MINUTES OF A PUBLIC MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF NORTH BARRINGTON, HELD ON JUNE 12, 1972, AT THE NORTH BARRINGTON SCHOOL IN SAID VILLAGE

President Caldwell noted that this was the regular June meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of North Barrington, the date having been changed from June 26, 1972, by vote at the May meeting, with proper notice having been given by newspaper publication and posted at the meeting place and in the Clerk's office.

Clerk Tingleff called the roll. President Caldwell led a brief meditation.

Trustee Schulke moved that the minutes of the meeting of May 15, 1972, be approved as prepared; seconded by Trustee Carlson and passed unanimously.

President Caldwell presented proposed Resolution No. 367 reappointing Walter R. Clarke a member and chairman of the Plan Commission of the Village of North Barrington. Trustee Talbot moved adoption of Resolution No. 367; seconded by Trustee Cragg and passed unanimously.

President Caldwell presented proposed Resolution No. 368 reappointing Walter R. Clarke a member of the Electrical Commission of the Village of North Barrington. Trustee Cragg moved adoption of Resolution No. 368; seconded by Trustee Schulke and passed unanimously.

Trustee Forrest brought up the matter of the street lights which were approved at the May meeting to be installed at the intersections of Route 59 with Signal Hill Road, Golfview Drive, Eton Drive and Brookside Road, stating that he had been informed that a petition was forthcoming against such installation. After discussion, Trustee Cragg moved that the President be requested to withold signature of the contract for installation of street lights at the intersections of Route 59 with Signal Hill Road, Golfview Drive, Eton Drive and Brookside Road until the July meeting; seconded by Trustee Talbot and passed unanimously.

President Caldwell announced the appointment of the following Trustee Committees to serve for 1972-73:

Trustee Forrest moved adoption of the Treasurer's Report; seconded by Trustee Carlson.

The President declared the motion carried.

Treasurer Ypelaar then presented the "Flash Report" of receipts and expenditures for the period June 1 through 12, announced that during the month a savings account had been activated at the First National Bank of Barrington, and presented a comparison of receipts and expenditures since fiscal year 1964 for both the corporate fund and motor fuel tax fund.

<u>CLERK</u> - Clerk Tingleff presented three vouchers for payment from the general corporate fund totaling \$4,014.52. After discussion, Trustee Talbot moved to approve payment, noting that reimbursement from an insurance company was due to the Village for \$125.00 of the amount to cover the invoice from Barrington Barn Builders; seconded by Trustee Schulke.

The President declared the motion carried.

Clerk Tingleff then presented Audit Report No. 8 which was received from the State of Illinois covering the receipt and disbursement of Motor Fuel Tax Funds by the Village of North Barrington for the period January 1, 1970, through December 31, 1970. Trustee Talbot moved that the Board of Trustees receive and file this report; seconded by Trustee Carlson and passed unanimously.

<u>PLAN COMMISSION</u> - Chairman Clarke presented and reviewed the minutes of a public hearing with regard to the North Barrington Official Comprehensive Plan covered by proposed Ordinance No. 141, held on May 31, 1972, and a

meeting of the Plan Commission held on the same date. Mr. Clarke called attention to the portion of the minutes of the Plan Commission meeting in which the Plan Commission voted to recommend to the Board of Trustees the adoption of Ordinance No. 141. After discussion and the viewing of the Comprehensive Plan Map, Trustee Forrest moved adoption of Ordinance No. 141; seconded by Trustee Cragg. It was noted that publication will be in pamphlet form, as is customary.

The President declared the motion carried.

President Caldwell called attention again to the Public Hearing tentatively scheduled for July 8, 1972, on proposed Ordinances Nos. 88.3 and 88.4, as stated in the minutes of the Plan Commission meeting.

HEALTH - Health Officer Cameron announced that with regard to the continuing Lake Zurich pollution situation, an injunction had been issued prohibiting Gerhard Meyne Co. from further pollution of the brook, either directly or indirectly, by effluent from the lagoon. The EPA case against Lake Zurich before the Pollution Control Board for previous pollution of the brook had been decided against Lake Zurich, the penalty being \$100 plus being placed on an arbitrary schedule for completion of the tertiary treatment expansion.

Trustee Ofsthun arrived for the meeting and Trustee Talbot left.

Trustee Forrest moved to authorize the Village President to communicate with the Environmental Control Division of the Attorney General's Office, the Environmental Protection Agency and the Pollution Control Board and commend them on their activities in the Lake Zurich case; seconded by Trustee Schulke and passed unanimously.

#### COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD

<u>Parks and Auxiliary Services</u> - Trustee Carlson reported that a lawn service had been contracted to mow the Village parks and action on the purchase of a tractor had been deferred. After discussion, the Trustees concurred with this action.

Trustee Carlson then reported that a request had been made by Brian Betsworth that "No Parking" signs be erected on Grandview Drive during Little League season. The matter was at present being discussed with the Township highway commissioner since the entire right-of-way of Grandview Drive is outside the Village.

Planning and Zoning - Trustee Forrest announced that the matter of a shopping center for which rezoning is required at the northeast corner of Barrington Road and Route 68 was being reviewed by the Village of Barrington tonight and that on June 6, 1972, the Lake County Plan Commission gave approval to all but one of the waste water proposals brought before them, that one being a proposed project in southwest Lake County.

President Caldwell stated that he had received project notification from the Northeastern Illinois Planning Commission with regard to this sewer project. He then explained the project, stated that he had acknowledged the communication and requested a clearer map and additional time until July 28, 1972, to answer the questions asked, and suggested that the matter be referred to the Committee on Roads and Public Utilities and the Committee on Planning and Zoning for study and that comments be welcomed also from the Committee on Building, Health and Sanitation. After discussion, Trustee Forrest moved to commend the action so far on the matter by the Village President and authorize him to do whatever else he felt necessary to present the views of this Village that the project does not appear to be in the public interest at this time; seconded by Trustee Carlson and passed unanimously. President Caldwell then referred the matter to the Committee on Roads and Public Utilities and the Committee on Planning and Zoning and invited comments from the Committee on Building, Health and Sanitation.

#### OLD BUSINESS

President Caldwell presented proposed Ordinance No. 142, a building code variation. After discussion, Trustee Forrest moved adoption of Ordinance No. 142; seconded by Trustee Schulke.

By roll: Ayes: Trustees Carlson, Cragg, Forrest and Schulke

Nays: None

Abstain: Trustee Ofsthun Absent: Trustee Talbot

The President declared the motion carried.

President Caldwell announced that proposed Ordinance No. 143, a road vacation ordinance, could not be acted upon since neither payment of the required fee nor proof of ownership of contiguous property had been received.

President Caldwell presented the comments of Sergeant Barta of the North Barrington Police Department on proposed Ordinance No. 139 pertaining to the registration of solicitors. After discussion, President Caldwell referred proposed Ordinance No. 139 to the Committee on Police, Fire and Public Safety for further study and requested that a report be made at the next meeting. President Caldwell then stated that since proposed Ordinance No. 140 pertaining to trespassing was a companion ordinance to No. 139, any action on it should be deferred also and considered at the same time as No. 139.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

President Caldwell stated that a communication had been received from the Lake County Soil and Water Conservation District notifying all municipalities that they must now notify the District of any petition for a hearing covering a variation, amendment, or other relief from its zoning ordinance.

President Caldwell presented proposed Resolution No. 369 appointing Frank L. Dinello as a Probationary Police Officer of the Village of North Barrington. Trustee Ofsthun moved adoption of Resolution No. 369; seconded by Trustee Schulke and passed unanimously.
