

LWV Slate Champagne Brunch

Grace Mary Stern, State Senator for the 29th District, will address the topic, "Reproductive Rights-Women's Choices in 1994" at an upcoming Champagne Brunch in February. In her speech she will touch on such topics as reproductive actions anticipated for the coming legislative session, proposed federal health care plans as they relate to reproductive choices, and other timely topics relating to the reproductive rights of women in our state.

Ms. Stern is a very remarkable woman whose record of achievement is quite impressive. Currently as a state senator,

she is serving on the Local Government and Elections Committee, the Judiciary Committee, the Governor's Health and Physical Fitness Advisory Committee, Citizen's Council on Mental Health and Developmental Disabilities, the (D) State Senate Task Force on Health and is the chairperson of the (D) State Senate Task Force on Higher Education. Previous to her election to the state senate she served four terms as state representative from 1984-1992. In 1982 Adlai Stevenson chose her to run with him as Lieutenant Governor which gave her the distinction of being the first woman nominated by the Democratic Party for a major statewide office. This Stevenson/Stern ticket lost the General Election by only 1/14 of one percent.

What Are Alpha-Hydroxy Acids?

There is an abundance of products on the market containing glycolic and other alphahydroxy acids (AHAs). Although these products are new, these acids have been used for ages. Question: How did you become interested in painting?

Answer: It was a natural thing. You know when you do something well. I knew in grade school that I had a special talent, and in high school too. That's fun. When I was in college and painted better than my instructor, then I knew how good I really

Question: Do you mind being so completely identified with sports?

Answer: No. Sports are very important. don't go watch the games, I go to watch the people, the players, the owners, the writers. Some of these people are great, like Arnold Palmer, Bobby Hull and Reggie Jackson-good guys.

Question: What has been your greatest achievement?

Answer: Being my own man. The most important thing and the hardest thing is to be your own man. The artist has the feeling of being a little like a saint. We sin when we try to do something good.

'It's kind of important to keep losingto keep yourself exposed to shock and disappointment. You have to plunge into chaos occasionally, and get yourself completely beat up in the process. It's the way to stay alive. I mean, if life goes on beautifully all the time, you get not to really care about anything. But the emergency disasters, the bad stuff-you learn from it." seats, but in the flush 1980's, carriers routinely staffed them at higher levels. Now they're cutting back, usually by just one person, but it means slower service and more complaints. The cutbacks do have a silver lining: along with other cuts and a slowly improving traffic outlook they result in profits. Delta and American were both in the black during the latest quarter-a rare occurence.

Airports: No More Butts

More and more airports are banning smoking—even in bars and restaurants. A new law in Vermont will ban smoking in all the state's airports, Green Bay, Wisconsin, bans smoking entirely; San Francisco limits smoking to enclosed "smoking rooms;" and Orlando has eliminated smoking in the main terminal, except in certain restaurant areas.

Canadiana Village

Win, Win Strategy: "The Price Is Right"

Not very surprisingly, one of the most usually "Is it the seller's price"? effective ways of selling a home is by pricing it right. Correct pricing attracts customers and stimulates those customers to buy right then and there. Strategic pricing works for any home and especially in slow times when there are numerous homes (in a selected price range) on the market.

It's a fact in real estate that price weakens with time. The more time on the market, the higher the likelihood of a shrinking selling price. In a hot real estate market, a home, priced right, can often sell in the first week and often at full price.
