President Caldwell noted that this was the regular May meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of North Barrington, the date having been changed from May 22, 1972, by vote at the March meeting, with proper notice having been given by newspaper publication and posted at the meeting place and in the Clerk's office.

Clerk Tingleff called the roll. President Caldwell led a brief meditation.

Trustee Talbot moved that the minutes of the meeting of April 24, 1972, be approved as prepared; seconded by Trustee Carlson and passed unanimously.

Clerk Tingleff administered the oath of office to Russell C. Schulke who was appointed as Trustee at the April 24, 1972, meeting.

President Caldwell presented proposed Resolution No. 365 appointing Paul J. Barta as Sergeant of the Police Department of the Village of North Barrington. Trustee Cragg moved adoption of Resolution No. 365; seconded by Trustee Talbot and passed unanimously.

<u>TREASURER</u> - Treasurer Ypelaar presented a Treasurer's Report for the period ending April 30, 1972, showing balances as follows:

Trustee Talbot moved adoption of the Treasurer's Report; seconded by Trustee Carlson.

By roll: Ayes: Trustees Carlson, Cragg, Schulke and Talbot Nays: None Absent: Trustees Forrest and Saville

The President declared the motion carried.

<u>CLERK</u> - Clerk Tingleff presented two vouchers for payment from the general corporate fund totaling \$4,090.11. After discussion, Trustee Talbot moved to approve payment; seconded by Trustee Schulke.

By roll: Ayes: Trustees Carlson, Cragg, Schulke and Talbot Nays: None Absent: Trustees Forrest and Saville

The President declared the motion carried.

Clerk Tingleff presented a voucher for payment from the MFT fund totaling \$731.21. After discussion, Trustee Talbot moved to approve payment; seconded by Trustee Carlson.

By roll: Ayes: Trustees Carlson, Cragg, Schulke and Talbot Nays: None Absent: Trustees Forrest and Saville

The President declared the motion carried.

BOARD OF APPEALS - Chairman Hammer presented the certified minutes of the Board of Appeals hearing of April 21, 1972, and continued to May 11, 1972, containing a resolution passed by the Board of Appeals, dealing with an appeal by D. Glenn and Audrey H. Ofsthun, 170 N. Signal Hill Road, from a decision of the Building and Zoning Officer relative to the construction of a swimming pool enclosure. The resolution recommended that the Board of Trustees approve the issuance of a building permit as requested, subject to strict compliance with the requirements of all ordinances except for those respects in which the enclosure as specified fails to be provided for in the Building Ordinance. After discussion, Trustee Talbot moved that the Board of Trustees concur with the recommendation of the Board of Appeals and direct that an ordinance be prepared giving effect to this if such an ordinance is deemed necessary by the Village Attorney; seconded by Trustee Carlson.

By roll: Ayes: Trustees Carlson, Cragg, Schulke and Talbot Nays: None Absent: Trustees Forrest and Saville

The President declared the motion carried.

President Caldwell referred again to the announcement several months ago of the pending resignation of Trustee Saville and the introduction of D. Glenn Ofsthun as a prospective appointee to fill the unexpired term. He also called attention to the fact that the resignation and appointment were deferred because of a building code variation request pending from Mr. Ofsthun. President Caldwell then read a letter of resignation from Trustee Saville and Page 3 Minutes of 5/15/72

Trustee Talbot moved that the resignation of Trustee Saville be accepted with deep regret and best wishes for a full recovery and return to normal activities; seconded by Trustee Cragg and passed unanimously. Trustee Carlson moved that D. Glenn Ofsthun be appointed to fill the remaining term of Trustee Saville, expiring in April 1973; seconded by Trustee Talbot.

By roll: Ayes: Trustees Carlson, Cragg, Schulke and Talbot and President Caldwell Nays: None Absent: Trustee Forrest

The President declared the motion carried.

Clerk Tingleff administered the oath of office to D. Glenn Ofsthun.

<u>ROADS</u> - Trustee Talbot reported for Superintendent Wileman that bids from four firms had been received on the complete list of projects suggested by Wight Consulting Engineers to be incorporated in the 1972 MFT Contract Maintenance Program. The bids were: Liberty Asphalt - \$12,256.66; Skokie Valley Asphalt - \$13,316.58; Geske & Sons - \$13,351.58; and Peter Baker & Son - \$13,491.24. Trustee Talbot stated that it was the recommendation of Superintendent Wileman and Wight Consulting Engineers that the bid from Liberty Asphalt be accepted. After discussion, Trustee Carlson moved to accept the bid from Liberty Asphalt and award them the contract for the 1972 MFT Contract Maintenance Program and to authorize the signing of the necessary MFT contract documents; seconded by Trustee Schulke.

The President declared the motion carried.

Trustee Talbot further reported the recommendation from Superintendent Wileman that street lights be installed at the intersections of Route 59 with Signal Hill Road, Golfview Drive, Eton Drive and Brookside Road, that the lights at the intersections of Miller Road with Biltmore Drive and Kimberly Road be taken over by the Village from the County, and further that the County be requested to retain the light at Miller Road and Arrowhead Lane, the incremental cost of this program to be \$487.08 per year. After discussion, Trustee Talbot moved to approve the program for street lights on Route 59 and on Miller Road as recommended by the Superintendent of Roads; seconded by Trustee Carlson and passed unanimously.

<u>MOSQUITO ABATEMENT</u> - Superintendent Ritchie recommended that the proposal received from Clarke Outdoor Spraying Company, Inc. for mosquito control for 1972 in the Village of North Barrington at a total cost of \$3,359.00 be accepted. He explained that the program would be basically the same as last year with the addition of two helocopter prehatch treatments of 75 acres of floodwater mosquito breeding areas.

Trustee Forrest arrived for the meeting.

After discussion, Trustee Cragg moved that the contract for the 1972 mosquito control program be awarded to the Clarke Outdoor Spraying Company, Page 4 Minutes of 5/15/72

Inc. in the amount of \$3,359.00, and that the President be authorized to sign the contract subject to receipt of a proper certificate of insurance naming the Village and the Trustees as additional assureds; seconded by Trustee Schulke.

The President declared the motion carried.

<u>PLAN COMMISSION</u> - Chairman Clarke announced that a public hearing with regard to the comprehensive plan ordinance and map will be held at the North Barrington School on May 31, 1972, at 8:00 P. M., with the regular June 6, 1972, meeting of the Plan Commission to be held immediately after the hearing rather than on June 6th.

Chairman Clarke then read that portion of the minutes of the Plan Commission meeting held on April 4, 1972, with regard to a petition for the vacation of portions of Essex and Mockingbird Lanes submitted by John A. and Beverlee J. Denker, in which the Plan Commission recommended to the Board of Trustees that the vacation be granted. President Caldwell called attention to the policy with regard to payment required for road vacations and stated that Mr. Denker was aware of this. After further discussion, Trustee Talbot moved that the Board of Trustees concur with the recommendation of the Plan Commission relative to the petition of John A. and Beverlee J. Denker and direct that an ordinance be prepared to grant the road vacation requested subject to proof of ownership of contiguous property and payment of the required fee of 2 cents per square foot plus the \$50 filing fee already received; seconded by Trustee Carlson.

The President declared the motion carried.

Chairman Clarke announced that copies of the drafts of proposed Ordinances Nos. 88.3 and 88.4 relative to parking of trailers and stabling of horses had been distributed to Plan Commission members and that the subjects would be discussed at their May 31, 1972, meeting.

Chairman Clarke asked that the Board of Trustees consider asking the Electrical Commission to revise the electrical code of the village to include all of the latest in safety requirements. After discussion, Trustee Forrest moved that the Board of Trustees refer to the Electrical Commission the question of updating the village electrical code with regard to the latest in safety requirements; seconded by Trustee Talbot and passed unanimously.

Trustee Cragg moved that the Board of Trustees refer to the Plan Commission the question of a map amendment to rezone the property commonly known as the Biltmore Country Club area from R-1 to C classification and that the Plan Commission hold a public hearing on that question; seconded by Trustee Forrest and passed unanimously.
