### VILLAGE OF NORTH BARRINGTON

MINUTES OF PUBLIC MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF NORTH BARRINGTON, HELD ON FEBRUARY 26, 1968, AT THE NORTH BARRINGTON SCHOOL IN SAID VILLAGE.

8:15 P.M. PRESENT: Trustees Cutler, Davis, Jablonski and Schulke President Anderson - Clerk G. Scharfenberg

Trustee Cutler moved the minutes of the January 22, 1968 minutes be accepted - seconded by Trustee Jablonski and passed unanimously.

### OFFICERS' REPORTS:

TREASURER: Treasurer Gerry reported balances as of February 26, 1968 as follows:

Trustee Cutler moved acceptance of the Treasurer's report - seconded by Trustee Schulke -

By roll call vote: AYES: Trustees Cutler, Davis, Jablonski and Schulke NAYS: None ABSENT: Trustees Forrest and Krumlinde

The President declared the motion carried.

<u>VILLAGE CLERK:</u> The clerk presented invoices for approval totaling \$1,374.24 from the Corporate Fund. Trustee Schulke moved to approve payment - seconded by Trustee Cutler -

By roll call vote: AYES: Trustees Cutler, Davis, Jablonski and Schulke NAYS: None ABSENT: Trustees Forrest and Krumlinde.

The President declared the motion carried.

The clerk presented invoices totaling \$3,143.10 for payment from the Motor Fuel Tax account. Trustee Schulke moved to approve payment - seconded by Trustee Cutler -

By roll call vote - AYES: Trustees Cutler, Davis, Jablonski and Schulke NAYE: None ABSENT: Trustees Forrest and Krumlinde

The President declared the motion carried.

<u>POLICE:</u> In the absence of Chief Svacha a full police report will be submitted at the next meeting.

HEALTH OFFICER: The President reported notices had been received from Lake County Health Department on four faulty septic systems. Dr. Olson will follow for correction of the systems.

ROADS: Supt. C. M. Newgent reported -

Additional guard rails will be installed before the end of the fiscal year, and even with this additional cost the road program will be well within the budget. All Village streams will be protected by guard rails except at Honey Lake, which will be a major undertaking.

It is expected that street identification signs will be installed shortly. Weather permitting, Rydin Sign Company expects to do the work within the next two or three weeks.

Mr. Newgent discussed traffic signs and advised it is his opinion the purchase and placement, as well as maintenance, of traffic signs should be the responsibility of the Road Department and not the Police Department. A survey will be made and a program pursued.

Mr. Newgent discussed the road maintenance and reconstruction program submitted by Wight Consulting Engineers. The 1968 budget submitted for the Road Department is based substantially on the Wight recommendations for the 1968/69 season.

Mr. Wight is starting preliminary work on the Motor Fuel Tax papers so as to get an early start in the season, and Mr. Newgent asked Board of Trustees authorization for this preliminary work. After discussion Trustee Cutler moved to authorize Wight Engineers to proceed with preliminary proposal and paper work on the 1968 program only, as set forth in their report - seconded by Trustee Schulke and passed unanimously.

Mr. Newgent will arrange to set up a meeting of the Trustees Committee on Roads, Building Officer Milton Schwartz, and a member of the Wight Engineering organization to discuss their proposal for improving the intersection at Signal Hill Road and Honey Lake Road.

BUILDING OFFICER: Mr. Milton Schwartz reported several applications for permits pending.

Mr. Schwartz again discussed the benefits to be derived from membership in the Building Officials Conference of America, Inc. Membership fees, he believes, are \$125.00 or \$150.00. The President proposed that Mr. Schwartz be granted membership for an amount not to exceed \$150.00. Trustee Schulke so moved - seconded by Trustee Cutler - and passed unanimously.

Mr. Schwartz discussed the Indian artifacts to be found in the area and submitted a notice he proposed to give to contractors and excavators with building applications, requesting that the Chicago Archaeological Society be given the opportunity to record the sites before they are destroyed forever, and that they be informed if arrowheads and beads etc., are found. Trustee Cutler moved to authorize the notice to contractors - seconded by Trustee Schulke and passed unanimously.

PARKS: No report.

When the Elementary School Board inquired about the zoned school site in the Village, President Anderson reported he met with Mr. Jack Mervis to reaffirm the acreage which had been dedicated by the Mervis family for school site in the Old Oak Subdivision. Mr. Mervis reaffirmed that the site is dedicated for school purposes and if the school board is not interested in the property for a school it will be deeded to the Village for recreational purposes.

### MOSQUITO ABATEMENT:

The President submitted the proposed contract with Clarke Outdoor Spraying Inc. for the 1968 season -

After discussion Trustee Schulke moved to approve the contract for a dry summer in amount \$2,451.00, with the understanding that additional foggings will be requested if needed. Seconded by Trustee Davis and passed unanimously.

FIRE COMMISSIONER: No report.

CIVIL DEFENSE: No report.

<u>PLAN COMMISSION:</u> The President reported that Ken Schmid has submitted a petition for a Planned Development of his property, which is now under consideration by the Plan Commission. Public hearing is scheduled for Saturday, March 30, 1968.

### BOARD OF APPEALS:

The President reported two cases are under consideration at the moment on which public hearings will be held.

LAW: No report.

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FINANCE & LAW - A meeting of the Budget Committee is tentatively set for March 18, 1968.

The President submitted Resolution No. 236 - a resolution to designate Village depository and check signers and co-signers on checks drawn. The Treasurer is authorized to sign checks in amounts up to and including \$250.00 - the Treasurer and President will sign checks in amounts over \$250.00. During prolonged absence of the President the chairman of the Trustees Committee on Finance and Law will sign in place of the President. Trustee Cutler moved the adoption of Resolution No. 236 - seconded by Trustee Jablonski and passed unanimously.

### POLICE, FIRE AND PUBLIC SAFETY:

President Anderson advised he had met with Trustee G.E. Davis, Chief of Police Roy E. Svacha, and Fire Commissioner Walter Webster to discuss security measures for the Village and the proposed program for additional police patrols, payment for additional time for patrols, and improved organization. Trustee Davis discussed the proposed plan, and advised that in the absence of Trustee Krumlinde actual figures were not available. After discussion Trustee Schulke moved to concur in the general policy to compensate police officers - seconded by Trustee Cutler and passed unanimously. The Board will review the proposed plan at the next Board meeting when actual facts and figures are available.

### GENERAL:

The President advised that the zoning variation of the Campbell property on Signal Hill Road, on which the Board of Trustees concurred with the Board of Appeals recommendation for acceptance on October 23, 1967, had been referred to the Village Attorney for an ordinance. President Anderson submitted Ordinance No. 91 granting variation in use to allow the owner to utilize said property as one building lot pursuant to the R1 (5 acre) zoning district of the Village, notwithstanding the fact that said property comprises 4.473 acres. Trustee Cutler moved to adopt Ordinance No. 91 seconded by Trustee Jablonski -

By roll call vote: AYES; Trustees Cutler, Davis, Jablonski and Schulke NAYS: None ABSENT: Trustees Forrest and Krumlinde

The President declared the motion carried.

The President again discussed the request of the Barrington Area Development Council for unqualified finance support of \$1.00 per capita. After discussion Trustee Cutler moved to approve Resolution No. 233 for unqualified support to the Barrington Area Development Council - seconded by Trustee Schulke -

By roll call vote: AYES: Trustees Cutler, Davis, Jablonski and Schulke NAYS: None ABSENT: Trustees Forrest and Krumlinde.

The President declared the motion carried.
