Pursuant to Resolution No. 257 this meeting is being held on the 16th of December in lieu of the 23rd because the school will be closed on the 23rd.

Trustee Forrest moved to approve the minutes of the November 25, 1968 meeting - seconded by Trustee Schulke - and passed unanimously.

President Anderson advised he had received a report from the local hospital planning group. He said Carl O. Anderson has reported that some findings have occurred in the past few weeks which make it improper to discuss it at this time. He said things are looking in a favorable direction and asked if the Village of North Barrington would entertain an audience at the next board meeting. A letter will be written to Mr. Carl O. Anderson that there is considerable interest.

OFFICERS' REPORTS

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TREASURER: Mr. Harold Gerry reported balances at December 16, 1968 as follows:

Corporate Fund \$9,821.25
Indemnity Deposits 4,000.00
Motor Fuel Tax Fund 15,466.96
Police Contribution Fund 202.38

Pursuant to suggestion made by Trustee Jablonski, the indemnity deposits have been indicated separately.

Treasurer Gerry said he had conferred with Putta & Kelsey C.P.A's as to the particular treatment and use of revenue from motor vehicle licenses and was informed that so long as the disbursements for road maintenance exceeded the total of the vehicle license fee funds and Road and Bridge tax, nothing need be done to allocate the funds.

Treasurer Gerry also reported that he had just received a check which he had previously issued to O'Malley & McKay for police insurance in the sum of \$557.48. The insurance company did not produce a policy and check has been cancelled. The board will tonight be requested to ratify another premium for a lesser amount. The amount of the cancelled check has been added to the bank balance in the current report.

Trustee Schulke moved to approve the Treasurer's report - seconded by Trustee Davis -

By roll call vote: AYES: Trustees Davis, Forrest and Schülke. President Anderson.

NAYS: None

ABSENT: Trustees Gross, Jablonski and Krumlinde.

The President declared the motion carried.

<u>VILLAGE CLERK:</u> The clerk submitted invoices payable from the Corporate Fund in amount \$2,231.62. Trustee Schulke moved to approve payment - seconded by Trustee Davis -

By roll call vote: AYES: Messrs. Davis, Forrest, Schulke and Anderson

NAYS: None

ABSENT: Messrs. Gross, Jablonski and Krumlinde.

The President declared the motion carried.

The clerk submitted invoices payable from the Motor Fuel Tax Fund in amount \$7,282.61. Trustee Schulke moved to approve payment - seconded by Trustee Davis -

By roll call vote: AYES: Messrs. Davis, Forrest, Schulke and Anderson

NAYS: None

ABSENT: Messrs. Gross, Jablonski and Krumlinde.

The President declared the motion carried.

<u>POLICE:</u> Chief Swacha reported a number of incidents and complaints processed, and discussed the change in format in reporting police incidents.

HEALTH OFFICER: No report.

ROADS: No report.

BUILDING OFFICER: No report.

PARKS & AUXILIARY SERVICES: No report.

MOSQUITO ABATEMENT: Mr. L. M. Palmer is leaving the area in the middle of January and a successor is being considered.

<u>CIVIL DEFENSE:</u> Chief Swacha reported that the weather alarm radio - approved for purchase in November - is in operation and the department is monitoring for any dangerous weather.

BOARD OF APPEALS: At the November 25, 1968 board meeting Chairman Caldwell submitted two petitions for zoning variation, with recommendation the Board of Trustees allow the petitions. Board action on the two petitions was deferred to the December meeting to enable the trustees to study them thoroughly before making a determination -

1. Petition of JOHN A. DENKER to allow division of his property consisting of lots 1 through 9 and part of the west half of the vacated portion of Hawthorne Road adjoining the east property line of lots 7, 8, and 9 in Block 4, Unit 2 - Biltmore Country Estates into Parcel "A" comprising approximately 35,000 sq. ft., and already containing the single family dwelling known as 301 Glen Circle - and - Parcel "B" comprising approximately 44,000 sq. ft. vacant. This petition was first filed in October, 1966, at which time Hawthorne Road had not been vacated and the area of Parcel "B" was only 39,000 sq. ft. Action was deferred pending some move to increase the area of at least one of the parcels to over 40,000 sq. ft. This was accomplished by the recent addition of approximately 5,000 sq. ft. to Parcel "B" from the vacation of a portion of Hawthorne Road.

As there was no adverse testimony at the public hearing, and after due consideration, the Board of Appeals recommends approval of the petition of John A. Denker.

President Anderson inquired if Mr. Denker had sold Parcel "B" - the vacant property involved in the petition - to Mrs. W. A. Pertl, one of the petitioners for vacation of a portion of Hawthorne Road. He said he had been contacted by a realtor relative to the purchase of the Pertl property and the application and division of the vacated Hawthorne Road property. Mr. Denker confirmed that he had sold the property to Mrs. Pertl, but had no knowledge of the planned application of the vacated Hawthorne Road property.

After discussion Trustee Schulke moved to concur with the recommendation of the Board of Appeals to allow Mr. John A. Denker's petition - seconded by Trustee Davis -

By roll call vote: AYES - Trustees Davis, Forrest and Schulke. President Anderson.

NAYS - None

ABSENT - Trustees Gross - Jablonski - and Krumlinde.

The President declared the motion carried.

2. Petition of JAMES M. RAY for variation in the application of the Zoning Ordinance to property known as 590 Crooked Lane, and consisting of lots 36, 37 and 38 and part of the east half of vacated road known as Sunset Drive adjoining the west property line of said lot 38 in Block 20, Unit 2 - Biltmore Country Estates - to allow him to utilize said property for a single family residence. The property is vacant and comprises 32,000 sq. ft., in the R3 zone requiring 40,000 sq. ft. There is no vacant property adjoining the property covered by the petition.

As there was no adverse testimony at the public hearing, and after careful consideration, the Board of Appeals recommends approval of the petition of James M. Ray.

After discussion Trustee Forrest moved to concur with the recommendation of the Board of Appeals to approve the petition - seconded by Trustee Davis -

By roll call vote: AYES - Trustees Davis, Forrest and Schulke President Anderson.

NAYS - None ABSENT - Trustees Gross, Jablonski and Krumlinde.

Trustee Forrest moved adoption of Resolution 259.1 - seconded by Trustee Schulke and passed unanimously.

The President presented plaques to Dr. Jack D. Noyes, John A. Denker and Robert J. Kerr, who were present.

TRUSTEE COMMITTEE REPORTS:

FINANCE & LAW: Trustee Schulke advised that the Finance Committee had reviewed the financial position of the Village and the availability of funds to support the Village participation in Phase II of the Barton-Aschman engineering study for the Barrington Area Development Council, He said - after careful study of expenditures through November 30 - adequate funds were found in the Plan Commission account, and as a result the committee recommends that the Village provide \$1,500 support for Phase II of the Barton-Aschman project. He further advised that this would leave adequate funds to allow the Plan Commission to function for the balance of the year.

After discussion, Trustee Schulke moved to approve an amount of \$1,500 for Phase II of the B/A Study - seconded by Trustee Forrest -

By roll - AYES: Trustees Davis, Forrest and Schulke. President Anderson. NAYS: None ABSENT: Trustees Gross, Jablonski and Krumlinde.

The President declared the motion carried.

President Anderson read a letter from the President of School District #4, dated December 13, 1968, recommending that the Village adopt a resolution to support the Barrington Area Development Councill After discussion it was the consensus that the Village of North Barrington is financially supporting the BADC, and the resolution is not necessary.

The President also advised that he has been informed that the school facilities will not be available for the regular meeting on the fourth Monday in March. He then submitted Resolution No. 262 designating March 31, 1969 in lieu of March 24, 1969 for the regular Board of Trustees meeting. Trustee Schulke moved to adopt Resolution No. 262 - seconded by Trustee Davis and passed unanimously.

POLICE, FIRE & PUBLIC SAFETY:

On recommendation of Chief R. E. Svacha, the President submitted Resolution No. 261, providing for the appointment of Joel F. Klukan as a Special Policeman for a term of two years. Trustee Forrest moved to adopt Resolution No. 261 and to confirm the President's appointment of Mr. Klukan - seconded by Trustee Schulke and passed unanimously.

The President read his preliminary report of the police study being made with the Barrington Village Manager and the Barrington Police Officials. After further study a report will be presented for discussion of present and potentital police protection services.

BUILDING - HEALTH & SANITATION: No report.

ROADS & PUBLIC UTILITIES - No report.

PARKS & AUXILIARY SERVICES - No report.

PLANNING & ZONING: - The President reported the Plan Commission will meet after the holidays on flood plain zoning.
