

Happy Mother's Day to all mothers!



# BAHS's 1994 Town and Country Home Tour "Doorways Through The Decades"

"Doorways through the Decades" is certainly an appropriate title for the Barrington Area Historical Society's 1994 Town and Country Home Tour on Thursday, May 26. Each of the four homes that are open for viewing depicts a different decade and its style of architecture in the Barrington area.

The first and oldest home on the tour was built at the turn of the century during the estate period in Barrington Hills. Originally constructed as a dormitory for farm workers on the Hammond Estate, this lovely home has gone through several structural changes resulting in a home so picture perfect that it is being featured in the magazine, "Victorian Sampler."

The second home built twenty years later also reflects the grandeur of the estate period but is a Georgian style home. It dominates a lovely woodland lot overlooking a lake in Barrington Hills.

The third home is in the village and represents the era when large corporations were moving their headquarters into the Barrington area. This home is a charming Dutch Colonial that was one of the earliest homes built in Jewel Park.

The last house on the tour is another Barrington Hills home that was built after the Second World War. Although it initially was a ranch style home commonly built at the time, successive owners have transformed the modest brick ranch into a splendid French Country Style.

Beside the four homes, the BAHS is also providing guests with a rare opportunity to tour the stately Bellarmine Hall in Barrington Hills. This magnificent structure which was once the estate home of the Hammond family is now the Jesuit Retreat House. There have been some major alterations to the original structure but the expansion has been very sensitive to the preservation of the original architectural details of the original home. Tea will be served throughout the day in the dining

This year, the Town and Country Tour has been expanded to include transportation to the homes, a private boutique, an optional luncheon, and a candlelight preview party. Since parking at the homes is limited, mini-buses will carry guests to and from the homes on the tour. One of the stops on the tour will be a private boutique which will feature quality home accessories made by local artisans which participants may purchase. For those wishing to have lunch, two seatings at the Barrington Hills Country Club will be provided but reservations are mandatory. And for those wishing to start early, there will be a preview party on Wednesday evening. May 25, at one of the featured homes where wine and hors d'oeuvres will be served. Later in the evening, guests will be transported to the private boutique where coffee and dessert will be served. The cost of the tour on May 26th is \$20. the optional luncheon is \$20, and the preview party on May 25th is \$35. For registration and ticket sale information contact the BAHS at 381-1730.

Of course, the Town and Country Tour is not the only event the Barrington Area Historical Society has planned in May. On the morning of Saturday, May 7th, the Fox

Saturday. May 20th is a really special day for the Barrington Area Historical Society — its ribbon cutting ceremony for the BAHS Heritage Research Center. The

Center was created by the Historical Society as a repository for documents and collections pertaining to local history. It is located in the Kincaid House on the Society's grounds and is open to the public. In honor of its most prestigious acquisitions, the archives of the Jewel Tea Company, the ceremony will be held at 3:00 p.m. on the steps of the old Jewel Tea building on Lake Zurich Road, just off Route 14.

On Friday, June 3, the Barrington Area Historical Society invites the community to join them on a bus tour of Historic Oak Park/River Forest and the home and studio




The bus will leave Langendorf Park in Barrington at 10 a.m. and leave the Union League Club at 2:30 p.m. The fee, which

# Facial Plastic Surgery, Looking Your Best

Dr. Churchill specializes in plastic and reconstructive surgery of the face and neck. He has an office and private surgical suite in Barrington, and is one of a handful of physicians in the country to complete extensive subspecialty training through a fellowship with the prestigious American Academy of Facial Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery. Dr. Churchill is board certified and on staff at a number of local hospitals and surgery centers. The following is an excerpt from an upcoming newsletter.

#### What Can Be Done **About Prominent Ears?**

Ears can be made less prominent through an operation known as Otoplasty. This consists of creating deeper folds in the cartilage of the ear to reposition it closer to the head. It is accomplished through an incision in the crease behind the ear so no scars are visible. The operation can be done on one ear or both depending on the need. It is done as an outpatient with minimal discomfort. A soft bandage is worn over the ears for one to two days. An elastic headband is also worn around the ears for the first week and at night-only for another week following surgery. Most people are comfortable going back to workor school within a week.

#### At What Age Can This Surgery Be Performed?

This surgery can be performed on children or adults, but the ideal time is about 5 to 6 years of age. By this time, the ear has grown to 90 percent of its adult size and is almost completely formed. This is the time most children are entering school and correcting the ears will prevent teasing and nicknames from their schoolmates.

A big advantage in correcting the ears at an early age is that the cartilage is still very soft and pliable. This allows the cartilage to be molded more easily.



#### What Type of Anesthesia is Used?

For adults, a twilight anesthesia is usually used. With this, the patient is asleep at first, allowing the ears to be injected with anesthetic solution. As the operation progresses, the patient gradually wakes up. There is usually very little memory of the operation but the patient is able to go home rather quickly. For children, a general anesthesia is usually used. With this, the child will be completely asleep during the entire operation and unaware of anything until the surgery is done.

#### What if One Ear Lobe Sticks Out More Than the Other?

The ear has three main areas that are corrected. The upper portion is generally corrected by making a new fold in the ear's contour. The central region is corrected by flattening the ear closer to the bone behind the ear. The ear lobe is corrected by reducing the amount of skin behind it', causing it to flatten. Each of these three areas must be addressed during the surgery and corrected as needed so that a balanced and pleasing result is obtained. If the lobe is protruding alone, it can be made smaller with a simple tuck of skin behind it.

# Whiplash Injuries-The Real Cause and the Right Treatment

Dr. Reffell is a graduate of the National College of Chiropractic. Whiplash is the most commonly occurring neck injury in the U.S. today. Its occurrence is on the rise in metropolitan, areas and, surprisingly, among women (the incidence of whiplash is five times higher in women than men). The term 'whiplash' (or more properly: 'hyperextension/hyperflexion injury) is used to describe the painful and debilitating condition that results when the head is thrown violently backward (hyperextension) and forward (hyperflexion) during a traumatic insult to the neck, often leading to loss of consciousness. While whiplash is usually associated with car accidents, it also occurs in sports injuries, falls, and even from being pushed from behind. The resulting injury affects both the hard tissue (bones) and the soft tissue (muscles, ligaments, tendons, nerves, etc.) of the cervical spine and surrounding region, causing damage that lasts anywhere between six months (in 75% of cases) and more than two years (25% of cases). As you will see, damage to the soft tissue is the main cause of prolonged pain in the Whiplash patient.

#### Symptoms Begin Hours or Even Years After Initial Injury

The most frequent symptoms of whiplash include: stiffness/achiness; headaches; shoulder/neck/arm pain; nausea; chest pain and more. Many times the injury is not felt immediately by the injured person. Authorities estimate injuries may not be felt for several hours or even years following the initial trauma, which makes early treatment extremely important in preventing future problems. Dr. Reffell explains, "I've had patients come to my office who woke up one day with headaches and neck pain for which there seemed to be no apparent cause, only to discover that a year or two earlier, the patient was in a motor vehicle accident but was never treated for their soft tissue injury.'

#### Soft Tissue Injuries— The Real Culprit

"While a patient may have healed from their bone fracture, it is the injury to the soft tissues that takes time to heal." Dr. Reffell continues, "The soft tissues of the cervical spine contain many structures capable of causing pain. Until these areas are treated with the appropriate therapy, these structures will continue causing pain and may lead to early degenerative changes and further discomfort." Each whiplash case is unique. Therefore, the most impor-

Bumping Up Slightly

More people are being involuntarily bumped by airlines: 51,000 fliers in 1993, or 113 bumps per million passengers. Considering how many people-fly each day, that's not a lot, but it compares to 103 per million in 1992. If you are bumped, you're entitled to compensation that varies depending on how late you'll arrive at your original destination: from nothing if you arrive within an hour of the scheduled time, to \$400 if you're over two hours late. (There's no compensation though, under certain circumstances, such as when mechanical troubles require switching to a smaller plane.) If you want to be bumped, let the gate agent know when you check in for the flight. If they need extra seats, you'll be the first person they will approach, and you'll get payment in the form of a credit for a future flight.

Rail/Fly Plan Popular

Amtrak's train/plane liaison with United Airlines is proving popular with travelers. The program lets you fly one way and take the train back, or vice versa, at prices typically cheaper than flying both ways. The Air-Rail Travel Plan has experienced double-digit growth in each of the last two years. Meanwhile, Amtrak has extended its 55 percent off sale until June 16. The discount applies to one-way coach tickets costing \$75 or more, but not on Metroliner, AutoTrain, or Boston-Washington corridor trains.

Lost Luggage Land

The next time you're in Scottsboro, Alabama, be sure to visit the Land of the Lost Luggage. Known officially as the Unclaimed Baggage Center, this is where lost bags from around the country finally end up when no one claims them. The suitcases and contents are then sold at bargain-basement prices to the public. Although the airlines move about two million pieces of baggage per day, only 10,000 to 20,000 of those get mislaid temporarily, and fewer than 200 end up in Scottsboro. Still, that's 10,000 bags a year. So if

you've lost luggage, this is the place to look for it. Of course, you'll have to pay to get it back-but the price will be right.

Palm Springs Beyond the Links

When people think of Palm Springs, California, they think great weather, golf and retirement. In fact, there's a lot to do besides chasing the little white ball in a cart. Just a short drive from the city, there's the Joshua Tree National Monument with its eerie rock formations, mountains, and the distinctive, twisted Joshua Trees (actually they are a type of Yucca, named by the Mormons who thought they resembled the profit Joshua stretching his arms heavenward). A startingly naturalistic mummy portrait from the Fayum region exemplifies the aesthetic change Roman rule effected in Egypt. 



# Protection From Tornados, Windstorms, Floods

Northern Illinois is entering the season when it is subject to the ravages resulting from tornados, windstorms and floods. Homeowners can not prevent such events but they can minimize the damage.

The Professional Remodelers Association (PRA) suggests the following procedures. First, get a camera and go through the home, room by room, taking pictures. Stand against one wall and take a picture of the opposite wall. Do it again, taking a picture of each wall in each room, until the home has been completely photographed.

"Next," said Alan Foss, President of PRA, "collect all-personal items such as antique furniture, books, dishes, silver, TV's, VCR's and any other object of value and take photos of all of them.

Go to a utility store, added Foss, "and


buy an inventory record book. Use it to list all the items photographed." Where possible, include in the book the purchase receipts. Indicated the value of each item and the date of the record. If the homeowner has a fireproof safe - these records should be kept there. If not, PRA recommends the homeowner rent a safe deposit box and keep all the records there.

If the unexpected, such as a tornado or fire should occur, the homeowner has a full, complete record of family belongings, so that the full insurance claim will be supported by good, solid evidence. "Finally, concluded Foss, "if the homeowner should require a contractor, they may phone PRA and ask for its member book to be sent to them." The PRA phone number is (708) 627-7577.

Last month in this publication, I discussed an overview of the difference between mortgage lenders, brokers, banks, and savings banks. Due to the dominance of the secondary market, mortgages have increasingly become generic products, and each year underwriting standards and documentation requirements become more uniform. The benefit to the consumer is more competition between mortgage providers, more selection of products, and lower pricing. The cost has been seemingly inflexible standards that lenders are required to impose in order to deliver the loan to the secondary market and passthrough the lower pricing. The proof of the cost benefit is to look at pricing levels of 'yield' or 'B and C' lenders, who typically charge 1% to 3% higher rate in addition to more points.

Now about the subject, advertised mortgage rates. First, the pricing of MBS securities varies minute-by-minute, and generally reflects the trend of the U.S. Treasury securities. As a rule, then, you would expect that advertised rates are either higher or lower than the market when you call. Also, most pricing surveys neglect to mention lender costs such as underwriting, processing, tax service, etc., when advertising rates. Don't fall for the lowest rate without finding out the costs, and on the other hand don't focus on costs without comparing rates. I had one customer tell me that he would go with another lender who was \$100.00 less in closing costs, even though the rate was .125% higher! On a \$150,000 loan, this amounts to spending over \$900.00 to save \$100.00. That doesn't make sense in my book.




# Works By Three Chicago Self-Taught Artists Scheduled At Terra Museum Through July 31

In the beginning there were only 40 members but by the year of 1975 the membership grew to 114. As of this writing the membership stands at 120.


