Dreading The School Days

and tear-streaked face, begging for mercy. Or, clutching his stomach in feigned agony, your son cries, "I feel sick-I can't go to school today!"

The first day of the school year should be an exciting time of new clothes, new teachers and new friends to look forward to. Why is it that some children dread starting school in the fall?

According to Dr. Raymond Huntington, founder and president of the Huntington Learning Center, there are many reasons why children may be reluctant, or even frightened, about returning to the classroom. A new environment can be a tremendous adjustment for a youngster, whether they are moving from one school to another or simply going into a new classroom with unfamiliar students and a different teacher. However, children may also have a particular attitude towards school which creates their intense fear:

1. Lack of self confidence—"I can't do it!" If a child does not believe in himself, he may not think he is capable of succeeding in school. To build your child's confidence, set reasonable expectations and attainable goals, and praise your child's achievements. When a child finds that they afraid to move on to bigger and better chal-

2. Fear of failure or fear of criticism from others-"You can't do it - you're stupid!" When they do not ask for help, this fear of failure often causes students to fall further and further behind in school.

3. Lack of motivation—"I won't do it!" When a child is unmotivated, he would rather avoid a difficult task than face it head-on. Sometimes, children become bored or disinterested when "textbook knowledge" seems meaningless. The key to motivating a child to learn is to make learning interesting. Find examples in ev-

"No! I don't wanna go!" your daughter eryday life and children will learn without sobs, looking up at you with her wide eyes even trying! Reading food boxes and cans, counting cars on the highway, and writing letters to friends are things that we do every day, but activities such as these can spark a child's interest in learning. Other times, a child may just give up without trying if they think they cannot do the work. Again, show the child all of the little things he can accomplish and he will be more likely to take on larger tasks.

4. Negative attitude about learning-Children who have a negative attitude about learning may see school as a chore, like a criminal who has been sentenced to 13 years of hard labor! As a parent, you can change this bad attitude by making learning enjoyable. Set an example by taking an interest in learning yourself. Reading with your child and helping them with their homework are only two things you can do. Your child will be enthusiastic about going to school when they see that learning can be fun!

5. Lack of basic skills-"I don't know how to do it!" You child will certainly be frustrated if they cannot keep up with their classmates or school assignments due to a lack of basic skills. If your child was having problems at the end of the school year, they may have even more difficulty with the can complete small tasks, they will not be introduction of new material. The Birth Center's creation includes the footprints of newborns with the notation that more than 22,000 babies have been


The Volunteer Services quilt block features miniature versions of volunteer uniforms while Administration sports the steering influence of a ship's helm.


The quilt squares have been sewn, drawn, painted and glued, and are decorated with everything from glitter and silk flowers to buttons and bows.

My dad had the dream first to have his own store, then to own a building for a store. We took a then run-down 135 year old building and completely re-built it. And it was the first re-development in downtown Arlington Heights, which was the start of great things to come for down-

town Arlington Heights. Now, with its brick walkways, new lighting, repaved roads and new parking garages, it's become a really great place to shop.

"Henry B. Betts Award Honors Inventor And Designer; Hotchkiss A Global Pioneer

Ralf Hotchkiss, a pioneer in the field of rehabilitation engineering, has won the \$50,000 Henry B. Betts Award for 1994. A national jury of fifteen distinguished leaders in business, government and philanthropy named Hotchkiss as the 1994 Betts Laureate for his visionary invention and design of wheeled mobility devices during the past thirty years. Hotchkiss was also recognized for his humanitarian work in establishing a worldwide network of wheelchair builders in 20 developing countries. He co-founded the Rehabilitation Engineering Program at San Francisco State University and currently serves as Senior Research Scientist and Technical Director of the Wheeled Mobility Center there. The Betts Award is named for Dr. Henry B. Betts, medical director and CEO of the Rehabilitation Institute of Chicago and Magnuson professor and chairman of the department of physical medicine and rehabilitation, Northwestern University School of Medi-

John D. Kemp, chairman of the 1994 Betts Award jury, announced Hotchkiss as the Betts Laureate, "The jury has chosen a remarkable thinker and doer who exemplifies the kind of dedication that inspired Dr. Betts' life work. Ralf Hotchkiss generates creativity and accomplishment in a global arena in an age of cynicism. The jury salutes his worldwide activity and points out that his impact is felt everywhere, in rich and poor countries, on the lives of millions of users of wheel chairs and other mobility devices.'

Hotchkiss' interest in the design of wheeled mobility devices developed in the late 1950's. To date he has invented eight mobility devices for people with physical disabilities. Instead of securing a patent on his inventions, Hotchkiss chooses to leave the designs in the public domain so people with disabilities can have access to necessary equipment at affordable prices. Hotchkiss is an expert witness and continues to provide testimony for congressional hearings on product safety, disability rights and adaptive device design priorities.

More Than a Decade of Global Ingenuity

The combination of disability rights advocacy and technical knowledge formed the in the current wheelchair designs. As a re-

catalyst for Hotchkiss' international program. In years following his original wheelchair workshop in Nicaragua in I 980, Hotchkiss traveled to 20 countries. He spearheaded an international network to provide wheelchair riders and builders with the technical skills and training needed to support mobility and independence among the poorest of the poor. During his travels to countries with all types of terrain, Hotchkiss discovered that most wheelchair designs did not meet the needs of the people who depended on them. In response, Hotchkiss researched and wrote Independence Through Mobility a manual for the design and manufacture of state-of the-art lightweight wheelchairs.


Hotchkiss became interested in mobility devices early in life, and a motorcycle injury during college years became the prime motivation for his subsequent work. Living with T-2 paraplegia as a result of the injury, Hotchkiss found himself "chopping up" the wheelchair given to him and redesigning it for use in "pre-ADA" buildings, doorways, transportation, and public restrooms. Hotchkiss went on to have a marked effect on the wheelchair industry. working to raise awareness of deficiencies


