


FRANK LLOYD WRIGHT'S ARIZONA MASTERPIECE:

When architecture critics attempt to name Frank Lloyd Wright's "best" works, Taliesin West is consistently singled out as one of his greatest triumphs. In a 1991 survey by Architectural Record magazine—which named the best buildings in the world from the previous 100 years—12 buildings der signed by Wright were cited. Taliesin West was ranked as one of Wright's best residential designs, along with the Robie House in Chicago, IL, and Fall-


ingwater in Mill Run, PA. In 1959, Taliesin West was selected by the American Institute of Architects (AIA) as one of 17 buildings nationwide that exemplify Wright's contribution to American architecture.

From the beginning, this remarkable set of buildings astounded architectural critics with its beauty and unusual form. Frank Lloyd Wright literally created Taliesin West "out of the desert." He and his apprentices gathered rocks from the desert floor and sand from the washes to build a winter home, studio and architectural campus.

Situated on 600 acres of rugged Sonoran desert at the foothills of the McDowell Mountains in Scottsdale, AZ, Taliesin West is now a National Historic Landmark. A broad range of daily public tours, ranging from one to three hours, are offered. Visitors to Taliesin West will not see a museum but rather a remarkably vital and active community of students and architects working together to maintain Wright's vision. Today 70 people live, work and study at Taliesin West.


Taliesin (pronounced TALLY-EHSSEN) literally means "shining brow" in Welsh, the nationality of Wright's ancestors. Taliesin in Wisconsin sits on the "brow" of a hill overlooking the valley below while Taliesin West is located on a broad mesa. In 1987, at Taliesin West's 50th anniversary, the U.S. House of Representatives recognized the complex as "the highest achievement in American artistic and architectural expression."

Wright was drawn to Arizona as early as 1927 when he was asked to collaborate on designs for the Arizona Biltmore. In 1937, Wright bought several hundred acres of raw, rugged desert at the foothills of the McDowell Mountains and, with his architectural apprentices, began construction of Taliesin West.

At age 70, when most men would have given strong consideration to retirement, Wright went on to stage one of the most remarkable professional comebacks of the century. In his seven decade career, he designed more than 1,100 works; nearly one-third of his entire output of work oc-

curred during the last decade of his life, much of which was spent in

Taliesin West is notable because of its there during creation," Wright said. dramatic response to the desert setting. In describing his design for Taliesin West, Wright wrote, "I was struck by the beauty of the desert, by the dry, clear sundrenched air, by the stark geometry of the mountains, the entire region was an inspiration... and out of that experience, a revelation is what I guess you might call it, came the design for these buildings."

A visit to the site reveals dramatic forms, rough rocky surfaces and innovative uses of materials such as textiles and plastics. Taliesin West was literally built of the desert. Wright scooped up rocks from the desert floor and sand from the washes to build a great desert sculpture. "We devised a light canvas-covered redwood framework resting upon massive stone masonry that belonged to the mountain slopes all around," Wright said about Taliesin West. Hundreds of cords of stone, carloads of cement, carloads of redwood and acres of stout white canvas went into the construction of the complex.

"Our new desert camp belonged to the Arizona desert as though it had stood

Taliesin West is entered by crossing a graveled courtyard with views of a vinecovered pergola and colorful sculptures. Shallow steps lead to the sunset terrace with a 240 degree panoramic vista of distant mountains and the surrounding desert landscape.

Turning from this view, the dominant theme of Taliesin West comes to view with stone and concrete walls, white translucent roofs and connecting horizontal parapets, all as a backdrop to lawn, pool and gardens in the foreground.


Taliesin West includes the Cabaret Theater, a pavilion theater for performing arts, a drafting studio, Wright's former architectural office, dining room and kitchen, the little Kiva conference room, pools, terraces, gardens, a workshop and residences for the apprentices and staff of the school of architecture. The Garden Room, or living room, with its dramatic canted roof, is the central showpiece of Taliesin West.

Experimental desert residences, built by apprentices, dot the 600-acre desert land-

scape surrounding the complex.

Taliesin West is the national headquarters for The Frank Lloyd Wright Foundation, which owns and operates Taliesin West, Taliesin in Spring Green, WI, The Frank Lloyd Wright School of Architecture (which uses both Taliesins as its campus) and The Frank Lloyd Wright Archives (at Taliesin West.) A broad range of guided tours of the site are available.



the Barrington Community Associates of the Art Institute of Chicago will be to the University of Chicago's Smart Museum of Art and The Oriental Institute Museum.

The recently renovated Smart Museum. formally known as the David and Alfred Smart Museum of Art, was named in memory of the Smart brothers who founded Esquire Magazine. They were serious art collectors who were also concerned about art education. A current exhibit explores the artistic legacy of Native American artist Silver Horn and his successors. The exhibit features hide paintings, rare ledger book drawings and works that have never before been displayed.

Slated for May 18, the spring excursion of Grimshaw Egyptian Gallery at The Oriental Institute Museum displays approximately 800 objects dating from the Predynastic Period (ca. 5,000 BC) to the Arab conquest (7th Century AD). Many fragile objects of cloth, wood, rush and papyrus are exhibited for the first time. A colossal statue of King Tutankhamen stands at the entrance to the new gallery.

The bus will leave Langendorf Park at 8:30 AM. Alyce Anthony is maintaining a waiting list for reservations. For information, please call 847-526-2051.





Good News for IRAs

Can it be that the beginning of the millennium is already five months behind us? Spring is in full bloom and summer is on its heels.

This month, I will discuss a new favorable ruling from the IRS concerning IRAs. IRA planning should be an integral part of one's total estate plan, along with today's necessary documents: Will, Revocable Trust, Living Will and Durable Power of Attorney. Before I discuss the new ruling, I will review an earlier ruling on a similar subject.

In 1999, the IRS approved the request of an IRA beneficiary—let's call him George —to name a contingent beneficiary for a seven-figure IRA he had inherited from his mother. Because George's mother had failed to name a secondary beneficiary for her IRA, George was concerned that, at his death, any balance in the IRA would be distributed in full in the year after he died. For large IRAs, that could mean a huge tax liability would be due all at one time. However, if George were allowed to name a contingent beneficiary, then in the event of his premature death, the IRA could be paid over his remaining life expectancy as if he had not died.

In the new IRS ruling, the question was how to interpret the phrase "at least as rapidly" in a tax rule involving IRA distributions. The rule says that if IRA owners are taking minimum distributions at the time of their death and they leave their IRAs to someone other than their spouse, distributions to the beneficiaries must continue being made "at least as rapidly" as during the IRA owner's lifetime.

The IRA owner-we'll call her Bethin this ruling had converted her deceased husband's traditional IRA into her own traditional IRA. At the same time, she named her three sons as beneficiaries of the IRA upon her death. Beth began receiving minimum distributions from the IRA based on her single life expectancy, recalculated yearly. As a result, when she died a few years later, it looked like her sons might have a major income tax mess on their hands. Based on a literal interpretation of the phrase "at least as rapidly," it appeared the entire balance of Beth's IRA would have to be distributed to her May and see you in June.

sons no later than December 31 in the year after her death since her life expectancy in that year had dropped to zero.

However, believe it or not, the IRS ruled otherwise. The IRS noted that Beth could have taken minimum distributions based on her and her oldest son's joint life expectancy. Instead, she chose to receive distributions over her single life expectancy. Thus, what she really did was take larger distributions than the tax rules required. As a result, the IRS concluded that "at least as rapidly" rule would not be violated if distributions after Beth's death are calculated using the life expectancy of her oldest son since she could have used his and her life expectancy to determine required distributions during her lifetime.

Beth could have saved her sons the trouble of having to apply for an IRS ruling simply by electing to calculate her minimum distributions using her and her oldest son's joint life expectancy. Then, she could have taken additional IRA distributions (in any amount) as the need arose. That way, at her death, there would be no question about the distributions continuing automatically using her oldest son's life expectancy.

As you can see, it is important to plan for the future. We all have the opportunity to make decisions and choices now that will enable our loved ones to continue after we are gone with ease and less hassle from the IRS. Take the time now to create your estate plan or, if you have one in place, to review your documents and the assets that you presently own.

An Interview with Dr. Philip Bushnick, Board-Certified Plastic Surgeon

"Boy, she looks great for her age! Is she just slow to show her age or did she have cosmetic surgery?"

"Used to be that only her plastic surgeon knew the answers to these questions, but not anymore," says Dr. Philip Bushnick as he comments on the dramatic increase in the number of people seeking cosmetic surgery solutions.

"In my 18 years as a plastic surgeon, it's not the patients who have changed—it's the public."

"Today, personal cosmetic surgery success stories have become part of casual conversation. Patients no longer hide the fact that they've had surgical enhancements."



"Usual and Customary" Fees— An Insurance Company Deception

Insurance companies use the term "usual and customary" to compare your dentist's own fees with what the insurance company has already decided to allow as coverage. Of course, their focus is their bottom line, not the patient's oral health. Allowed fees are derived from their own databases which include significant numbers of HMO's and other forms of managed or discounted care. They do not publish their sources.

Managed care in dentistry usually equals inferior care, since there are only a few ways to offer lower fees while making the same profit. One is to use less expensive, less experienced employees. A second is to use less durable or less aesthetic materials. A third is to see large numbers of patients. If fees are lowered about 30%, the average dental office would have to see 42% more patients, necessitating increasing their office hours by nearly the same percentage.

Another way to decrease overhead is to reduce the time spent with each patient. But adequate treatment time and preventative education time are probably the most important aspects of quality dental care. When your insurance company writes you that your dentist's fees are higher than "usual and customary," don't





be misled.

If your dentist is conscientious about providing quality dentistry, his fees must be higher than "usual and customary." Your dentistry will look better and last longer. It will be well worth the extra investment.

I ran this article once before and one of my colleagues anonymously complained to the dental society. I guess the truth can hurt.

Today, the American Dental Society recommends that, by the age of seven, your child should have an orthodontic exam to screen for developing problems.

At your child's initial exam, the orthodontist will look for crowding of teeth, overbite (vertical overlap of the upper teeth covering the lower teeth), overjet (the horizontal distance between the upper and lower jaws), missing or extra teeth and any other developmental abnormalities.

By treating a child's malocclusion (bad bite) or crowding at an early age, the orthodontist is often able to eliminate the need for future permanent tooth removal or surgical intervention. An additional benefit of interceptive orthodontics is that

room for erupting teeth and treating the malocclusion. the remaining permanent teeth will have a more proper foundation to come into. This re-





How is a Treatment Done?

The Botox is mixed from its freeze dried state and diluted to the strength desired. Usually, two injections are done on each side of the eyebrows to reduce frowning or on the sides of the eyes to reduce the crows feet. The effects are not seen immediately, but take place over two to three days. Over that time, the muscles will gradually become weaker until there is almost no ability to frown. If the crows feet area is injected, the crinkling of the skin in that area will be reduced as well. If further weakening is desired, a second injection can be done after one week. But this is rarely necessary

Land acquisition, successful habitat restoration efforts and expanded educational programs were highlighted at the recent CFC Annual Meeting held at the Barrington Area Library. CFC President Sharon Pasch reviewed the continuing negotiations with Lakewood Homes for the purchase of land to expand Flint Creek Savanna. The site contains creek course and oak savanna and presents opportunities for prairie restoration and the design

of a "cutting edge" filter marsh.

Keynote speaker Stephen Packard, Director of the National Audubon Society Chicago Region, reminded CFC members that subtle changes can make big differences in the world. Packard said we can build a culture that reflects conservation in all aspects of our lives, from the houses we build to the design of transportation systems. "When people look at the history of the earth, they will see that this was a

time when our sustainable modern culture first learned to live in harmony with the earth," he said.

Rob Neff, a longtime CFC volunteer, was elected to the Board of Directors. Directors Bob LeFevre, Patsy Mortimer and John Schweizer were elected to serve new terms. Following the meeting, the Board of Directors reelected the current slate of officers: Sharon Pasch, President; John Wagner, Vice-President; Dave Kullander, Treasurer; and Melissa Washow, Secretary.

The William H. Miller Conservation Award, recognizing outstanding contributions to conservation in the Barrington area, was presented to Charles (Chuck) Westcott, former director of Crabtree Nature Center, and jointly to The Barrington Park District and the Village of Barrington for a restoration project at Langendorf Park. Westcott was recognized as a pioneer in prairie restoration and for his years of service introducing school children and families to the gentle beauty of the Midwest's heritage landscape. John Heinz, Director of Public Works for the Village of Barrington, showed slides of the transformation of Langendorf Pond into an inviting open space with nature trails winding along the shores of a healthy lake and an adjacent wetland, where frogs and fish are already at home.

The Great Blue Heron Award for outstanding conservation effort within CFC activities was presented to Joe Tragresser for his stewardship of the Ela Road Prairie and to Dave Kullander, longtime Trea-

surer of CFC.

Joyce Allen, Demmy Giannis, Helen Hawthorne, Greg LeFevre, Jerry Masino, Gail Vanderpoel and Ruth Vanderpoel received Mighty Oak Awards for 50 hours or more of volunteer service in the last year. Shooting Star awards for 10 years of service went to Laura Arndt, Helen Hawthorne, Tom Mohorek and Mark Vanderpoel. Edith Auchter was recognized for her ongoing coordination of CFC's Junior Naturalist Program.

Director Karen Hunter reminded members that CFC is still \$22,000 short of the Millennium Challenge goal for funds to expand Flint Creek Savanna. District 220 school children contributed over \$3,000 through Pennies for the Prairie. Each elementary school was recognized for its participation in this project.

Tony Hafner, environmental studies teacher at Barrington High School, spoke enthusiastically about Preservation Partners, a program cosponsored by The Lake Country Forest Preserve, Chicago Wilderness and CFC, through a donation from the late Barrington educator Marge Luther. In a major restoration effort, 80 high school students cleared buckthorn at Flint Creek Savanna. Twenty students are enrolled in the new Ecology Club at Barrington Middle School Station campus, led by science teacher Kara Kitsch.

Tom Vanderpoel, restoration cochairman, concluded the evening with a slide presentation reviewing the accomplishments of CFC throughout the year.






Your Personal Landscape III— Screen Planting for the Front Garden

In the previous article, we discussed the importance of planting the Front Garden to compliment and enhance the architecture and lead your eye to the front door. One of the most overlooked aspects of any garden is privacy. In the case of the Front Garden, as you approach the entrance walk and door, your eyes, should not be drawn to pe rimeter activities. As much as we might enjoy our neighbors, we still don't care to see their parked cars, dog run,

recreational vehicles, poor landscaping or the inside of their garage.

Screen planting enhances the experience of enjoying your garden by isolating objectionable noises, views and odors, while at the same time enhancing the sights, sounds and fragrances common to individual gardens. Screen planting will also extend your living space by creating outdoor "rooms" for your family and guests to enjoy.

Most screen planting takes place along the property lines. It may be important to screen both sides of the property and the front if you have a great deal of traffic.



One of the great advantages of this is the enhanced view out of your windows into your own garden. An attractive composition of plants will also provide visual interest all year and attract wildlife

Planting evergreens, deciduous shrubs, intermediate trees of a low branched nature or multiple stem should comprise the planting composition. Consideration should be given to the relationship of the plants to one other. Monotony is not desirable nor is a busy arrangement with every type of color and texture.
