

Local Church Architect Wins AIA Award

Architect David F. Schultz, AIA, NCARB, of the firm David F. Schultz Associates, Ltd. of Barrington, recently won a Distinguished Building Award for Merit in Architecture from the American Institute of Architects Northeast Illinois Chapter. Mr. Schultz's firm won the award for the addition and remodeling of First United Methodist Church in Crystal Lake.

Jury comments included: "Innovative interior with a nice, light feel. It has some nice features; the liturgical cabinet work is nicely done."

Originally, First United Methodist Church wished to erect a new sanctuary, associated support spaces, classroom and office areas and expanded parking. They

also desired the existing sanctuary to be preserved in some way. The existing building had dead-end corridors, five different floor levels and was not fully accessible. Access to available land areas was through an hourglass-shaped "neck" in

> the site. Available land areas for building and parking expansion were at the basement floor level, making it essential that the new sanctuary and narthex be visually "linked" with upper level circulation and the existing narthex/entry.

> Today, the creation and orientation of a new two-story vaulted narthex with large expanses of glass into the new sanctuary effectively links the upper level to the new sanctuary/narthex. The prow shape of the sanctuary floor plan is a pattern reflected in both the large chancel window and the new chancel furnishings. The front third of the existing sanctuary was converted into a memorial chapel, thus preserving the history of the existing sanctuary.

Protecting Your Legal Rights— Civil Rights Tax Relief Act of 2004 by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

On Oct. 22, 2004, President George W. Bush signed the Civil Rights Tax Relief Act (or CRTRA); a provision included in the American Jobs Creation Act of 2004 (H.R. 4520). The CRTRA ends the double taxation of attorneys' fees and costs applied to individuals who win or settle employment discrimination and related cases. Section 703 allows plaintiffs to exclude attorneys' fees and costs from their adjusted gross income, ending double taxation of fees and costs and avoiding any problems with the Alternative Minimum Tax. The law applies to civil rights cases, employment discrimination cases, Fair Labor Standards Act and other wage and hour cases,



ERISA benefits cases, and cases under any federal, state or local statute, or common law regulating the employment relation-

Until the passage of the CRTRA, complications existed with nearly every settlement of an employment discrimination case since the IRS required a civil rights plaintiff who won or settled a case to pay taxes on the entire award or settlement including the payment that went to the plaintiff's attorney. For instance, if the plaintiff won an award of \$100,000, the plaintiff would be required to pay tax on the entire amount even though a contingent fee of \$30,000 went to the plaintiff's attorney and even though the plaintiff's attorney would have to pay taxes on the \$30,000.


The IRS position was that since the entire award went to the client, it should be taxed to the client regardless of whether the client actually received the money since it was money received to extinguish a debt owed by the plaintiff to an attorney. The plaintiff argued that the IRS position did not take into account that there would be no recovery without the assistance of the attorney creating a "joint venture" between the attorney and the plaintiff. This issue has been the subject of numerous court cases throughout the country with mixed results. Some circuits followed the "joint venture" approach sid-

majority of the courts, including our Seventh Circuit, the IRS position has prevail-

Although the law is now in effect, in early November, the United States Supreme Court heard oral argument on the issue in a case where both plaintiffs won awards in employment disputes and challenged the IRS based on tax bills based on the full amount of the recovery including attorney's fees. The Supreme Court's decision remains important to the issue since the CRTRA applies to fee payments made after Oct. 22, 2004, when the law became effective. As such, plaintiffs who have recieved awards or settlements before Oct. 22, 2004, do not benefit from the new enactment. A decision is not expected from the Supreme Court until the spring of 2005. "I Hate My Teeth!"

Those words are heard in dental offices every day. But when the dentist asks the patient, "What do you hate about them?" the answer is usually, "I don't know, I just hate them!

So many factors contribute to the appearance of teeth. These factors may not be clearly identifiable by the patient but are clearly evident to the dentist that has had training in smile design. When evaluating a smile, the dentist needs to ask himself many questions. Are the edges of the teeth worn? What is the patient doing to wear them down? Do the gums show when smiling? If they show, do they appear to follow the lips or are they canted? Do the edges of the upper teeth follow the shape of the lower lip? Do the upper teeth show while the patient is speaking? Does the midline of the upper teeth line up with the midline of the lower teeth? Do the teeth have a "windswept" appearance that makes the spaces between the teeth look angled? and the pressure is building! Let's not put any more stresses on you. The sustaining effects of your New Year's resolutions in the past have not had the staying power anyway, so why stress yourself out. When was the last time you heard a person say, "Yeah, I smoked my last cigarette 23 years ago! It was a New Year's resolution that did it! I made a New Year's resolution to quit smoking and I'm proud to say that I haven't had a cigarette in 23 years!"

I am not saying that New Year's resolutions are a complete waste of time and effort. However, what I am saying is that New Year's resolutions are a complete waste of time and effort, most of the time! So, no pressure here! Let's take a more successful approach to making personal changes. I have about 500 of these "baby steps" that I use in our office to promote lifestyle changes. These "babies" make a lot of sense and they work, too! Here are a few for you to ponder and utilize in your daily life.





An Appeal to Help the Young and Old

For 120 years, Woodstock Christian Life Services (or WCLS) has served the very young and very old of McHenry County. Today, their early learning centers in Woodstock and Belvidere serve a record 598 children, and their Hearthstone Senior Living Community serves 277 seniors in Woodstock.

Over one third of the residents at Hearthstone Manor have outlived their personal savings and rely on Medicaid state funding. WCLS loses nearly \$50,000 every month in uncompensated costs for nursing home care. Over half the children at Woodstock and Belvidere Early Learning Centers are from families who rely on financial assistance. In 2004, WCLS contributed over \$50,000 toward the cost of tuition for these children. In total, WCLS received \$627,000 less than their costs in 321-4039.

WCLS receives limited tax dollars and must rely on gifts and monetary donations to continue their mission.

WCLS conducts fund-raising appeals twice a year, hosts several major fundraising events, is the recipient of grants, and is the beneficiary of annuities, trusts and bequests. Bequests from individuals remembering WCLS in their estate planning provide the majority of the funds.

Folks give to WCLS for a variety of reasons, such as working or volunteering there, because they have a family member or friend living in the community, or they know the value of the mission.


