## Art Associates to Celebrate 42nd Anniversary

On Jan. 9, the Barrington Community Associates of The Art Institute of Chicago will celebrate its 42nd anniversary with a luncheon and lecture at D & J Bistro in Lake Zurich.

"A Day in the Life of Parisian Ladies of Leisure" will be the topic of a slide lecture by Miranda Hofelt. Using the Art Institute's dazzling collection of impressionist and post-impressionist art, as well as a few objects from other museums, this lecture will chronicle the daily life of Parisian women in the late 19th century.

Just imagine changing clothes six or seven times a day! In Paris, during the age of impressionism, every activity required a particular outfit. Whether rising in the morning, shopping at Bon Marché, attending the opera, promenading at the Tueleries or boating on the Seine, we'll discover how clothes, coiffure and poise make a "lady."

Miranda Hofelt arrived at The Art Institute of Chicago after receiving a master's degree in art history from the University of Pittsburgh in 1995. Before accepting the position of lecturer in the General Programs Division of Museum Education,

#### Protecting Your Legal Rights— **Final Payments** by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

The Illinois Wage Payment and Collection Act provides that an employer is required to pay "final compensations" at the time of separation if possible, but in no case later than the next regularly scheduled payday. Final payment includes all wages which are defined as any compensation owed an employee pursuant to an employment contract or employment policy. Generally, final compensation under the act includes earned wages, salaries, commissions, severance agreements, bonuses and vacation pay. This often becomes an issue with commissioned sales persons who are entitled to a commission or bonus per agreement or company policy. Additionally, a company that enters into a severance agreement but fails to pay is also subject to the act. With regard to vacation pay, where the company has a policy that provides for vacation pay, all earned but unused vacation time is required to be paid to the employee even if the employee resigns or is terminated. Moreover, the act provides that no employment policy shall provide for the forfeiture of earned vacation time upon separation.

In order to preserve your legal rights, a written demand for payment should be made. If the company fails to comply, than an action with the Department of Labor or private action for the unpaid amounts can be pursued which includes a claim for attorney's fees, costs, interest and statutory penalties.

Knowing what you are legally entitled to as final payment is especially important if you are presented with an agreement that requires you release your legal rights

## The Healing Process Patients frequently become nervous dur-

ing the healing phase following a surgical procedure. They see certain changes in the affected areas which are actually quite normal and predictable. It is helpful if patients are aware of these normal changes and the reasons for them, as it will help them feel more relaxed about the final outcome of the procedure.

Any surgical or traumatic injury to the skin and soft tissue results in the same steps of healing. There is an initial release this time that the blood vessels that formof enzymes from the damaged tissue ed during the proliferative phase shrink which starts the healing process. These enzymes actually cause inflammation, without which there would be no healing. This is the start of the first phase of healing called the "proliferative phase." During this phase, the tissue proliferates or buildsup. The ultimate goal of this phase is the buildup of collagen, which in turn mends and binds the tissue. The human body is very efficient and therefore very quickly binds the tissue with a crude form of collagen which is thick and bulky. In addition to the buildup of collagen, new blood vessels form, which explains why scars are pink at first. Also, many white blood cells, other repair cells and inflammatory components rush into the tissue. This causes swelling and a thickening where the incision or surgery was performed. The proliferative phase of healing lasts for approximately four to six weeks.

After this, the second phase of healing, the "remodeling phase," begins. During this period of time, the collagen that was produced in the first four to six weeks is broken down by the body's enzymes and reabsorbed while replaced by a finer, have any questions regarding facial plassofter and thinner collagen. and disappear from the wound, which explains why scars fade over time. In facial wounds, much of the remodeling phase happens in approximately eight weeks. While three months after the initial trauma or procedure, facial scars are much softer and smoother, full maturation of a scar can take nine months to a year.

Our typical follow-up for patients is in one month, so that we can see the healing of the wound when it reaches the peak of the proliferative phase, and then again in two months, after the end of the remodeling phase.

It can be helpful and reassuring to patients to realize that there are sound, scientific principles behind much of what we do in our practice of medicine. When patients understand the natural course of healing and what to expect, they are less anxious about their recovery from facial surgery. We always try to educate our patients so their concerns are addressed and their fears are minimized.

## Steeple Raising and "Steeplechase" **Celebration at Barrington United Methodist Church**

Surmounted by a skyward spire and cross, the church steeple stands as a beacon of hope to all who gaze up to the heavens. And now, four years after fire destroyed their church home, the people of Barrington United Methodist Church witnessed the raising of their new steeple above a magnificent sanctuary in their long-awaited church, now under construction at 98 Algonquin Road (the southeast corner of routes 59 and 62).

On the morning of Friday, Oct. 25, the steeple was complete. On Oct. 27, there was a special "Steeplechase" time of worship and thanksgiving at the church's 10:30 a.m. service in their partially completed Fellowship Hall.

The steeple will complete the exterior outline of the 54,000-square-foot facility, 67 feet from tower to cross and 137 feet from grade level to top. One hundred and eighty thousand bricks and 2,500 sheets of drywall will be used for the new church. And, since the fall of 2000, it has taken approximately 235 man-hours a day with 40-to-50 crew people to bring the project to this point.

#### Historical Background

The congregation has more than 1,000 members and a 160-year tradition in the Barrington community. Their church home on 311 South Hough Street was tragically destroyed by fire in October of 1998. The German custom of decorating an evergreen tree became popular in 1856, when President Franklin Pierce placed a "German tree" in the White House. Early decorations were homemade: strings of cranberries were placed throughout the house; clove-studded oranges scented the air; and



Fabric wrap

This is a first in a series of articles on the latest in area rug and carpet design. The artists and designers at ColorMyRug will provide you with the latest trends and fashions in custom soft flooring.

What we're covering in this article is machine bindings, serging, wide bindings, fabric wraps, fabric insets, cording and woven borders.

Machine binding is simply finishing the edge of the rug with a 3/8 inch of material to provide a finished edge and prohibit fraying. The material is available in cotton or polyurethane. We suggest polyurethane since it is more colorfast and will resist fading. Hand binding is nearly the same and is used where a finer edge finish is desired and when there is a rug with color changes and irregular shapes.

Serging (tape) is similar in size to machine binding but is a series of colored threads that provides a more custom sewn finished look.

Wide bindings are typically 1 to 3 inches wide. The material used mostly is canvas and faux leathers. Combining this edge with patterned or plain fields provides endless possibilities. Wide binding is a creative way to design a great edge finish while keeping the cost down.

Fabric wraps and fabric insets are very popular when matching a pattern in furniture or draperies. Also, many have used fabrics simply because they like the design, and the colors coordinate with the room setting. When selecting a fabric, take into consideration the traffic the rug will experience. The heavier the fabric, usually the better it will wear. The fabricators at ColorMyRug have seven different techniques they use to ensure that the material used will provide the best look as well as the best wear.


Cording has been effectively used to add dimension as well as interesting character to area rugs. The cording provides a separation between the two adjoining material and usually complements their colors.

Woven borders provides another method to add an ornate border with a simpler field. Many manufacturers offer complementing borders for their broadloom or primary field carpeting. The colors and styles coordinate quite effectively.


