

HAMPTON COURT PALACE: CENTER OF ENGLISH LIFE FOR 500 YEARS


This article is the second in a series of articles to appear in Lifestyles concerning London and the surrounding area. To me, Hampton Court Palace was two palaces. One was the dark, almost sinister, foreboding castle of Henry VIII. The other was a mansion of elegance and refinement, reflecting the tastes of William and Mary

Known as the South Front, William and Mary commissioned Christopher Wren to provide this look of elegance. This section of the palace contrasts sharply with the Tudor turrets, gables and chimneys of Henry's time. South Front is considered the most ceremonial portion of the palace.



William III (1689-1702) and Mary II (1689-1694) planned to transform Hampton Court into a modern baroque palace. Fountain Court was the only baroque element completed towards this goal.

or over 200 years, Hampton Court Palace was the center of court life and politics. This palace is most identified with Henry VIII. Viewed from the west, Hampton Court remains the red brick Tudor palace of Henry VIII (1509-1547). From the east, however, one sees a more stately facade designed by Sir Christopher Wren for William III (1689-1700).

The exquisite interiors reflect the tastes of those sovereigns. However, William III did change much of Henry VIII's choices in decor when he came into power. Namely, Henry VIII's and his queens' apartments on the south and east sides of the palace were destroyed for William's renovations. The interior houses many great works of art, many in the positions for which they were intended.

The palace is set off by beautiful gardens and extensive parklands by a riverside. Over 60 acres of gardens can be viewed.

My favorite room among Henry VIII's state apartments was the Royal Chapel. The room was exquisite in every detail. The magnificent ceiling had carved and gilded rendants and remains

unchanged since Henry VIII worshipped there. It is said he attended Mass every day. It was in this chapel that the king learned of the infidelity of his fifth wife, Catherine Howard, and two years later (1543) married his last wife, Catherine

There are over 60 acres of gardens to enjoy at Hampton Court. What better way to enjoy these beautiful grounds than on a carriage ride.

Parr, in the Queen's Closet adjoining the chapel.

The gardens at Hampton Court are not to be missed. It was Cardinal Wolsey (c. 1475-1530) who first planted ornamental gardens here (now the site of Fountain Court). However, it was Henry VIII that began to establish Hampton Court as a showplace for English gardening. And it is he who laid out the basic structure of the gardens very much as they remain today. William and Mary liked the Baroque concept and laid out avenues of trees and their concepts have scarcely been altered.

It must be pointed out that while Henry VIII is probably considered Hampton Court's most famous resident, it was Thomas Wolsey, Archbishop of York, who first took up residence in 1514 at Hampton Court. In 1525, Wolsey finished building lodges for his king. Three years later, Wolsey was forced to surrender his ownership of the palace to the king.

In 1838, Queen Victoria opened Hampton Court to the public.

The Astronomical Clock shows the hour, month, day, number of days since the beginning of the year, and the phases of the moon. The sun revolves around the earth as the clock was designed before the discoveries of Galileo and Copernicus. Shown is the clock above George II's Gateway in Clock Court.

Sapphire September Birthstone

Mitchell's Jewelers, as always, wants you to know as much as possible about gems and jewelry. So here is some information about sapphire, the birthstone for September.

Sapphire is of the corundum family and consists of any color except red (ruby). Red, light red and red with a violet overtone is always ruby. All other colors of corundum are sapphire. The word Sapphire is derived from the Latin word Sapphirus, Greek (Sappheriros), and Hebrew (Sappir). Historically, sapphires have been called many names. Saphiros was the word Romans used which meant Lapislazuli, green sapphire was called "emeralds," and purple sapphire was called "amethyst."

Sources include Burma, Thailand, Sri Lanka, Africa, Australia and U.S. (Montana). Kashmir, India produced some of little since World War II.

Colors include blue in various hues, colorless, pink, orange, yellow, green, purple and black. The hardness is 9 (same as ruby), toughness; good. Sapphires are commonly heat treated to produce color in colorless sapphires or to intensify color, make color uniform or to lighten stones.

Star Sapphires are sapphires that are never completely transparent, because they must have enough silky, needlelike inclusions to produce a star. They occur in almost every color ruby and sapphire that exist, although orange and yellow are almost unknown and green is very rare. The most common is black. Today most of the Star Sapphires bought in jewelry stores are synthetic (most colors other than black which is usually genuine).







Mid-Year Check Up by Sharon L. Keller, J.D., LLM

September is here and summer is soon becoming a memory. It is not too early to begin working on reducing your 1999 tax liability. This article will discuss a few ideas to help you begin that process.

Investments

The stock market, because of its volatility, is not the best investment for shortterm investments. Funds that you need for tuition or a down payment on a house should be in something more conservative. Otherwise, you may have to sell stocks when the market is in a slump. If you do need to liquidate stocks, check with a tax advisor to ensure that you do it in the most tax-efficient way possible.

Vacation Homes

Renting a vacation home can offset the cost of owning and operating the property. But, the IRS has stated that the rental deductions are limited if the owner uses the property for personal purposes more than the greater of 14 days or 10% of the rental days during the year. Personal use includes any day the property is rented at less than fair market value and normally includes all the days the unit is used by the owners or their family members. By monitoring personal use for the rest of the year, you may be able to avoid the limitation on rental expenses and report a tax loss for the year.

Retirement Plans

You should take advantage of retirement plan options. The earnings of most retirement plans are tax-deferred. Thus, the sooner you fund an account, the faster the tax advantage begins. If you can afford to fund a plan now for 1999, there is no reason to wait until December 31 or April 15 (the tax filing deadline) to make your contributions. If you are self-employed and presently do not have a retirement plan for your business, you might consider setting one up for this year.

Health Care Expenses

For many years, self-employed taxpayers prosperous September!

have hired their spouses as employees. This can result in a business deduction for 100% of the family's medical insurance and other out-of-pocket health care expenses. The IRS has recently released new guidance on this issue. The IRS has stated:

- · A business can provide fully deductible health insurance overage to selfemployed owners by covering the owner's spouse who works in the business.
- · Out-of-pocket health care expenses of the owner's family can be fully deductible if the business sponsors a written medical reimbursement plan.
- The IRS reiterates the "common sense" requirement that the spouse must be a bona fide employee of the business for these health care benefits to be deductible to the business and non-taxable to the spouse. Thus, the employee status of the spouse who performs only minimal services for the business could be challenged

Recently, the House of Representatives and the Senate have passed tax reduction bills. The President has vowed to veto any such bill. Included in the package is an elimination of the estate tax. If you feel strongly about the elimination of the estate tax or any other part of the bill, please write to your Congressman, Senator and President to let them know your concerns.


LWV to Discuss Wetland and Mitigation Projects

The League of Women Voters (LWV) of the Barrington Area have invited Iohn Rogner, Field Office Supervisor of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, to discuss a recently published Wetland Mitigation and 404 Permit Compliance Study at their September 21 meeting. Mitigation is the process where a tract of wetland is destroyed, usually by a developer or landowner, in order to develop the land for commercial or residential use. Another wetland of greater acreage is established to replace the one destroyed either on-site or at another site. The Barrington area has been the recipient of several mitigation projects.

In 1996, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife implemented a study of 61 permits in the six-county Northeastern Illinois area to determine compliance rates and success of the resulting 128 wetland mitigation projects. According to federal regulations,

the 289 acres of wetland that were destroyed would have resulted in 355 acres of newly established wetland, producing a net gain of 66 acres. However, the study found that there was actually a loss of 6 acres on the mitigation sites as a result of projects completed unsuccessfully.

Join the League of Women Voters and Mr. Rogner as he explains the criteria used in the study to determine the success, partial success and failure of the mitigation projects. Learn how wetland mitigation applications are evaluated, permitted and inspected, and what you can do in your village to insure that mitigation projects are successfully completed and maintained. The League of Women Voters will meet on September 21 at 9:30 AM in the meeting room of the Barrington Area Library. What You Can Do to Reduce Sugar in Your Child's Diet

Children who have a diet high in sugar often are so filled up on empty sugar calories that they eat less nutrient-rich foods such as whole grains, fruits and vegetables necessary for proper development. Other problems with too much sugar in the diet include tooth decay, obesity and even high blood pressure and cholesterol levels. Here are some things you can do to help:

- Choose 100% juice, which includes a natural balance of flavonoids (naturally occurring antioxidants from plants) rather than partial juices made with flavorings and added sugar.
- Dilute fruit juices with water or unsweetened herbal tea to help limit the amount of juice your child drinks in a day.
- Read labels carefully, especially on baked goods and cereals. Some cereals are made up of almost 50% sugar!

Mental Fitness

The focus of this month's issue is "health and fitness." How many of you think about mental fitness as an important part of your daily routine? Most people will talk about eating right, vitamin supplements, exercise and personal grooming as the primary components of health and fitness. Yet, one of the most crucial aspects of good health and fitness is your state of mind. And although it is one of the most obvious, it is often the most overlooked responsibility that a person has to his or her "self."

It is the state of your mind that allows you to take care of yourself, to provide the motivation and interest in doing a workout or prepare a nutritionally balanced meal or even take a shower or a hot bath. Anxiety and depression, which are the most frequently experienced mental difficulties in our society, can prohibit you from actively doing those things that will benefit your physical health. Both of those "mental" ailments can cause tiredness, lethargy, procrastination, lack of interest, loss of sexuality, loss of enthu-

- Offer your child healthy snacks such as regular or frozen yogurt, cut-up veggies, fresh or dried fruits, etc. to keep blood sugar levels even throughout the day.
- Experiment with new foods and tastes. Try something spicy, salty or sour to stimulate your child's developing taste buds and to break free from a sugar habit.
- Use sugary treats only occasionally. Don't use them as rewards or bribes.
- Keep artificial sweeteners out of your diet as well as your child's. Aspartame, which is sold under the brand names of Equal or NutraSweet, breaks down chemically in the body into formaldehyde. Any product containing saccharin (such as Sweet 'n Low) must be labeled, "Saccharin has been determined to cause cancer in laboratory animals," (specifically bladder cancers).

Focus on Rhinoplasty

"It's as plain as the nose on your face."

This old adage says a lot about this central feature of our anatomy. Occupying the middle third of the face, probably no other single feature can so dramatically affect our appearance. The nose determines to a great extent the balance and symmetry of our faces. If one's nose is out of proportion to the rest of their features, it can dominate their looks. Someone who doesn't like their nose can focus on it, becoming self-conscious and insecure. A change in the appearance of their nose can make all the difference in the world to them. This is why rhinoplasty surgery is one of the most common plastic surgical procedures being performed in the United States today.

What is rhinoplasty?

This is the part of nasal surgery that changes the outer shape of the nose. This is accomplished by a combination of removing and/ or repositioning cartilage and bone which is already present. The goal is to shape the nose in a natural way so it is balanced and in harmony with the rest of the face and does not appear to have been "done."

What is external rhinoplasty?

In traditional rhinoplasty there are multiple incisions made inside the nose in order to reach the cartilage and bone. In addition, the cartilage usually needs to be "delivered" or pulled out of the nostril in order to operate on it.

External rhinoplasty is a technique we use in which one single incision is made starting just inside the nostril on one side and extending across the base of the nose to the other side. This allows the cartilage to be worked on in its natural position without distortion and provides a much

greater visibility during the operation. Also, there is very little bleeding during external rhinoplasty due to the single incision. We have found this technique gives much better control and predictability of the final result. We can also eliminate the need to pack the nose which significantly reduces the post-operative discomfort. External rhinoplasty is used on the majority of our patients.

What is a septoplasty?

The central support structure of the nose is the septum. It is made up of cartilage in the front of the nose and bone further back. This is what divides the nose lengthwise into two separate sides. The septum is often "deviated" or crooked due to some type of trauma earlier in life. This can lead to sinus infections as well as a chronic stuffy nose. If the deviation is located just beneath the bridge of the nose, it can cause the external form to look crooked. During a septoplasty, both the cartilaginous and bony portions of the septum are straightened and repositioned to the midline in order to improve the airway. This can be done as a separate operation or in conjunction with a rhinoplasty.





The Skinny on Home-Gym Purchases

might be one of the most important decisions you make in maintaining a consistent and effective workout regimen. Time and money spent at the onset could prove a wise investment or a frivolous and frustrating expenditure. So it's important to invest intelligently, choosing equipment that best suits you and falls in line with your exercise expectations.

Before heading off to the specialty equipment store, determine your needs and avoid impulse-buying another soonto-be-unused exercise machine. Determine your goals, available space and spending limit before plunking down your hard-earned dollars.

Choosing the right exercise equipment doesn't have to be limited to a large, onetime purchasing experience. If your budget allows you to purchase everything you want at one time, great. If not, purchases can be made piecemeal. Make sure to buy for quality; having to periodically replace non-quality equipment is far more costly and time-consuming than purchasing a higher-end, safe, stable component from the get-go.

Weighing Options

When it comes to cardiovascular activity, several outdoor options exist throughout much of the year, including walking, running, roller blading and biking. However, if privacy or only the most pleasant weather conditions are desired, a plethora Keep in mind that buying equipment of cardio-machines are available, offering outdoor intensity with indoor convenience. Treadmills, stationary bikes, stairclimbers and the most recent addition, elliptical trainers, all can be used inside the home to maximize your workout.

Provided special conditions—such as knee or back problems—aren't an issue. then the #1 consideration is deciding what you enjoy. One equipment type isn't necessarily superior to another. A stairclimber capable of burning a high level of calories certainly isn't preferable to a more modestly paced treadmill if an individual only sticks with the stairclimber for a week and the treadmill indefinitely. The goal of using cardio-equipment is to increase aerobic condition and burn calories, so equipment with any additional functions or purpose is unnecessary and probably translates to a higher cost with substantially decreased return on investment.

Once you've selected the equipment type best suited for you, try different models at the store while wearing exercise shoes. Consider several factors:

- Are the controls easy to use? (Keep special watch for treadmills with hard-toadjust speeds.)
- Is the movement smooth at warm-up and target pace?
- Is the piece proportioned to fit your body? (If you're tall, make sure treadmill belts accommodate your stride length.)
- Are the electronic readouts documenting calories burned and distance important? Is a simple timer sufficient?

Also important is what a particular exercise store offers you for purchasing a product from them. Ideally, you should seek out a store that offers the following: a 30-day, unconditional return policy as well as a one-year warranty; a factory-authorized service team on the premises; and proper, getting-started instructions.

Bench Basics

Turning our focus to a specific type of equipment-free-weights-takes into account many of the principles discussed

Again, focus on purchasing the core of a proper free-weight program—the bench -and forego the fancy frills until later. Avoid the temptation to lay on the extras at the expense of a high-quality bench. The bench comprises the building blocks for all else that follows and should offer not only safety, but comfort and versatility as well.

A bench should have a steel base of 14gauge or even better quality with twoby-two tubing for legs and feet. Keep in mind that the lower the gauge number, the better the quality; a 13-gauge is better than a 14, for example. Avoid the 16and 17-gauge models frequently found in sporting goods shops as they also offer inferior tubing sizes for legs and feet.

Sit on the bench and get comfortable com.

with it. If a comfort level cannot be achieved, then it is the wrong bench for you and will certainly impede your progress. The vinyl covering should be checked to see if it is rigorous enough to withstand age and use.

When in the store, perform a bench or dumbbell press to check it for safety and comfort. Keep in mind that different bench types exist. Some are simple structures, others incorporate more sophisticated features such as adjustable angles and inclines as well as the ability to allow attachments for such exercises as pulldowns and leg extensions.

With the options comes greater complexity. Therefore, it's important to ensure that a leg attachment accommodates the length of your lower leg for leg extensions and curls. Beware of benches that expose your legs to not only uncomfortable but unsafe angles.

But the bench is only one element in the free-weight workout. You can realize much versatility by using various dumbbells, a couple of bars (seven-foot straight and four-foot straight and curl bars are available) and some elastic resistance.

The larger bar sizes are intended for bench presses and squats. The four-foot versions are used to strengthen the biceps and triceps. Ankle weights are effective leg-sharpeners and should weigh at least 10 lbs each

Don't forget that weight plates are needed on the bar and collars are necessary to hold them in place. Plates and bars should possess the same diameter as your bench's leg attachments to allow inter-

Keep in mind that ultimately all you need is a bench, free weights and elastic resistance (excellent for travel). These three components comprise the basis upon which all other components can be built.

When it comes to workout gear, the core message is-forego the frills and focus on foundation. With the building blocks in place, all else will fall in line.
