

Air travel...consider using a business address and phone number on your luggage tags rather than home contact information.



What's New in Facial Surgery

Although facelifts have been performed for years, the techniques have progressively improved over time to give more natural and longer lasting results. The way facelifts are performed today is a synthesis of a better understanding of the anatomy and dynamics of facial surgery.

What is the SMAS?

The most important step in the development of better facelifts came from the identification of the structure called the SMAS. Before that it was assumed that tightening the skin alone was all that was necessary to accomplish a facelift. Early facelifts were accomplished by simply excising the excess skin, pulling the remaining skin tighter, and closing the incision. But these lifts did not last long and soon the patient looked the same as they did prior to surgery

In reality facial skin laxity is based on laxity of the SMAS. SMAS stands for the Superficial Musculo Aponeurotic System, or in other words the structure just beneath the skin that is made up of the platysma muscle and tough connective tissues. The SMAS supports the skin and when the



SMAS becomes loose as we age the overlying skin also looks loose. Conversely, when the SMAS is tightened in a facelift, the overlying skin also tightens.

As we've seen, early facelifts did nothing to tighten the SMAS. Modern facelifts, however, should always tighten the SMAS. The result is a more natural appearing lift that lasts for years.

How is the SMAS Tightened?

An incision is made around the ears and the skin released for a short distance off the SMAS. At this point the SMAS may be tucked up toward the ear (this is called a plication) or the SMAS may also be released and sutured to a higher attachment point (this is called a SMAS flap technique). The latter technique is also called a deep plain facelift or composite facelift by some surgeons. In either technique the owls and neck are tightened significantly, but the deep plain technique has the potential to improve the creases going from the nose to the lip better. Most surgeons still don't do a deep plain facelift as it is technically more demanding. I choose the technique that best suits the patient.

Advantages Of Strength Training

weight training, as an activity only for athletes whose goal it is to improve their performance, strength and size. To the surprise of many, including physiologists, the effect of decreasing disease-related health risk factors through a strength training program is greater than anticipated.

Health risk factors increase with age. Some of these include: coronary heart disease (CHD), diabetes, osteoporosis, colon cancer, obesity and hypertension.

Blood Lipid Profile

In recent strength training studies there have blood lipid profiles. These results are comparable to those related to aerobic training.

Glucose Metabolism Glucose intolerance increases with age due to hyper-insulinemia—high insulin levels. Evidence supports improvements in glucose metabolism with strength training, independent from changes in body composition and aerobic conditioning. Also, individuals with impaired glucose tolerance became stabilized following a strength training program. Four months of strength train-

Some people view strength training, or fat percentage is associated with the aging process. This scenario can compound the effects of other coronary risk factors, such as diabetes, due to change in glucose metabolism and obesity related to decreased metabolic rate.

Early reports stated that older individuals in response to strength training did not increase their muscle mass; but, gains were made due to neurological adaptations. Investigators from independent labs have now observed substantial increases in muscle mass with strength training among older individuals—even up to the age of 96!

Bone Mineral Density

been significant improvements revealed in Several studies show that strength training is associated with a high bone mineral density, and bone mineral density is related to the associated muscles. Technology allows us to observe significant increases in specific bone sites after only four months of resistive strength training.

Gastro-Intestinal Transit Time

There are possible increases in gastro-intes-'tinal transit time that could reduce the risk of colon cancer.

Conclusion

This evidence now shows that there is strong support that strength training can improve one's health status. Though further research may lead to stronger conclusions, it is apparent that risk factors for many agerelated diseases are reduced after a continu-



Let's Talk Teeth: Seal Up Your Child's Dental Health

February is Children's Dental Health Month. With preventative dentistry, children and young adults today may avoid many of the cavities which plagued their parents' oral health.

Dental decay can be a serious problem for young children. Decay is caused by the bacteria present in dental plaque. These bacteria use food debris, especially sugar, to produce acid byproducts which attack tooth enamel. Through brushing, it is almost impossible to remove the plaque which accumulates deep in the pitted and grooved areas of the teeth, because these grooves are narrower than the diameter of a toothbrush.

BAHS Plans Trip To Chicago

On February 17th the Barrington Area Historical Society invites guests and members on a day tour to the world famous Kenyon and Oppenheimer Conservation Laboratory and Art Gallery in Chicago. This company is one of the leading specialists in historical paper conservation and reconstruction and is employed by historical societies and museums throughout the world. In its laboratory a staff of six under the direction of Douglas Kenyon, diagnoses and treats the problems that are inherent in most antique papers and art work. Let's Talk Teeth

A plastic barrier called a Dental Sealant has been developed to fill these grooves, thereby preventing the accumulation of the decay causing plaque, Sealants are usually applied to back chewing teeth and should be applied when permanent teeth erupt. Occasionally, baby teeth may benefit from sealants as well.

Application of sealants is painless and inexpensive. After thoroughly cleaning each tooth, the chewing surface is roughened or etched with an acidic-gel to help the sealant adhere to its surface. The toothcolor sealant materials is then placed into the grooves and hardened with a polymer-

izing beam of light. It may be several years before the sealant must be reapplied. Sealants are checked at regular dental visits to determine the need for reapplication.

Poor Report Cards: What To Do

Report card day brings stress to many familearn and reinforce those missing skills. lies. If you and your child are unhappy about a report card, what should you do? When you look at your child's report card and performance record, the most important things to evaluate are these: Is your child doing his or her best? Is he or she achieving his or her highest potential?

According to Dr. Raymond Huntington, founder and president of Huntington Learning Centers, "Parents know their own children. If you believe your child could be doing better than his or her grades show, you owe it to your child to remedy the situation."

"More than current grades are at stake, " Huntington continues, "If grades are mediocre or poor, it means your child is not gaining valuable skills. This can come back to haunt the child later. The skills children learn in school are like building blocks. If a skill is not learned adequately, future skills will suffer. When a child tries to build advanced skills on a shaky foundation of abilities. knowledge, there's likely to be trouble ahead."

Mediocre or poor grades can result from a variety of problems. Dr. Huntington offers the following suggestions for what to do when a child brings home a poor report card:

1. Examine the situation realistically. It's grades indicates that valuable skills are be-


But while this is being done, it's also important to identify and remedy the basic problem, so it does not continue to hurt your child's education.

2. What is really the problem? Is there a behavior problem? Sometimes, bright students get bad grades for behavior related activities. Does your child hand in their homework? Is it correct and on time? Is your child bored with schoolwork, and so is not paying enough attention? These are not excuses; they are symptoms of different problems. You must identify the problem before you can remedy it.

3. Talk with your child. Why does he think he got poor grades? Does he take the situation seriously? How does he plan to do better? It's important that your child knows you take the situation seriously. Work with him to develop a plan that will help him to achieve better grades. Let him know you are supportive and that you believe in his

4. Talk with your child's teacher or counselor. Your child's teacher or counselor is a professional educator. What are her observations? What does she recommend?

It is important to remember that the difficulty that caused these poor grades may be a serious problem. Your child may have missed one or more important skills. It's important to remember that every drop in vital that you get help for your child as soon as possible, before the problem gets worse. ing missed. 


