



"Great Moments in Art History"

"Great Moments in Art History" is the theme of the February Seminar Series sponsored by the Barrington Community Associates of the Art Institute. All lectures will be at 1 PM on Thursdays at the Barrington Area Public Library, 505 N. Northwest Hwy.

On February 3, David Stark will present "17th Century Baroque in Spain and Holland." This lecture will survey 17th Century art of the Baroque period. Spanish Baroque painting is characterized by bold, dramatic presentations of religious subjects, utilizing extreme contrasts of light and dark with graphic emphasis on physical suffering and spiritual torment. Powerful images by Spanish masters such as Zurburan and Ribera will be examined along with the royal portraits and compelling scenes of everyday life by Velazquez. Dutch art during the same period reflects the more mundane reality of the common man living in a Protestant country driven by a strong middle-class art market. Masterpieces by Rembrandt and Vermeer as well as landscapes and still-lifes by the "Little Masters" of Holland will illustrate the unique balance between straightforward Realism and hidden moralizing seen in Dutch art of this rich period.

David Stark received his B.A. in French from Oberlin College and his M.A. and Ph.D. in History of Art from Ohio State University. He has taught art history at the University of Minnesota, Morris and has held the position of Curator of Education at two museums. His research focuses on 19th Century Belgian art with emphasis on Charles De Groux. His publications have appeared in several art magazines as well as the "Catalogue of a De Groux" retrospective held in Belgium in 1995.

"20th C. Paris Before the Great War"

"20th C. Paris Before the Great War" is the final topic in the February Seminar Series, "Great Moments in Art History," sponsored by the Barrington Community Associates of the Art Institute.

The years between 1900 and 1914 were among the most exciting in the history of Western art. The center of this activity was Paris. Les Fauves, or "The Wild Beasts," was the name an art critic gave to a group of young artists who showed together at the Paris Salon d'Automne of 1905. The painting of Matisse, Derain, Vlaminck and Braque was rigorously opposed to the lyrical charm of Impressionism. Color was not based on nature. Using strident colors applied in a manner that derived from Cézanne, Gaugin and Van Gogh, Les Fauves took painting back to basic principles, inspired by primitive art, popular prints and children's paintings. This lecture will focus on this powerful but very brief period as well as comparing and contrasting Braque and Picasso's Invention of Cubism which also occurred in "Paris Before the Great War."

Celia Marriott, Associate Director of Museum Education for Media Programs at the Art Institute of Chicago, attended Vassar College and received a B.A. and M.A. in Art History at the University of Wisconsin at Madison. She received a certificate in film making from the NYU Film School. Her film Museum is in the permanent collection in the Museum of Modern Art in New York. Celia Marriott lectures on a wide variety of subjects. Her field is Modernism, but her interests include The





Questions About Taxes by Steven Pribramsky, Steven Pribramsky & Associates, CPAs

With the holidays behind us, it is time to turn our attention to preparing to file our income taxes.

One of the area's leading tax experts has answered some questions that people typically have when preparing their tax records

How long do I have to keep my tax records?-Generally, the IRS has only three years from the date you file your return to go after you for back taxes. However, I would recommend the following: four years for bills and receipts that support your deductions; six years for bank statements and canceled checks; and I would permanently keep W-2 forms and tax returns.

Last year, I sold personal items through

an internet auction. Do I owe taxes on what I sold?-You owe no tax on items that you sold for less than you paid. But since they were personal items, you cannot claim a loss. If you sold the items for a gain, that is a more complicated issue and I would seek additional tax advice.

Planned Giving

I'm glad to see that we all survived the transition to the new millennium. As of this writing, I have just returned from aweek long tax conference in Miami. The conference was extremely informative and exciting (however, I use this term loosely, unless you find 2,700 tax specialists exciting). One topic of discussion was . the current ability of many Americans to make charitable donations. This^s month, -I will focus on the "Community Foundation" for the philanthropically-minded individual.

There is a changing desire for individuals to see results of their charitable donations. Bill Gates and his wife recently made a \$15 billion contribution to their private foundation. TV interviews on MSNBC and NBC News regarding current' now operate around the country. With funding of charitable foundations and direct charitable activities by newly made, they received more than \$1 billion in new millionaires in Seattle/Silicon Valley indicate such donors' preferences for narrow and specifically directed charitable activities. Michael Milken advised Bill Gates to "Follow Your Passion" in a Wall Street Journal op-ed, October 5, 1999, Europe edition. Donor-centered philanthropy is becoming an accepted standard. Increasingly, individuals are beginning to realize that the "whole dollar" has value, not just that portion of a family's wealth that is consumed or passed on to heirs. What is left-the social capital-will pass involuntarily as taxes or voluntarily as charitable gifts.

Today, individuals have many choices, and one choice is to use the community foundation instead of the private foundation as a philanthropic mechanism of choice. Community foundations are among the fastest growing institutions in philanthropy as a result of their attractive tax advantages, high degree of flexibility and tradition of service to donors.

Community foundations began as partnerships between banks and community leaders. Initially, bank trust departments managed charitable endowments and a committee of citizens chosen by representative community leaders supervised the distribution of income and, in some cases, principal for a variety of charitable purposes

While community foundations are now governed in a number of different ways, each maintains a board that holds the power to vary the use of the funds if literal compliance with a donor's instruc-

tions becomes impossible, impractical, unnecessary or undesirable. This power enables the community foundation to carry out the donor's intent in perpetuity.

More than 400 community foundations aggregate assets of more than \$13 billion, gifts and gave an estimated \$753 million in grants to charities in 1995.

The mission of the community foundations is broad. It typically includes keeping and maintaining charitable endowments for their communities in perpetuity, helping donors to manage their philanthropic legacies effectively and acting as a resource for other nonprofits and foundations on grantmaking, administrative and technical issues.


Community foundations are public charities and gather support from a broad spectrum of the public. An individual may receive a gift deduction of up to 50% of Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) for cash gifts to community foundations. For gifts of appreciated property, charitable deductions of 30% of AGI are allowed for gifts to community foundations. In addition, the community foundation can provide expertise in finding suitable grantees and in managing the grantmaking responsibilities of a trust in a manner consistent with the don'or's interests.

A donor can easily establish a fund in a community foundation by filling out prepared forms and trust agreements. The community foundation places the contributed assets with a reputable investment manager, often aggregating small funds into large investment pools.

In many cases, a donor can utilize the community foundation's flexible fund options such as:

• Designated Fund—The donor specifies funds to a specific public charity (i.e. (Please continue on page 44)



Poor Report Cards—What to do?

While January marks the beginning of the be made to learn and reinforce those new year, it is also the halfway point in your child's school year. The skills developed during the first half of the year will be your child's foundation for the more difficult work ahead. Shortly, schools will be distributing midyear report cards.

Report card day brings stress to many families. If you and your child are unhappy about a report card, what should you do? When you look at your child's report card and performance record, the most important things to evaluate are these: Is your child doing his or her best? Is he or she achieving his or her highest

According to Dr. Raymond Huntington, founder and president of Huntington Learning Centers, "Parents know their own children. If you believe your child could be doing better than his or her grades show, you owe it to your child to remedy the situation."


"More than current grades are at stake," Huntington continues, "If grades are mediocre or poor, it means your child is not gaining valuable skills. This can come back to haunt your child later. The skills children learn in school are like building blocks. If a skill is not learned adequately, future skills will suffer. When a child tries to build advanced skills on a shaky foundation of knowledge, there is likely to be trouble ahead."

Mediocre or poor grades can result from a variety of problems. Dr. Huntington offers the following suggestions for what to do when a child brings home a poor report card:

1. Examine the situation realistically. It's important to remember that every drop in grades indicates that valuable skills are being missed. An effort should

missing skills. While this is being done, it's also important to identify and remedy the basic problem, so it does not continue to hurt your child's education.

2. What is really the problem? Is there a behavior problem? Sometimes, bright students get bad grades for behavior related activities. Does your child hand in homework? Is it correct and on time? Is your child bored with schoolwork, and so is not paying enough attention? These are not excuses; they are symptoms of different problems. You must identify the problem before you can remedy it.

3. Talk with your child. Why does your child think he or she got poor grades? Does he or she take the situation seriously? How does he or she plan to do better? It is important that your child knows you take the situation seriously. Work with your child to develop a plan that will help him to achieve better grades. 




Facelift Surgery

Aging of the face is inevitable. With time, the effects of gravity, genetics and sun exposure begin to demonstrate their impact on our appearance. Fine wrinkles begin to appear at the corners of the eyes. The sharply demarcated jaw line becomes less defined with the appearance of jowls and the smooth contours of the neck are lost. The actual timing of when these events take place varies from person to person. Once these signs of aging become apparent, a facelift, also known as rhytidectomy, could provide the desired facial rejuvenation.

What is a Facelift?

A facelift allows rejuvenation of the lower two-thirds of the face. It addresses the sagging neck, jowls and cheeks. It may be combined with liposuction and tightening of the muscles in the neck to provide a tighter, smoother contouring. The incision for the facelift extends from the patient's temple hairline down in front of and then just inside the ear, and continues around the lobe behind the ear into the hairline. All incisions are placed where they would fall in a natural crease or hidden within the patient's hair. The skin is then raised and the underlying soft tissues are tightened. This places the tension beneath the skin and prevents a pulled or too tight look. The skin is then redraped over the underlying tissues. The excess skin is trimmed and the incisions are closed with fine sutures. Depending on the extent of surgery, the procedure can last from two to four hours. Following the surgery, the patient will have a dressing placed to protect the entire area where the incisions have been made and the skin has been raised. A facelift may also be combined hospital.

with eyelid and forehead surgery to provide rejuvenation of the upper one-third of the face.

What Can the Patient Expect After Surgery?

Most patients report very little pain after surgery, however, there is some degree of discomfort due to the swelling. The patient will be instructed to sleep with the head elevated on two to three pillows. Medication is prescribed to allow the patient to tolerate the mild pain. The dressing that was applied immediately following surgery is removed on the first day after surgery. Recovery usually takes between two to three weeks although most patients are able to go back to work in one to two weeks. The incisions are barely noticeable even early on since they are hidden in natural contours and the hair.

Where Can This Procedure be Performed?

Facelifts are commonly performed at **The Center for Facial Plastic Surgery**. Some patients prefer to spend the night there while others go home following surgery. Either twilight or general anesthesia is used. Facelifts can also be done in the hospital.





Barrington Rotarians Help Eradicate Polio in West Africa


Few Barrington Rotary Club members know much about Timbuktu, Ouagodougou or any of the other major cities in 13 West African nations hugging the Atlantic coastal region just between the equator and the great Sahara desert. But all of them know that those nations are among the last few where the dread disease Polio must be eradicated in the year 2000 in order for Rotary to achieve a world certified free of Polio by 2005.

Club President Lawrence Irwin explained that the eradication of Polio and certification that the world is free of Polio has The Rotary Foundation's highest priority this year. That was why the Barrington Rotary Club joined with 22 sister Rotary clubs here in Northeastern Illinois to provide funds to equip one of the five Polio surveillance stations that local Rotary District 6440 is supporting in West Africa

The club, like most others in this area, usually concentrates on local community service projects. But the eradication of Polio is a task in which the club has a strong interest. The last known case of Polio in the western hemisphere was reported in 1991. Rotarians, however, realize that until Polio is eradicated worldwide, a possible new outbreak is just a plane ride away.

The Barrington Rotary Club donation of \$750 helped put together a total of more than \$21,000 to be matched by The Rotary Foundation. Since the start of Rotary's involvement in the fight against Polio, this group of 23 Northeastern Illinois clubs has donated more than \$673,000 to Polio eradication. One billion children have been immunized in a worldwide effort for which Rotarians have provided more than \$450 million since the first Polio pilot project in The Philippines in 1985.


REMODELING 2000... STORY #1



All plans should place your residence and all other structures on the property in their proper location (a survey is required to do this) and drawn to scale. The diameter of each circle represent the tree or shrub's spread.

FEBRUARY TIPS

• Cold weather make branches brittle and prone to breakage. Gently remove small amounts of loose snow. Don't attempt to remove ice or frozen snow-that can cause damage. With proper care, plants usually spring back to shape.

• Water evergreens during warm spells. Warm winter days with sun cause plants to become active. If the soil is dry, plants are prone to winter windburn.

• Be careful when pruning evergreen branches. What appears to be dead may not be. Discoloration can be caused by cold temperatures. The needles may be dead, but in all likelihood the buds are still "kicking."

• Inspect crab trees for egg masses around stems. Prune off mass or crush by hand to prevent hatching later in the spring.
