



Proceeds of the Crop Walk are used to fight hunger and aid in disaster relief around the world and across our country with 25% of the proceeds being returned to the Barrington area to help fund our local agencies. Meals with Wheels that provided 6,040 meals last year; the CWU Barrington Food Pantry where more than 304 individuals were served and \$4,550 in food vouchers were distributed; the Fish Carpentersville Food Pantry serving approximately 300 families a month; the Salvation Army that helps when no one else can; and the Northern Illinois Food

The Barrington Area will celebrate its 18th Bank that sends out up to one million Walk: This year, PIN (People In Need), to churches for help, will be added to the Crop Walk funds. Approximately \$2,000

The 1999 Barrington walk raised \$50,755 to restore hope and provide a helping hand in disasters. Funds also educate people on better farming techniques, provide pumps for fresh water, call for the riddance of landmines, lobby for the forgiveness of third world debts and generally work to raise the living standards of impoverished people. We are called to help children, provide food and help the poor many times and in many ways. But this ecumenical event calls people of all denominations, people who care about our earth and the distribution of abundance, to walk together to bring awareness to the world that death due to starvation and malnutrition is still commonplace in many parts of the world. The inspiration to walk is the knowledge that starvation is preventable. Margaret Mead once said, "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed citizens can change the world; indeed, it's the only thing that ever has." We're trying to reduce the number of children who go to bed hungry, maybe eradicate it all together, trying to educate people out of poverty, and lend a helping hand when disaster strikes. We Barringtonians can show the world we care by joining the Crop Walk.

There will be walking, face-painting, rest stops on the way and the Sanfilippo calliope will once again be heard throughout the Village. throughout the day.





## Take Care of Your Back

One of the most common medical problems today is low back pain. It is estimated that at one time or another, eight out of ten people will suffer from this condition.

Much of this discomfort can be eliminated with physical therapy. Proper exercise, correct body mechanics and posture are important components in preventing and treating low back pain.


The most important exercises in treating low back pain are strengthening the abdominal muscles and maintaining spinal flexibility. Sit-ups are a great way to strengthen your abdominals. When doing a proper sit-up, don't raise your body any more than it takes to clear your shoulder blades off the surface you are lying on. Hold it for a few seconds and slowly lower your body. A good exercise for spinal flexibility is standing, placing your hands behind your back and arching backwards. We often sit in a flexed position-i.e. driving the car, working at a computer, etc. so extending the spine feels good.



#### Snoring, Strokes and Dentistry by Raymond P. Kotz, DDS, and James T. Gavrilos, DDS

In patients over sixty, 60% of males snore and 40% of females snore. Some simple solutions to decrease, snoring involve avoiding alcohol and heavy meals before bedtime, losing excessive weight and regularly exercising. Regular sleeping habits may also help as will decongestants. You might try sleeping on your side rather than on your back. (To remind you to sleep on your side, place a tennis ball in the back of your pajamas with a rubber band to awaken you if you roll onto your back.) Besides nagging from your mate or minor damage from an elbow in your side at night to urge you to roll over, there may be serious health risks because snoring is often associated with a condition known as obstructive sleep apnea.

In sleep apnea, breathing is interrupted for ten seconds or longer repeatedly during sleep. This can mean that an individual might have below normal oxygen levels for as much as half of their sleep time. During this time, the heart must pump harder to circulate the blood faster and an irregular heart rate may be the result. Irregular heart rates are often the cause of increased blood pressure, heart enlargements and possibly strokes.

If these simple solutions do not work and if your mate continues to notice these symptoms, or you are excessively tired during the day, do not procrastinate on



medical consultation. Your physician may recommend sleep studies to determine the exact nature of the problem and then, if severe enough, he might recommend a device called a CPAP (Continuous Positive Air Pressure) machine. This is a device which pumps air into your nose and throat to maintain an open airway while you sleep.

The CPAP is difficult for many people to become accustomed to. Another option is surgical alteration of your mouth or jaw, but these procedures have either unpredictable results or are very extensive. Another newer solution is the use of a dental device called a Herbst Appliance. This is non-invasive and worn only at night. Your dentist can explain the device and discuss it with your physician.

## Jointly Held Property

October is here. Halloween is around the corner. I guess summer is officially over. I hope you all had a cool and safe summer. This month, I am going to discuss joint tenancy as an ownership technique. Joint ownership is a convenient form of ownership; however, there are significant problems with this form of property ownership.

Joint ownership implies a partnership, a marriage of title. Initially, it appears as the right way to take title to property between people who care for each other. If two people own property jointly and one of them dies, the other continues to own the entire property. Jointly held property requires no will or trust. It does not go through probate court on the death of the first joint tenant. It seems too good to be true-no will or trust and no probate!

However, there are serious problems with joint ownership. Jointly held property may pass to the wrong people. On death, a joint owner cannot control the way the property passes nor the time of its passage. Which joint tenant will die first is unknown. Consider the following example:

A widow with two adult children marries a widower with one adult child. They combine their assets and title them jointly. The widow dies first. The widower receives everything and the widow's children nothing.


What happens if joint owners die simultaneously? Most states have adopted the Uniform Simultaneous Death Act. Under this law, joint property is distributed in proportion to the number of joint tenants. However, if one tenant outlives the other by one second, then the property goes to the heirs of the one who survived by one second. Property may pass to unintended heirs

Jointly held property is beneficial to creditors of the owners. The misdeeds of one may cause the entire property to be seized by creditors.

Federal gift tax laws must be considered when owning property jointly with others. When you own property with your spouse, there is no federal gift tax. There is an unlimited lifetime martial deduction on gifts between U.S. citizen spouses. Therefore, spouses who are citizens of the U.S. can acquire property jointly without incurring a federal gift tax.

However, this is not the case if one person owns property and adds another person, other than the spouse, to the title. If the individual added to the title has not paid for their beneficial interest, then a gift has been made. The following is a common example of this type of gift: Mom owns a house and decides to put her son's name on the deed as a joint tenant. Mom has made a potentially taxable gift of onehalf the value of the home to her son.

Putting another person's name on a bank account is usually not a gift. However, if the other person takes money out of the account, a gift immediately occurs.

Great care must be used in creating \* joint ownership with individuals that are not your spouse. Jointly owned property always belongs to the surviving owners. In addition, your estate might have to pay tax on the value of your interest in the property even though the property is going to a non-family member. Remember that cottage owned jointly with your friend? He may get the cottage if you die first, and your estate: may pay the federal estate tax on half its value.

Another problem with property held jointly with a spouse concerns the stepup in basis rules. Property in the estate of a decedent gets a new basis for federal income tax purposes. The new basis of the property, is the fair market value of the property on the date of the decedent's death. Joint property does not get a 100% step-up in basis for income tax purposes, but rather only a 50% step-up because only 50% is included in the estate of the first spouse to die.

Joint ownership is a potential planning pitfall and should be entered into cautiously, if at all. Have a wonderful October and Happy Halloween.

#### Severance Agreements— **Protecting Your Future**

As you may know, a severance agreement is intended by an employer to provide a terminated employee with a specific sum of money and/or benefits in exchange for the release the employee's legal rights against the company. Although employers are not required by law to offer severance, often employers will offer severance pay in situations of a lay off or down-sizing Under those circumstances, severance is usually defined by a company policy which sets forth the calculation of pay based on the employee's length of service and position with the company. Another reason for the offer of severance is to resolve an employee dispute related to the termination. In some situations, the employers may not offer a severance package, however, depending on the particular situation which led to the termination of an agreement. A severance agreement is beneficial to an employer where it desires to avoid future litigation.

A properly drafted severance agreement is enforceable and therefore should be carefully considered by both the employer and the employee. Before you sign a severance agreement, it is extremely important to know your legal rights and to understand exactly which rights the company wants you to relinquish by agreeing to terms proposed by the company.

Sometimes terminated individuals are fearful and agree to sign away their legal rights in exchange for inadequate compensation or terms which may restrict future employment. For instance, carefully consider a severance agreement if it includes a "non-compete" agreement or "restrictive covenant" provision. If such provisions are properly drafted, they are enforceable and will legally effect your ability to accept future employment. As such, it is recommended that you consult with an attorney to determine whether the severance pay offered is adequate when compared against any restrictions the agreement may place upon you and the legal rights which you release in favor of the company.

For example, if a terminated employee is over the age of 40, the agreement must be properly drafted in order to legally release an employee's right to pursue a case

of age discrimination. In particular, the company must advise the employee in the agreement of certain rights in order for the agreement to be binding. Specifically, under the Older Workers' Benefit Protection Act (OWBPA), employers are required to give an employee the right to review the agreement for 21 days before it has to be signed and give the employee the right to revoke the agreement within 7 days after acceptance. Additionally, the agreement should advise the employee to consult with an attorney before signing the release agreement.

As such, the best approach to determining whether a severance agreement fairly compensates you is to review the facts of your termination with legal counsel. If you do so, you will go a long way to insure that you receive adequate and reasonable severance in consideration of releasing your legal rights. Additionally, in order to avoid future claims, an employer should use a well-drafted severance agreement tailored to the particular facts of the termination.

Next month, when I will continue to discuss the importance of employment laws to employers and employees. Until then, best wishes for a wonderful fall.







An exhibition of the extraordinary landscape paintings of one of America's most celebrated Impressionist artists can be seen at The Art Institute of Chicago now through November 26, 2000. William Merritt Chase: Modern. American Landscapes brings together more than 30 major paintings that span a brief but formative period (1886-1893) in Chase's career and represent the artist's first serious foray into an intense exploration of the Ameri-



can urban landscape. Painted mainly in the New York City boroughs of Manhattan and Brooklyn, these airy, light-filled canvases also helped establish Chase's reputation as the foremost Impressionist in the United States as well as the "inventor" of the American park subject.

William Merritt Chase (1849-1916) was one of the first American painters to document turn-of-the-century urban life in the public spaces devoted to leisure

activities. Chase was, in fact, one of the most prominent artists in the United States around the turn of the century. Celebrated for his expertise in a variety of styles and media, Chase applied his considerable technical talents to an equally wide range of genres-portraits, still lifes and landscapes. In 1886, he began to depict views of the public parks and harbors of Brooklyn and Manhattan, utilizing methods clearly inspired by French Impressionism, only to abandon these urban subjects in the early 1890s as abruptly as he had adopted them. William Merritt Chase brings these paintings and pastels together as a group for the first time.

Although he returned to New York to teach at the Art Students League in 1878, Chase continued to travel in Europe, particularly to Paris, into the 1880s, studying and absorbing much of what he saw. Reflecting his rigorous European straining, his early pictures were characterized by a brushwork and tonal palette that evoke the Old Master painting tradition, effectively obscuring the American subjects he portrayed.

By 1885, Chase's art had come under attack from American critics who asserted that it indeed aligned itself too closely with foreign styles while avoiding truly native subject matter. Taking these criticisms seriously, Chase immediately began to alter both the form and content of his work. After resettling in Brooklyn, he began a series of works that depicted the city's newly created parks. Echoing his French: counterparts, he produced gorgeous views of everyday life-the Brook-

lyn Navy Yard and Tompkins, Prospect and Central parks for example-as well as scenes of his parents' backyard. These paintings and pastels were also the products of his personal link with Brooklyn. Like another American Impressionist, Mary Cassatt, who painted her Parisian home life during the 1880s, Chase's new subject matter focused on the environments that defined his own daily routines-what might be called "domestic exteriors".

#### Fact Sheet May Help McHenry County **Residents Save Trees from Gypsy Moth**


The Illinois Department of Agriculture (IDA) announced last week that McHenry County may have a serious enough gypsy moth problem to warrant a quarantine of the county. While a quarantine decision isn't likely to be made until next spring, McHenry County residents can protect their trees from the gypsy moth by learning how to identify and eradicate the pest.

University of Illinois Extension is assisting IDA with public education about gypsy moth control methods. A fact sheet on the subject is available through Extension, and Master Gardeners at Extension's McHenry County office will answer questions over the phone.

Earlier this summer, gypsy moths in Lake County had risen to such a high level that the county is now under a quarantine that restricts movement of nursery stock, firewood, household belongings and other materials out of the area. The rise in gypsy moth populations in Northeastern Illinois is widely attributed to a migration of caterpillars from infested areas of Michigan and Wisconsin.

Tree species that are highly susceptible to gypsy moth attacks include oak, crabapple, linden, poplar, beech, willow, birch, sweetgum, serviceberry and hawthorn. Other trees that may be infested include pine, spruce, ash, sycamore, indian bean, honeylocust, dogwood, juniper, yew, lilac, arborvitae, arrowwood viburnum and tulip tree.

At this time of year, gypsy moths have, laid their egg masses, and most of the adult moths are dead. The egg masses are, gypsymoth. McHenry County residents about one inch long by one-half inch wide and resemble buff-to-tan-colored felt patches. Females lay egg masses on sheet or talk to a Master Gardener over tree bark and other exposed surfaces as the phone. Call 815-338-3737.



well as in hidden locations, including under loose bark, beneath house siding, within hollow areas of swing sets and in car wheel wells. Egg masses should be scraped off and dropped into rubbing alcohol or soapy water. Dispose of them in the trash.

In the spring, when the eggs hatch, spray applications are recommended and most effective at the time when leaves on oak trees are expanded about halfway. In Northeastern Illinois, this is usually in mid-May. An insecticide that is effective against the moth larvae is Bacillus thuringiensis kurstaki, which is commonly sold as Dipel, Thuricide and other trade names.
