# "20th Century Women in Art" **Lecture Series**


"20th Century Women in Art" is the theme of this year's February Seminar Series hosted by the Barrington Community Associates of the Art Institute of Chicago. Georgia O'Keeffe, Frida Kahlo, Tamara Lempincka and Faith Ringgold are the subjects of four professional speakers on each Thursday in February at 1 PM at the Barrington Area Library, 505 N. Northwest Highway.

On February 4, Paula Wisotzki will lecture on Georgia O'Keeffe. Her slide-illustrated talk will consider O'Keeffe's work and career through issues which have caught the attention of scholars in recent years—especially the multiple

meanings of O'Keeffe's imagery, early critical responses to her work and the impact of her relationship with Alfred Stieglitz.

Wisotzki is an art historian on the faculty of the Fine Arts Department at Loyola University, specializing in Modern and American Art. She received her Ph.D. from Northwestern University and is an Adjunct Lecturer for the Department of Museum Education at the Art Institute of Chicago.

On February 11, Clare Kunny will discuss the work of Frida Kahlo. Kahlo, who died in 1954, painted in a style that was

sometimes shocking to the traditional art world. The Mexican artist, twice married to mural painter Diego Rivera, brought her dramatic life experiences as well as a rich ethnic background to her work. She is most widely known for her many nonsmiling self-portraits with the continuous swallow-shaped eyebrows.

Kunny holds an M.A. in Art History from the University of Chicago, with a specialization in Hispanic art and culture. She is a Senior Lecturer with the Department of Museum Education at the Art


Professor Ringgold is the recipient of more than 75 awards and her art has been exhibited in museums and galleries on every continent.

# **Ten Secrets To Having** Your Children Photographed

Parents are often unaware of all there is to know when having their children's portraits made. Understanding what to look for, will insure your child a very successful photographic session. Keep in mind the following points.

- 1. Research photographers. It's not enough to call on the phone. You must go to see the photographer's work. You will notice vast differences in the style and quality of individual photographers. Your photographer should insist on a pre-portrait consultation. 2. It is important not to prime your children before their session. A conscientious photographer will want to work with your child from a level playing field...meaning the child should not be anticipating anything. This will avoid cheezy or fake looking expressions.
- 3. Decide on a location to hang your portrait first. Knowing this will guide you as to the clothing style, color and mood of the portrait.
- 4. Measuring the size of this display space will help determine if the portrait should be a closeup, half or full length.
- 5. Be certain your child is not sick, hungry or overly tired for the session. It's important that children feel good in order to look good. Don't let a photographer talk you into coming in anyway if your child is under the weather. Simply reschedule.
- 6. Unless you want a trendy portrait (which will be dated in a few years ) adhere to the photographer's clothing recommendations. In a successful portrait, clothing should not draw attention. The primary focus should be your child.
- 7. Notice if the photographer's props and backgrounds are cheap looking or gimmicky. Simple is better.
- 8. Choose a photographer whose primary goal is not to make your child laugh. The most thought provoking portraits tend to be those that are serious. Long term, these portraits will yield more satisfaction and be regarded as works of art. Chances are you already have plenty of big grin and smiley pictures.
- 9. Don't be misled by the cheapest price. You really do get what you pay for.

Braude Memorial Collection in The Art Institute of Chicago presents a major portion of the Old Master drawing collection of Dorothy Braude Edinburg, with works ranging from Gothic-style drawings of the 15th and 16th centuries to early 19th-century Romantic works.

Dorothy Braude Edinburg is one of the most energetic and discriminating collectors of the second half of the 20th century. For almost 50 years, Edinburg-a graduate of Wellesley College and lifelong resident of the Boston area—has passionately pursued distinguished art works in two very different and specialized fields: Chinese ceramics of the Tang and Song dynasties and prints and drawings of the 15th through 20th centuries. She inherited the first of these interests from her parents, Harry B. and Bessie K. Braude, and it is in their memory that Edinburg is making a gift of her collection in the second arena to the Art Institute. Gifts of a Lifetime represents the first time a major portion of Dorothy Edinburg's Old Master drawings have gone on public display.

Gifts of a Lifetime ranges widely in time and place, across 300 years and throughout Europe and Great Britain. The earliest pieces are an illuminated Northern Italian Henry Fuseli, John Singleton Copley and Nativity drawing, heightened with gold, c. Benjamin West.

n exhibition of 50 Old Master draw- 1450, and two pen and ink drawings from ings, representing 28 gifts and 22 the first half of the 16th century by the great Mannerist artist Giulio Romano. There follow highlights from Renaissance and Baroque masters such as Federico Zuccaro, Pietro da Cortona, Bartolome Murillo and the Carracci brothers. In addition to French sheets by Jacques Callot, Claude Lorrain and Jacques Stella, works from the 17th century also include drawings by Italian printmakers Stefano della Bella and Salvator Rosa.



### Focus on Botox... an Alternative to Surgery by Gary S. Churchill, MD

Many people have very active frown lines between their brows and would love to have a simple way to reduce them. These lines are the result of corrugator muscles. These muscles lie horizontally under the central eyebrows. When they contract these muscles wrinkle the central brow into a configuration similar to corrugated cardboard, hence the name corrugators for the muscles. A number of options are available to treat these lines. What is Botox and How Does it Work? Botox is a highly purified form of the protein botulinum toxin. When it is injected into a muscle it blocks the nerve signals coming into that muscle resulting in complete or partial paralysis lasting from 3 to 6 months. Although it sounds scary, Botox is very safe and has been used effectively for years to treat spasms of the eye and face. Over the last few years many studies have been conducted and many patients treated with good results in reducing the frown lines and crows feet at the outer corners of the eves.

#### How is a Treatment Done?

state and diluted to the strength desired. Usually two injections are done on each side of the eyebrows to reduce frowning or on the sides of the eyes to reduce the crows feet. The effects are not seen immediately but take place over two to three days. Over that time the muscles will gradually become weaker until there is almost no ability to frown. If the crows feet area is injected the crinkling of the skin in that area will be reduced as well. If further weakening is desired, a second injection can be done after one week. This is rarely necessary.



# **Breaking Down** the Weight-Loss Brick Wall

It's not uncommon after a few months on a weight-loss program to suddenly stop seeing results. This phenomenon-called hitting a plateau—isn't unusual. As a matter of fact, unless you're constantly updating your program to reflect the changes your body has already experienced, it's almost certain you'll hit a weight-loss plateau.

"You need to look at a variety of factors: diet, specifically the number of calories consumed and the amount and intensity of exercise," says Jennifer Clark. president and owner of Barrington-based Body Constructors. "One of the first things we do is analyze clients' diets. Most people underestimate the number of calories they eat, simply because they're unsure how to accurately assess how much they're eating."

"Additionally, many people drop their calories in an attempt to lose weight when, in fact, they are causing their metabolic rate to slow down in response to their low caloric intake, therefore making it that much harder to meet their weight-loss goals in spite of an increase in activity."

"It's important to remember that as weight is lost, the body's metabolism slows because there's less body mass to fuel during rest as well as periods of activity," according to Clark. "Even if a 1,800 calorie-per-day diet aided in a certain level of weight loss, once a plateau has been reached, that 1,800 calories could very well be the exact amount needed to maintain your current weight."

"So, you need to either lower your calorie intake further or change the way you exercise," Clark says. "The first option isn't recommended. People find low-calorie

diets unsatisfying and these diets also are nutritionally deficient."

"It's much better to slightly reduce calories to a point that you can keep when you reach your goal weight," she said. "The exercise component is the best way to move beyond the plateau. That doesn't mean that you have to exercise several hours each day to burn more calories. What it does mean is that exercise needs to be an integral part of the weight-loss routine."

"Start with 30 minutes of continuous activity several times a week, gradually increasing the intensity and duration of those exercise sessions. Activities that individuals find enjoyable, such as basketball or in-line skating, should be included. Those who have been exercising for much longer will need to incorporate cross-training and interval training into their regimen."

"Another means for getting off the plateau is strength-training. The added muscle increases your metabolic rate, which offsets the metabolism-lowering effects of diet and weight loss. The more muscle you have, the higher your metabolism will be."

"If you've stopped losing weight, the way to get back on track is to vary your program," Clark says. "By mixing things up and changing your program with new techniques and workout formats, Body Constructors' trainers help break down the weight-loss brick wall."

# Keep Your Heart Healthy— What Women Need to Know

men. In fact, it kills more women than any other disease in America. That's the bad news. The good news is that heart disease is preventable. In fact, comprehensive lifestyle changes, without drugs or surgery, can actually reverse the process of heart disease. 





### **Charitable Lead Trusts**

by Sharon L. Keller, J.D., LLM Charitable Lead Trusts are rarely discussed, but for certain individuals, they provide a vehicle that allows them to transfer more

property during their life or transferred it to them at death.

A Charitable Lead Annuity Trust (CLAT) is a split interest gift in trust of an annuity interest to a charity for a specified term. followed by a non-charitable (family member) remainder interest. The Grantor is entitled to an immediate income tax charitable deduction and a gift tax charitable deduction. The amount of these deductions is the present value of the charity's "lead" interest. Actuarial tables are used to determine life expectancies to determine the charity's "lead" interest.

to family members than if they gifted the

When an individual sets up a CLAT with the "lead" interest to last for the individual's life, and the individual dies prematurely, the "lead" (charitable) interest turns out to be overvalued and the remainder (taxable) interest turns out to be undervalued for transfer tax purposes. This means that the amount of the gift tax charitable deduction turns out to be too high and the amount of the taxable transfer and gift tax paid on the transfer too low.

Income tax savings are also produced when this happens. When the CLAT is set up, the individual (Grantor) receives an immediate income tax deduction for the full present value of the annuity stream the charity is expected to receive. If the Grantor lives for a relatively short time after creating the CLAT, however, the charity will receive only a few payments taxable to the Grantor. Thus, the income tax deduction that was previously taken by the Grantor is overstated and a benefit to the Grantor.

Thus, the shorter the Grantor's actual life expectancy is in relation to his or her actuarial life expectancy, the greater the tax savings that can be produced. To use the actuarial tables, there must be more



than a 50% chance at the time the CLAT is created that the Grantor will live for at least one year.

The following example may clarify the use of a Charitable Lead Annuity Trust:

W is a wealthy widower who wants to transfer property to his daughter, D. Although W is suffering from terminal cancer, W has a statement from his doctor indicating that W has more than a 50% chance of survival for more than one year. W is 60 years old and in a combined 42% federal and state income tax bracket and a 55% transfer tax bracket. The CLAT pays an annual annuity of 10% during the life of W to the charity, the trust assets produce 10% annual return.

Using the annuity factor from the tax code, the value of the lead interest is \$86,443, producing an income tax deduction of \$36,306 (.42 x \$86,443). The value of the remainder (gift) interest is \$13,557 (\$100,000 - \$86,443). The gift tax payable on the transfer is \$7,457 (.55 x \$13.557).

# Why Do Some Children Require Two Phases of Orthodontic Treatment?

Children sometimes exhibit early signs of jaw problems as they grow and develop. An upper or lower jaw that is growing too much or not enough, or is too wide, too narrow, or crooked can be recognized at an early age when children are growing rapidly and are beginning to lose their baby teeth. 

# **Barrington Attorney Becomes Officer** of Kiwanis International



# Mid-Year Report Cards are Catalyst for New Year's Resolutions

While January marks the beginning of the done, it's also important to identify and New Year, it is also the halfway point in your child's school year. The skills developed during the first half of the year will be your child's foundation for the more difficult work ahead. Shortly, schools will be distributing midyear report cards. What should you do if you are unhappy with your child's midyear report card?

According to Dr. Raymond Huntington, founder and president of Huntington Learning Centers, "Parents know their own children. If you believe your child could be doing better than his or her grades show, you owe it to your child to remedy the situation."

"More than current grades are at stake," Huntington continues, "If grades are mediocre or poor, it means your child is not gaining valuable skills. This can come back to haunt children later. The skills children learn in school are like building blocks. If a skill is not learned adequately, future skills will suffer. When a child tries to build advanced skills on a shaky foundation of knowledge, there is likely to be trouble ahead."

Mediocre or poor grades can result from a variety of problems. Dr. Huntington offers the following suggestions for what to do when a child brings home a poor report card:

1. Examine the situation realistically. It's important to remember that every drop in grades indicates that valuable skills are being missed. An effort should be made to learn and reinforce those missing skills. But while this is being ington at 847-382-3655.

remedy the basic problem, so it does not continue to hurt your child's education.

2. What is really the problem? Is there a behavior problem? Sometimes, bright students get bad grades for behavior related activities. Does your child hand in their homework? Is it correct and on time? Is your child bored with schoolwork, and so is not paying enough attention? These are not excuses; they are symptoms of different problems. You must identify the problem before you can remedy it.

3. Talk with your child. Why does he think he got poor grades? Does he take the situation seriously? How does he plan to do better? It's important that your child knows you take the situation seriously. Work with him to develop a plan that will help him to achieve better grades. Let him know you are supportive and that you believe in his abilities.

4. Talk with your child's teacher or counselor. Your child's teacher or counselor is a professional educator. What are her observations? What does she recommend?

It is important to remember that the difficulty that caused these poor grades may be a serious problem. Your child may have missed one or more important basic skills. It's vital that you get help for your child as soon as possible, before the problem gets worse.







## **Store Firewood Properly**

homeowners cut and split firewood for use in their stove or fireplace. Bob Frazee, U of I Extension Educator, Natural Resources, Peoria, cautions homeowners, "that a lot of hard work and sweat may be wasted if firewood isn't stored properly."

According to Frazee, "storing firewood involves more than space. Other considerations, such as location, seasoning, rot, exposure and termites are also important. For example, firewood stored in a shady corner near buildings or surrounded by shrubs and vegetation deteriorates more quickly than wood stored in a sunny, exposed location. Also, wood in contact with the soil is soon infected with decay, and decayed wood has considerably less fuel value than sound wood. To prevent stored

As winter approaches each year, many firewood from rotting, it is recommended that it be placed on a rack that allows air movement on both the bottom and sides of the woodpile." Plastic sheeting or closer stacking of the top pieces will help to protect firewood from rain and snow.

> Wood seasons faster without bark, and pieces with small diameters air-dry faster than large chunks. "To speed the drying time for firewood," Frazee recommends, "halving or quartering the large pieces will help the seasoning process.'

Firewood should not be stacked against buildings, because of the danger that termites or other insects may attack the wood and thereby gain entrance to the building. And the general dampness and decay of the wood should not come in contact with the structure.
