#### **Protecting Your Legal Rights—** Illinois WARN Act by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

Effective Jan. 1, 2005, Illinois enacted the Illinois Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification Act (WARN). The act requires that employers with more than 75 employees must notify employees in the event of a layoff or plant closing. The Illinois act is closely patterned after the federal WARN act. Like the federal statute, Illinois WARN requires the employer to give 60 days advance written notice to employees, including managerial and supervisory employees, to unions and certain state and local governmental officials, in the event of a plant closing, mass layoff or relocation. While the federal act re-reduced the number of employees re-



quires written notice to businesses with 100 or more employees, the Illinois law

quired for notice to 75 employees. Also, the Illinois act does not require notice to an employee of an employer's decision to transfer an employee within a reasonable commuting distance.

The Illinois act also varies from the federal law regarding the situations that require notice to employees. For instance, Illinois WARN requires notice in the case of a reduction in force at a single location even if not a plant closing and affects at least 33 percent of the employees and at least 25 employees, or 250 employees regardless of the percentage. However, the federal WARN requires notice where the reduction in force affects at least 33 percent and 50 employees, or 500 employees regardless of the percentage. A violation of the Illinois act is investigated and enforced by the Department of Labor. Like the federal statute, penalties include up to \$500 each day of the violation and back pay, including wages and benefits to each employee entitled to notice who loses employment where notice was required. As such, if you are being affected by a reduc-

tion in force, mass layoff or job relocation, you are well advised to have your legal rights analyzed under the Illinois and federal WARN acts. It is also typical for employers to offer severance in WARNrequired situations in exchange for a general waiver of legal rights against the employer. As such, it is especially important that the severance agreement be carefully reviewed and evaluated with counsel for protection of all legal rights under federal and state laws. # Letter to the Editor

Dear Editor,

I am deeply concerned about Check 21. the new federal banking law that helps banks deduct money more quickly from consumers' accounts but does nothing to speed up the processing time for checks deposited by consumers.

While I appreciate the banks' need for efficiency and believe that Check 21 will help banking fast-forward into the future. I have received numerous consumer complaints about bounced checks, as Check 21 has eliminated the "float time" between the time a consumer writes a check and when the money must be in the account to cover that check.

The Check Clearing for the 21st Century Act, or Check 21, allows banks to replace paper checks with legal "substitute checks"-printouts of electronic images of the originals—that enable banks to quickly process checks electronically and reduce the cost of physically handling and transporting original paper checks. As a result, banks will save an estimated \$2 billion a year in check-processing costs.

Check 21, however, does not give consumers the advantages of electronic clearing, as the law does not require banks to speed up the time when they make funds available from checks deposited by consumers. A check deposited today may not clear until anywhere from two to 11 days have passed. As banks clear checks faster but continue to hold deposits, consumers

are being hit with more bounced check fees that are resulting from the loss of their float time

A new federal law, proposed by Rep. Carolyn Maloney (D-N.Y.) and co-sponsored by Rep. Jesse Jackson, Jr. (D-Ill.), will help consumers enjoy the same benefits of electronic check-processing that banks get under Check 21. HR 5410, or the Consumer Checking Account Fairness Act, corrects the imbalance between the faster check-clearing time under Check 21 and the slower time that deposits clear.

HR 5410 would require the Federal Reserve Bank to order banks to credit deposits as quickly as they debit checks. It also prohibits banks from charging bounced check fees if the funds have already been deposited but are in the holding period. In addition, it requires banks to clear deposits before they clear checks presented on the same day, and requires banks that clear checks on Saturdays to count Saturday toward the deposit hold period.

Check 21 has created some of the biggest changes in banking in years. I urge you to voice your support for HR 5410 and help move this important piece of legislation as quickly as possible to prevent harm from being done to our consumers'



These shows are inspiring thousands of people to seek professionals and have their own makeovers. Even the last person on earth you'd expect to have a makeover just did- Michael Moore. But all this excitement and publicity will come to a halt as soon as programs like 60 Minutes and 20/20 start showing the "surgeries gone bad".

What we don't see is the endless hours spent trying to select the dentists and surgeons that will perform the procedures for the shows. The producers want the result that will give them the greatest "wow" effect. This strict and lengthy process helps to ensure the "wow", and it also prevents them from getting bad publicity.

Unfortunately, most people do not spend the time doing the required research when it comes to their own makeover. Picking someone out of the Yellow Pages or finding them on the Internet is a starting point, but it certainly does not speak to their qualifications. Your first appointment with a dentist or surgeon should be an interview with you asking all the questions: "Have you ever had your license suspended? Have you been reprimanded by the Department of Professional Regulation? How many procedures have you done like mine? Have any of them turned out poorly? If yes, what happened? How would you prepare for my procedure?

What associations are you involved with? Who would you, the doctor, go to if you needed this procedure done? How many dentists/doctors do you have as patients?

While you may feel uncomfortable asking hard questions such as these, it is absolutely imperative that you get these answers from the person that is going to be performing permanent invasive procedures on you. If they are truly the top professionals in their field, they will not feel threatened by these questions. Permanent physical changes to your body should only be done by the best-qualified person. Keep this in mind when you see the backlash that is sure to be coming to television. When you see a guest weeping to Oprah that they have been scarred for life from some plastic surgeon or dentist, ask yourself, "How did they choose him?" Chances are, they spent more time getting ready for the Oprah show than they did selecting the surgeon.

### What Age is Best for Certain Procedures? by Gary S. Churchill, MD

Patients often ask at what age it is best to get certain procedures done. This will vary from patient to patient, but there are some general guidelines that apply in most cases. Ultimately, only the patient along with their surgeon can determine if a certain procedure is right for them or if the timing is appropriate.

#### **Eyelid Rejuvenation**

Most people will notice the aging process first around their eyes. Some puffiness beneath the eyelids, especially in the morning, will get more and more noticeable. This can create a tired look even when the person is well rested. Although some people will notice this in their twenties, this usually becomes more apparent upper and lower eyelids may age simultaneously, some people will notice only one or the other aging sooner.

Fine lines will begin to appear around the eyes in the late twenties or early thirties. These can be treated with light chemical peeling or the newer glycolic acid creams at home

#### Facial Rejuvenation-Forehead Lifting

A forehead lift allows the brows to be elevated as well as the frown lines smoothed. This is done through an incision behind the hairline. Although some patients in the thirties and forties. #### Facial Rejuvenation-**Chemical Peeling**


