



The TNOS benefit, "An Evening at the Verdi's," was worth singing about, netting \$12,000 to help support the ongoing expenses of the chorus.





Brian Piccolo Run And Fitness Walk Sunday, June 18

The Brian Piccolo Cancer Research Fund was established 25 years ago to remember the Chicago Bears running back and to raise money to help find a cure for the cancer that took his life. Brian, an All-American halfback from Wake Forest, died on June 16,1970, from testicular cancer, which at that time had only a 5% cure rate. Today, due to a large extent to research at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center in New York, supported by the Brian Piccolo Postdoctoral Fellowship, testicular cancer has a cure rate of over 90%.

In 1992, the Piccolo Committee decided

to focus on breast cancer research. Rush-Presbyterian-St. Luke's Medical Center in Chicago was chosen as the recipient of the Fund's annual proceeds. In 1994, the Brian Piccolo Endowed Chair for Cancer Research was established as a permanent endowment, and the Committee plans to increase it well into the future. Income from the endowment is directed to Dr. Kambiz Dowlat's breast cancer research program at Rush.

In 1995, in order to emphasize the Fund's commitment, the Committee requested that Sloan-Kettering redirect the income from the permanently endowed fellowship to breast cancer research, Dedication to breast cancer research is now Piccolo's primary focus at both institutions.

The Fund also supports two local facilities: Children's Memorial Hospital's Bone Marrow Transplant Unit and Clearbrook Center for the developmentally disabled in Rolling Meadows.







Laser Resurfacing To Remove Wrinkles Everyone knows that as we age we get more wrinkles. This starts in some people even in their late twenties. There are many remedies for this. Lotions, creams, and moisturizers have been used for years. More recently alpha-hydroxy acids have gained popularity. Yet the only permanent improvement that can be made in wrinkles requires some method to resurface the skin; to actually remove the outer layers of skin and allow a new and smoother skin surface to form in the healing process. Good results' have been obtained in the past with both dermabrasion and chemical peeling. Now, an exciting new advance in laser technology makes it possible to safely and effectively resurface the skin using the laser.

What Type Of Laser Is Used And How Are The Treatments Done?

A carbon dioxide laser is used for skin resurfacing. When this type of laser is applied to the skin it barely penetrates and therefore vaporizes only a minute layer of the surface. The laser is passed over the skin a number of times to remove the amount of surface skin necessary to smooth the wrinkles. As this is done the laser seals any blood vessels so there is no bleeding. A local anesthetic is usually used for small areas but if the entire face is being resurfaced a twilight sleep is more comfortable for the patient.

Can This Be Used For Scars As Well As Wrinkles?

The smoothing of scars has traditionally been done with dermabrasion. Laser resurfacing is definitely another option to be used. The two procedures heal similarly and will get similar results. The advantage to using the laser, though, is that the procedure is bloodless and that makes it easier to see the depth to which the skin and scars are removed.

Where Can This Be Done?



Some Common Dental Terms

Many of my patients seem confused by dental nomenclature. Since it's easier to communicate if we both know the same language, I will include a brief glossary for you and to help teach your children.

1. Carious Lesion—The damaged tooth structure created by the bacteria found in plaque (this is commonly referred to as a 'cavity").

2. Dental Restoration—The product of proper use of a dental material to recreate tooth structure to its original or improved form, (patients usually call these "fillings"). Dentists may disparagingly refer to a poorly executed restoration as a "filling".

3. Crown—The natural portion of a tooth which is made of enamel and is visible in your mouth. Also, the product of replacement of the natural crown with various dental materials. These are sometimes called "caps".

4. Onlay—A restoration that covers the biting surface of a tooth but does not extend over the entire crown. Onlays offer strength without excessive loss of tooth structure.

5. Gingiva—The tissue which covers the a barrier to bacteria and protects the under-tist. by Dr. Raymond Kotz



lying bone while chewing. Commonly called "gums".

6. Mucosa—The tissue covering your lips, tongue, cheeks, and the areas of the mouth not covered by the gingiva.

7. Periodontal Disease—Inflammation and destructive disease involving the gingiva and bony support of the teeth.

If you were unfamiliar with these terms, you might want to save this glossary for bone adjacent to your teeth. It functions as reference before your next trip to the den-

Kumon: Summer Exercise For The Brain

Summertime and Kumon-what a perfect pair! So says Patt Heise, director of the Kumon Math and Reading Center of Palatine. 
Infant Welfare Spring Luncheon Attracts Over 250 Women




BAAC June Exhibit


BAAC's 1995 Art Fair Commemorative Poster

Have shady areas where grass does poorly, yet mulching a large area is undesirable? Then, consider growing a ground cover. There are many groundcovers; the following are some that tolerate shade. Most of these ground covers are prone to either root rots, stem cankers or leaf diseases when planted in poorly drained soils. Make sure there is good air circulation and good soil drainage.

Another plant to consider is English Ivy (Hedra helix). Depending on cultivar, this plant may or may not be hardy. Two cultivars that are hardy are 'Bulgaria' and 'Hebron'. To keep this plant dense and vigorous, use hedge clippers every other spring ter the ground starts to freeze.

Bugleweed (Aguga reptans) is another possibility for shady areas. It produces blue to purple, white or red flowers on 3 to 6" spikes in spring. Flower color depends on the cultivar. All these plants are either evergreen or semi-evergreen. Therefore, winter survival is better when protected from winter sun and winds. Straw (weed free) and evergreen branches (from Christmas trees) can be used to cover these plants af-

Nine-To-Five Dog

Dogs thrive on routine: walk, play, feed, train, owner leaves for work, hang around the house, owner arrives home, walk, play, feed, train, hang around with owner, walk sleep, etc. Once they know the routine, they expect it. Changes in routine means trouble. Anticipation can cause problems. Dogs who are normally well behaved can fall apart if you go out in the evening after being away all day.

If your dog is left alone all day on its own, without physical or mental stimulation, a dog can develop stereotypical routines. Just like a caged wolf in a zoo, it might pace relentlessly or it might run up and down the stairs, bark incessantly, or even urinate and defecate in the house. Separation anxiety and this kind of obsessive behavior occur most frequently in dogs rescued from animal shelters or animals with an inadequate exercise routine.

Most dogs get worked up at the sign of your departure or your arrival home. Canine extroverts behave in a relentlessly gregarious way, but so do highly strung or neurotic individuals. Prolong boredom can also induce over excitement. The tendency to be excitable is partly inherited and partly learned. Excitement is a gratifying feeling. It acts as its own reward, which is one of the reasons dogs behave this way.

sociable species, and it is unnatural for them not to have companionship or activity. A dog needs to be mentally active for about half of its time, and if it is not its brain actually shrinks in size. Most bored dogs just

look glum and lie around, but many become destructive, overexcited, and do things that crave attention.

Dogs do not like being left alone for long periods of time, without physical or mental stimulation, a dog can become bored, frustrated, worry, show signs of separation anxiety or become destructive. Signs of your dog having these traits are chewing and tearing of things, and digging and soiling anywhere in the house. Further examples, your dog may exhibit any of the following: Picking up a towel or throw rug and shake it as if it is prey; howling, barking, especially continuous, rhythmic barking; chewing up the newspaper. These are signs of anxiety, frustration and boredom.

The Role of Exercise

Stress affects dogs just as it can people. Think how stressed you would be if your family came and went as they pleased, never telling you where they were going, when they would return or what they were up to. A dog, being naturally social, is particularly stressed by hours of isolation mandatory in today's world. Situations that create stress for you-a new job with different hours, a new child or problems in your relationship can all add up to increased stress for your dog.


