## Ambassador from Zambia Praises Hands of Hope for Funds from the Barrington Country Garden Faire Fund-Raiser

Hands of Hope members were greeted by Dr. Inonge Lewanika, the Zambian ambassador to the United States, at a December luncheon hosted by the charity's founder, Vicky Wauterlek. Ambassador Lewanika extended her gratitude to those involved in the Barrington Country Garden and Antique Faire, the charity's main fund-raising effort, and highlighted the many improvements made possible this year by the funds.

"Everybody (in Africa) is dancing! You are transforming life, giving hope and taking people out of poverty," she explained.

One example she gave the group was a school for blind children in a rural area in Zambia that was in great need of bedding, clothing, first aid kits, a vehicle and musical instruments. It can be very difficult to find ways in which the blind can earn a living. Hands of Hope made it possible to purchase musical instruments, which are enriching the lives of these students greatly.

"They sing very well," the ambassador stated. "Perhaps one day, they will come here and sing.

Dedicated to meeting the critical needs of women and children, with a current focus on Africa, Hands of Hope partners directly with microfinance projects such as the goat initiative for poor rural women sponsored by the first lady of Zambia, Maureen Mwanawasa. The goats produce kids, which go to the next group of women who raise more goats and pass their offspring on to a new group of women and so on. The women sell the goat's milk and/or meat to support their families.

The money raised by Hands of Hope is working in several countries in Africa. Hands of Hope has funded various initiatives, such as a women's hospital wing in Nigeria; HIV/AIDS educational materials for a province in Rwanda; self-regenerating microfinance loans for poor working women in Uganda, Rwanda and Congo; "You are empowering women and mak- and a vocational training center for AIDS

orphans in Uganda.

'It is thrilling to see people once living in the moment-to-moment crises of poverty now able to earn a living and truly grateful that there are people a world away who care about them.

## Protecting Your Legal Rights-**Final Compensation**

The issue of final compensation must be examined at the end of any employment relationship, whether as a result of termination or resignation. Under Illinois law, final compensation is defined under the Illinois Wage Payment and Collection Act. The act provides that an employer is required to pay "final compensation" at the time of separation, if possible, but in no case later than the next regularly scheduled payday. Final payment includes all "wages" which are defined as any compensation owed an employee pursuant to an employment contract or agreement pensation includes earned wages, sala-

and vacation pay and any other compensation. Under the act, an "agreement" is broader than a contract and requires only a manifestation of mutual assent on the part of two or more persons. Parties may enter into an "agreement" without the formalities and accompanying legal protections of a contract. The act provides an employee with remedies more expansive than a common law breach of contract action when it uses the words "employment contract or agreement".

Significant monetary issues of final pay may exist where an employee is entitled to a commission or earned bonus per an agreement or company policy. With regard to earned vacation and bonus pay, where the employee meets the requirements for payment under the company policy or agreement, all earned compensation is required to be paid to the employee even if the employee resigns or is terminated before the effective date of the payment as established by the employer. Moreover, the act provides that no employment policy shall provide for the

forfeiture of earned vacation time upon separation. In order to preserve your rights to final compensation, a careful examination of final compensation issues should be reviewed with legal counsel. A written demand for payment should be made in the amount owed before filing suit. If the company fails to comply, then a compliant may be filed with the Illinois Department of Labor or in state court for the unpaid amounts. Recovery for a violation of the act includes all unpaid compensation, attorneys' fees and costs. For additional information, please visit our Web site at www.joettedoran.com.



## Gum Recession—What Does it Mean?

Exposed roots are the result of gum recession, not the natural aging process. There are many factors that contribute to a receding gumline. First, receding gums may be caused by bone loss beneath the gums, which cannot be seen. The supporting bone of the tooth could be deteriorating without the patient realizing it. Periodontal disease (bacterial infection) is most often painless and needs a dentist to diagnose the problem by X-rays and a clinical examination. Second, a receding gumline may be caused by a lack of strong gum tissue around the tooth. Genetics play a role in having strong or weak gum tissue surrounding particular teeth. Everyday brushing and chewing can make weak receding gum tissue even worse. Aggressive tooth brushing can damage fragile gum tissue as well.





The program on April 1 will be "An American Vision: Artists and Composers."


