





First Exposure: The Sketchbooks And Photographs Of Theodore Robinson

Impressionist painter Theodore Robinson site en plein air, Robinson often used (1852-1896), who was strongly influenced by his close friend, noted French artist Claude Monet, captured chance occurrences in everyday life, many of which will be featured in First Exposure: The Sketchbooks And Photographs Of Theodore Robinson at Terra Museum of American Art, 664 N. Michigan Avenue in Chicago. The exhibition, which overlaps with the ongoing Indivisible: Stories of American Community, will be on view through Sunday, December 31, 2000.

This major exhibition features three sketchbooks and 25 black-and-white photographs by the artist which conjure up a sketch of Robinson's social environs. Although he tended to paint landscapes on

these photographic and sketched studies as a resource. First Exposure brings to the foreground works which have typically been considered background.

Organized by Terra's sister museum, the Musée d'Art Américain in Giverny, France, the exhibition demonstrates the internal struggle Robinson faced to meet his own high artistic standards. Though shy, he achieved a degree of celebrity as he moved through several transitions in style, from academic to impressionism to the streamlined aesthetic of his artistic maturity.


The following are criteria to assist you in making informed decisions when choosing the best surgeon for your specific needs:

If the holiday season is starting to cause you stress and anxiety—you are not alone! 





## **Oral Habits—How Do They Affect Our Teeth?**

There are many oral habits that both children and adults may have that can either affect how their teeth develop or how they fit together. One of the most common oral habits in children is thumb or finger sucking; this habit can be very destructive. If a thumb or finger sucking habit is present past the age of five, it can constrict the width of the palate and move the front teeth out of position. The palate may even take the shape of the finger that is in the mouth, thus making it too narrow to be able to accommodate all the permanent teeth without crowding. If a child cannot break this habit on their own, an orthodontist can place an appliance that will block their ability to get their finger in the palate.

Another oral habit that may be present in children as well as adults is tongue thrusting. This is a habit in which the tongue thrusts forward and pushes against the front teeth instead of resting on the palate behind the front teeth when a person swallows. # **Employment Agreements—Establishing the Employment Relationship**

Typically, a written employment agreement specifies the terms and conditions of employment, such as responsibilities, pay and duration, and is signed by the employee and employer. The agreement should also set forth under what circumstances an individual may be terminated by the company. As you may recall from a previous article, employment in Illinois is regarded as "at will." This means an employee may be terminated for a good reason, bad reason or no reason at all. An exception to the "at will" doctrine is an enforceable contractual relationship with the employer.

The best means of protection from "at will" termination is entering in a written agreement which specifies under what conditions the employment relationship may be terminated. For instance, the agreement may specify that the employer may only terminate the employment relationship upon mutual agreement, advance notice or for specified reasons of "cause." The term "cause" will be defined in the agreement and may include failure to satisfactorily perform the job duties or for theft or dishonesty.

The agreement may also call for the parties to give a specific period of notice prior to the termination. Many of the individuals with whom I consult mistakenly believe that the law provides for two weeks notice of termination or for resignation. Rather, due to the general presumption of "at will" employment, an individual may be terminated without notice and an employee may resign without notice. However, for reasons of professional courtesy, the parties often do and should provide advance notice of their intention to terminate the employment relationship.

Employers will usually offer a written employment agreement when they want to protect their clientele after the employment relationship ends. In that situation, the employer may offer to terminate the employee only for cause, with prior notification or severance pay in exchange for a restrictive covenant or non-compete agreement which extends after the end of the employment relationship. vision is proposed, review the language carefully as such provisions are enforceable when properly drafted.

Both employers and employees should avoid relying on verbal promises since they are difficult to enforce, if at all. This is especially true where the written agreement between the parties contains a provision known as a "merger" or "integration" clause. A merger or integration clause is a contractual provision which states that the contract contains all the agreements between the parties. Therefore, if the verbal promise is not contained in the written agreement, it is contractually presumed to not to have been made.

Another source of potential contractual rights is a company policy and/or handbook. Even though an employee does not have a written agreement, a policy or handbook may provide the basis of a contractual employment claim. For instance, a written policy which states there will be no termination without just cause or progressive discipline may be enforceable as a contract.

In any employment relationship, the best time to determine the legal effect of an agreement is before the contract is signed. As such, it is highly advisable to consult with an attorney to review the proposed employment agreement to determine the legal ramifications should you need to take legal action to enforce it in the future.

After hurricane Mitch, the quality of water in that area of Honduras worsened. Families boil water to make it potable. The process, however, is done under very unsafe conditions and children mostly fall victims to severe burns, the healing of which causes serious damage to their faces, limbs and body in general.

After last year's dental mission to Peru, the club decided to bring this year's project to Honduras and meet the families and children that are yet to come to Chicago for medical treatment. The goal is to raise the level of confidence in these children and their families by personal contact. They do not speak English, hardly ever left their town; and now they face the need of leaving their familiar surroundings to fly to a foreign country to be treated by medical strangers.






# REMODELING 2000...

# Report Looks at Dog Breeds Involved in Fatal Human Attacks—Breed-Specific Legislation Not the Answer

Data contained within a report published might cause people who want a dangerin the September 15th issue of The Journal of the American Veterinary Medical Association (JAVMA) indicates that although fatal human attacks appear to be a breed-related problem-pit-bull type dogs and Rottweilers-other breeds may bite and cause fatalities at higher rates. The report concludes that breed-specific legislation is not the solution to dog bite prevention.

The study was coauthored by investigators at the AVMA, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Humane Society of the United States, which maintains a registry of dog-bite related human fatalities. Data for dog bite related human fatalities that occurred between 1979 and 1996 was combined with data on newly identified fatalities for 1997 and 1998. During the past 20 years, at least 25 breeds of dog have been involved in 238 human fatalities. Pit bull-type dogs and Rottweilers were involved in more than half of these deaths. Twenty four percent of deaths involved dogs that were not restrained and were not on their owners' property; 58% of deaths involved dogsthat were not restrained but were on their owners' property; 17% involved restrained dogs on their owners' property; and less than 1% involved a restrained dog off its owners' property.

"To decrease the risk of dog bites, several communities have enacted breedspecific restriction or bans," said Dr. Gail Golab, coauthor of the study and Assistant Director of the AVMA Education and Research Division. "However, the breeds responsible for human fatalities have varied over time. Since 1975, dogs belonging to more than 30 breeds have been responsible for fatal attacks on people including Dachshunds, Golden Retrievers, a Yorkshire Terrier and a Labrador Retriever," Dr. Golab explained.

ous dog to turn to another breed for the same qualities they sought in the original dog such as large size and aggression easily fostered.

"A dog of any breed can become dangerous when bred or trained to be aggressive," Dr. Golab added.

Pediatrician and Medical Epidemiologist Dr. Julie Gilchrist from the CDC agrees. "Any dog can kill. Dog bite reduction strategies are more likely to be effective if they focus on reducing inappropriate dog and dog owner behaviors regardless of the dog's breed, instead of banning specific breeds," Dr. Gilchrist explained.

Dr. Randall Lockwood, Vice President, Research and Educational Outreach for the HSUS, points out that, "Because of difficulties inherent in determining breed with certainty, enforcement of breed-specific ordinances raises constitutional and practical issues."

"Fatal attacks represent only a very small proportion of dog bite injuries and shouldn't be the primary factor driving public policy regarding dangerous dogs, said Dr. Golab. Dr. Golab suggests that alternatives to breed-specific legislation should include: enforcement of generic, non-breed specific dangerous dog laws with an emphasis on chronically irresponsible owners; enforcement of animal control ordinances such as leash laws and fencing requirements; prohibition of dog fighting; encouraging neutering; and school-based and adult education programs that teach pet selection strategies, pet care and responsibility and bite prerention.





Leaves can make good mulch beneath trees, shrubs and other landscape plantings. Chopping the leaves can help reduce "matting" of larger, wet leaves. If mower bag, the leaf and grass clipping



Leaves or compost can be added to the garden as a soil conditioner, but again chopping of the leaves is helpful. The organic matter may help improve the drainage and filth of clay soils. Several years of adding organic matter will often be needed to make a noticeable improvement. Leaves or compost should be considered as organic matter, rather than as a large boost to the garden's fertility.

Most typical home applications of leaves to gardens or flower beds should not adversely affect the soil pH or nutrient content. Excessive applications in very small areas may have some impact.

If there is a concern about soil pH or other fertility, have the soil tested before and after applying large amounts of leaves. But time needs to be allowed for the material to break down. Fall is a good time to take soil samples for testing. Once every four to five years is often enough for most homeowners to test the soil, unless excessive amounts of material have been applied.


