This special meeting was called due to lack of a quorum at the regular meeting of December 23, 1963. A waiver of notice was signed by all trustees present. The president declared a quorum present and opened the meeting.

Trustee Urick moved the minutes of the December 2, 1963 meeting be accepted as written - seconded by Trustee Schunk and passed unanimously.

OFFICERS' REPORTS:

The treasurer advised that - after discussion with and at the suggestion of the Finance Committee - it is recommended the following adjustments be made of the appropriation by accounts within the total of the budget:

Mr. Keagy also advised the \$400 received from the North Barrington Property Owners Association for the purchase of police radio equipment has previously been shown in Receipts, but it is now properly shown as a credit against expenditures for police equipment. This reduces the police expenditure account to \$1,490 net spent against an appropriation of \$1,730, and correctly reflects the financial condition.

Trustee Krumlinde moved to accept the recommendations of the Finance Committee for the transfers - seconded by Trustee Lafferty and passed unanimously.

Mr. Keagy read letter received from Allan Parsley advising that check for snow-plowing - dated 2/28/63 - amount \$15.00 - had never been received by him, and requesting that duplicate check be issued. Mr. Keagy advised a STOP PAYMENT order was issued and requested Board of Trustees approval to issue duplicate check to Allan Parsley in amount \$15.00. Trustee Forrest so moved - seconded by Trustee Schunk and passed unanimously.

Mr. Keagy requested Board approval to cancellation of a check - in amount \$50.00 - for supervisory and advisory services in connection with the road maintenance program, which was not accepted. Trustee Forrest so moved - seconded by Trustee Lafferty and passed unanimously.

<u>VILIAGE CLERK:</u> The clerk presented invoices for approval totaling \$543.02 - list attached. Trustee Forrest moved for approval of payment - seconded by Trustee Lafferty and passed unanimously.

The Board discussed the Police Contribution Fund and the procedure to be followed in distributing automobile stickers. It was the consensus 1964 will be the final year that contributions to the Police Contribution Fund will be solicited at the time applications for automobile stickers are sent out. The Village budget for 1964 will include essential supplies for the Police Department, which tax funds will not be collected until 1965.

<u>CIVIL DEFENSE</u>: The president discussed the resignation of Mr. Hans Huning as director. Chief Roy Svacha has agreed to act as director, with a deputy to be appointed to serve under his direction. After discussion Trustee Schunk regretfully moved that Mr. Huning's resignation be accepted and that a letter be sent to him expressing the appreciation of the Board for his splendid effort - seconded by Trustee Urick and passed unanimously.

PLAN COMMISSION: No report.

TRUSTEES COMMITTEE REPORTS:

FINANCE & IAW: No report other than the transfers of departmental funds presented by Treasurer Keagy.

PLANNING & ZONING: No report.

Trustee Forrest advised the new Lake County minimum homesite with septic system will be 40,000 sq. ft.

ROADS & PUBLIC UTILITIES: No report.

POLICE, FIRE & PUBLIC SAFETY: No report.

BUILDING REGULATIONS
HEALTH & SANITATION: No report.

The president advised he had written to Trustee Bliss requesting that his committee study Village ordinances relative to the construction of driveways over ditches where culverts are required.

CIVIL DEFENSE: No report.

PARKS & AUXILIARY SERVICES: No report.

OLD BUSINESS: The president reported:

A meeting with the Trustees Committee on Planning and Zoning, the Plan Commission, and the Building Officer - relative to upgrading the minimum zoning, was scheduled for Monday, January 6, 1964. It is now planned to meet on Thursday - January 16.

The Village request for exemption of taxes on the property deeded to the Village by the Home Owners Association is coming up for hearing within the next week. Advice has been received that the Village may be required to pay \$70.00 for the year prior to August, 1962, when the property was deeded to the Village.

NEW BUSINESS:

The president read letter of resignation received from Trustee V. R. Bliss. After discussion Trustee Krumlinde moved that Mr. Bliss' resignation be accepted and that an expression of appreciation for his help and dedication be sent to him. Seconded by Trustee Schunk and passed unanimously. Consideration of a successor to Mr. Bliss will be deferred until the next regular Board meeting.

The president presented Ordinance No. 53 - prepared by Attorney J. Wim Braithwaite - vacating that portion of Rustic Drive abutting the properties of Samuel R. and Helen A. Iewis and Elmer G. and Idabelle M. Gustavson. Relative to remunerative consideration the president advised the Plan Commission determined to charge \$50.00 each to the Iewises and Gustavsons in accordance with the following formula adopted by the Plan Commission at its meeting of December 12, 1963 - (copy excerpted.)

"Each property owner whose lot size would be increased by any part of a vacated street would pay the Village \$50.00 for any area so added up to 30,000 sq. ft., and \$50.00 additional for each additional 10,000 sq. ft. or fraction thereof."

Trustee Forrest moved for concurrence with the formula of the Plan Commission for the vacation of municipal dedicated - unimproved roadways. - Seconded by Trustee Schunk and passed unanimously.

Trustee Krumlinde moved for adoption of Ordinance No. 53 - vacating a portion of Rustic Drive - seconded by Trustee Lafferty -

ABSENT-Trustee Bliss.

Motion carried by more than 2/3 vote.

The president presented Ordinance No. 54 - vacating that portion of Rustic Drive abutting Village property (Leonard Park.) After discussion Trustee Urick moved for adoption of Ordinance No. 54 - seconded by Trustee Lafferty.

ABSENT-V.R.Bliss

Motion carried by more than 2/3 vote.

The president advised a deed to 33 ft. of lot 9 in the Canterbury Hill Subdivision has been received from Michael Graft, owner and developer. Mr. Forrest moved the deed be recognized as being received and filed in the papers on the Graft annexation. Seconded by Mr. Schunk and passed unanimously.

The Board discussed the Human Relations Council and it was the consensus no action would be taken.

Trustee Forrest presented for consideration request of the Northeastern Illinois Metropolitan Area Planning Commission for Village participation at a \$50.00 fee. After discussion Trustee Forrest moved a \$25.00 voluntary contribution be made for 1964 - and since the Plan Commission may benefit from the informative literature distributed by the Northeastern Illinois Metropolitan Area Planning Commission the amount be charged against that appropriation - seconded by Trustee Schunk and passed unanimously.

The president advised he, and Mayor J. H. D. Blanke of the Village of Barrington, had conferred with Mr. Robert Berryhill, Manager of the Barrington Office of Illinois Bell relative to the five minute rate enjoyed by Palatine and other municipalities within the Chicago Metropolitan rate area. It was learned all

telephone rates in the State of Illinois are published. The Chicago Metropolitan Area takes in a radius of 30 miles and anything within the radius has variable rates: over 5 miles - 10 - 15 - 20 - 25, and each has a different rate, but all have a 5-minute initial period. Palatine falls within the radius - Barrington is outside and has a 3-minute initial period. Barrington, however, is included in another metropolitan area - The Dunkirk exchange area - and the Illinois Bell Telephone Company hopes to enlarge the area within the next 2 or 3 years so as to encompass all or most of Cuba Township.
