Natural Habitat by Guyol. Crystal, stainless steel.



Woodstock Mozart Festival 14th Season Announced

The 14th season of the Woodstock Mozart Festival will take place on three consecutive Friday and Saturday evenings of July 28 and 29; August 4 and 5; and August 11 and 12 at the Woodstock Opera House. In addition to the Friday and Saturday night performance schedule, a chamber music concert will take place at 4 PM during the final Saturday afternoon on August 12.

For the weekend of July 28 and 29, the Festival's General Director, Anita Whalen, will join pianist Gerald Robbins in a 7 PM pre-concert performance of the Rondo from Mozart's Piano Four Hand Sonata K. 19d. Following will be remarks by conductor Robert Houlihan about the evening's program. At 8 PM, the opening work of the concert, Mozart's Impressario Overture, will be followed by the 25th Piano Concerto performed by Mr. Robbins. The Festival's Principal Cellist, Eugene Osadchy, will then be featured in the Cello Concerto in C Minor by Johann Christian Bach. A native of Killarney, Ireland, conductor Robert Houlihan's career has taken him to leading orchestras throughout Europe and South America. Awards at the Besançon and Hungarian Television Conductor's Competitions prompted Maestro Houlihan's conducting career which led to music director posts in Rumania and Hungary. In addition to his current position at the Municipal Theatre in Metz, France, Houlihan enjoys an active guest conducting career throughout Europe including appearances at numerous festivals. 


Art Associates to View "Pharaohs of the Sun"

Akhenaten, the revolutionary Egyptian Pharaoh, (1353-1336 BC), rejected the old forms of religion and worshipped a single god, Aten, light of the sun. He moved the capital from Thebes to Tell-El-Amarna. After his death, his reforms collapsed and the capital returned to Thebes. Because the abandoned city existed in isolation, archaeologists have been able to excavate and learn about this particular city, a thriving city with anywhere from 20,000 to 50,000 residents. Art from the Amarna Period is more naturalistic; figures are displayed in informal, intimate ways.

The "Pharaohs of the Sun" exhibition at the Art Institute focuses on the 17-year reign of Akhenaten and his queen Nefertiti who has become a symbol of feminine beauty. The Amarna Age is recreated through 250 objects, many of which have rarely traveled out of Egypt. Participants will have a comprehensive look at Akhenaten's reign, focusing on the daily life of Amarna citizens and the royal family as well as the period before and after his rule.


Pharaohs of the Sun

Akhenaten, Nefertiti, Tutankhamen

One of the most important international presentations of Egyptian art and culture in recent times arrives at The Art Institute of Chicago when "Pharaohs of the Sun: Akhenaten, Nefertiti, Tutankhamen" opens at the museum July 17, 2000. The first major exhibition of Egyptian art to travel to the city in more than 20 years, "Pharaohs of the Sun" is expected to draw at least 250,000 visitors during its run in the Art Institute's Regenstein Hall, the Daniel F. and Ada L. Rice Building, through September 24, 2000. Dated, timed tickets are required for the exhibition and are available at the museum, through the museum's website at www. artic.edu, and by phone at 1-312-930-4040 as well as at Illinois Ticketmaster outlets.

"Pharaohs of the Sun" sculpts a vivid portrait of the Amarna period -the revolutionary age of Akhenaten, Nefertiti and Tutankhamen. It was during this startlingly brief epoch (1353-1336 BC) that Pharaoh Akhenaten assumed the throne of Egypt at its peak of imperial glory. In a dramatic break with his already ancient culture's three-anda-half-millennia religious tradition, he established the worship of one god, moving the Egyptian capital to Amarna, an extraordinary city that he built in the desert.

"Pharaohs of the Sun" is the largest reassembly of objects from this prolific time in Egypt's history since the city was abandoned 3,500 years ago. The exhibition evokes the Amarna Age with more than 250 works, including both monumental and small-scale sculptures, as well as reliefs, ceramics and household items from public and private collections around the world. This wealth of precious objectsas well as a remarkable 20-foot, three-dimensional model of the city—will provide visitors with an intimate view of the daily life and culture of Amarna, bringing to light its place in Egyptian history and the dramatic forces that shaped and eventually



history, one era has engendered the greatest interest—the Amarna period (1353-1336 BC), the age of Akhenaten (originally Amenhotep IV), Nefertiti and Tutankhamen. It was during this time that the New Kingdom Pharaoh Akhenaten and his wife Nefertiti elected to abandon Egypt's age-old multitude of deities in favor of a single god-the disk of the sun, known as Aten. The Pharaoh, his family, court and many subjects withdrew from the centuries-old traditional capitals at Thebes and Memphis and founded a new center for his new age at the site of present-day Amarna, called Akhetaten, the "Horizon of the Sun Disk." This spectacular planned and rapidly built city—which boasted a population of between 20 and 50 thousand at its height—was a place of magnificent temples and sumptuous palaces brightly decorated with paintings and tiles, gardens, pools, private houses and tombs. But, soon after the Pharaoh's death in 1336 BC, his radical vision was quashed. The worship of many





peels, it stimulates a repair process that actually forms a thin layer of new collagen in the upper layer of the skin. 



Mosquito Season is Here

tial for high populations of mosquitoes. "According to entomologists at the University of Illinois, there are several points be egg sites, though. to remember about controlling and living with the annual mosquito invasion," reports John Church, University of Illinois Extension Educator, Natural Resources, Rockford.


There are 3,000 different kinds of mosquitoes worldwide. About 50 known species are in Midwestern states. However, only a few are nuisance biters or a concern as carriers of diseases or parasites such as encephalitis in humans or heartworms in dogs.

The entire life-cycle of a mosquito can be completed in about seven to ten days. Most mosquitoes remain within one mile of where they breed. Both males and females feed primarily on nectar and plant juices. Only the female bites humans and draws blood as a protein source for her eggs. Mosquitoes lay eggs in standing water or flood prone areas. Young mosquitoes live as larvae in water, however, the treehole species.

Rainy weather can help add to the potenthey are rarely found in deep water such as lakes or in flowing streams or rivers. Shallow or wetland areas near these may

There are three general classifications of mosquitoes, depending on where the larvae live, including floodwater or temporary pool areas; treeholes; artificial containers; and standing water. Those from floodwater areas are the most common nuisance type of mosquito in Illinois. Encephalitis is carried by mosquitoes primarily with breeding sites in treeholes and standing water sites.

Homeowners should eliminate any unnecessary water holding areas and containers from around the home and yard to help reduce egg-laying sites. Sites such as wading pools, birdbaths or pet watering dishes should be freshened with new water often. Eliminating tall grass and weeds can help reduce populations near the home, since it is a favorite hiding place during the day. Removing old stumps and decaying trees can reduce egg sites for
