A Reminder to Animal Owners

The Hooved Animal Humane Society would like to remind all animal owners that as the spring planting and bedding season approaches, special consideration should be given to the source and base of bedding materials used. Free or very low priced wood chips can contain lethal levels of toxic plants, namely black walnut. Freshly cut black walnut can be absorbed by large animals hooves and create serious or fatal health problems in animals. Anyone using mixed wood chips in areas where animals reside should be certain that black walnut is not present. Hayfields, barnyards and paddocks can be contaminated with the toxins leeching

out of these wood chips.

If horses have been exposed to toxins from hardwood bedding with unknown toxins, owners should be on the watch for swollen lower limbs, fever, heat in the hooves or loss of appetite. With any signs of trouble, the animals should be removed from the affected area and given veterinary attention immediately.

Animal owners and keepers should be aware of these potential health problems. Any wood chips that are used in context with any animal should be guaranteed free of walnut particles by the seller. Those wood chips that cannot be guaranteed free of walnut should be avoided at all costs.

Nine Barrington Churches Join Hands to Build Affordable **Housing for Those in Need**

area churches joined hands in a Habitat for Humanity partnership. The group's objective is to do their part in reaching Habitat for Humanity's goal of eliminating homelessness and poverty housing from the face of the earth... one household at a time. The new union, known as the Jovful Hands Habitat Partnership, became the fourth partnership of the organization's local affiliate, Habitat for Humanity of the Northern Fox Valley.

Since 1976, when Millard Fuller founded Habitat for Humanity International, volunteers have built more than 70,000 simple, sturdy houses worldwide. In most cases, local churches were the catalysts. Showing the same spirit of togetherness that has led to other successful, local ministry efforts like the Crop Walk and Meals with Wheels, Barrington area churches are again joining hands.

Currently, several properties are being considered for Joyful Hands' first Habitat project. On Saturday, February 20, nine Barrington United Methodist Church. These partners will share responsibility for raising the estimated \$40,000 needed to buy building materials and for recruiting the volunteer labor necessary to construct the house.

Partner families are carefully screened, not only from a need perspective, but also from a credit standpoint and their history of meeting commitments. They make a down payment and are expected to invest at least 500 hours of sweat equity" in the construction of their home. Once the house is completed, the partner family assumes all the traditional responsibilities of ownership, including a mortgage.

The Habitat project represents another example of the Barrington area's commitment to reaching out to those in need. In the weeks ahead, the partner churches will be seeking donations from the surrounding communities in the form of volunteer labor, construction materials, food for the workers and monetary contributions. New Tax Developments

Spring is here! March 20 ushered in the first day of spring. April 15 brings us to the end of another tax year. As we begin a new tax year, I thought it would be a good time to discuss the new tax developments for 1999.

Proposed Bills-Early in the 106th Congress, several new tax bills were introduced. On January 6, 1999, a new bill was introduced that would repeal the federal estate, gift and generation-skipping transfer taxes. The proposed legislation is called the Heritage Preservation Bill.

Another bill was introduced that would accelerate the phase-in of the \$1 Million exclusion for estates of persons dying and gifts made after December 31, 1999. Under the current law, the \$1 Million exclusion will be available in 2006.

The American Dream Tax Fairness Equity Bill was introduced to reduce the maximum capital gains tax for individuals, replace the estate and gift tax unified tax rate with an estate and gift capital gains tax and establish a capital gains tax on trust property at the death of the contributor.

1999 Inflation Adjustments—The IRS has announced the inflation adjusted items that will affect taxpayers for 1999:

- Special Use Valuation—If an executor of an estate of a person who dies in 1999 elects to use the special use valuation method for qualified real property, the aggregate decrease in the property's value may not exceed \$760,000.
- Annual Exclusion for Gifts—The \$10,000 gift tax annual exclusion stays the same. However, the first \$101,000 of gifts to a non-citizen spouse are excluded from
- •GST Exemption—The generationskipping transfer tax exemption is increased to \$1,010,000 for 1999.
- Installment Payments of Estate Tax-The dollar amount used to determine the amount of estate tax subject to 2% interest is now \$1,010,000.

New Law for Disclosure of Gifts-If you give more than \$10,000 (in cash or property) to someone during a single year, you normally must file a gift tax return by April 15 of the following year to report the gift. Since most people give far less than this amount, few are required to file a gift tax return. However, a change in the law in 1997 and a recent issuance of Proposed Regulations from the IRS, now means that some people should file a gift tax return even though their gifts do not exceed \$10,000.

For gifts made after August 5, 1997, the tax law requires adequate disclosure of a gift on a gift tax return before the threeyear statute of limitations begins to run for a healthy and prosperous April!



that gift. Once the statute of limitations is up (3 years), the new rules prohibit the IRS from revaluing the gift when determining any future liability for gift or estate

The good news is that still most gifts do not need to be reported. For example, it is unnecessary to report gifts of cash, publicly traded stocks or mutual fund shares or other easily valued property as long as they and any other gifts to the same person don't total more than \$10,000 for the year. However, gifts of interests in closely held businesses and other hard-to-value assets, plus gifts on which a valuation discount was claimed probably should be reported on a gift tax return even if total gifts to that particular donee are no more than \$10,000 for the year.

The Cost of Luxury—The federal luxury tax on new cars is 6% this year, down from 7% in 1998. The luxury tax is scheduled to be phased out by 2003. The tax is assessed on the amount of the purchase price that is in excess of \$36,000.

Savings Bonds to Charity-In a recent Private Letter Ruling, the IRS ruled that the distribution of savings bonds in kind to charities would not result in the recognition of income by an estate.

According to the Service, the accrued interest on the bonds will be includable in the gross income of the charities when the bonds are disposed of, redeemed or reach maturity. The accrued interest will be exempt from tax when it is recognized by the charities because they are tax-exempt organizations.

I hope this information will help you with your tax planning for 1999. It is never too early to start. I will keep you informed of new tax changes and proposals during the year.

Plastic Surgery and People's Fears

by Gary S. Churchill, MD

Many people think and talk about getting plastic surgery for years but fear prevents them from taking that final step and actually carrying through with it. Their concerns are understandable, and undergoing surgery is certainly not something to be taken lightly. Yet many of these fears can be eased with a little more knowledge and some accurate information.

Fear of the Results

A facelift is probably the procedure most feared by patients. One concern they have is that a facelift won't look natural; nobody wants to look pulled or too tight. The goal is to look refreshed and not as if surgery was performed. So how is this accomplished? Rather than depending on extensive skin undermining and pulling as is commonly done, we use a less invasive technique that depends more on tightening the deeper layers beneath the skin. This lifts and tightens the skin in a more natural way, distributing the tension from beneath the skin rather than directly from the incisions. The result is a faster recovery, a longer lasting result and a very natural look. This technique also miniresulting in far better healing.

Fear of Scars

Patients also worry that their scars will show. Unfortunately, many surgeons still use incisions that result in visible scars. But this is not the case with our incisions. After years of experience and constant refinements, we have developed an incision that is virtually undetectable when it has healed. The uniqueness of our incision is that it preserves the hairline in its natural position. While most surgeons place their incision in a straight line in front of the ear where a telltale scar will be seen, we hide the incisions in all the

natural creases around and then just inside the ear. We also use dissolving sutures in all the incisions so no staples or sutures ever need to be removed.

Fear of Pain

The fear of post-operative pain prevents some people from considering undergoing surgery. However, facial surgery is not generally painful. During a facelift, the skin around the incisions is lifted. The skin will be numb at first, reducing postoperative pain. Most patients describe a facelift as feeling "tight." Very few people complain about pain.

Fear of Anesthesia

Anesthesia is far safer now than ever bemizes the tension on the incisions fore. The newer anesthetic medications and monitoring equipment have revolutionized the field of outpatient surgery. 





Save Your Smile, Wear Your Mouthguard by Drs. Michael Hayward & Robert Skopek

According to the American Dental Association, more than 200,000 oral injuries are prevented annually in this country by sports mouthguards. While this is an impressive preventative figure, it is unfortunately estimated by the National Youth Sports Foundation that more than 5,000,000 teeth will be knocked out in sporting activities this year. In fact, dental injuries are the most common type of injury sustained during participation in sports. Therefore, the American Dental Association recommends that a mouthguard be worn during any sporting activity.

Trauma from falls at home or on the playground, flying objects or from athletic participation are frequent causes of injury to teeth and soft tissues of the mouth. 




Gustave Moreau Exhibit to be Viewed by Art Associates

Gustave Moreau is remembered as a painter of enchanting and intricate mythical and Biblical scenes and also as an exceptional teacher adored by his students. 
Your Personal Landscape II— The Front Garden Planting

In our previous article, we discussed the importance of the entry walk. The same principles discussed there are true for the front planting. The planting of the front garden should compliment and enhance the architecture, and lead your eye to the front

The scale of the plant material utilized around the entrance walk and home is one of the most important aspects of planting design. We have all seen residences where the selected plants have grown above windows or over doors and generally obscured the home from sight. The majority of

plants used in the front garden should maintain a low profile, growing anywhere from six inches (6") to thirty inches (30"). As these plants mass together, (as opposed to a series of individually trimmed geometric shapes), they provide a unified appearance that compliments the home. Another advantage to using smaller scale plants that mass together is the reduction of pruning and maintenance.


Avoid the common practice of planting visually strong plants such as those that for the front garden.



Local Food Pantry Benefits from \$3 Million Raised by US Rotary Clubs

Thanks to local Rotarians and Rhode Is- at Brown University and the Feinstein the Barrington Food Pantry recently reraised as a result of Mr. Feinstein's challenge to US Rotary Clubs. Mr. Feinstein offered to match, up to \$1 million, all funds donated by Rotary clubs to food banks, food pantries and soup kitchens.

According to the terms of the challenge, all funds donated by Rotary Clubs between October 16, 1998 (World Hunger Day) and October 31, 1998 would be matched up to \$1 million. If more than \$1 million dollars was raised, challenge funds were to be divided proportionally amongst all beneficiaries. If Rotarians failed to raise \$1 million, no funds would be donated. Beneficiaries had to be 501(c)(3) food

Rotary clubs throughout the country raised a total of \$2,011,811.70 during this 2-week period. To this was added the \$1 million dollars from the Feinstein foundation. The Barrington Rotary Club donated \$1.770 to the Barrington Church Women United Food Pantry and this was matched by an additional \$879 from the Feinstein Foundation. A check was recently given to Mary Anderson who received the money on behalf of the food pantry.







How Do I Work with a Kitchen Designer?

You've decided that the time has finally come to remodel your kitchen. You're facing a multitude of decisions to make your dream kitchen become a reality. What wood, style and finish do I want for my new cabinetry? Should I choose a freestanding range or a built-in model? Would I like solid surface or laminate for the countertop?

You know you should contact a kitchen designer but you're not sure how to work with one. Many potential remodelers have questions about the role of a designer, according to Star Norini-Johnson, CKD, ASID, owner of Distinctive Kitchen Designs, Inc. in Wauconda IL. Her answers to some of the most common questions might help you in achieving your dream kitchen.

1) Will a designer try to sell me what I don't really need? "Most good designers won't oversell. They'll try to make you aware of the options available to you," Norini-Johnson says. And there will be more than you may realize: cabinets packed with ingenious storage aids; new labor-saving, high-tech appliances; and a broad range of revolutionary countertop materials, just for openers. "Your designer should present different ideas to help you make the right decisions."

2) Suppose my designer won't do what I want? "When a designer disagrees with what you want, the professional designer will usually discuss the pros and cons of the issue." says Norini-Johnson. "Perhaps the designer is concerned about a safety issue, such as proper clearances. However, it's your money and you have the final decision. If, on the other hand, you feel that the designer is not interpreting your needs or ideas, it may be a good idea to look for another professional to assist you.

3) Why does the designer need to know how much I want to spend? The obvious answer, according to Norini-

Johnson, is so you won't end up with an elaborate commercial-type installation if you're interested in a simple, family kitchen. The designer also has to know your family's special needs. What about a baking center or a snack counter for toddlers? Or an island with a vegetable sink to allow more than one person to participate in food preparation? A good designer is usually very practical and should make recommendations as to which cabinets or finishing materials may best maximize your budget.

4) If I use a designer, how can I be sure what my kitchen will look like? "Only a few clients can visualize what their kitchen will look like from a floor plan. As a rule, I will often draw a perspective rendering of the finished kitchen. If you are not certain, or do not understand any element of the design, be sure to ask the designer to clarify the design concepts before placing the order for cabinets or other materials."

5) Will my kitchen cost more if I use a designer? "Quite often, the very opposite is true," says Norini-Johnson. "As mentioned before, designers can usually maximize the client's budget and avoid costly mistakes. However, don't be surprised if the designer has the policy of asking for a retainer at some point prior to your commitment for a purchase. After all, our time is valuable too, and we all have to make a living. The retainer usually covers the drawing and design time that the designer will invest prior to your ordering the kitchen. The retainer can usually be applied as part of the deposit for the order. It is a good idea to ask the designer about the billing policy during the first interview."

O: WHO DOES THE LANDSCAPE PLAN AND WHAT DOES IT TELL ME?

A good landscape plan is the basis for a quality job. An architect or designer can be used. An architect has completed 4-5 years of study involving horiculture, soil, surveying, site plans and construction while a designer may have had a wide range of courses. As to what the plan will tell you, it will indicate plant location, existing and new, plus pedestrian patterns, grading and hardscapes.

Q: HOW DO YOU DETERMINE WHAT MY LANDSCAPE REQUIREMENTS ARE?

At an initial meeting with the homeowner, we ask a series of questions involving your lifestyle and needs. Your answers become the direction of the plan and is the first step to creating an outdoor living space that fits your family's requirements.

Q: WHAT'S IT GOING TO COST?

Cost is determined by your needs and budget. Once those are determined, we draw up a plan along with a proposed budget. It's important for you to be satisfied with the design of the plan at this point. If you aren't, we will continue to revise the plans until you are satisfied. All plants are not created equal. We only buy from Northern Illinois/Wisconsin nurseries to ensure a plant that is adapted to our climate. Many lawn and garden centers sell bulk plant materials with undersized root systems to accommodate volume shipping. These same plants often come from the south, allowing them to be more prone to disease and unable to handle our winters. Another thing to consider is plant size. Professional nursery stock is larger and helps create a more pleasing look during the first season before the plants are established.

Q: WHAT GUARANTEES DO YOU around and work with those businesses OFFER?

Our plant materials carry a guarantee for one full year from date of completion. Exceptions are perennials at 50% guarantee. Hardscape work is guaranteed for 6 years. We are not responsible for acts of




