Hands of Hope, a nonprofit organization tween 250,000 to 600,000 suffer from VVF dedicated to the needs of women and children around the world, will host the Country Garden Faire in Barrington on June 23 and 24. Guests are invited to stroll through two enchanting garden estates while enjoying live entertainment, refreshments, garden-related art exhibits, gardening crafts, pond displays and more. Horticultural experts will also be on hand to answer garden related questions.

Nestled in the hills of Barrington, guests will have the opportunity to explore two distinct lavish garden estates. Beginning at the English Garden, guests will be taken back in time to a 19th-century farmstead where gardens take their cues from classic styles and woodland settings. The grounds feature 10 acres of formal gardens, English gardens, rose gardens, surrounding cottages and an English country home. The estate owner has recently refurbished a late 1800's farmhouse where guests will find local artists displaying their garden-related works.

The Woodland Garden will lead guests through a myriad of intimate garden rooms. Carved out of a serene woodland setting, the path will wind through shady perennial garden beds, sunny English cottage beds and a formal rose garden.

"The Country Garden Faire is a delightful way to spend an afternoon," said Vicky Wauterlek, founder of Hands of Hope. "Not only can guests enjoy live entertainment and fine arts against a backdrop of picturesque gardens, but they can feel good knowing the proceeds will offer hope to women around the world."

Hands of Hope is hosting the Country Garden Faire in an effort to aid Nigerian women who are afflicted with the gynecological disease Vesico-Vaginal Fistula (VVF). Although VVF is uncommon in the U.S., it is estimated that millions of women are afflicted with this condition and bein Nigeria alone.

A vast majority of the cases are due to obstructed labor directly related to the custom of early marriage in Nigeria. Frequently before the age of 18, and often before the onset of menstruation—as early as 11-girls are given in arranged marriages. When they become pregnant, their pelvises are too small to deliver the baby. During delivery, the baby jams against the pubic bone and, over days of labor, the grinding pressure wears a hole between the birth canal and the bladder. Less than 7% have a live baby at the end of the delivery. Approximately 15% of VVF cases are caused by female genital mutilation, an accepted practice promoted by longstanding cultural traditions.

"In their culture, a women's significance lies solely in her ability to bear children," said Wauterlek, who recently returned from Jos, Nigeria where she visited with the women first-hand. "When pregnancy is no longer possible due to the effects of VVF, women are literally abandoned by their husbands and many times by their families too.'

Hands of Hope will donate all proceeds to the ECWA Evangel Hospital in Jos, Nigeria. Their goal is to build a 50-bed, VVF hostel with a multi-purpose rehabilitation center. The center will focus on surgical repair, social rehabilitation and educational training.


Another common denominator that defines a connected relationship is when partners feel that they can talk to one another about their feelings for each other, reached at 847-842-9365. their points of view on controversial is-

An Interview with Dr. Philip Bushnick, **Board-Certified Plastic Surgeon**

"Boy, she looks great for her age! Is she just slow to show her age or did she have cosmetic surgery?"

Contemporary Tooth Replacement

Today, when natural teeth are lost but a patient's remaining teeth and bone are healthy, dentists usually evaluate the possibility of replacing those teeth with lifelike crowns supported by one or more artificial roots. These artificial roots are called dental implants.

However, if the remaining bone is inadequate in the area of the missing teeth, it may be necessary to consider replacement with a fixed bridge. A fixed bridge attaches to the teeth or implants on each side of the void. The result with implants or bridges is lifelike and stays rigidly in place even while speaking and eating.

If replacement utilizing implants or fixed bridges is not possible, the last choice is a removable partial or full denture. This appliance is removable by the patient for cleaning but it is generally less stable and the idea of removal is less appealing to most patients.

A dentist skilled in reconstructive dentistry must carefully evaluate each individual's situation because these techniques by Raymond Kotz, DDS



may sometimes be used in combination to achieve a superior result. A solution should be chosen in consultation with the patient since there are advantages and disadvantages to each solution and the patient's input is very important.



Life Insurance and the Irrevocable Trust by Sharon L. Keller, J.D., LLM

Estate planning and the use of life insurance go hand in hand. Life insurance often represents a major part of the estate planning process. Within that process, life insurance should be purchased for the following reasons: to create an estate that does not exist or to protect one's existing estate from losses that would be sustained through death taxes and probate.

A disadvantage associated with the purchase of life insurance is that the proceeds usually increase the taxable estate of the policy owner. Upon the death of the insured owner, the life insurance proceeds are included in the estate of the insured owner for federal estate tax purposes. Many people buy life insurance with the belief that insurance proceeds can be used by their beneficiaries free of federal estate tax. However, if the insured owns a life insurance policy on his or her own life, all of the life insurance proceeds are included in his or her estate for federal estate tax purposes upon death.

To avoid the federal estate tax issue, many people have the life insurance on their lives owned by their spouses or others; then upon the death of the insured, the policy proceeds are paid to the owner's beneficiary free of federal estate tax. However, the following are problems associated with the cross-ownership of these policies:

- 1. The insured loses control of the life insurance policies.
- 2. Proceeds are usually taxed on the death of the policy owner if he or she is the beneficiary and dies after the insured.
- 3. Few people can plan for the contingency that the owner-beneficiary may die first.
- 4. If the proceeds are payable to other than the insured or the owner, there is a gift of the entire insurance proceeds to the beneficiary from the policy owner.

There is a better way to avoid federal estate tax on life insurance proceeds—that is the use of an irrevocable life insurance trust. An irrevocable life insur-



ance trust (ILIT) is used to own the life insurance policies that insure your life. By using an ILIT, the proceeds are free of federal estate tax upon your death.

Generally, if a life insurance policy is given away, the value of the proceeds will not be included in the estate of the person who gave the policy away. The ILIT is used to own an insurance policy, whether it is purchased by the irrevocable trust or given to it. The ILIT must be irrevocable. Once the trust is executed, it can never be changed. If an ILIT is not totally irrevocable or if the maker retains direct control over it, the insurance proceeds will not be free of federal estate tax in the insured's estate upon death.

Using an ILIT, three estate planning objectives can be achieved:

- 1. Insurance proceeds can be kept free of federal estate tax upon the deaths of both spouses.
- 2. Because of the terms provided in the trust document, the trust maker can control the insurance proceeds received by the ILIT to care for the maker's beneficiaries.
- 3. The life insurance proceeds received by an ILIT can be used to pay the death expenses, including taxes, of both the maker and the maker's spouse.

You can transfer your existing policies into an ILIT or you can have the ILIT purchase life insurance policies on your life. However, if a life insurance policy is given

Preventative Orthodontics— The Use of Expanders

During your child's initial orthodontic exam, the orthodontist can detect if the iaw structure is too narrow and recommend the use of expanders. Children with a narrow upper jaw are usually mouth breathers and would benefit from palatal expansion greatly. Expanders allow early treatment of skeletal problems that are commonly present in children with mixed dentition (combination of baby and adult teeth) that, as a rule, will not self-correct or could lead to deviation of the jaws and possible TMJ problems. Since expansion

dontist by the age of seven. By correcting a cross-bite and/or making additional room for teeth at an early age, the patient can often avoid the need for permanent tooth removal in the future.

The nose determines to a great extent the balance and symmetry of our faces. If one's nose is out of proportion to the rest of their features, it can dominate their looks. Someone who doesn't like their nose can focus on it, becoming self-conscious and insecure. A change in the appearance of their nose can make all the difference in the world to them. This is why rhinoplasty surgery is one of the most common plastic surgical procedures being performed in the United States today.

What is rhinoplasty?

This is the part of nasal surgery that changes the outer shape of the nose. This is accomplished by a combination of removing and/or repositioning cartilage and bone which is already present. The goal is to shape the nose in a natural way so it is balanced and in harmony with the rest of the face and does not appear to have been "done."

What is external rhinoplasty?

In traditional rhinoplasty there are multiple incisions made inside the nose in order to reach the cartilage and bone. In addition, the cartilage usually needs to be "delivered" or pulled out of the nostril in order to operate on it.

External rhinoplasty is a technique we use in which one single incision is made starting just inside the nostril on one side and extending across the base of the nose to the other side. This allows the cartilage to be worked on in its natural position without distortion and provides a much greater visibility during the operation. Also, there is very little bleeding during consultations.

external rhinoplasty due to the single incision. We have found this technique gives much better control and predictability of the final result. We can also eliminate the need to pack the nose which significantly reduces the post-operative discomfort. External rhinoplasty is used on the majority of our patients.

What is a septoplasty?

The central support structure of the nose is the septum. It is made up of cartilage in the front of the nose and bone further back. This is what divides the nose lengthwise into two separate sides. The septum is often "deviated" or crooked due to some type of trauma earlier in life. This can lead to sinus infections as well as a chronic stuffy nose. If the deviation is located just beneath the bridge of the nose, it can cause the external form to look crooked. During a septoplasty, both the cartilaginous and bony portions of the septum are straightened and repositioned to the midline in order to improve the airway. This can be done as a separate operation or in conjunction with a rhinoplasty.

Computer Imaging

Computer imaging allows a patient to preview what changes are possible and how they might look after surgery. This is done with a special computer and software. Computer imaging is available in our office and used on all our rhinoplasty





camps; however, participants come and go. Again, these vary in length from one day to many weeks. There are also travel camps where campers move from location to location, usually through means such as bikes or canoes. Campers carry the things that they will need while they are on their trip with them. Before deciding on a camp, your family will want to consider what other activities (such as family vacations and other obligations) you are planning to participate in this summer.

Cost is, of course, another consideration for families. The costs for camps vary widely, ranging generally from \$15 to \$55 per day for programs offered by groups like 4-H, scouts and churches. Camps for profit will probably cost more

\$80 per day. Be sure to ask about any scholarships or price-breaks that might be available from camp's that you are considering for your child.

Another consideration is the accreditation of a camp. The American Camping Association offers an accreditation program that many camps participate in. This process includes a checklist of more than 300 criteria judged to be important for the safety and quality of a camp. Other camp professionals review camps that are part of this process at least once every three vears.



When you're taking a ride in a tune, anything that sounds even vaguely like the original tune is strictly coincidental," he laughs.


I found my way to the office which, not shiny floors and comfortable looking furworking at a computer assured me that 847-304-9020 and 847-712-1818.






