



### A SKETCH OF THE HISTORY OF BARRINGTON

from the copyrighted "History of Barrington" by Annett C. Lines

The first settlers began to come to Barrington in 1834 after several treaties with the Indians, the last being in 1833 at the close of the Blackhawk War. There were still several hundred Pottowatomies hereabouts but they left as soon as they received their annuities from the government.

Yankees from western Massachusetts, mostly from Bershire County, who heard of the good rich soil, came here and took up claims, followed closely by groups of English and Germans. There were many Irish who settled in Cuba Township. The first settlers told their relatives in the east about the fertile lands and the influx of inhabitants began in earnest. These townships were organized and took their official names in 1850. The schools of Barrington Township were organized in 1840 with four established units.

This new village was not "a widening in the road." It was laid out in Barrington and Cuba Township, in Cook and Lake Counties, in 1854 when the railroad came through. The Deer Grove depot was moved here on a flat car. The settlement was represented in two stores, a home and a blacksmith shop.

By November 18, 1863 the settlement of Barrington Station was nine years old and the people felt a need for their own village government. Until that time they had been governed by the township organization. A voting to incorporate was held at that time and officers were elected. The Legislature was petitioned and that body passed an act to be in force in 1865 authorizing the incorporation, ratifying the election of officers, and giving the legal location in Cook and Lake Counties.

The Elgin, Joliet and Eastern Railroad, the Chicago Outer Belt Line, was laid through Barrington Center in 1889.

After several bad fires, a waterworks system was installed followed by an organized fire department. That same year a new village hall was erected, the village lighted with electricity, and the telephone extended to Barrington.

A country school house had been here when the village was laid out, but another was built on South Hough street in 1855. The first sewer system was constructed in 1925. Barrington saw its first paved streets during this era and the park system was organized.

There had been two churches at "Barrington Center" and the Evangelical at Deer Grove. The first church settlements were the Methodist, Baptists, St. Paul's Evangelical, Zion Evangelical and St. Anne's Catholic in that order.

The Health ordinance was adopted and the Board appointed in 1948.






