Hand Pain: Is It Carpal Tunnel Syndrome?

Good Kitchen Substantially Increases Value of Home

"It's a proven fact that homes with good kitchens sell faster, and get their asking price," says Jim Walker, Certified Kitchen Designer at Barrington Homeworks.

Here are some suggestions Walker recommends that both buyers and sellers consider when analyzing a kitchen.

• Adquate Counter Space—The basic requirement is at least 24 inches of space on either side of the sink and 12 to 18 inches on each side of the range.

One common omission is an isolated refrigerator with no adjacent counter space. The need for landing space next to the handle side of the refrigerator is especially important, because we usually remove more than one item at a time, Walker said.

• Ample Storage-Cabinets should be positioned at point of first or last use. There should be storage for dishes near the table or dishwasher, drawers for utensils near the range, and shelves for canned food near the food preparation area.

• Adequate Ventilation—This is especially important in open-plan houses, where the barriers between kitchen and the rest of the home are minimal.

This "great room" concept demands adequate venting of smoke, grease and odors to the outside.

• Safety Considerations—This can be as basic as developing a traffic pattern that does not interfere with the work triangle. The fewer the number of people who enter the work triangle, the less chance there is

for an accident to occur.

Other safety considerations in the kitchen should include avoidance of sharp corners on islands, which are usually evelevel with children and hip-level with adults.

• Adequate Clearance Spaces-For safety, comfort and efficiency, it's imperative that clearance spaces be allowed for opening the oven, refrigerator, dishwasher and cabinet doors, using the appliances, passing behind seated diners and passing other family members in the kitchen.

• Appliance Placement-In most families, the refrigerator is the most-often-used appliance.

Regardless of the model chosen, good kitchen design places the refrigerator in a spot within the work triangle, but still accessible to the rest of the family without entering the work area.

Placement of the range is even more important. It should never be placed near a combustible wall, and should preferably be place away from a window, where an open flame could ignite curtains.

• Professional Design-The rapid growth of the kitchen industry has spawned a whole area of specialization in design of this room. The National Kitchen & Bath Association has a certification program for kitchen designers (CKD).

Gone are the days when your best bet would be to obtain your loan from the local savings and loan. Today, you can choose from mail-order loans, mortgage lenders, mortgage brokers, banks, savings banks, savings and loans, and alternative sources. How then, does one go about making this an informed decision? First, learn the difference and focus on the origination source.

Mortgage lenders in Illinois provide 'their own funds' to close the loan, typically provided by a warehouse lender (usually a bank) that provides the lender with a line-of-credit secured by your loan. The loan is then typically sold to FNMA. FHLMC. or a private conduit, while the lender continues to collect your payments. Mortgage brokers in Illinois either 'tablefund' to close a loan by immediately selling the loan to a lender, or the loan closes in the lender's name. The loan is then sold to FNMA. FHLMC. . . .

Banks use their own funds to close the loan, then sell the loan to FNMA, FHLMC ... banks and some mortgage lenders owned by banks or S&Ls may actually keep your loan if it is an adjustable rate or unusual product.

The common thread is that most mortgages end up in a mortgage backed security sold on Wall Street, regardless of the origination source. This is why you have probably heard that mortgages are becoming more and more 'generic' products. The difference, then, is not in the loan itself, but how well your particular loan is handled, and whether you are satisfied. 



lifts, and removal of frown lines easily and with minimal incisions using videoendoscopic technology in our Barrington office. As new techniques are developed certain aspects of facelifting will be enhanced as may other surgeries of the face and neck.

How Can Minimal Incisions Change The Brows and Forehead?

The skin and muscles of the brow and forehead move as one unit sliding loosely up and down. The muscles are attached high up on top of the scalp and low down at the level of the orbital rims. Through a tiny incision behind the hairline a 4mm scope is placed easily beneath the muscles and special instruments are used to detach the muscles from their attachments above and below. The muscles are shifted higher and reattached resulting in an elevation of the brows. Frown lines can also be lessened at the same time.

The corrugator and procerus muscles are located between the eyebrows and pull the brows strongly down and toward the midline. This results in creases and furrows of the overlying skin. During traditional forehead lifting corrugator and procerus resection is commonly performed to weaken these muscles and lessen their effect on the overlying skin. Over time, most of the lines smooth out. Traditional surgery, though, requires an incision across the scalp extending from ear to ear. Very few people are interested in such drastic surgery for frown lines. Minimal incision surgery for frown lines is much simpler. Only two tiny vertical incisions are made behind the hairline. These provide access for scope and instruments to reset the muscles from underneath. The incisions are closed with a few dissolving stitches and are virtually invisible the day following surgery.

What Is The Advantage of Minimal Incision Forehead Surgery Over Traditional Forehead Lifting?

Traditional forehead lifting involves making an incision from ear to ear across the scalp. This necessitates dividing the nerves that supply sensation to the scalp above the incision. The resulting numbness of the scalp usually resolves but not for months. The minimal incision technique laces the incisions between these nerves so there is no loss of sensation. Traditional forehead lifting accomplishes the lift by removing a strip of the scalp. This results in tension on the incision that can spread and leave a visible line where hair can't grow. The minimal incision technique shifts the brows to a higher point without removing any scalp. The tiny vertical incisions are not under any tension so hair loss around the incision is extremely rare. These incisions are usually closed with only a few dissolving sutures.


What If A Patient Wants Only The Outer Brows Lifted and Not The Entire Forehead?

The beauty of minimal incision surgery is that individual components of the forehead and brows can be changed without affecting other areas. For instance, the frown lines can be improved without any other lifting: or just the outer brows can be elevated to eliminate hooding of the eyelids without changing the position of the central brows. Traditional forehead lifting is an all or nothing proposition. The type of anethesia employed depends on what is being done and the patient's preference.

What is The Recovery Period Like?

A cotton padded dressing is placed over the forehead and removed the next morning. There is usually some swelling but because the incisions are so small the swelling quickly resolves. Occasionally some bruising of the upper eyelids can result that usually resolves in seven to ten days. Our office makes an effort to stay on the forefront of the field of facial plastic surgery and we are currently using the KTP laser in many of the minimal incision surgeries. This unique application has many advantages that could be discussed in consultation.
