MINUTES OF A PUBLIC MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF NORTH BARRINGTON, HELD ON JUNE 26, 1967, AT THE NORTH BARRINGTON SCHOOL IN SAID VILLAGE.

Trustee Forrest moved to approve the minutes of the May 22, 1967 meeting - seconded by Trustee Davis and passed unanimously.

OFFICERS' REPORTS

TREASURER: Treasurer Gerry reported balances as of June 26, 1967 as follows:

Trustee Keagy moved to accept the Treasurer's report - seconded by Trustee Davis -

By roll call vote - AYES - Trustees Cutler, Davis, Forrest, Keagy and Krumlinde NAYS - None ABSENT - Trustee Schulke

The President declared the motion carried.

VILLAGE CLERK: The clerk presented invoices for approval totaling \$3,161.94 - (copy of details attached.) Trustee Forrest moved to approve payment - seconded by Trustee Keagy -

By roll call vote - AYES Trustees Cutler, Davis, Forrest, Keagy and Krumlinde. NAYS None ABSENT Trustee Schulke

The President declared the motion carried.

<u>POLICE</u>: Chief Svacha reported the following complaints and incidents processed:

Noisy party.

Motorcycles racing on roadway. Motorcycles racing on Golf Course.

Cars racing on roadway

Road blocks and barricades - also flares - removed from dangerous road area.

Low flying aircraft.

A store of liquor found hidden in wooded area.

Lights in vacant lot.

Prowler

Theft of construction equipment and material

Burglary in progress

Suspicious parked car.

Daylight theft of garden statue.

Three incidents of family trouble.

Three teenagers reported missing.

The Police Department reported an incident in which a resident diverted a flow of water from private property across a Village roadway.

Sign reconstruction.

<u>HEALTH OFFICER</u>: The President advised that Health Officer Dr. A. Barlow has resigned and moved from the area. A successor for Dr. Barlow will be appointed shortly.

<u>ROADS:</u> The President submitted Resolution No. 219 confirming appointment of Charles M. Newgent as Superintendênt of Roads. Trustee Cutler moved to adopted Resolution No. 219 and to confirm the appointment of Mr. Newgent seconded by Trustee Keagy and passed unanimously.

Supt. Newgent advised that one of the serious problems faced by the Road Department was the washout under Honey Lake Road to such an extent that a heavy vehicle could have fallen through. A new culvert has been installed. Additional work and a guard rail is needed and should be considered.

Mr. Newgent discussed guard rails, either in need of repairs or replacement, and the road program in general. He is hopeful that an overall road improvement program can be worked out with the help of an engineering firm, but that cold patching and some scarifying are of prime importance right now.

The President discussed proposed payment of \$150.00 to Mr. Robert H. Freking for consultation and advisory services rendered to the Road Committee. Trustee Krumlinde moved to approve payment of \$150.00 to Mr. Freking seconded by Trustee Davis -

By roll call vote: AYES - Trustees Cutler, Davis, Forrest, Keagy and Krumlinde NAYS - None ABSENT - Trustee Schulke

The President declared the motion carried.

The President submitted Resolution No. 220 appointing Mr. Robert H. Freking a Special Police Officer. After discussion Trustee Keagy moved that Resolution No. 220 be adopted. Seconded by Trustee Forrest. Motion carried unanimously.

The Board was informed that a drain tile at Drury Lane and Eton Drive had become plugged and backed up water to a depth of several feet, which was a serious hazard to health and property. The President read a letter he had received from Mr. Raven-Hansen, advising that 50% of his property was under water and petitioning that some corrective measures be taken. The President then read a petition, signed by 13 residents on Drury Lane and one on Biltmore Drive, also petitioning the Village to take immediate action to permanently correct the hazard. The President advised that Mr. Chris Rieke, Sanitary Engineer, had rodded out the tile, which relieved the situation. Mrs. Elaine Albrecht, Mr. William Meyers and Mr. Raven-Hansen testified as to the condition of their properties and the area affected. After discussion the Board assured those present that immediate steps would be taken to determine the cause of the back-up of water and that corrective measures would be taken.

Mr. Gahagan, representing Mr. Raven-Hansen, addressed the Board and commended them on the manner in which this particular matter was handled, as well as the general conduct of Village business. President Anderson read letter from the Department of Public Works denying his request for the installation of signal STOP AND GO lights at the intersection of Highway 59 and Miller Road. The President advised that this matter will continue to be pursued vigorously as it is felt the lights are necessary to safely cross the highway to and from the school, and to impede the speed of traffic on Highway 59 to enable secondary road traffic to enter or leave the highway.

BUILDING OFFICER:

The President discussed the rebuilding of homes destroyed in the April 21 tornado. At least one owner of a severely damaged home does not intend to rebuild and desires to sell the property as-is. The President advised that the possibility of condemnation proceedings may require Board consideration.

PARKS & AUXILIARY SERVICES: Trustee Keagy advised that he, together with Supt. Jack Blazo, had explored the proposed park improvement program and the possibility of securing playground equipment. He advised that with the facilities that are available at the Biltmore Country Club and the school the residents contacted felt that additional equipment was not needed, and that supervision of such a park would not be available. After discussion it was the consensus to merely keep the parks mowed at this time.

MOSQUITO ABATEMENT: Due to the very wet weather the mosquito situation is extremely bad. It is intended to fog again this week-end.

FIRE COMMISSIONER: New stickers are being procured to show the new Police telephone number.

<u>PLAN COMMISSION:</u> The President reported that Chairman Richard E. Johnson had planned to attend this meeting to present the recommendations of the Plan Commission on the amended zoning ordinance and the proposed annexation of the balance of the Fifer property. However, due to clerical difficulties this was not possible and Mr. Johnson has requested, if possible, this meeting be adjourned to a later date for the purpose of considering the propositions of the Plan Commission. Mr. Johnson will mail copies of the propositions to the Trustees for study prior to the meeting.

The President discussed the petition received from Messrs. Denker and Pertl to vacate a portion of Hawthorne Road. The Plan Commission feels that all of Hawthorne Road should be vacated and recommended that a new petition be submitted, signed by all parties involved.

The President also discussed waiving the fee due to related petition in the Board of Appeals. This will be presented at a later date for Board consideration.

BOARD OF APPEALS: The President has been advised by Chairman E. C. Gross that the Board of Appeals stands recessed pending completion of action on the related petition in the Plan Commission.

TRUSTEES COMMITTEES:

FINANCE & LAW: Trustee Keagy read the proposed Annual Appropriations for the fiscal year from April 1, 1967 to March 31, 1968 totaling \$59,600. After discussion Trustee Keagy moved adoption of Annual Appropriation Ordinance No. 82 - seconded by Trustee Forrest -

By roll call vote - AYES: Trustees Cutler, Davis, Forrest, Keagy and Krumlinde NAYS: None ABSENT: Trustee Schulke

The President declared the motion carried. Copy attached as part of these minutes.

The President submitted his annual departmental budget of \$34,175, which serves as guidelines for the various departments but has no effect in any way on the annual appropriation. Trustee Cutler moved to approve the budget - seconded by Trustee Davis and passed unanimously.

The President advised that the Finance Committee has given consideration to revenues needed with respect to the Police and Road Departments, increasing the number of policemen, equipping and operating cars, etc, and recommend that the Village make a charge of \$5.00 for each vehicle sticker for a year, and \$2.50 for half a year, 60% of the revenue to be allotted to the Police Department and 40% to the Road Department. The matter has been referred to the Trustees Committee on Police, Fire and Public Bafety for review and recommendation to the Board on enforcing procedures.

The President reported he had received a letter from the Lake Zurich Cab Company requesting a franchise to operate within the Village. After discussion it was recommended no action be taken.

The President advised that arrangements are being made to secure a duplicating machine from the SCM Corporation.

<u>POLICE, FIRE & PUBLIC SAFETY</u>: Trustee Krumlinde discussed the need for additional personnel for the Police Department. Effort will be made to secure additional police officers. Trustee Krumlinde advised that it may be necessary to hire police officers on week-ends.

<u>CIVIL DEFENSE:</u> No conclusions have been reached as yet relative to merging Civil Mefense with the Police Department.

BUILDING REGULATIONS

<u>HEALTH & SANITATION:</u> Trustee Cutler advised he would call a meeting of his committee and the President some time within the next week.

ROADS: No report.

PARKS & AUXILIARY SERVICES: Reported earlier.

<u>PLANNING AND ZONING:</u> Trustee Forrest commended Chairman Richard E. Johnson and the members of the Plan Commission on the way they have handled the amended zoning ordinance.

NEW BUSINESS:

The President advised that the Police Indemnity Insurance expires July 7, 1967. After discussion Trustee Krumlinde moved the insurance be renewed - seconded by Trustee Cutler and passed unanimously.

As there were no more items for consideration President Anderson asked for adjournment to a later date. Trustee Cutler moved to adjourn this meeting to July 17, at the North Barrington School - 8:00 P.M. Seconded by Trustee Forrest and passed unanimously.
