Clerk Davis called the roll and President Caldwell led in a brief meditation. Trustee Davis moved that minutes of the meeting of April 27, 1970 be approved as prepared; seconded by Trustee Saville and passed unanimously.

President Caldwell introduced Mrs. Elma Lindfors and J. Walter Gillis, two members of the Barrington Public Library Board, who presented a proposal of the Barrington Library Board to annex the area bounded by the Barrington Area Council of Governments to the Barrington Library District. The Trustees were asked to adopt a resolution approving such ation. (See page 5 of these minutes.)

Treasurer - Treasurer Gerry presented the Treasurer's Report ending May 18, 1970 as follows:

Trustee Saville moved adoption of the Treasurer's Report; seconded by Trustee Davis.

The President declared the motion carried.

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<u>CLERK</u> - Clerk Davis presented vouchers totaling \$2096.24. Trustee Forrest moved to approve payment; seconded by Trustee Carlson.

By roll: Ayes: Trustees Boynton, Carlson, Davis, Forrest and Saville

Nays: None

Absent: Trustee Huning

The President declared the motion carried.

<u>POLICE</u> - Chief Svacha distributed copies of the Police Department Activities during the month; there were no questions concerning the report. He reported that funds are available through the Lake County Chief of Police Association for a training program of certain police officers. It is felt that probably three North Barrington Police Officers will be eligible and will attend the program. Trustee Boynton said he thinks it is a very fine program.

Trustee Boynton read a letter from Judge Kaufman of Waukegan commending the work of Officer Gunnar Jensen (copy attached).

ROAD - Trustee Davis gave a report from Superintendent Talbot as follows:

Bids are being solicited for road surfacing using the MFT funds recently authorized by the State.

Cold patching is also being used on some of the very bad areas.

A formal request for three additional stop signs will be made at the next meeting.

Police Chief Svacha reported that inspections had been made concerning the need for additional stop signs in the village and that he recommends stop signs to be placed at Osage Drive and Signal Hill, Mohawk and Signal Hill, and at Seminole and Signal Hill. He recommended that the stop sign at Miller Road and Woodland Drive should remain in its present location. Trustee Forrest asked if a stop sign could be put on each side of Miller Road at that location in order to clearly indicate that a stop is required before entering Woodland Drive or Highway 59. A written recommendation regarding the additional stop signs will be presented at the next meeting.

President Caldwell announced that a request for bids for MFT road work will be published in the local newspaper this week; the bids to be opened on the afternoon of June 8 in the office of Wight Consulting Engineers and the contract to be awarded at the meeting of the Board of Trustees later that same day.

BUILDING AND ZONING - B&Z Officer Ray gave a brief report of building activity in the village during the past month and told of a land use seminar which he had recently attended.

<u>PLAN</u> - President Caldwell stated that each trustee had received copies of two proposed amendments to Zoning Ordinance No. 88 -- one defining a golf course and one relative to flood plain zoning. Trustee Forrest stated that such designations of the flood plain areas would be very valuable to the community

in many respects. Plan Commission Member Moody discussed parts of the proposed amendment concerning flood plains. Trustee Forrest moved that the Plan Commission be directed to hold a public hearing relative to the two proposed amendments to Zoning Ordinance No. 88. Seconded by Trustee Boynton and passed unanimously.

Alcon Subdivision - Subdivision Enforcing Officer Weaver reported that the property in the Alcon Subdivision is so low that the area is saturated with water now and suggested that a study be made of drainage in that area. Attorney Braithwaite stated that it might be possible to establish covenants which would require maintenance of problems caused by water in that subdivision. President Caldwell asked that Officers Ray and Weaver discuss the possibilities with Attorney Braithwaite and make a recommendation at the next meeting. Officer Weaver also reported on the status of roads in the Alcon Subdivision and said that the cul-de-sacs were being very attractively landscaped.

HEALTH AND SANITATION - Trustee Saville gave a report from H&S Officer, Dr. Olson, that all dye tests recently completed were satisfactory and that tests by the Lake County Health Department indicate that Honey Lake and the three ponds on Miller Road are satisfactory for beach and swimming purposes.

Trustee Saville presented Ordinance No. 111, regulating construction and maintenance of ponds and artificial lakes within the limits of the village, and moved its adoption. Trustee Davis seconded. B&Z Officer Ray asked about legal implications -- whether the Building and Zoning Officer would be liable if a fence had been ruled by him to be not required (Section H. 1.) and an accident occurred. Attorney Braithwaite said that a public official acting in good faith cannot be held responsible for actions or accidents that may occur in such a situation. It was decided that the pond ordinance be made available in pamphlet form as specified in the ordinance but that a summary should be published in a local newspaper as well.

The President declared the motion carried.

Trustee Saville suggested that a request for bids to install a pump at the intersection of Eton Drive and Oxford Road be published. William Moody, a neighboring resident, said he prefers that the area be left in its present form - that even though there are periods of very high water, after it gets to a certain level it seems to stay at that level (which he believes to be the water table there), and that he would not like to have the area drained as he likes the swampy condition which attracts wildlife there. R. L. Hatton, a neighboring resident, asked if the planned drainage would cause the level of his lake to drop. Trustee Forrest suggested that the matter be explored more thoroughly before proceeding. Trustee Saville moved that the village engineers be asked to review the proposal and give an evaluation of the situation in that area regarding grade levels, flow, and controls; seconded by Trustee Boynton and passed unanimously.

Trustee Forrest recommended that such information be shared with all neighboring property owners.

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ROADS AND PUBLIC UTILITIES - No report.

PLANNING AND ZONING - President Caldwell reported that he had discussed the proposed annexations in Cherry Hills Subdivision and on Miller Road with each of the property owners concerned and they have no objections. Attorney Braithwaite reported that he had a telephone conversation with Attorney McGrath representing the owners of the Miller Road property and that Mr. McGrath is fully satisfied with the ordinance and is knowledgeable of the annexation proceedings involved. Trustee Forrest moved adoption of Ordinance No. 113, annexing Lot 6 of Cherry Hills Subdivision; seconded by Trustee Carlson.

Trustee Forrest described some of the pressures being made upon governmental agencies to approve zoning variations in adjacent areas.

FINANCE AND LAW - President Caldwell reported that Trustee Huning is continuing to work toward an acceptable insurance package for the village.

Trustee Boynton moved authorization of up to \$350 to pay renewal premiums on accident and hospitalization policies for seven policemen; Trustee Forrest seconded.

The President declared the motion carried.

President Caldwell reported that there has been no court activity on current litigation.

Ordinance No. 112, Annual Appropriation Ordinance, was presented. Trustees were reminded that any amounts not included in the appropriation ordinance may not be spent, but that the budget is the actual working document between the Board of Trustees and the Department Heads of the Village. Trustee Forrest moved adoption of Ordinance No. 112; seconded by Trustee Davis.

The President declared the motion carried.

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Trustee Carlson read Resolution No. 259.3, an additional resolution to recognize former village officers of the Village of North Barrington, and moved its adoption; seconded by Trustee Boynton, and approved unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS - None

<u>NEW BUSINESS</u> - President Caldwell read a letter from the League of Women Voters thanking the Board for the generous contribution to the June 3 meeting to be presented at the High School to explain Phase II of the BADC Barton-Aschman Report.

President Caldwell presented a resolution objecting to the rezoning of the area on the southwest corner of Algonquin and Barrington Roads to allow construction and operation of a gasoline service station. After discussion, Trustee Forrest moved adoption of Resolution No. 317 protesting rezoning of the southwest corner of Algonquin and Barrington Roads -- Cook County Zoning Board of Appeals Docket No. 1744, ZA No. A-70-15; seconded by Trustee Boynton.

The President declared the motion carried.

There was a discussion concerning action requested by the Library Board members at the beginning of the meeting -- they had asked that a resolution recommending to citizens of the village that they vote favorably on annexation to the Barrington Library District be adopted. Trustee Boynton moved that a decision whether to approve annexation be deferred to the June meeting in order that trustees might ascertain reaction of residents; seconded by Trustee Forrest and approved unanimously.

At 10:00 p.m. Trustee Carlson moved that the meeting be adjourned; seconded by Trustee Saville and passed unanimously.
