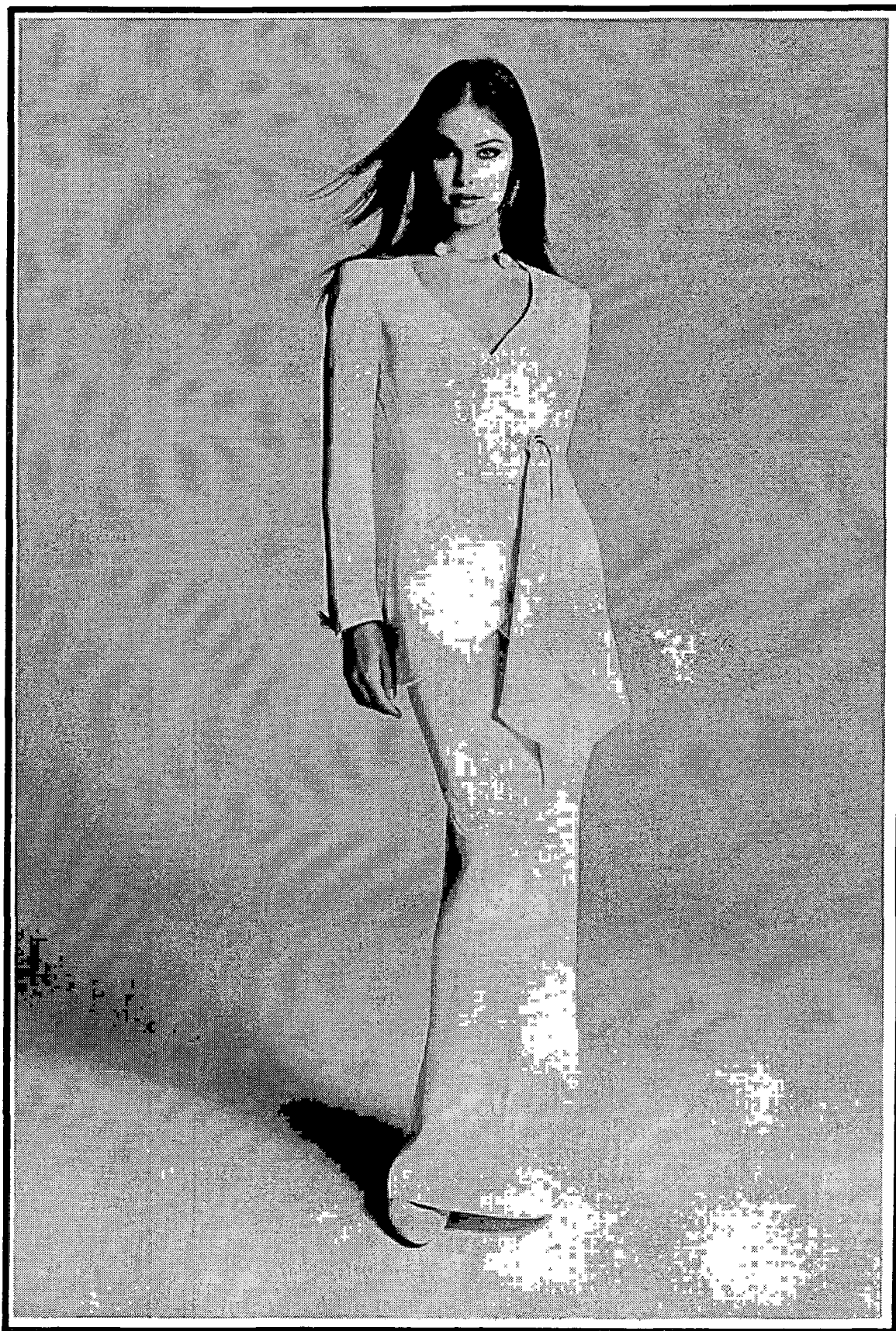

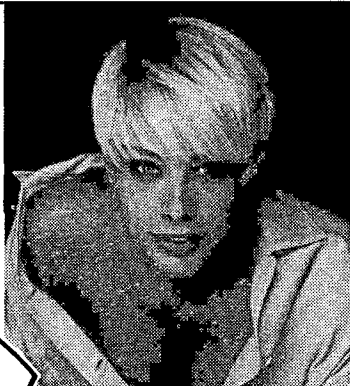

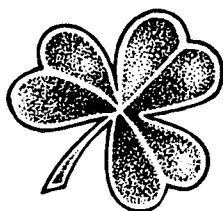

Until next time, may all your thoughts be sunny.

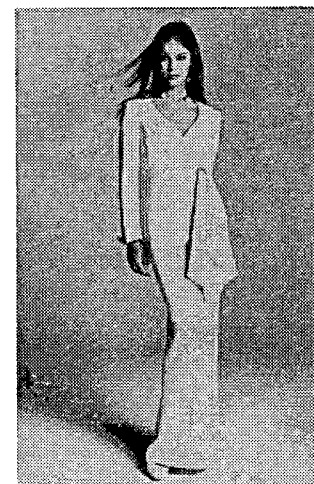

me, Eleanor, a one woman dramatization

me, Eleanor, a one-woman dramatization written and performed by Marilyn Darnall, will be presented Wednesday, March 16 at 3 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. in the McHenry County College Conference Center.

me, Eleanor, a play about Eleanor Roosevelt, adds color to the black and white pages of history. You may have wondered what it would be like to sit in the living room of an historic figure and chat. With the 50-minute portrayal of the first lady, you have the opportunity to witness what a remarkable woman she was. Eleanor's experiences and relationships come alive. Darnall shows how Eleanor overcame fears and loneliness, turned her visions into reality, and gained respect and admiration for her work throughout the world.

Darnall spent one year researching 28 books, writing, and re-writing her work, all the time becoming more fascinated with Mrs. Roosevelt's 78 years. The inspiration came as she watched television during Operation Desert Storm and it occurred to her that if Americans are looking to go in a new direction, maybe they needed different heroes and heroines. A little while later she found an old copy of a biography of Eleanor Roosevelt telling what an intelligent woman she was and how blessed with common sense. Mrs. Roosevelt drew strength and courage from the adversities in her life. "She was far-sighted and ahead

of her times," Marilyn feels, "addressing many of the questions facing the world right now. She was unafraid of new ideas and new experiences, and, above all, she was a humanitarian—an individual who felt compassion for each person she encountered." The first lady, well known for her work in the area of human rights and the early years of the United Nations, was instrumental in the repatriation of refugees following World War II. In the 1950s, she remained active in global politics, urging that Red China be accepted for membership in the United Nations.

Actress Marilyn Darnall, of Oakbrook, is a graduate of the University of Illinois where she studied music and theater. Her acting experience includes numerous stage roles in community theater and summer stock. Since 1975, she has been an active member of the Theater of Western Springs, one of the oldest and most prestigious community theaters in the country, serving for three years on the Board of Governors.

Placement Test

A total of 272 prospective students took the Placement Tests given at St. Viator in January. "This is the best record we have had in recent years," said Recruitment Director, Ann Aiello. "Last year the total number taking the tests was 258. In 1992, 257 took the tests. This healthy 5.5% increase bodes well for our overall enrollment," Aiello noted. "We have seen a steady rise in enrollment in the freshman class over the last few years. It looks as if we will see a significant jump this coming year. The Class of 1997 numbers 193. We'll certainly go over 200 for the Class of 1998."

Two other factors will significantly influence the choice of a St. Viator education, a minimal tuition increase and an expanded financial aid program. "During this current school year we have given out over \$130,000 in tuition assistance," said Vice President for Finance, Steve Doherty, "and we will increase that next year.

Tuition assistance is given for many reasons. Many of our families may have significant income, but have several children in Catholic schools or in college, making tuition at each of these schools a financial burden. Such factors are taken into consideration."

The Board of Trustees, committed to minimal tuition increases, voted at its January 11th meeting to increase tuition by only \$100 next year. The '94-'95 tuition will be \$4,450. "Tuition increased by only \$150 last year," said Doherty. "A more substantial increase came two years ago when the Board voted to cover operating expenses with tuition income so that Annual Fund revenues could go toward endowment, financial assistance and capital expenses instead of subsidizing tuition. I think we have now proven that we will do everything in our power to continue this policy of insignificant tuition increases in the future."

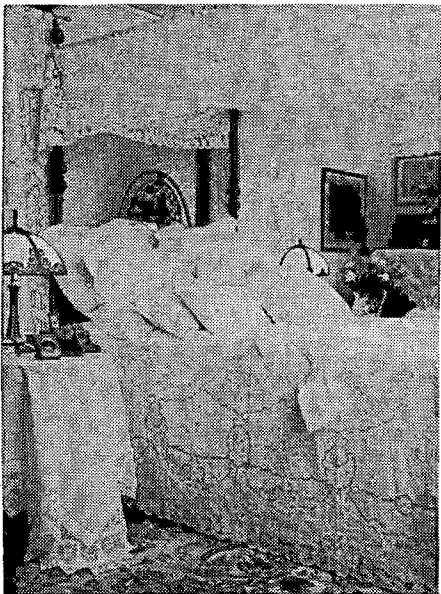

Deep Peels

A virtual revolution has taken place in recent years regarding chemical peels. Chemical peels are used to remove surface irregularities and wrinkles in the facial skin. The standard chemical peel, which has been around for decades, is done with the chemical phenol. This type of peel gives dramatic results but has certain limitations and drawbacks. It should only be done in light complected individuals since it tends to lighten the skin and the healing and recovery time is quite prolonged. For darker complected patients and those who do not need such dramatic changes a lighter peel is more desirable. In the last few years, a number of less dramatic peels have been developed.

Light Peels

Light peels are good for evening out the skin tone especially in patients who have discoloration due to the sun. There are many peeling agents that penetrate just the outer layer of the skin where the abnormal pigment lies. When one of these agents is applied to the skin it causes the epidermis or outermost layer to dry up and flake off. Some of the peeling agents used in-

clude trichloroacetic acid, glycolic acid, liquid nitrogen, resorcinol, salicylic acid, and lactic acid. In our office, the most common agent is trichloroacetic acid or TCA. The concentration can be varied to control the depth of this peel. The application of TCA is simple and there are no toxic side effects. The patient will see the area that has been peeled slowly turn a dark brown color and peel or flake off over a period of five to seven days. Light peels do not penetrate deeply enough to eliminate any lines or wrinkles. To have a peel that can improve the surface texture of the skin, a stronger chemical or combination of agents needs to be used.

Medium Peels

The term medium peel refers to a peel that penetrates the upper level of the dermis where the most superficial lines and wrinkles are formed. When the skin peels off it is replaced by a new thin layer of dermis and epidermis resulting in a smoothing effect on the skin. There are a number

Electrical Anesthesia or "No Shots" has been used in her office for fillings, crowns and other dental procedures. It has been used alone or in combination with other therapies (such as nitrous gas) to be sure the procedure is painless. **Dr. Pelak** explains that electrical patches are

placed on the face near nerve areas. This creates a "busy signal" similar to the telephone. The nerve path is blocked. Therefore, when the body tries to transmit the signal for pain, it is never received. Another benefit with this procedure is that multiple fillings can be done and the sensation of being "numb" is gone when the patches are removed.

Implants, the other great advancement in dentistry, are now 90%-98% successful. Depending on the particular case, they can last 10-25 years. **Dr. Pelak** states that implants act as the roots of teeth. Usually made from titanium, they are either inserted into or on top of the jaw bone. Implants can be performed with regular novocaine in a normal office setting. Hospitalization is not usually necessary. The key to success with implants is seeing a qualified Implantologist, one who is trained in all types of dental implants.

Looking for a dentist? **Dr. Pelak** believes one should look for a dental team that continually updates themselves with the current technologies and research to provide optimum care. She states that the dental team should be proud of their work. She invites us all to see her modern office and talk to her patients.

Good Shepherd Exhibit Highlighted at Nursing Research Colloquium

An exhibit developed by a team of clinical nurse specialists from EHS Good Shepherd Hospital was featured at the Fifth Annual Nursing Research Colloquium held recently in Fort Wayne, Indiana.

The theme of the Indiana University/Purdue University-sponsored colloquium was "Creating a Research Climate".

Bonnie Schleder (of Kildeer), Marla Long (of Lake Zurich) and Teresa Godfrey (of Barrington), clinical nurse specialists from EHS Good Shepherd's intensive care, orthopedics and obstetrics units, presented a "From Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI) to Research" display at the event that focused on a new method of drawing blood from patients.

"The idea was developed by the intensive care unit's Clinical Nursing Practice Council," explained Schleder. "Previously when blood was drawn through an arterial line, we had to discard a measured amount to insure specimen integrity for laboratory analyses. We now maintain the amount of blood that used to be discarded

in an attached syringe and are able to return it to the patient.

"Following a one-year research project, we discovered we still could get accurate lab results by handling the blood draw in this manner. The new method not only saves the patient's blood, but reduces staff exposure to the sample."

A display illustrating the new method of drawing blood was exhibited at the colloquium and examined by university professors, nurses and nursing students involved in research classes.

Schleder said the new blood draw procedure has been initiated at EHS Good Shepherd and the research results have been shared with other critical care divisions of EHS Health Care, the hospital's parent company.

Also involved in the research project were Joan Biddle (of Cary) and Carolyn Hren (of Fox River Grove) from EHS Good Shepherd Hospital's intensive care unit, along with Leslie Buck (Crystal Lake) and Laura Campbell (Arlington Heights), registered medical technologists.

For A Successful Remodeling Project Work With A Well-Established Company

Peterson says, it's important to visit a number of companies to get a sense of who they are, what they have to offer, and how they operate. These exploratory visits are much like interviewing attorneys to draw up your will: you want to determine the firm's capabilities, and the person's credentials who represents that firm, to satisfy your needs.

One of the very best services you should expect is a thorough Needs Analysis. Your answers to a whole host of questions (the more the better) may generate some design solutions you never thought of and which still may be within your budget range. Prune Ice-Damaged Trees and Shrubs Carefully



The recent ice storm throughout north-eastern Illinois left many shrubs and trees damaged and weakened. With some judicious pruning, homeowners can help the affected plants regain their health and appearance.

"When repairing damaged plants, homeowners should proceed cautiously," says John A. Church, University of Illinois Extension Educator in Natural Resource Management. Care should be taken to protect the plant from additional damage, as well as to protect the individual doing the pruning from injury.

There are different approaches to handling the icing problem on different types of plants, Church said. On evergreen shrubs and trees, he advised taking a "wait and see" approach as much as possible and let Mother Nature reduce the problem by

allowing the ice and snow to melt. Do not force the ice and frozen snow off branches which may cause damage. Broken branches that present a danger to people or to the rest of the tree or surrounding plants can be cut off and removed. Homeowners can remove as much of the loose snow as possible, that can be easily brushed off, to help reduce the weight load. Use boards or other props under heavy laden branches to help reduce further breakage, but do not force any of the branches back into more upright position.

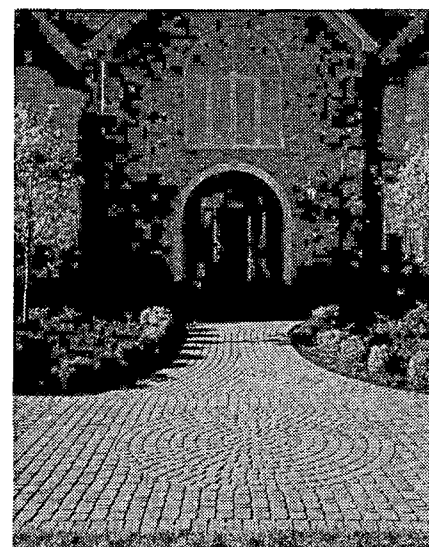
"It will take some patience to deal with evergreens affected by the ice storm by first letting the melting occur and then letting the tree or shrub regain its natural shape as much as possible over the coming months. Some branches may still need to be pruned out and some may remain bent, but future growth can help the tree regain its appearance. Even if the damage is severe, the tree can usually be saved with proper pruning and care. The trees may not be "pretty" again for a few years, he said, but most should recover to a great degree. He recommended all pruning cuts on limbs be made flush against another branch if possible and do not leave small stubs at the ends of branches after pruning. If a branch has completely been broken off the tree, removing the damaged stubs will help keep the tree healthy, he said.

Improperly pruned branches with stubs left intact are more susceptible to disease entering through the decaying end of the branch. Flush cuts will tend to heal more

quickly and more cleanly. He advised against "topping" damaged trees to remove broken branches, which can cause groups of weak branches to develop as growth occurs. Instead, again try to cut the individual branches off flush to the next possible branch.

Damaged trees and shrubs should be fertilized and watered properly this spring and summer, Church said, noting stressed and damaged plants are the most susceptible to disease, insect, and weather related problems.

If large trees have been damaged, home-

owners may need to contact professional tree trimmers, Church said, advising them to obtain several bids and asking each contractor to explain their procedures in advance.

For further pruning information on damaged plants and for general care, fertilizing, and maintenance recommendations, contact the McHenry County Unit office of the University of Illinois Cooperative Extension Service, located in Woodstock, Illinois, phone (815) 338-3737.

of medium peels being used today. Some of these include TCA (at more concentrated levels than in light peeling), liquid nitrogen, and certain combinations of chemicals. One peel being heavily marketed is the "Obagi peel" which was developed by Dr. Obagi. The ingredients of this peel are a secret even to the physicians that have taken Dr. Obagi's courses and purchased the ingredients from him. He has not published his results in a medical journal and this peel cannot be recommended.

We are currently using a medium peel which combines two peeling solutions. First, we apply a thin layer of Jessner's solution. This solution consists of 14% lactic acid, 14% salicylic acid, and 14% resorcinol and has been used since early in this century to remove keratosis and other skin lesions. Next, we apply a layer of 35% TCA. The Jessner's solution disrupts the keratin layer at the surface of the skin and allows the TAC to penetrate more deeply. I prefer to use a maximum concentration of 35% TCA since there are reports of scarring with stronger concentrations.

Results

After a medium peel, the skin typically blisters somewhat and peels off in five to seven days. The new skin that forms is somewhat pink and may remain so for three to six weeks. In most patients, the pink is fairly light and can be easily covered by makeup. Occasionally, there may be slight darkening of the skin that has been peeled that is much like the tan that occurs following a sunburn. If this occurs, it is treated with a fade cream for a few weeks. The medium peel can be repeated in a few weeks if further improvement is sought. The nice thing about a medium peel is that it doesn't lighten the skin the way a deep peel does and so can be used in darker complexioned patients.

WITH OPEN EYES: A MULTIMEDIA EXPLORATION OF ART

Available at the Museum Shop, this electronic publication is featured in an exhibition that offers an adventure in art for visitors of all ages.

Art Institute Showcases Computer-Driven Laserdisc of Museum's Masterpieces

Visitors to The Art Institute of Chicago will be offered an entirely new way of enjoying the museum's masterpieces, one in which works of art become more meaningful at the touch of a computer screen. An interactive exhibition, *With Open Eyes: A Multimedia Exploration of Art*—on view in Gallery 141 now through May 1, 1994—showcases the museum's new electronic publication, *With Open Eyes: Images From The Art Institute of Chicago*. Captured on computer-driven laserdisc are 212 magnificent works from the museum's vast collections, which offer participating visitors a myriad of information and activities relating to each one. Both the exhibition and laserdisc publication, aimed principally at children and families, highlight the Art Institute's masterpieces and make an ideal introduction to the museum.

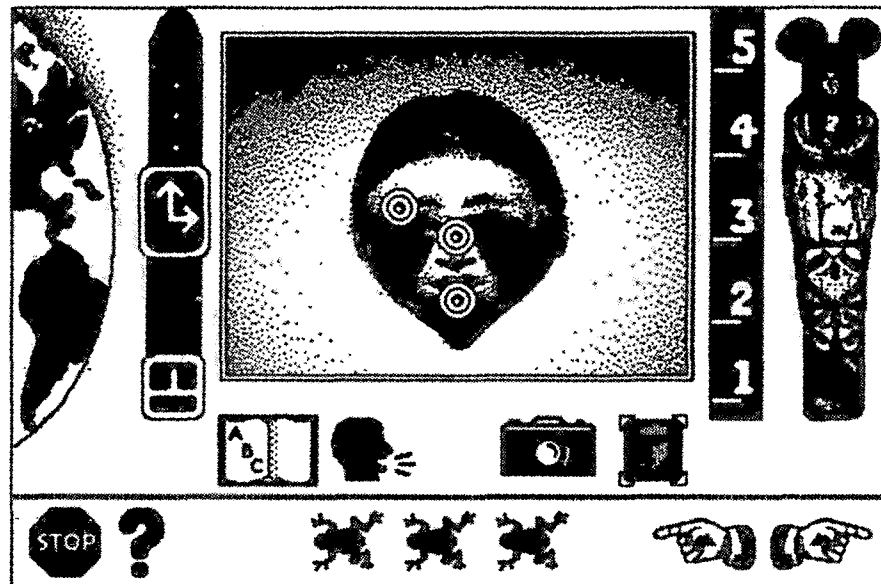
The exhibition represents the culmination of a project organized as a joint venture between The Voyager Company and two departments of The Art Institute of Chicago: Museum Education, and Imaging and Technical Services. The aim of this project was to create an electronic "browser" that would allow young people to explore works of art either individually or with the guidance of adults. The result is the laserdisc itself—which holds 212 full-view images, along with 1,200 details of the works—and an accompanying computer software package, which allows the laserdisc to be

used interactively. Whether the disc is used by itself or with the computer software, it presents an innovative way to explore the collections of the Art Institute.

The laserdisc contains a wide range of works from the museum's holdings, which span more than 5,000 years and represent cultures from around the globe. Works from the museum's ten curatorial departments are included: Africa, Oceania, and the Americas; American Arts, Architecture; Asian Art; European Decorative Arts and Sculpture, and Classical Art; European Painting; Photography; Prints and Drawings; Textiles; and Twentieth-Century Painting and Sculpture.

The exhibition demonstrates the interactive use of the computer software with the laserdisc and also presents a display of all the images recorded on the laserdisc. The viewer may select options from the computer program by means of a simple touch-screen and those choices are reflected in a monitor directly in front of them and on two additional monitors in the gallery. A third monitor reflects the sequential display of images solely from the laserdisc.

Each of the main images on the laserdisc is accompanied by two soundtracks, one of which pronounces caption information, including the title, description, creator, and date of each work of art, while the other provides seven-second "sound-bites" designed to enhance the viewer's appreciation of the work. These "sound-bites" may be words, music, or even a

Viewers also may see details of each artwork, make a picture scrapbook of masterpieces, and play different games such as "connect the dots" for each object.

related sound-effect evoking a playful atmosphere for the image: for example, the sound of feet on wet pavement accompanies Gustave Caillebotte's *Paris Street; Rainy Day* and the strains of *Swan Lake* herald Edgar Degas' dancers.


The computer software program links every work on the laserdisc to a number of activities, triggered by touching different icons on the computer screen. The "globe" and "watch" icons provide the geographical and temporal framework for each object, shown on a map of the world, or a time chart. Touching the "tape measure" icon conjures up a display showing the size of the object in relation to a five-foot tall, eleven-year old child. Each image also relates to one of a number of games, such as an on-screen jigsaw puzzle or a quiz about the use of an artifact. All provide an entertaining way for a young person or adult to learn more about each artwork.

Visitors interested in obtaining a copy

of the laserdisc *With Open Eyes: Images from The Art Institute of Chicago*, may do so at The Museum Shop, where it is available for \$59.95. This includes the 212 images, 1,200 details, and two accompanying sound tracks. The computer software or "stack," designed for Macintosh computers, also may be purchased separately for \$59.95.
