

herd Hospital.






Award Programs Provide Business Owners Opportunity to Tout Their Achievements

1998 small business awards underway, now is the time to prepare an awards package that could win you valuable recognition in the business community, according to Shirley Gross-Moore, a member of the Awards and Appointments Committee of the Chicago Area Chapter of the National Association of Women Business Owners (NAWBO).

The committee aggressively pursues award opportunities for members who deserve recognition for business or personal achievements. It has an excellent success rate: NAWBO's nominees have won the last two Small Business Administration's Small Business Person of the Year awards and the last four Accountant Advocate of the Year awards.

"When members we have nominated for awards are recognized, it legitimizes women-owned businesses while promoting them as business leaders and role models," said Gross-Moore, President of Barrington Dodge. "It also gives women a stronger presence in business and legislative forums."

Whether self-nominated or nominated by an organization like NAWBO, business owners should consider several rules of thumb in preparing their package, according to Gross-Moore. ing to Gross-Moore.

At the start, it's key to go after the right difficult to write dispassionately, yet con-

With calls for nominations for various award—one that best matches your unique qualifications-and then carefully investigate the awards criteria. You don't want to waste your time preparing an application for an award for which you're not eligible.

Gross-Moore recalled the NAWBO awards committee considering at a potential nominee for a young entrepreneur award. Requirements called for candidates who were under 30 and in business for at least three years. The candidate fit the age requirement, but not those for years in business. "You have to look over the requirements very carefully," she said.

It also helps, she added, to read between the lines when studying the application guidelines. Those can help you in your approach to presenting your qualifications and devising a "hook" for the judges-whether it's a successful turnaround, business growth or innovative management.

The nomination package should be professionally presented. This means it has to look polished and contain as much support materials as possible, ranging from press clippings about you and your business to marketing collateral materials.

"It also helps, if you can swing it, to hire a professional writer to help you craft your message," Gross-Moore added. "It's

It's also key to include your volunteer or charitable endeavors. Judges are impressed by nominees who realize the importance of giving back to the communities they serve.

"The process of putting together an awards package can be difficult," said Gross-Moore. "But it's well worth it for the winning nomination in terms of heightened visibility and the opportunity to be seen as a leader and expert in your field."

Dental Mercury—Magic or Menace by Drs. Raymond Kotz & Stephanie Skopek

Dental amalgam was invented in Chicago by G.V. Black of Northwestern University. When Black mixed mercury with ground silver and other metals, like magic, the mixture over a few minutes hardened into a filling which was hard, resisted wear and was stable in the mouth over long periods of time. Literally billions of dental fillings (called amalgams) have been placed in patients over the last one hundred years.

Criticism of amalgams based on their mercury content warrants review because many people have been misled by the television sensationalists. The studies referred to on television were made by feeding ground amalgams to sheep! While people sometimes exhibit psychological similarities to sheep, their digestive tract contains a chamber called a rumen which is a sort of bacterial fermentation tank, allowing sheep to digest grass and also absorb quantities of heavy metals, i.e. mercury, far exceeding amounts that occur in people. Although mercury in dental fillings may cause allergic reactions, these are very rare—less than one has been reported for each year amalgam has been in use. Claims have been made that associated dental amalgams with multiple sclerosis, but even the National Multiple Sclerosis Society has denied these as having no validity. 

Poor Report Cards: What to Do



Interesting Atmosphere, Wonderful Food



You can almost smell the salt air as you set foot into Port Edward Restaurant. In our indoor harbor floats the 25 foot "Porpoise" sailboat built in 1934 by Bond Boat Builders in Chicago. The Porpoise was Tony Bond's personal boat and was designed by his close friend and associate, naval architect John Deering. The strong and large wooden hull would have made her a fine fishing vessel at the turn of the century. But now our unique Porpoise is to dine one or two couples graciously in her cabin... a true unique dining adventure!

Our indoor harbor is New England inspired. To the south by the Colony House of Newport, Rhode Island North, by the

old Union Oyster House in Boston, and the picturesque Fisherman's Lobster Dock Shacks of old Penobscot Bay, Maine.

The huge timbers, joists and decking were salvaged from an old Milwaukee cheese factory and the old Starck Piano Company warehouse of Chicago. The strong timbers are virgin cutting of long leaf yellow pine, no longer available commercially. Three McHenry County barns were used for planking and hand hewn timbers for the Salem Lounge and Wine cellar. The old 1920's windmill dividing the lobby and the lounge was saved from destruction by Edward and provided an intimate setting for "popping the question" or romantic dining.

Fox River was inspired by the House of Seven Gables of Salem, Massachusetts. Salem's obsession with witchcraft in 1692 motivated the building of a secret room and stairs for the safety of the owner's sisters to provide a hideout from the "burning at the stake" witch hunters. We too have a secret room in the lounge. Look and see if you can find it. In the far end of the restaurant is the Navigator's Room with an outstanding collection of hard hat diving helmets, whaling harpoons, lances and an old jaw bone of a Sperm Whale. Hanging from the ceiling are oars from World War II Liberty Ship life boats.

We are celebrating Port Edward's 32nd anniversary this year with Edward's continuous hand on the helm. Interestingly, in 30 years of serving Alaskan King Crab Legs, Port Edward's suppliers have calculated that put end to end, the crab legs will have gone around the world during our celebration.


The encrusted cannons by the entry are of Spanish origin, circa 1680, from the Caribbean and the double ship's wheel is from an Alaskan ice breaker. The coral encrusted anchor in front of our indoor harbor was hauled up from the east coast of the Florida Keys and a few steps away, an old diver's two man pump from

Our lounge overlooking the beautiful Montreal, Canada in excellent working order. Just up to the side of it is a battered French ship's figure head from the turn of the 17th century. Throughout the restaurant is a collection of English antique nautical signs, rare "lead top" and 18th century binnacles, Edward Wolowiec's original paintings and nautical artifacts too numerous to mention. The collections and selection of Edward's world wide travels are reflected in our "gifts international" shop next to the wine cellar in our lower level. Top Side features an art gallery with more of Edward Wolowiec's paintings as well as nautical prints of other outstanding artists such as Turner, Spurling, Carl Evers and Charles Vickery.

28 Years and Still Growing!

Supporting Berea College Student Crafts

In the 1890's, the Berea College President got his first lesson in weaving when he asked a local weaver whether she thought orders could be filled in a month or two for six handwoven coverlets made to his standards. Her reply summed up the difference between handcraft and manufacturing:

"President Frost, in order to make so many kivers (covers) we will have to raise more sheep, shear them, pick and wash the wool, card it and spin it, then collect the bark and sich to color it. Then we will have to have the loom all set up... and we will be ready for the weaving. It would take we'uns nigh one year or more to afore we could have that many kivers wove. It's no child's play to weave a kiver,

It is still, today, "no child's play" to weave a blanket, throw a vase, turn a wood leg, shape hardwoods into baskets; roll a broom from natural corn, or forge hot steel on the anvil, but Berea students have been involved in such hand production work for over a century.







Hopi Jewelry Show

Humble in nature, creative in spirit, Watson Honanie gives from the heart, putting his best effort into every item he makes. Watson Honanie creates jewelry of gold and silver portraying Hopi culture and ceremonial life. Watson is credited with popularizing the use of gold in the overlay style at the 1991 Santa Fe Indian Market where he won Best of Division (including all categories of jewelry) for a gold and silver choncho belt. Although he has been making jewelry since 1972, it was not until 1985 that he started to work in gold.

In making his jewelry, Watson has always used the overlay style that has Hopi jewelry. In overlay, a design is cut from one sheet silver or gold, then soldered to another. Most Hopi silversmiths oxidize the areas revealed by the cutouts and texture the background to make the design stand out. Watson, however, does not accelerate the oxidation. By leaving his design to oxidize naturally, his jewelry matures and develops with time. Individuals who have purchased his rings as wedding bands, for example, say that the served basis.

The history of Haeger Potteries spans 126 years full of traditions within the Haeger family, the Haeger business and the growth of the Dundee Township. Within the showcases of the Haeger Museum are pottery pieces of memorabilia. One of the oldest ceramic pottery pieces is a green ceramic drinking glass vase. 

"We found that in preview screenings of "Thrill Ride," the audience was screaming and putting their hands in the air in the roller coaster segments because it seems as though you re moving," observed producer Charlotte Huggins. The movie also educates viewers, providing some interesting lessons about the science of how motion pictures are made and the physics of roller coasters. For instance, the film illustrates that although a roller coaster seems to go faster and faster, it is actually losing momentum and speed as it goes along-slowing down from the first drop. To compensate, engineers design the coasters so that the turns get tighter towards the end of the ride, giving the perception that the speed is increasing.

"Thrill Ride" also shows how computer graphics of ride films are created-from the wire frame skeleton designed on the computer—to the process of covering the skeleton drawings with a "skin" to give the objects shape and shadow. Higher resolution textures and colors are then added along with lighting and other atmo-

Sale of a Residence

Another year is rapidly coming to a close. November is a month to give thanks and focus on the blessings of this year and years to come. It is not too early to begin planning your year end annual gifting. In the year 1997, the annual gifting amount is still \$10,000 that any one individual may give to another without incurring a gift tax liability. There is no limit on the number of individuals to which one can gift

This month I will discuss a recent change in the law that has caused much confusion among professionals. The Tax Relief Act of 1997 repealed Section 1034 of the Internal Revenue Code which was entitled "Rollover of Gain Sale of Principle Residence." The new tax law also changed IRS Code Section 121, which previously dealt with the one-time exclusion of \$125,000 of gain from the sale of a principal residence after attaining the age of 55. The new Section 121 replaced the previous Section 121 with the provision that a taxpayer is now able to exclude up to \$250,000 (\$500,000 if married and filing a joint return) of gain realized on the sale or exchange of any principal residence at any age as long as the taxpayer has lived in the principal residence for two years from the date of the previous sale of a principle residence.

However, the new law did not reflect the bridging of the two laws. The question among professionals became: what happens to the unrecognized gain on sale of principal residences prior to May 6, 1997, the effective date of the new law... does it vanish or must it be taken into account in calculating the gain on a sale after May 6, 1997. Prior to May 6, 1997, unrecognized gain on the sale of a residence could be rolled over into the next purchase, if the sales price of the old resi-




dence did not exceed the taxpayer's cost of purchasing the new residence.

In order to determine the answer to this question, I had to call the office of Chief Counsel of the IRS in Washington, D.C. I spoke to the specialist of Code Section 121. He admitted it was a very confusing issue and that the unofficial opinion of the IRS is that all unrecognized gain from the sale of a personal residence prior to May 6, 1997 will be applied to the first sale of a residence after May 6, 1997. All sales thereafter will treat the basis as being generally the purchase price of the residence and the gain will be the difference between the sales price and the purchase

An unofficial opinion from the IRS is generally a reflection of their best thinking on an issue at the time, but there is always the possibility of change. If you have any further questions on this issue, please do not hesitate to call.
