#### **Art Associates to Attend Lecture** by Robert Guinan

On Tuesday, November 2, members of the Barrington Community Associates of the Art Institute of Chicago will attend a lecture and slide presentation by Robert Guinan, an unknown Chicago Master Painter. His works have been purchased by the Metropolitan Museum of Art and the Museum of Modern Art in New York as well as galleries in Europe, but are not available at the Art Institute.

Robert Guinan was born in upstate New York in 1934. His early sketches of a bowl of fruit or a vase of flowers followed the tradition of many novice painters. After seeing the film "Moulin Rouge" in his late teens, he developed the style for which he is best known.

In 1959, Guinan enrolled in the school of the Art Institute of Chicago after serving in the Air Force. When not earning a living at various small jobs, he frequented local Chicago bars where his love of music and the culture of jazz helped him make friends with those of modest condition. These men and women became his models because they were interesting, a slice of life.

Albert Loeb, son of the legendary Parisian gallery owner Pierre Loeb, discovered Guinan's paintings in a booth of the Vienna Gallery at the Basel Art Fair in 1972. This was the beginning of a long collaboration. From his lake-view studio in Chicago, Robert Guinan continues painting social realism today.

#### **New Center for Sleep Disorders**


"It's estimated that nearly 40 million Americans suffer from sleep disorders but almost all of them-95%-are undiagnosed and untreated. In many cases, sleep disorders can contribute to other serious health problems like irregular heartbeat, high blood pressure, congestive heart failure and heart attack," said Daniel Nepomuceno, MD, a pulmonary medicine specialist at Good Shepherd Hospital and Medical Director for the new center.

One of the distinguishing features of Good Shepherd's hospital-based Center for Sleep Disorders is the ready availability of physician specialties such as Behavioral Medicine, Neurology, Otolaryngology and Pulmonology. By involving these specialists, a wide variety of underlying causes can be addressed.

"The signs and symptoms of sleep disorders include snoring, daytime sleepiness or fatigue and reduced cognitive function. They could also include depression, irritability, sexual dysfunction, learning and memory difficulties and falling asleep while at work, on the phone or driving," said Dr. Nepomuceno.

"Usually spouses are the first ones to suspect that something is wrong, either because of loud snoring or irregular breathing during sleep," said Dr. Nepomuceno.

By far the most commonly under diagnosed sleep disorder is Sleep Apnea, a serious, potentially life-threatening condition affecting nearly 18 million Americans. Sleep Apnea is a breathing disorder in which brief interruptions of breathing occur during sleep. There are two types of sleep apnea: central and obstructive. fails to signal the breathing muscles. Obstructive sleep apnea occurs when air cannot flow into or out of the person's nose or mouth although efforts to breath continue. The good news is both types are treatable when diagnosed.

Specific treatment plans vary by individual. However, they may include medication; oxygen administration; and behavioral modification such as avoiding alcohol, tobacco and sleeping pills. The standard treatment is nasal continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP) in which the patient wears a mask over the nose during sleep and air pressure is used to keep the airways open. In severe cases, surgery may be required to remove the adenoids and tonsils, nasal polyps or other growths.

Persons experiencing signs and symptoms of sleep disorders should contact their physician. A physician's order is required to conduct a sleep study in the new Center for Sleep Disorders. Sleep studies are also covered by many health insurance plans. Check with your insurance provider.



### **Conversation About Cosmetic Surgery** Comes Out of the Closet

They all have a different starting point and wear their years differently. For some, the first signs of aging show up as wrinkles on the neck or as laugh lines. For others, it's the loose, puffy skin around the eyes."

"While some people feel their aging signs show character, others are upset by them. The inconsistency between the internal and external image can create a great deal of personal dissatisfaction. This is the primary motivator for 30- and 40-year-old patients seeking cosmetic surgery improvements. This has also fueled the dramatic rise of cosmetic surgery procedures with the aging senior population. People are living much longer than they used to. Today's senior citizens are active people on the go; they want a body and face that are consistent with how they see themselves."

"Patients of all ages are driven to seek changes for different reasons. Most patients come to see me because some part of their appearance really bothers them. For them, looking in the mirror becomes a source of agitation and anxiety. It can either be something they were born with or something that's changed over time. It gets in the way of who they are. Bottom line is that they're just not happy about it and eventually decide they're ready to change it."

Dr. Bushnick cautions patients to consider cosmetic procedures for the right reasons. "Plastic surgery should never be done to impress someone else. It is a process that must be based on one's personal interest in improving appearance and self-image." When asked what one should look for when evaluating a physician to provide cosmetic surgery solutions, Dr. Bushnick offered the following checklist:

#### Are You and the Doctor on the Same Page?

Can you openly and honestly communicate with the doctor? Is there chemistry between you? Does the doctor listen and understand what's important to you? Are your questions responded to directly? Does the doctor have a good understanding of what bothers you and what you want to change? Were you afforded the time and attention you needed to make your evaluation of the doctor and the practice?

#### Are You Clear About Reasonable **Expectations and Results Associated** with Procedures and Recovery Times?


What to expect and what not to expect should be key parts of a quality interaction between a patient and the doctor. Included in this dialogue should also be conversation about recovery time, which for most procedures is 1 to 2 weeks, as well as expectations and physical limitations during recovery.

#### Do You Understand the Credentials and Training of the Physician You are Engaging to Perform Surgery?

Board certification in plastic surgery demonstrates the most significant time, education and training commitment that can be undertaken by a physician performing plastic surgery. It is the medical industry's well-recognized seal of approval. This level of training well-qualifies a physician to discuss realistic goals and expectations for surgical procedures. #### **Facelift Surgery**

Aging of the face is inevitable. With time, the effects of gravity, genetics and sun exposure begin to demonstrate their impact on our appearance. Fine wrinkles begin to appear at the corners of the eyes. The sharply demarcated jaw line becomes less defined with the appearance of jowls and the smooth contours of the neck are lost. The actual timing of when these events take place varies from person to person. Once these signs of aging become apparent, a facelift, also known as rhytidec- facelift may also be combined with eyelid tomy, could provide the desired facial rejuvenation.

#### What is a Facelift?

A facelift allows rejuvenation of the lower two-thirds of the face. It addresses the sagging neck, jowls and cheeks. It may be combined with liposuction and tightening of the muscles in the neck to provide a tighter, smoother contouring. The incision for the facelift extends from the patient's temple hairline down in front of and then just inside the ear, and continues around the lobe behind the ear into the hairline. All incisions are placed where they would fall in a natural crease or hidden within the patient's hair. The skin is then raised and the underlying soft tissues are tightened. This places the tension beneath the skin and prevents a pulled or too tight look. The skin is then redraped over the underlying tissues. The excess skin is trimmed and the incisions are closed with fine sutures. Depending on the extent of surgery, the procedure can last from two to four hours. Following the surgery, the patient will have a dressing placed to protect the entire area where the incisions have been made and the skin has been raised. A hospital.

#### What Can the Patient Expect After Surgery?

Most patients report very little pain after surgery, however, there is some degree of discomfort due to the swelling. The patient will be instructed to sleep with the head elevated on two to three pillows. Medication is prescribed to allow the patient to tolerate the mild pain. The dressing that was applied immediately following surgery is removed on the first day after surgery. Recovery usually takes between two to three weeks although most patients are able to go back to work in one to two weeks. The incisions are barely noticeable even early on since they are hidden in natural contours and the hair.

#### Where Can This Procedure be Performed?

Facelifts are commonly performed at The Center for Facial Plastic Surgery. Some patients prefer to spend the night there while others go home following surgery. Either twilight or general anesthesia is used. Facelifts can also be done in the




#### Jürgen Görg **Returns to** The Studio of Long Grove







#### **Bone Health**

While past research tells us that there is a bone health test. no need to be concerned about our bones until age 40, studies are now showing different results. Recent research proves we really need to start thinking about building strong bones during childhood and adolescence. All too often, we don't discover that there's a problem with fragile or brittle bones until after menopause. There are no symptoms of osteoporosis. Unfortunately, many women don't know they have a problem until a fracture occurs. Over time, bones become more porous and fragile. If left unchecked, bone fractures may occur. Women generally reach their peak bone mass in their thirties. After age 30, a certain amount of bone loss is normal. With the onset of menopause and declining estrogen levels, bone loss accelerates considerably for the first 5 to 8 years. Osteoporosis is diagnosed when bone mass has deteriorated 10% to 25% below peak. Risk factors for developing osteoporosis include: thin or frail physique, cigarette smoking, moderate to heavy alcohol use, sedentary lifestyle, family history of osteoporosis and use of certain medications. Our risk of developing osteoporosis is actually greater than our combined risk of getting breast, ovarian and uterine cancer. More and more doctors are recommending that every menopausal woman or women with any of the above mentioned risk factors have

Calcium is one of the most important nutrients for bone health. The National Academy of Sciences recommends women ages 19 through 50 have 1000 milligrams of calcium per day. Pregnant women and women over the age of 50 need a daily intake of 1200 milligrams. In addition, women over the age of 65 are recommended 1500 milligrams per day. Calcium must be in balance with magnesium levels. According to Dr. C. Northrup, "A diet low in magnesium and relatively high in calcium can actually contribute to osteoporosis." The ideal ratio of calcium to magnesium is 2 to 1. Vitamin D is required for the absorption and utilization of calcium. The recommended daily amount is 400 to 800 International Units. It is easy to get adequate amounts of vitamin D in the summer when you are outside exposed to the sun. Once winter comes, it is important to use a vitamin D supplement.

Ellsworth Kelly: The Early Drawings, 1948-1955 and Bill Viola-Video Artist are the focus of a bus trip to the Art Institute on Tuesday, October 19 sponsored by the Barrington Community Associates of the Art Institute of Chicago.

The day begins with a lecture by Celia Marriott, Associate Director of Museum Education-Media Programming. Marriott's field is late 20th century art; her projects include a video presentation for the Caillebotte and Monet exhibits. 





#### **Recent Developments**

This month, I will share a recent court determination concerning stocks and bonds and also identify various tax proposals that bear watching in the future.

In a recent ruling, the Illinois Appellate Court found that stocks and bonds did not qualify as personal effects. Marie died and under her will left "all of her personal effects, household goods and all other goods and chattels" to her good friend Mary. Her will declared that she left the residue of her estate to Principia Corporation, a Missouri educational institution. At the time of her death, she owned her residence, its contents and furnishings and various certificates representing ownership of certain common stocks and bonds. Upon her death, most of her stock and bond certificates were found in her safe-deposit box, however, some were found in and among her household and personal possessions.

Marie's will was admitted to probate and Mary, Marie's friend, sought a declaration that she, not Principia, was entitled to Marie's stocks and bonds, which in total valued over \$1 Million. Under Section 1 of the will, all other tangible personal property of Marie, including her automobile, was distributed to Mary. The combined value of those items was \$9,075.

After hearing oral arguments, the Circuit Court entered judgment in favor of Principia, determining that Principia should receive Marie's stocks and bonds under the terms of her will. Mary ap-

The Illinois Appellate Court ruled the phrase "personal effects" denotes "tangible personal property." Thus the Circuit Court correctly determined that the stocks and bonds passed to Principia under the residuary clause Sverid v. First National Bank of Evergreen Park, 295 Ill. App. 3d (1998).

#### Tax Proposals

Income Taxation-Both the House and the Senate have proposed income tax reduction. The House version would have reduced all brackets by 10% over 10 years. By 2009, the current top rate of 39.6% would end up at 35.7%. The Senate plan would have reduced the 15% bracket to prosperous October.

14% and expanded the income range of taxpayers who fall into that market.

Capital Gains-The House proposed lowering the 20% capital gains rate to 15% but this was modified to 18% by the Conference Committee.

Minimum Tax—An increasing number of middle income taxpayers are now subject to the Alternative Minimum Tax because the income threshold for AMT has remained the same while income levels have risen. The House would repeal the AMT while the Senate would significantly limit its application.

Retirement Plans-Following the Senate's plan, the bill would increase the maximum annual contribution limits on tax deductible IRAs from \$2,000 to \$5,000.

Conservation Easements—Beginning in 2000, land located within 50 miles of a metropolitan area, national park or wilderness area or within 25 miles of an Urban National Forest would qualify for the conservation easement exclusion. This would expand upon the present IRS qualifications.

In Addition—The House and Senate also plan to address the allocation of the Generation Skipping Tax exemption, the severing of trusts, the "marriage penalty," tax breaks for buying health insurance and a reduction of capital gains tax for businesses.



#### Free Workshop Helps Parents Win War Over Homework

School is back in session and that means homework. And most parents would agree that homework can turn your home into a war zone. In "Homework: A Parent's Survival Guide," a community service workshop presented by Huntington Learning Center, parents learn key strategies for conquering daily homework battles.

The president and cofounder of Huntington Learning Center, Dr. Raymond I. Huntington, offers this critical workshop through local PTAs because he believes, "A parent's motivation, interest and support are crucial for a child to do well in school. - 6. Does your child wait until the last minute to finish assignments?
- 7. Does your child put off homework if you are not home?

In the workshop, parents are given guidelines to deal with these problems and help their children learn to do homework on their own. As Dr. Huntington points out, "Parents can have a tremendous influence on a child's self-confidence and can show encouragement by praising their child's efforts." According to him, "The three C's-care, concern and communicating—are the best way to enforce good study habits."




We are extremely proud to announce the work of Randy Willis, a most accomplished young local artist, who is now available through Dunton Gallery in downtown Arlington Heights.


Summer Hay Field, Oil, 9"x12".





# TERRAIN - OF -FREEDOM

#### American Art and the Civil War

An exhibition that explores the idea of freedom as it was represented by various sections, one revolving around The Freed-American artists during the Civil War period is currently at The Art Institute of Chicago and remains on display through November 28, 1999. Terrain of Freedom: American Art and the Civil War highlights two recent major Art Institute acquisitions: John Ouincy Adams Ward's sculpture The Freedman (1863) and Albert Bierstadt's painting Mountain Brook (1863), both of which were featured attractions in the 1863 annual exhibition at New York's National Academy of Design. In addition to being critical successes at the time, each carried specific iconographic meanings related to the Civil War. Through a rich display of paintings, prints, photographs and sculpture, this exhibition probes how the concept of freedom—as it related to the "great national conflict" and the burning issue of emancipation—was seen by Americans before and during this crucial period in American history.

Terrain of Freedom is divided into two man and one around Mountain Brook. The first focuses on strong images of African-American slaves and freedmen in Civil War-era society. Modeled from life, The Freedman is widely considered the first and most accurate representation of an African-American figure to be cast in bronze. Freed slaves were commonly portrayed in the 1860s as being dependent on and indebted to their eventual emancipator, Abraham Lincoln. The Freedman's popularity, however, can be seen as a response to Ward's presentation of his subject as independent, strong and dignified—an agent of his own liberation. The sculpture further relates to the historical role that African-Americans played as soldiers, who joined the Union Army in great numbers to fight for their own freedom. Other works in this section of the exhibition by Currier & Ives, Samuel J. Miller and Alexander Gardner expand upon the







in social standing and fighting to determine their own fate in achieving citizenship and political rights.

The Mountain Brook section presents a number of visual images of the American landscape and examines their metaphorical relationship to freedom. Responding to the crisis of this country's greatest internal conflict, artists transformed natural events—particularly autumn scenes—into a type of visual poetry that addressed the concerns of a nation at war with itself.

Bierstadt, for example, portrayed the White Mountains of New Hampshire as virginal, unspoiled by civilization. Although it was a recognizably northern landscape, Mountain Brook also functioned as an emblem for the nation as a whole, both a signal image of peaceful times and a reminder of the brutal confrontation then raging with the simple details of nature taking on symbolic meanings. Autumn foliage, for example, is seen as fratricidal blood spilled upon the land, a passing from life to death. In addition to the nationalistic Mountain Brook, particularly significant are On the St. Anne's, East Canada (1863) by the African-American artist Robert Duncanson and Our Banner in the Sky (1861) by Frederic Church. As the time's most popular form of

portrayal of African-Americans as elevated American artistic expression, these landscape paintings held the power to address the need for national unity in a country otherwise torn by Civil War.

Ward's The Freedman and Bierstadt's Mountain Brook are masterful works in themselves. When their historical meaning is unpacked and placed within a broader spectrum of Civil War-era visual culture, Terrain of Freedom: American Art and the Civil War opens a window on this country's most difficult moment-a moment when freedom was the issue.





Money to restore Stickney House is raised through grants and donations from





#### Toward a Healthier Ela— ECS Takes on Local Quality of Life

There is a movement afoot in the U.S.

People all over the country are quietly coming together to do something positive about some of the problems facing American society. They are following the Healthy Communities Agenda in an effort to prevent social injustices—school violence, drive-by shootings, drug abuse and other tragedies we read about all too often—from happening right here in our community.

And, right here in our community, in Ela Township, the Ela Communities for SUCCESS (ECS), an outgrowth of the nationwide Healthy Community movement, has been working for more than four years to identify concerns of local residents and to develop social programs that address those concerns.

Says ECS President Barbara Evans, "As residents of a community, we must ask ourselves, 'How safe are our communities? What can we do to make things better? What steps should we take now to prevent a Littleton, CO from happening right here in Ela Township?' And then we get to work."

The ECS charter members believed that by creating community partnerships to pool existing resources, the group can measurably improve the health and wellbeing of all Ela Township residents. And that's just what they are doing.


Since it was established in 1995, ECS has initiated several successful community programs. The first, Parent University, provided support for more than 45

parenting workshops and training programs in association with local schools, including District 95 and St. Francis de Sales School. Another on-going educational outreach effort, Active Parenting, has been conducting workshops in cooperation with the College of Lake County, Lake County Fighting Back and Good Shepherd Hospital.

The most visible program initiated by the ECS is the Ela Festival of Arts. It was held for its fourth year on September 11, 1999 from 10:00 AM to 5:30 PM at Paulus Park in Lake Zurich. The Festival has grown from a concern among residents and art enthusiasts that Ela Township had relatively few outlets for creative expression. In four years, the Festival, which is now known as a "Celebration of the fine art of community," has grown to include more than 500 local performers of music, dance, theater and fine art. Last year, more than 6,000 people attended the one-day event

"ECS is not meant to be a programming entity," explains Evans. "We are more of a catalyst for change. We try to identify resources in the communities we serve—Deer Park, Hawthorn Woods, Kildeer, Lake Zurich, Long Grove and North Barrington—and bring them together as we did with the Festival of the Arts. ECS initiated the first festival, and then once it was running successfully, founded the Cultural Arts Connection, the non-profit cultural organization which now orga-

### **Barrington Schools and Parks** to Get Lightning Prediction System

motivated the Barrington Breakfast Rotary Club to undertake its largest ever community service project-providing lightning prediction systems for each of Barrington's schools and parks. At a recent meeting, the Rotarians, along with their guests from the area parks, schools and youth athletic leagues, heard from Park Ridge Rotarians about a similar project they completed two years ago. The Park Ridge project was inspired by the lightning strike and death of a popular youth soccer league coach. The Barrington Rotary Club has decided to be proactive, being preventive instead of responding to a similar potential tragedy.

Also at the presentation were representatives of Barrington School District 220 and the park districts of Barrington, North Barrington, South Barrington, Barrington Hills and Tower Lakes. Also attending was a member of the Barrington Area Soccer Association. During the meeting with the Park Ridge group, the attendees asked numerous questions about the previous project including design, technology, selection criteria, operation and maintenance. They learned that although these systems are commonly used by golf courses, very few communities have them. About 350 people are killed by lightning strikes annually, including about 10 in Illinois. Since being installed, the Park Ridge system has performed flawlessly. Breakfast Rotary President David Waring said, "Every person attending the presentation was inspired and motivated. After the meeting, the Rotarians received numerous calls supporting the project including encouragement from those unable to attend such as the area youth baseball and football groups."

The lightning prediction system consists of detection monitors, warning horns and warning lights. As the atmospheric static electricity charges reach critical levels, warning horns and strobe lights are activated to give a 10- to 15-minute warning. After a few minutes, the horn stops but

Recent Barrington lightning strikes have the lights continue to flash until the danger has passed. The system has battery back-ups in case of electrical power outage. It also has a timer, which is usually set to operate during daylight hours. President Waring said, "Although this will be an expensive project, the Rotary Club's a initiative and coordination will allow a cost effective system. As an example, several of the schools can share detection devices with the nearby parks."

Waring said, "The Barrington-wide lightning prediction system is an ambitious project. The plan includes the playgrounds and sports fields of each elementary, middle and high school along with each parks' respective swimming areas and playing fields."

The Rotary Club is currently identifying the specific sites to be covered and working with competing manufacturers to ensure that a cost-effective, proper system is designed and installed. The Barrington Breakfast Rotary Club also will provide a community-wide lightning safety educational program, including the new prediction system. The Rotary Club doesn't yet know how much the Barrington system will cost or how it is going to pay for it. (The Park Ridge System was \$50,000 two years ago for fewer sites and a smaller area.) The Rotary Club hopes to raise funds with the assistance and support of community organizations, individuals and corporations. A major event is planned for Saturday, April 15. The Club wants to have the system operational in time for next summer.




## From a Woman's Point of View
