BUILDING OFFICER: In the absence of Mr. R. J. Kerr, the President read Mr. Kerr's letter, dated January 25, 1965, addressed to the Trustees relative to application for a septic system proposed by Mr. William Vale on Lakeview Place which, to allow for 50% reserve would require a sewage ejector system for that reserve. Mr. Kerr outlined his reasons for requesting that a "condition" be attached to the permit to protect future owners. Mr. Vale, who was present, advised the board that because of the concern of everyone involved relative to the proposed system he had made a further study and had learned that if he re-placed and elevated his proposed home he could meet the required 50% reserve within his property without the sewage ejector system. He will present the new plat and design to the Building Officer for consideration. The Board assured Mr. Vale of their desire to be of assistance within the bounds of good planning and administration.

HEALTH OFFICER: Dr. Ann Barlow reported two complaints registered - both of which are repeats. However, at the time of inspection - because of the frozen ground - both checked O.K. Another inspection will be made at a later date.

Dr. Barlow commented on the dogs running loose, causing damage and harming and frightening children. After discussion it was the consensus that the problem has now reached the point where some action must be taken. Trustee Krumlinde will confer with Chief Svacha and the members of the Police Department to prepare recommendations for consideration of the Board within the next 60 days.

The President reported that Mr. Davis obtained bids to repair the culverts on Biltmore Drive and Signal Hill Road damaged in automobile accidents and settlement of claims for damages has been made by the insurance companies.

On January 20, 1965 bills totaling \$67.00 were received from the Biltmore Country Club covering the removal of concrete from the creek as a result of the damaged abutment on Biltmore Drive. The bills have been returned to the Club with recommendation they attempt to make settlement with the surety since the Village of North Barrington had no knowledge that the work had been performed - no authority was given by proper Village officers to have the work done - and settlement of the Village claim has already been made.

The President advised that as a result of trips he had made to Elgin and Libertyville, and discussion with officers of the State and County Departments of Highways - - -

- 1 A "Slow-Curve" sign has been erected on Highway 59 north of Highway 22 and the Village name and population sign has been moved to the farthest extremes of the Village.
- 2 Consideration will be given to installing rumble strips on Miller Road at Highway 59 to alert motorists to the fast cross traffic.
- 3 Consideration will be given to installation of a third lane on Highway 59 from a point north of Miller Road to south of Golfview to enable safer ingress and egress to and from the highway. A traffic count will be necessary before a decision will be reached.

The Board discussed the light proposed for installation at the Miller Road - Highway 59 intersection. Action was deferred until Board members have observed similar installations.
