MINUTES OF A PUBLIC MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF NORTH BARRINGTON, HELD ON DECEMBER 18, 1972, AT THE NORTH BARRINGTON SCHOOL IN SAID VILLAGE

Clerk Tingleff called the roll. Acting President Schulke paused for a moment of silence in respect to the memory of Deputy Building Officer Frank Fenner who passed away this morning.

Trustee Cragg moved that the minutes of the meeting of November 27, 1972, be approved as prepared; seconded by Trustee Carlson and passed unanimously.

Acting President Schulke read a letter from Mr. Frank Stephenson asking that his resignation from the Board of Appeals be accepted immediately. Trustee Forrest moved to accept the resignation of Frank Stephenson from the Board of Appeals with regret; seconded by Trustee Cragg and passed unanimously.

Acting President Schulke stated that he had mailed to the Trustees brief resumes on Charles Newgent to fill a vacancy on the Plan Commission and Marvin English and Mrs. Anne Heffner to fill vacancies on the Board of Appeals. After discussion, Trustee Forrest moved adoption of Resolution No. 379 appointing Charles M. Newgent a member of the Plan Commission of the Village of North Barrington; seconded by Trustee Carlson and passed unanimously.

Acting President Schulke will have the other candidates present at the next meeting to meet the Trustees.

VILLAGE OFFICERS

TREASURER - Treasurer Ypelaar presented a Treasurer's Report for the period ending November 30, 1972, showing balances as follows:

Trustee Carlson moved adoption of the Treasurer's Report; seconded by Trustee Cragg.

The Acting President declared the motion carried.

Treasurer Ypelaar then presented the "Flash Report" of receipts and expenditures for the period December 1 through 14, 1972, a comparison of interest earned to date with prior years, and announced that the Revenue Sharing check had been received in the amount of \$2,296.00 and that he had opened a special checking account for this money and subsequent allotments. After discussion of the latter matter, Acting President Schulke asked that the Committee on Finance and Law make specific recommendations on the spending of the Revenue Sharing funds at the January meeting.

<u>CLERK</u> - Clerk Tingleff presented two vouchers for payment from the general corporate fund totaling \$2,198.53. After discussion, Trustee Forrest moved to approve payment; seconded by Trustee Carlson.

The Acting President declared the motion carried.

<u>POLICE</u> - Police Chief Svacha announced that the supplies had been received for use in the Operation Identification program and would be explained in the forthcoming newsletter.

<u>ROADS</u> - Superintendent Wileman reported that numerous telephone calls were being received from the citizens of North Barrington regarding the condition of the Village roads as a result of recent snow and ice storms. He stated that everything possible was being done to treat the roads under the terms of the present contract and at the present budget figure and that he could see only three alternatives (i.e. start plowing when only a covering of snow was present, sand solidly all the roads in the Village, use pure salt) to the present program, all of which would require a change in the contract and would increase costs considerably. After discussion, the Trustees concurred that no change in the contract was desirable at the present time and that an effort should be made to educate the citizens concerning winter driving.

Trustee Ofsthun arrived for the meeting.

<u>PLAN COMMISSION</u> - Acting President Schulke presented the minutes of the last Plan Commission meeting held on December 5, 1972, calling special attention to the discussions on the proposed development of the Lechner Annexation by Mr. J. Albright, the proposed division of the Martin Kelly property at 380 N. Highway 59, and the petition for County rezoning of the Barton property on Arrowhead Lane. After discussion of the latter matter, noting the request of the Plan Commission that the Village of North Barrington take a strong position against this County rezoning, Resolution No. 380 was presented and Trustee Ofsthun moved adoption; seconded by Trustee Forrest.

The Acting President declared the motion carried.

COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD

Finance and Law - Trustee Cragg presented a preliminary report on the BACOG Shared Services Program and what services the Village of North Barrington could utilize at this time and in the future. After discussion of the matter, Acting President Schulke asked Trustee Cragg to pursue the program further. Trustee Cragg also reported that he should have a recommendation regarding the Village copy machine in January.

<u>Planning and Zoning</u> - Trustee Forrest circulated a letter received from Mr. John W. Wastcoat, President of the Barrington Countryside Association, with regard to Centex-Winston and brought up the the ban on open burning with regard to leaves. After discussion, Acting President Schulke referred the latter matter to the Committee on Parks and Auxiliary Services, suggesting that they work with the Village of Tower Lakes in considering a petition for relief. Trustee Forrest also stated that the Lake County Comprehensive Plan was presently being rewritten; reported that a list of areas in the Village prone to flooding had been prepared and the Village Attorney asked to advise the steps to be taken to meet Federal requirements to allow citizens to apply for Federal Flood Insurance.

Trustee Forrest presented proposed Ordinance No. 88.4, amending the zoning ordinance relative to the raising and keeping of certain animals, stating that the Planning and Zoning Committee was recommending its approval; and stated that the proposed ordinance amending the zoning ordinance relative to trailers, etc. was being re-drafted by the Building Officer and Village Attorney. After discussion on proposed Ordinance No. 88.4, Trustee Cragg moved adoption; seconded by Trustee Carlson.

OLD BUSINESS

Acting President Schulke reported that the Building, Health and Sanitation Committee and the Roads and Public Utilities Committee had held a joint meeting with regard to the flooding of Village areas and had recommended that professional help be secured in developing a program of correction and maintenance.

Acting President Schulke presented proposed Resolution No. 376 allowing a reduction in septic field setbacks for the property at 466 Pine Woods Drive, which had been passed by motion at the October meeting. After a brief discussion, Trustee Carlson moved adoption of Resolution No. 376; seconded by Trustee Ofsthun.

At 10:05 P. M. Trustee Cragg moved that the meeting be adjourned; seconded by Trustee Carlson and passed unanimously.
