AND THE ARTS OF CHINA


scroll paintings, sculptures, calligraphy, textiles, ritual objects and scholar's books from more than 50 lenders in nine countries is at The Art Institute of Chicago to form an unprecedented exhibition of art related to the ancient Chinese philosophy and religion known as Taoism or Daoism. Taoism and the Arts of China is unquestionably among the most important exhibitions of Chinese art ever organized by the museum in its 107-year history.

Ranging in date from 500 B.C. to 1800 A.D., the 150 works of art brought together for this landmark showing highlight the conceptual and artistic achievements of the extraordinary ancient teachings of the Taoist tradition. Significantly, more than 30 works have been borrowed from institutions in the People's Republic of China -only two of which have been previously exhibited in the West. Important pieces have also come from the National Palace Museum in Taipei and from museum and temple collections in Japan. These and various others from major museums in the U.S. and Europe include many unknown and previously unpublished works of Taoist art.

It is difficult to overstate the significance of Taoism and the Arts of China. To

A group of extremely rare and precious truly understand Chinese civilizationboth ancient and modern-in all its vast complexity, one must understand the philosophy and religion of Taoism. With roots stretching back more than 25 centuries to Bronze Age China, Taoism has long stood at the core of Chinese culture, having a profound effect on such diverse realms as politics, military strategy, medicine, painting, martial arts, even Zen Buddhism. And although many of the greatest works of Chinese art come out of the Taoist tradition, this is only beginning to be recognized and discussed, even by specialists in the field.

> Tao (pronounced "Dao") means a road or a way, and is often translated in English as "The Way." A concept at once simple and profound, the Tao is commonly described as the void from which all reality emerges and in which all opposites are unified. It was the ideal of order inherent in the Tao that gave meaning and structure to people's daily lives in traditional China. The individual attuned to this concept concentrated on living in harmony with nature and the Tao that underlies it. These ideas were first articulated in the Daode Jing (Tao-te-jing), the great classic attributed to the sage Laozi (Lao-tzu) believed to have lived in the sixth century

Of the three dominant philosophies of China-Taoism, Confucianism and Buddhism, the last an import from India-Taoism is the least understood in the West. This has remained so even though Taoist-related subjects and activities have become quite common in the two decades since the United States reestablished diplomatic relations with China. Dozens of books about Daode Jing have appeared, as well as new translations of this brief but dense and powerful scripture. Feng-shui, the art/science of arranging one's environment in the most effective way (taking into account its own particular energy), is enjoying unprecedented popularity in the United States, as is the exercise and martial art of taijiquan (taichi ch'üan). Chinese medicine, including acupuncture and herbal medicine, also continues to gain widespread acceptance in the West. What is often not realized is that all of these areas are as Taoist in nature as the ubiquitous yin-yang symbol actually known as the Taiji diagramwhich has been emblematic of Taoism since the Song dynasty (960-1279).

In the course of its long and complex history, particularly between the late Zhou (5th to 3rd century B.C.) and Tang (618-906) dynasties, Taoism underwent a profound change from the philosophy expressed in the Daode Jing to a complex religion with a vast pantheon of deities and other supernatural beings, as well as a highly structured church and an enormous liturgy of ritual texts that came to be known as the Daozang (Treasury of

the Tao). In exploring this history, the exhibition builds upon several decades of investigation into Taoism by scholars of Chinese religion, demonstrating that an understanding of Taoism generates a deeper understanding of Chinese and Far Eastern civilization in general.

Divided into 12 sections, Taoism and the Arts of China begins with the origins of Taoist philosophy in the late Bronze Age (5th to 3rd centuries B.C.), exploring fundamental beliefs of philosophical Taoism and Chinese cosmology, and then focuses on the history and practice of Taoism as a religion. The role of Laozi is explored, as well as the Taoist pantheon of gods who inhabit the heavens and stars. Other topics include: early cults of sacred mountains and immortals, (xian, or adepts who have transcended the bounds of yin and yang); the birth of religious Taoism; Taoist ritual; deities of popular or folk religions; the roles of goddesses and female adepts; inner alchemy (neidan); and the meaning of landscape, within a Taoist context, as a symbol of cosmic structure and process. An important feature of the exhibition is a Taoist ritual altar which provides visitors with an opportunity to enter a sacred environment for Taoist worship and an experience of the use of Taoist art in this setting.

While the exhibition focuses on Taoism in traditional Chinese culture, it makes clear that Taoism is a living religion, still practiced by tens of millions in Taiwan, Hong Kong and many overseas Chinese communities, and one that is undergoing a major revival in mainland China today.







and now is the time to put a plan in action to minimize the effects of holiday stress on our bodies. The holidays are a time of festivity, parties, shopping, entertaining, religious observances, family gatherings, decorating and... stress! With all of the extra demands we put on ourselves and the expectations of the season, is it any wonder that most of us feel some stress during the holiday season? The source of holiday stress is simple; when it comes to time, money and social and family commitments, most people try to do too much. There are steps you can take to fight back and minimize the effects of the holidays.

We've all seen those depressing news items about how much weight most Americans gain between Thanksgiving and New Year's. Previous estimates say between five to ten pounds. Researchers at the National Institutes of Health set out to see if this was true. The good news is, although holiday weight gain is a fact, it is usually about 0.4 kg or less than one pound. A word of caution before you celebrate with some chocolate cake—this weight gain, though small, has a tendency to stick around.

- 9. Regular weight training or aerobic exercise is shown to improve the quality and duration of sleep.

Eyelid Surgery

"The eyes are the windows to the soul!" Eyes are one of the most expressive features we have and reveal a lot about us. Subtle changes in their appearance let people know if we are happy, sad, well rested, or tired. We are able to "read" people and at the same time be "read" by others through our eyes. Many have found that an energetic, youthful appearance can enhance others' perceptions of their performance at work. If their eyes look half closed due to excess upper eyelid skin or have "bags" beneath them because of excess fat bulging from beneath the lower eyelids, the overall appearance is one of tiredness and lack of energy. Even when they get plenty of sleep they can still look tired. Many people just feel younger than they look and would like to improve their overall appearance.

These are some of the reasons that a large portion of the cosmetics industry is devoted to enhancing the appearance of our eyes; through makeup, anti-aging and rejuvenating creams. Cosmetic companies realize that a first step in improving our looks is to improve the look of our eyes.

How Do the Eyes Change as We Age? The effects of aging are usually seen first in our eyes. As we get older the skin of the upper eyelid tends to increase and become redundant. This can hide the smooth skin just above the eyelashes where women wear eyeshadow. If enough excessive skin forms, it can actually hang over the eyelashes and obstruct vision. There can also be bulging of fat from behind the eyelid, causing a fullness or discreet bulge in the middle corner of

In the lower eyelids the first sign of aging normally seen is a bulging of the orbital fat creating the puffiness most people refer to as "bags". This is caused by a relaxation of the septum, a membrane beneath the eyelid muscles, which allows the fat of the eyesocket to bulge out beneath the skin. This relaxation is a normal consequence of aging but can occur in young people as a family trait. As pressure is applied to the closed eye one can see this bulge increase. Excess skin of the lower eyelid can also form but not usually to the same degree as in the upper lid.

What Can Surgery Accomplish?

In the upper eyelid excess skin is removed to allow a smooth contour when the eye is gently closed. When the eye this after the second postoperative day.

opens this results in a normal crease approximately 7mm above the lash line. Excess fat, if present, is removed with the skin to reduce the fullness of the upper eyelid. The incision line is closed precisely at the crease to hide it during the healing process. Eyelid skin heals very rapidly. Special techniques are used in Asian eyes and selected others to create a more prominent crease.

In the lower eyelid an incision is made just beneath the lashes or in selected patients on the inside of the lower eyelid. The excess fat, which is contained in three separate compartments, is then removed. Any excess skin is removed taking care not to place too much tension on the lower evelid.

An upper and lower blepharoplasty can be performed together or in combination with other facial rejuvenation procedures such as a facelift or rhinoplasty. The eyelids can also be improved in certain individuals with chemical peeling and/or brow lifting. The need for these are determined at the preoperative consultation.

Where is Surgery Performed?

Eyelid surgery is most often performed in our office surgical suite, however if preferred, surgery can be performed at a number of different hospitals or ambulatory surgery centers in the area.

What is the Recovery Period?

Dissolving sutures are used in the lower eyelids and do not have to be removed. Nonabsorbing sutures are normally used in the upper eyelids and are removed on the fifth postoperative day. Makeup can be worn the day following suture removal and most people return to work at this time. There can be swelling of the eyes for one to two days following the operation which might interfere with vision so we recommend not driving until the swelling is down. After this most people can easily be out in public with sunglasses. Any bruising that occurs fades in the first 7 to 10 days. Makeup can conceal

Evaluating Your Employment Rights

With the holidays upon us, it's time for celebration with family, friends and often times co-workers. This time of year can be especially difficult if you believe that your employer is wrongfully treating you and your position is in jeopardy. If you have such a concern, you are well advised to have your situation legally evaluated.

An evaluation of the employment relationship begins with whether you are considered an employee "at will." Under the employment "at will" doctrine, an employer may terminate an employee for a good reason, bad reason or no reason at all. Exceptions to "at will" employment include a valid and enforceable employment agreement and employment discrimination.

Employment discrimination is defined by state and federal law and prevents employers from basing an employment decision on an employee's sex, age, race, religion, national origin, disability or veteran status. A common form of unlawful discrimination involves on the job harassment known as "hostile work environment" harassment.


Building Images: Seventy Years of Hedrich Blessing Photography Captures the Essence of Architecture and Design

"Instead of recording a mere image, you have etched in film the elements of architectural personality. With your sympathetic interpretation, you have achieved the higher plane of active collaboration with the architect."—AIA Citation Presented to Ken Hedrich, 1959.

For 70 years, the firm Hedrich Blessing has been the vanguard in revolutionizing the way architecture and design have been captured on film. Countless architects-including Frank Lloyd Wright, Mies van der Rohe, Eliel Saarinen and Harry Weese, to name but just a fewhave relied on the Hedrich Blessing studio to bring the power of their buildings to the public. Now a new major exhibition, Building Images: Seventy Years of Hedrich Blessing Photography, at the Chicago Historical Society, Clark Street and North Avenue, brings into focus not only the best work of this firm's master photographers, but also the intricate process of creating truly memorable and striking images.

Designed by Chicago architect Stanley Tigerman, this first-ever showing of the Hedrich Blessing collection invites visitors of all ages -from photography buffs to architectural critics to lovers of urban vis-

tas-to experience firsthand the thought, ideal architectural or commercial photoplanning and vision needed to create the





As Timothy Samuelson, Chicago Historical Society Curator of Architecture and Design explains, only a special kind of photographer can find the viewpoint, the light and the angle that will "make the skyscrapers soar, make the spaces flow and convey the emotional intensity that is the soul of all great buildings." This exhibition showcases the uniqueness of the Hedrich Blessing style dramatic shadows,

bold juxtapositions and handsome details that reveal more than the

Historians credit Hedrich Blessing for setting the standard for this complicated art form. In 1929, Ken Hedrich, a 21-year-old photographer, opened his own commercial studio in downtown Chicago and soon earned the confidence of architect John Wellborn Root, Jr., whose work included the Chicago Board of Trade, the Palmolive Building and numerous other progressive structures throughout the country. With his simple philosophy, "Don't make photographs, think them," Hedrich captured the drama of these buildings on film in a new way and significantly changed the nature of architectural photography.


The ensuing decades resulted in a vast trove of invaluable and irreplaceable photographic materials. Beyond their work for America's leading architects, Hedrich Blessing's oeuvre encompasses product photography, industrial photography and editorial photography for magazines such as Better Homes & Gardens. During the 1990s, the Chicago Historical Society, acquired the Hedrich Blessing collection, of prints, negatives and transparencies dating from the firm's inception through the 1970s. Totaling more than 400,000 prints





and negatives from 40,000 assignments, this archive provides a rich resource for thousands of users each year.

Building Images: Seventy Years of Hedrich Blessing Photography showcases more than 450 celebrated photographs that chronicle the diverse trends of architecture and design throughout the greater part of the twentieth century. Since the firm's inception, only 19 photographers have shot more than 600,000 photographs, and all but two photographers spent their whole career at the studio.

The exhibition also provides an inside look at the intricate photographic process itself. Notes Tamara Biggs, Chicago His-

torical Society Director of Exhibitions, "Most people do not fully appreciate the work involved after the photograph is taken." Included in this part of Building Images are the five steps that make Hedrich Blessing photographs distinctive: vision, craft, teamwork, production and the collection.

"Vision" recreates an actual photo shoot, with a chaotic jumble of lights, stands, reflectors, cords and discarded cups and Polaroid prints. Here, viewers experience how photographers use the camera as an extension of their eye, to determine perspective, framing and lighting.

"Craft" explores how the photograph-



er's subtle use of supplemental light and filters distinguishes the professional from the amateur, the artist from the practitioner. A demonstration of lighting and filtration reveals the differences that can result from using either incandescent ("hot") or flash ("strobe") lights.

'Teamwork" underscores the Hedrich Blessing philosophy of peer review and mentoring. Cross currents of shared information about film, filtration, lens selection and photographic strategies have been the ethos of the Hedrich Blessing studio from the beginning—and this practice continues to enrich the next generation of master photographers.

"Production" provides the chance to see. firsthand the art of retouching and color correction of transparencies. While much retouching is still accomplished by hand, computer alterations to images scanned into digital files are increasingly in de-

Finally, "the collection" provides an overview of preserving photographs and making them accessible for future generations. Fragile negatives are stored in acidfree containers in a climate controlled environment and are cataloged to enable visitors and scholars alike to easily find images taken long ago-from architectural icons in A Century of Progress International Exposition 1933-1934 to views of the Great Northern Railway.

First Exposure: The Sketchbooks and Photographs of Theodore Robinson

(1852-1896), who was strongly influenced by his close friend, noted French artist Claude Monet, captured chance occurrences in everyday life, many of which are featured in First Exposure: The Sketchbooks and Photographs Of Theodore Robinson, an exhibition which opened Saturday, October 14, at Terra Museum of American Art, 664 N. Michigan Avenue in Chicago. The exhibition, which overlaps with the ongoing Indivisible: Stories of American Community, will be on view through Sunday, December 31, 2000.

The exhibition features three rarely exhibited sketchbooks and 25 black-andwhite photographs by the artist, which evoke Robinson's creative process. For although he tended to paint landscapes on site en plein air, Robinson often used these photographic and sketched studies as a resource. First Exposure brings to the foreground works which have typically been considered background.

Robinson was in a constant struggle to meet the high artistic and aesthetic goals he set for himself. This discipline and focus carried the artist through several transitions in style-from the academic realism of his youth to impressionism and, ultimately, to the streamlined, contemplative aesthetic of his artistic maturity.

Of the 25 photos featured in the exhibition, many are unidentifiable—of unknown subject, date and attribution-but

Impressionist painter Theodore Robinson lend insight into the people and places that filled the artist's life. Other photos can be identified as studies for paintings and were probably made while working in Giverny between 1888 and 1892. Graphite grids mark both the photographs and corresponding canvas, and suggest one aspect of Robinson's working process. He often used this method of transfer from photograph to canvas when working with models as a way of saving the expense of multiple sittings.

> Robinson had the distinction of being one of the few American artists who settled in Giverny to maintain a close personal relationship with the famed Impressionist Claude Monet. The shy and reclusive Robinson became somewhat of a celebrity himself as a rising talent, both in the opinion of contemporary scholars and particularly within the tight-knit group of his American colleagues, among them John Henry Twachtman, William H. Lowe, Kenyon Cox and J. Alden Weir.

> The exhibition was organized by Terra assistant curator Stephanie Mayer for Terra's sister museum, the Musée d'art Américain, in Giverny, France, The Chicago showing has been supplemented by additional oil paintings by Robinson from the Terra Foundation for the Arts collection and other museums.



\$14.3 Million Awarded to MS Research

The National Multiple Sclerosis Society has just committed \$14.3 million to support 54 new research projects by top scientists investigating many aspects of multiple sclerosis (MS). In its support for the national effort, the Greater Illinois Chapter forwarded \$2.9 million to the Society for research and programs during Fiscal Year 2000, (October 1, 1999 to September 30, 2000).

The new multi-year projects are part of a National MS Society program that will spend a record \$27 million in 2000 to advance research that will help in understanding this devastating disease, leading to new, safe and effective treatments and a cure. The society is funding more than 300 new and ongoing MS investigations in the U.S. and abroad-more MS research than any other voluntary health organization in the world.

There are 14 projects active in the Greater Illinois Chapter territory including seven investigations at the University of Chicago, four at Northwestern University, one at the University of Illinois at Chicago and two at the University of Illinois in Urbana.

The total amount of funding for current research projects in the Greater Illinois Chapter territory is \$4,052,675.

"We're excited by the promise these

projects hold for bringing answers to MS," says Stephen C. Reingold, PhD, the society's vice president of research programs. One newly-funded project is testing the ability of antibiotics to alter the course of the disease.

Two other new projects are part of a multimillion dollar effort to determine what gender differences can tell scientists about the cause and better treatment of the disease. This effort was initiated in part because MS is more than twice as common in women than in men.

Funds for research awards are provided in large part by the nationwide network of local chapters of the National MS Society. Locally, the Greater Illinois Chapter serves some 11,000 people with MS and their families in 73 northern and central Illinois counties.

Multiple sclerosis is a lifelong disease of the central nervous system. It is devastating because it strikes young adults and slowly steals physical functioning in unpredictable ways. MS affects nearly a third of a million people in the U.S.

The Remarkable Work of Polish **Astronomers Highlighted**

Nicolaus Copernicus is an unlikely revo- astronomers." lutionary, yet his astronomical discoveries changed the way mankind viewed their place in the universe. In the new exhibit The Remarkable Work of Copernicus, Hevelius and Other Historic Polish Astronomers, The Adler Planetarium & Astronomy Museum will celebrate Copernicus' theory of the Sun-centered planetary system and introduce the public to the scientific achievements of five other Polish astronomers. The exhibit will run through January 28, 2001.

The Adler, in partnership with the Polish American Congress-Illinois Division and the Consulate General of the Republic of Poland in Chicago, will highlight the significant contributions that Polish astronomers from the 1400s, 1500s and 1600s have made to the history of astronomy. Over 30 rare books by the astronomers Nicolaus Copernicus, Johannes Hevelius, Jan Glogowczyk, Albertus de Brudzewo and Stanislaw Lubieniecki will be featured in the exhibit, most from the world-renowned Adler History of Astronomy Collection. A replica of an astrolabe owned by Martin Bylica, on loan from the Jagiellonian University Museum in Krakow, Poland, will also be on display. The opening of this temporary exhibit coincides with Polish-American Heritage Month in October.

"Copernicus is arguably the most famous astronomer of all time, although most people are unaware of his Polish nationality," said Anna Felicity Friedman, exhibit curator. "However, the aim of this exhibition is not only to celebrate Copernicus, but to illuminate the accomplishments of a number of other Polish

Copernicus stopped the Sun and moved the Earth when he theorized that the Sun is at the center of our planetary system and the Earth is merely one of many planets orbiting the Sun. Copernicus's book, De Revolutionibus Orbium Coelestium, containing this theory was published shortly before his death in 1543. Born in Torun, Copernicus spent most of his life in Frombork, leaving Poland only briefly to attend several universities in Italy. He initially studied at the Jagiellonian University in Krakow, the preeminent institution for studying astronomy and mathematics in all of Europe from the 1400s through the early 1500s.

The Remarkable Work of Copernicus, Hevelius and Other Historic Polish Astronomers will feature first (on loan from the University of Chicago Library), second and third editions of Copernicus's De Revolutionibus Orbium Coelestium (1543, 1566, and 1617) as well as supplemental material including Pierre Gassendi's 1655

Johannes Hevelius, a Renaissance man of the history of astronomy, figures prominently in the exhibit with 11 of his lavishly illustrated books on display. He was a telescopic pioneer, great instrument builder, comet watcher and author of a monumental star catalogue and atlas, Firmamentum Sobiescianum (1690). His observatory, self-built on the rooftop of his home, was renowned as the best in Europe in the middle of the 1600s. He had a complete astronomical enterprise including a large instrument-making workshop and his own printing press.

"Hevelius was one of the most well-re-

spected observational astronomers in the 1600s who produced a phenomenal number of publications on nearly every astronomical topic studied at that time. Unfortunately, his extraordinary and copious achievements are completely unfamiliar to general audiences," said Friedman.

Aided by his particularly keen eyesight and the generous financial support from both the Polish King Jan III Sobieski and the French King Louis XIV, Hevelius carried out an enormous number of lunar, planetary, stellar and solar observations. Astronomers all over Europe prized his lunar maps, published in his Selenographia (1647). He also corresponded with astronomers and other scholars throughout Europe, leaving an invaluable treasure in the form of 17 volumes of letters.

Stanislaw Lubeniecki will be represented by three copies of his enormous illustrated Theatrum Cometicum, a history of comets and compilation of accounts of the comets of 1664 and 1665 from observers all over Europe, including a handcolored first edition (1667). The early Jagiellonian University professors will be represented by books authored by Jan Glogowczyk (one of Copernicus's professors) and Albertus de Brudzewo (on loan from the New York Public Library), as well as the Jagiellonian University's replica Martin Bylica astrolabe. The Remarkable Work of Copernicus, Hevelius and Other Historic Polish Astronomers will provide Adler guests with a rich historical overview of the significant history of astronomy in Poland in earlier times.
