fully during the consultation. This is the best way for a patient to become fully informed.

REMODELING 2002...


Experts predict that more people will be able to work from home as technology progresses. That was one impetus behind a recent remodeling project undertaken by Tom and Susan Carroll of Inverness.
