MINUTES OF A PUBLIC MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF NORTH BARRINGTON, HELD ON OCTOBER 26, 1970, AT THE NORTH BARRINGTON SCHOOL IN SAID VILLAGE

President Caldwell announced that a brief executive session would be held at the close of the public meeting.

Clerk Tingleff called the roll; President Caldwell led a brief meditation. Clerk Tingleff pointed out that the name of George Davis had been inadvertently omitted from the Roads & Public Utilities committee listed on page 4 of the minutes of September 28, 1970, Trustee Carlson moved that the minutes of the meeting of September 28, 1970, be approved as corrected; seconded by Trustee Saville and passed unanimously.

President Caldwell referred to a letter from the League of Women Voters of Barrington appointing Mrs. Robert G. Cragg as an official observer at our Village meetings and welcomed Mrs. Cragg to this meeting.

### VILLAGE OFFICERS

TREASURER - Treasurer Ypelaar presented a Treasurer's Report for the period ending October 26, 1970, showing balances as follows:

Trustee Davis moved adoption of the Treasurer's Report; seconded by Trustee Boynton and passed unanimously.

Treasurer Ypelaar then presented a comparison of expenditures vs. budget showing expenditures approved through September 30, 1970.

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<u>CLERK</u> - Clerk Tingleff presented three vouchers for payment from the general corporate fund totaling \$11,160.25. Trustee Forrest moved to approve payment; seconded by Trustee Saville.

The President declared the motion carried.

<u>POLICE</u> - Chief Svacha presented a report of police activities through September, 1970.

President Caldwell presented Resolution No. 328 reappointing Joseph E. Hammer a member and chairman of the Board of Appeals of the Village of North Barrington for a five year term expiring October 28, 1975. Trustee Boynton moved adoption of Resolution No. 328; seconded by Trustee Davis and passed unanimously.

President Caldwell then presented Resolution No. 329 appointing Lloyd Wileman as Superintendent of Roads of the Village of North Barrington for the unexpired term of John Talbot who is now a Trustee. Trustee Forrest moved adoption of Resolution No. 329; seconded by Trustee Saville and passed unanimously. Clerk Tingleff then administered the oath of office to Lloyd Wileman.

ROADS - President Caldwell reported for former Road Superintendent and Trustee Talbot that the Signal Hill resurfacing was complete; that the MFT work was complete with the exception of a culvert repair on Golfview; that certain patching and minor repair work had been arranged for, including Seminole Dr. and Homewood; that the snow removal contract and insurance certificate were due and that the rates were expected to be only slightly higher than last year's contract; that no report letter had as yet been received from Wight Consulting Engineers on Concord Lane; and that a contract had been let for removing the stump in Woodland and resurfacing the road. Superintendent Wileman reported on the traffic hazards which might result from the washing of gravel from Pine Woods Drive and stated his intentions of taking this situation up with the developer.

BUILDING AND ZONING - Officer Ray gave a brief report on Building and Zoning Office activity during September. President Caldwell announced that there was no final draft of proposed Ordinance No. 7.9 available for this meeting.

<u>PLAN COMMISSION</u> - President Caldwell announced that the Plan Commission had met this past month, and from their minutes announced with regard to the Frydenlund annexation application that this matter had been referred to a subcommittee for investigation; that with regard to the widening of Route 59, the commission had scheduled a meeting with the State Highway Department in order to receive their comments before making a statement and that he had written to the Northeastern Illinois Plan Commission stating that North

Barrington intended to comment on the project, but would require more than the 20 days allotted and that he would write again requesting still more time; and that progress is being made on the Village map.

HEALTH AND SANITATION - Trustee Saville gave a brief report on the Health Department activity through October 26, 1970, calling attention to the fact that there had been no new complaints. He also announced that Lake County was going to make tests on the North Creek at Kimberly and at Biltmore Drive on October 27, 1970.

PARKS - Trustee Carlson reported that Superintendent Woodhull had erected goal posts and benches on the sports field and that the parks were being used by many citizens at this time; and that he was unable to get any bids from contractors for the clearing of Indian Creek. Trustee Saville moved that in lieu of a professional program to clear Indian Creek, a Volunteer Day be declared for November 7, 1970, at 9:00 A. M., and help be solicited through the news media; seconded by Trustee Boynton and passed unanimously.

### COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD

Building, Health and Sanitation - Trustee Saville again presented copies of a smoke emission ordinance now in effect in other villages and moved to approve this ordinance in principle and to have it prepared in ordinance form applicable to the Village of North Barrington for consideration at the November meeting; seconded by Trustee Forrest and passed unanimously. He also suggested citizens be informed as to the acceptable methods to be used when burning leaves, etc. President Caldwell announced that the revised Health and Sanitation Ordinance was being typed.

<u>Police</u>, <u>Fire</u> and <u>Public Safety</u> - Trustee Boynton announced that a committee meeting had been held with the following matters being considered:

- 1. Mini-bikes, go-karts, snowmobiles, garden tractors--Since state laws prohibit these unlicensed motor vehicles from using roads, there is no need for further regulations concerning them by the Village. Trustee Boynton moved that the attention of citizens of North Barrington be called to the existence of these State laws and our obligation to enforce them, in the covering letter with the Village vehicle license application soon to be mailed; seconded by Trustee Forrest and passed unanimously.
- 2. Signs on Osage Dr., Mohawk Dr., and Seminole Dr. at Signal Hill Road--A meeting had been held with the Traffic Engineer of the State Highway Department to hear his comments on the matter. Trustee Boynton moved that an ordinance be drafted calling for "Yield" signs to be installed on Osage Dr., Mohawk Dr., and Seminole Dr. at Signal Hill Road; seconded by Trustee Saville and passed unanimously. Trustee Boynton has also asked the Police to use more radar in an attempt to slow the speed of traffic on Signal Hill Road.
- 3. Dog Ordinance--The following scale was suggested for fines as they relate to the dog ordinance: 1st offense--\$5 \$25

2nd offense--\$25 - \$50

3rd offense--\$50 - \$250

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Trustee Boynton moved that the sliding scale of fines be approved and that an amendment of Ordinance No. 67 be prepared to include this scale; seconded by Trustee Carlson and passed unanimously.

<u>Planning and Zoning</u> - Trustee Forrest reported on the status of the Lake County Zoning Ordinance Proposed "Second" Planned Development Amendment indicating the conservation philosophy seemed to be receiving increasing support; and on the September 3, 1970, meeting of the Zoning Commission of the State of Illinois.

<u>Parks and Auxiliary Services</u> - Trustee Carlson reported that a committee meeting had been held with regard to consolidating all the Village insurance policies and that an agent had been decided upon who is now to give them a concrete proposal.

Barrington Area Council of Governments - President Caldwell gave a brief history of the structure and activities of the BACOG and called attention to an outline of a proposal for the preparation of a comprehensive policies plan for the Barrington area. He also noted that the final billing for the 1970-71 assessments were approved at the September 29, 1970, meeting of the BACOG Executive Board with North Barrington's share being 9.4% or \$1504.00. Trustee Boynton moved to approve payment of \$1504.00 to BACOG to complete payment of North Barrington's share of the 1970-71 budget; seconded by Trustee Davis.

### NEW BUSINESS

President Caldwell made the following announcements:

- 1. Copies of the Lake County Planning Commission's Natural Resources Study #1 and #2 are available and will be distributed with the minutes of this meeting.
- 2. The next meeting of the Illinois Municipal Problems Commission will be on November 12, 1970, at 10:00 A. M. at the Sheraton-O'Hare.

Trustee Davis announced that he had received a request from Illinois Bell Telephone Co. for permission to install underground cable. This permission will be granted.

President Caldwell reported that he had been contacted with regard to the cooperation of the Village in construction of a temporary hockey rink on Honey Lake. The trustees concurred in his opinion that if a permit were necessary, it be granted without charge for this community activity.

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### HEARING OF CITIZENS

Joseph E. Hammer congratulated the Board of Trustees for their unanimous vote to approve additional funds for BACOG.

The League of Women Voters of Barrington sent notice of their November meeting to be held at the 1st National Bank on November 5, 1970, at 1:00 P. M., with Dr. Donald Hanson from the University of Illinois, Chicago Circle Campus, as speaker

At 10:00 P. M. Trustee Boynton moved that the meeting be adjourned; seconded by Trustee Davis and passed unanimously. The Board then went into executive session.
