#### Post-Employment Health Coverage by Sharon L. Keller, J.D., LLM

June is finally here, but will spring ever arrive. This month takes my family to California to attend our son's graduation from Stanford. It seems like he was just graduating from kindergarten at Grove School. I am looking forward to hearing Supreme Court Justice Breyer speak at his commencement. I also will be obtaining another degree in June—a Masters of Law in Taxation. Next year should be a great relief from tuitions.

I have received a number of calls recently from individuals leaving their employment with questions concerning post-employment health coverage. I will briefly review some of the key issues that affect whether, and under what conditions an executive may be able to obtain health insurance coverage upon ceasing employment.

For an executive who is voluntarily or involuntarily leaving employment, few issues raise as much anxiety as how he will obtain health coverage. Until he becomes eligible for Medicare at age 65, he faces concerns affecting his ability to obtain health coverage. Executives should seek protection in termination agreements that extend post-employment health coverage through the executive's former plan.

COBRA, the Federal mandate initially contained in the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985 amended ERISA, the Internal Revenue Code, and the Public Health Service Act. COBRA requires group health plans maintained by certain employers to offer continued coverage under the plan upon the occurrence of certain enumerated "qualifying events"—including termination of employment or reduction of hours. For



an executive who would otherwise lose health coverage as a result of termination or employment or reduction of hours, the maximum COBRA period is 18 months from the date of the qualifying event. The 18-month period can be extended to 29 months if the executive is determined to be disabled for Social Security disability purposes during the first 60 days of the initial 18 month period.

COBRA applies only to employers who employed 20 employees or more on 50% of the working days of the calendar year preceding the date of the qualifying event. An employer's obligation to offer COBRA coverage ends as of the first of the following to occur:

The date the required premium payment is not timely paid by the COBRA continuee.





Located at 117 North Avenue in Barrington, the restaurant is also housed in an historic building which was originally a wing of the old high school before it was dismantled. The oldest home on the tour was built in 1877 in the Greek Revival Style. Originally it was the farmhouse for the famous Waterman Diary on land that is now a part of South Barrington. Only one of the out buildings still exists, the smokehouse where meat was preserved before refrigeration.

remodeled under succeeding owners, the home still maintains its early Victorian character. The large spacious porch looks out over a rolling lawn and rock walls onto a spectacular vista of the surrounding creek valley.





For most children, spring and summer means playing outdoors after a long indoor school year. Unfortunately, their pent up energy occasionally results in accidents involving their mouth and

There are a few simple procedures parents should follow to avert more serious complications or even tooth loss.

If an orthodontic appliance breaks or becomes loose, do not ignore it. Please wax or even moistened cotton over the irritated area and see your orthodontist as soon as is convenient.

Should a piece of orthodontic wire, a stick or any other foreign body become stuck in your child's cheek or gum, take them to your dentist or a hospital emergency room. Do not try to dislodge it yourself.

Bleeding from a cut in the cheek, lip or tongue, caused by the teeth is usually stopped by pressure with a moist, clean cloth. If bleeding persists or if the injury seems large enough to warrant stitches, see your oral surgeon or hospital emer-

gency room immediately.

Knocked out teeth need to be seen by a dentist within thirty minutes. For first aid, gently rinse under running water and replace the tooth in the socket. A cup of milk or a cup of cool water is a second choice to carry the tooth to your dentist. Broken or displaced teeth should be evaluated by your dentist. Hospitals rarely have the equipment or a dentist available for such emergencies.

talk" on television, in the book stands, on the news and in conversations with friends. The lingo about "his issues" and "her issues" and "boundary issues" is everywhere. #### Poor Report Cards: What to Do

This is the time of year when many children are concerned about finishing up the school year and are excited about the long awaited summer vacation. But before floating about the pool with ease, there is one last hurdle to jump. Shortly, schools will be distributing fourth marking period report cards. The skills developed during the year will be your child's foundation for the more difficult work ahead. What should you do if you are unhappy with your child's report card?

According to Dr. Raymond Huntington, founder and president of Huntington Learning Center, "Parents know their own children. If you believe your child could be doing better than his or her grades show, you owe it to yourself and your child to remedy the situation."

"More than current grades are at stake," Huntington continues, "If grades are mediocre or poor, it means your child is not gaining valuable skills. This can come back to haunt children later. The skills children learn in school are like building blocks. If a skill is not learned adequately, future skills will suffer. When a child tries to build advanced skills on a shaky foundation of knowledge, there is likely to be

Mediocre or poor grades can result from a variety of problems. Dr. Huntington offers the following suggestions for what to do when a child brings home a poor report card:

1. Examine the situation realistically. It is important to remember that every drop in grades indicates that valuable skills are being missed. An effort should be made to learn and reinforce those missing skills. While this is being done, it is also imporproblem, so it does not continue to hurt Buffalo Grove at (847) 459-5939.

your child's education.

2. What is really the problem? Is there a behavior problem? Sometimes, bright students get bad grades for behavior related activities. Does your child hand in homework? Is it correct and on time? Is your child bored with schoolwork, and therefore is not paying enough attention? These are not excuses; they are symptoms of different problems. You must identify the problem before you can remedy it.

3. Talk with your child. Why does your child think he or she got poor grades? Does he or she take the situation seriously? How does he or she plan to do better? It is important that your child knows you take the situation seriously. Work with your child to develop a plan that will help achieve better grades. Let your child know that you are supportive and that you believe in his or her abilities.

4. Talk with your child's teacher or counselor. Your child's teacher or counselor is a professional educator. What are his or her observations? What does he or she recommend?

It is important to remember that the difficulty that caused these poor grades may be a serious problem. Your child may have missed one or more important basic skills. It is vital that you get help for your child as soon as possible, before the problem gets worse. The summertime provides the perfect opportunity for children to strengthen weak skills and prepare for the more advanced skills they will need in the upcoming school year.

The date the employer ceases to provide any group health plan coverage for any of its employees.

In addition, when it takes effect, the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (the Health Insurance Act) will likely resolve many of the material concerns an executive may have about replacing health coverage due to the loss of group health coverage on termination of employment or retirement. This should be the case regardless of whether the executive commences coverage under a new employer's group health plan or whether he purchases an individual health insurance policy covering him and his family.

Effective for plan and policy years beginning after June 30, 1997, the Health Insurance Act limits the ability of plan sponsors and insurers to design plan and policy provisions that deny coverage based on preexisting medical conditions. Under the Health Insurance Act, the maximum period for imposing a preexisting medical condition exclusion is 12 months. This maximum period may be increased to up to 18 months for an employee or dependent who fails to enroll in the group health plan during the initial enrollment period or during the 30 days following Have a safe and prosperous June. termination of coverage under another health insurance arrangement.

Due to this provision, no preexisting medical condition exclusion can apply to deny coverage to an executive or family member who has been covered by a health insurance arrangement for 12 or 18 months, as long as there has been no break in coverage exceeding 63 days. To verify prior coverage under a group health plan, the Health Insurance Act requires an insurer or plan sponsor to issue to a participant a certification of coverage upon termination of coverage, and upon request anytime within two years of termination of employment or coverage—whichever is


Because the Health Insurance Act prohibits a plan from discriminating in terms for either eligibility to participate or premiums based on an individual's medical history or status, evidence of insurability is no longer a concern for an executive or family member seeking coverage under a new employer's group health plan.

The fear of losing health insurance coverage has traditionally been an emotionally charged issue for executives. State and federal mandates have lessened the danger that an executive will lose coverage. With the enactment of the Health Insurance Act, the risk has been reduced further. However, care must still be taken to ensure that an executive is not faced with a gap in coverage





"Every plant has fitness and must be placed can be used. An architect has completed in its proper surroundings so as to bring 4-5 years of study involving horticulture, soil, surveying, site-plans and construction while a designer is not an accredited position. Once you've established your needs, a drawing will be rendered showing a "birds-eye-view" of your property. This drawing should indicate all existing structures, hardscapes and plant materials and is usually done in either an 1/8" or 1/4" scale. Plant materials are indicated with circles which, represents the tree or shrub's spread. Always keep in mind, "The right plant for the right location." A plant's mature size must always be considered, otherwise you may end up with too large or too small a plant for a given area.

#### **Plant Materials**

All plants are not created equal. We only buy from Northern Illinois/Wisconsin nurseries to ensure a plant that is adapted to our climate. Many lawn and garden centers sell bulk plant materials with undersized root systems to accommodate volume shipping. These same plants often come from the South, allowing them to be more prone to disease and unable to handle our winters. Another thing to consider is plant size. Professional nursery stock is larger and helps create a more pleasing look during the first season before the plants are established.




