SPECIAL MEETING - January 28, 1960

A special meeting was called by the president for the purpose of passing the Zoning Ordinance which was presented at the public hearing on January 25, 1960.

A motion was made by Mr. Hutchinson to accept the ordinance as set forth. Seconded by Mr. Krumlinde

9 Mr. Anderson presented to the Board a request from Tower Lakes for permission to incorporate. A motion was made by Mr. Urick that in giving consent we ask Tower Lakes for a letter stating that they will conform to the Village of North Barrington zoning regulations. Seconded by Mr. Dattilo.

By roll in favor: Messrs. Bliss, Dattilo, Forrest, Hutchinson, Krumlinde, Urick and Anderson.

Not in favor: None.

Mr. Bliss informed the Board he will finish the public relations letter, to be sent to all home owners, within the next few days. It was decided to defer discussion on the proposed annexation until after Mr. Bliss' letter has been circulated.

10 Mr. Anderson, along with Messrs. Magner and Svacha, called on the Chief of Police of Barrington, Mr. Smith, and discussed with him matters of police procedure, and the possibility of the Village of North Barrington using the Barrington jail if the need arises. Mr. Anderson reported fine co-operation on the part of Chief Smith and proposed that the Board consider the use of the Barrington jail. Mr. Bliss made a motion that the Village of North Barrington use the jail when necessary.

By roll in favor: Messrs. Bliss, Dattilo, Forrest, Hutchinson, Krumlinde, Urick and Anderson.

Mr. Anderson reported on the regulations governing voluntary police. Mr. Bliss made a motion to call the deputies of North Barrington "Special Police". Seconded by Mr. Krumlinde.

It was decided the special police should be bonded.

After discussion about the speed and traffic on Route 59, and the number of accidents which have occurred, it was decided to investigate posting the area as follows:

45 mile speed limit between Signal Hill Road and Miller Road.

20 mile speed limit in school area.

Install yellow "no passing" line.
