Clerk Tingleff called the roll; President Caldwell led a brief meditation.

President Caldwell announced that copies of the agenda were available for those in the audience and that a packet of additional material was also being circulated, to be retained by the press representative at the close of the meeting.

Treasurer Ypelaar pointed out that the balance in the Police Fund listed on page 1 of the minutes of March 22, 1971, should read \$286.73. Trustee Forrest moved that the minutes of the meeting of March 22, 1971, be approved as corrected; seconded by Trustee Talbot and passed unanimously.

#### VILLAGE OFFICERS

TREASURER - Treasurer Ypelaar presented a Treasurer's Report for the period ending March 31, 1971, showing balances as follows:

Trustee Talbot moved adoption of the Treasurer's Report; seconded by Trustee Carlson.

The President declared the motion carried.

Treasurer Ypelaar then presented a "Flash Report" of receipts and expenditures for the period April 1 through April 19. This new report will be presented monthly, with the transactions included in the Treasurer's Report given the following month. Page 2 Minutes of 4/26/71

Treasurer Ypelaar then announced that the year end report was completed and being typed.

<u>CLERK</u> - Clerk Tingleff presented four vouchers for payment from the general corporate fund totaling \$2,833.68. Trustee Carlson moved to approve payment; seconded by Trustee Boynton.

The President declared the motion carried.

President Caldwell appointed the Board of Trustees as the Canvassing Board for the general municipal election held on April 20, 1971. The returns of the election were submitted to the board and after the canvass it was declared that the tally showed the correct number of voters and the results were as follows:

President Caldwell then presented proposed Resolution No. 343 relative to the 1971 Village Election. Trustee Boynton moved adoption of Resolution No. 343; seconded by Trustee Davis.

By roll: Ayes: Trustees Boynton, Carlson, Davis, Forrest and Talbot Nays: None Absent: Trustee Saville

The President declared the motion carried.

Clerk Tingleff reminded the Board of the long hours of service put in by the five judges who worked at the election and a unanimous vote of thanks to the judges for their service to the Village was moved and seconded by the Trustees.

Retiring Trustee Davis then administered the oath of office to the newlyelected President, Elwood F. Caldwell; Clerk, Helen W. Tingleff; and Trustees, Elaine Carlson, Nelson Forrest, John Talbot and Robert G. Cragg.

President Caldwell thanked George Davis for over ten years of service to the Village of North Barrington and presented him with a plaque of appreciation. Page 3 Minutes of 4/26/71

President Caldwell then announced the appointment of the following Trustee Committees to serve for 1971-72:

Finance & Law: Trustees Cragg (Chairman) and Forrest, B. J. Ypelaar

<u>Planning & Zoning</u>: Trustees Forrest (Chairman) and Carlson, W. R. Clarke, J. M. Ray

Roads & Public Utilities: Trustees Talbot (Chairman) and Saville, L. H. Wileman, B. C. Betsworth

Police, Fire & Public Safety: Trustees Boynton (Chairman) and Talbot, R. E. Svacha, D. Zeilstra

Building, Health & Sanitation: Trustees Saville (Chairman) and Boynton, J. M. Ray, J. C. Cameron

Parks & Auxiliary Services: Trustees Carlson (Chairman) and Cragg, C. C. Woodhull

President Caldwell presented proposed Resolution No. 344, designating Village Trustee Robert G. Cragg to replace former Trustee George E. Davis as an authorized co-signer of checks. Trustee Talbot moved adoption of Resolution No. 344; seconded by Trustee Carlson and passed unanimously.

<u>PLAN COMMISSION</u> - President Caldwell announced that at the last meeting of the Plan Commission the following items were discussed:

- 1. The first draft of the new Village Map--has been received and discussed with the draftsman.
- 2. A request for possible annexation of a 10 acre tract.
- 3. Goals and objectives for the BACOG Comprehensive Plan now in preparation.

<u>DEPUTY HEALTH OFFICER</u> - Deputy Health Officer Cameron reported on a meeting attended by Health Officer Saville regarding the County Subregional Wastewater Act. Trustee Forrest moved that letters be sent to State Representatives urging them to give thorough favorable consideration to this County Subregional Wastewater Act; seconded by Trustee Carlson and passed unanimously.

SUPERINTENDENT OF PARKS - Trustee Carlson reported for Superintendent Woodhull that:

- Little League officials had approached him on the possibility of using the baseball field for Little League activities. This was referred by President Caldwell to the Committee on Parks & Auxiliary Services (consisting of Trustees Carlson and Cragg and Superintendent Woodhull).
- 2. Boy Scouts had cleaned the upper part of the creek and President Caldwell was asked to write a letter of appreciation.
- 3. Jonathan Eckert had been hired to take care of mowing Leonard Park and the sports field.
- 4. An early estimate showed that 30-40 trees would have to be removed as a result of Dutch Elm disease this year.

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Former Trustee Davis submitted recommendations on two matters in order to clear up his unfinished work as a trustee. The matter of insurance and permit requirements for work within public right-of-way or easements was referred to the Village Attorney for his recommendations and the matter of permit applications from public utility companies was referred back to the new Committee on Roads and Public Utilities.

#### COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD

Finance and Law - President Caldwell presented proposed Resolution No. 342, authorizing rates of compensation for the Office of Chief or Acting Chief of Police and Police Officers and others. Trustee Boynton moved adoption of Resolution No. 342; seconded by Trustee Talbot.

By roll: Ayes: Trustees Boynton, Carlson, Cragg, Forrest and Talbot Nays: None Absent: Trustee Saville

The President declared the motion carried.

<u>Parks and Auxiliary Services</u> - Trustee Carlson announced that the Workmen's Compensation Insurance policy covering all paid Village employees was now in full effect and that the bonds on the president, clerk and one signing trustee were being prepared at the present time.

#### OLD BUSINESS

President Caldwell presented proposed Ordinance No. 121, a zoning variation ordinance for the property at 297 Oxford Road. Trustee Forrest moved adoption of Ordinance No. 121, seconded by Trustee Carlson.

By roll: Ayes: Trustees Boynton, Carlson, Cragg, Forrest and Talbot Nays: None Absent: Trustee Saville

The President declared the motion carried.

President Caldwell then referred to the proposed statement of goals and objectives for the BACOG Comprehensive Plan now in preparation as presented to the BACOG Executive Board, which has accepted them for consideration. He stated that the Plan Commission of the Village of North Barrington had studied the statement and voted to endorse it subject to certain changes implied in his comments to them. After discussion, Trustee Talbot moved to concur with the proposed statement of goals and objectives for the BACOG Comprehensive Plan as presented to the BACOG Executive Board subject to certain minor changes as follows:

1. In the statement of Goal 1, the reference to "very limited development" should be viewed simply as an emphatic way of designating the "limited development" alternative of the Barton-Aschmann Phase II report as the one toward which BACOG plans and policies should be directed.

2. Objective E under Goal 1 should be interpreted as discouraging multiple family housing in what are now countryside areas, and opposing high

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rise construction throughout the entire BACOG area to the extent that this would imply a type and height of construction other than now permitted by building and zoning codes in Barrington and elsewhere.

3. Clarify Objective G under Goal 1 by striking out the words "(five acres and less)" and rephrasing to indicate that encouragement be provided to lower zoning densities in <u>certain</u> other areas where feasible, not necessarily throughout the whole plan.

4. Rephrase Objective B under Goal 5 to provide that retailing continue to be concentrated <u>primarily</u> within the downtown Barrington area, and that strip commercial zoning of area highways should not be permitted except in conformance with formal plans;

seconded by Trustee Boynton and passed unanimously.

President Caldwell then announced that a court decision had been handed down on April 23, 1971, which freed South Barrington to annex part of the Winston Lakes area.

#### NEW BUSINESS

President Caldwell referred to material sent to all trustees regarding a proposed residential treatment center for children in the Village of Deer Park, indicating that he intended to vote in favor of the proposed location if the BACOG Executive Board was asked to take a position, unless Deer Park itself was opposed. As the trustees concurred with the feelings of Dr. Caldwell on the matter, there was no discussion.

With regard to a request for support from the Village of Winthrop Harbor concerning state park expansion, it was decided that more information on the matter was required.

President Caldwell announced he had received information on a 3-day institute to be held at Illinois Beach State Park in May on zoning. The trustees concurred with his feeling that if someone from North Barrington could attend, the Village would pay the registration and out-of-pocket expenses.

President Caldwell announced that he had received both the Regional Transportation Interim Plan and Program and the Zoning Laws Study Commission final report and that they would be available for review by anyone interested.

President Caldwell then introduced Mr. G. L. Coody who will be assisting Superintendent (now Trustee) Cragg on the Mosquito Abatement program for a while with a view to being named Superintendent of Mosquito Abatement in the near future.

#### HEARING OF CITIZENS

Former Trustee George Davis expressed his pleasure in the way the Village of North Barrington had preserved its open space area and stated his feelings that the best way the people of the community could be served would be as Page 6 Minutes of 4/26/71

follows: maintenance of low density, continued police protection and maintenance of roads--in that order.

At 10:05 P. M. Trustee Boynton moved that the meeting be adjourned; seconded by Trustee Cragg and passed unanimously.
