Clerk Davis called the roll; President Caldwell, for the meditation, read a prayer-poem by Frederick Baker; and Trustee Huning moved that minutes of the May 18, 1970 meeting be approved as prepared, seconded by Trustee Davis and passed unanimously.

President Caldwell thanked the following individuals (each having served for two or more years as a trustee or chairman of a board of committee) for service to the Village, and presented to each one a plaque of appreciation: A. I. Jablonski, Edward C. Gross, R. C. Schulke, Douglas T. Krumlinde, Boubene Jaremus, and Richard E. Johnson. Similar plaques will be presented at the July 27 meeting to C. R. Anderson, Grayce Scharfenberg, Charles Newgent, H. W. Maher, Samuel Lewis, and Chester Mitchell. Plaques were also to be sent to John Blazo, Max Eberli, Eben Finger, Leonard P. Gotsch, John Iverson, Lyle M. Palmer, Charles E. Parks and Harold Parsley, and to Mrs. Hays for Edde Hays. President Caldwell then commended Trustee Carlson for excellent work in planning for and arranging the awards.

TREASURER - Treasurer Gerry presented the Treasurer's Report for the three-week period ending June 8, 1970, showing balances as of June 8 as follows:

Treasurer Gerry then presented the detailed Treasurer's Report - Fiscal Year Ended March 31, 1970. Trustee Huning moved that the report be accepted for purposes of publication as required by law; seconded by Trustee Davis and carried unanimously. Treasurer Gerry then discussed several items on the report comparing them with the same report a year ago.

<u>CLERK</u> - Village Clerk Davis presented vouchers for payment from corporate funds totaling \$4991.84. Trustee Saville moved to approve payment; seconded by Trustee Carlson.

<u>POLICE</u> - Chief Svacha presented a Report of Police Activities through May, 1970; referred to a letter from Mr. T. J. Bair, of the Beach and Lake Committee of the Biltmore Country Club, requesting assistance of the Police Department in several matters pertaining to Honey Lake, including keeping the beach cleared after sanctioned beach hours; and reported that several members of the Police Department had attended a special meeting of the Lake Zurich Fire Department.

President Caldwell asked that Chief Svacha prepare a written recommendation for proposed stop signs so the Board might consider having an ordinance prepared authorizing them.

President Caldwell stated that Chief Svacha recommended that Jack W. McGregor be appointed a Probationary Police Officer. Trustee Carlson moved adoption of Resolution No. 320 appointing Jack W. McGregor a Probationary Police Officer for a term ending December 31, 1970; seconded by Trustee Huning and approved unanimously.

<u>ROADS</u> - Superintendent Talbot reported that in response to a published request for bids on the previously approved road surfacing work to be paid from MFT funds, the following bids had been received and were publicly opened in the office of Wight Consulting Engineers on June 8:

He recommended that the contract be awarded to the low bidder, Liberty Asphalt (the recommendation was concurred by both State Division of Highways officials and Wight Consulting Engineers). Trustee Huning moved that the MFT contract be awarded to Liberty Asphalt; seconded by Trustee Davis.

Superintendent Talbot read the following bids for resurfacing a part of Signal Hill Road, to be paid from corporate funds, which had also been received and publicly opened in the offices of Wight Consulting Engineers on June 8:

The President declared the motion carried.

Superintendent Talbot reported that he had received several complaints and reports of water damage following the recent heavy rains. At the next meeting he will present a complete report of actions taken. He commended the prompt action taken by Wight Engineers in having a partly washed-out culvert embankment repaired on Woodland Drive.

HEALTH AND SANITATION - Trustee Saville reported that Dr. Olson had also received several calls concerning septic problems because of the recent heavy rains. He is working with Superintendent Talbot on one case involving road drainage into a septic field. Results are not yet available on several dye tests in progress by the Lake County Health Department.

BUILDING AND ZONING - Trustee Saville presented the Building and Zoning Office Report through May, 1970, from B&Z Officer Ray.

<u>PLAN</u> - President Caldwell stated that a hearing will be scheduled in the near future for Ordinance Nos. 88.1 and 88.2, probably June 27 or 29.

COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD

Building, Health and Sanitation - Trustee Saville reported that further study has been made of the slough developing in the area of Golfview to Brookside along Eton Drive. It has been ascertained that the entire area is a rather shallow saucer, ten to twelve inches deep. The heavy rains made accurate calculations impossible. There was very little fall between the slough and the creek water levels. An effort is being made, using chemicals, to eliminate the duck weed which now covers the water. The two citizens who live along the slough would like to see it retained for ecological reasons. Trustee Saville recommended that any action on drainage of this area be deferred for another month or two. He was asked to include in further studies the area east of Oxford Road.

President Caldwell presented Resolution No. 319, establishing the fee for filing a permit application under Pond Ordinance No. 111. After discussion, Trustee Saville moved adoption of Resolution No. 319; seconded by Trustee Davis.

The President declared the motion carried.

<u>Police</u>, <u>Fire and Public Safety</u> - President Caldwell reported that the police accident policies have been reinstated and are now up to date.

President Caldwell read a suggested amendment to the firearms ordinance concerning exceptions to the prevention of any use of firearms in the village -- that only shotguns might be used in the Grassy Lake area and removing the reference to migratory birds. Trustee Saville moved that the village attorney be directed to prepare such an amendment for consideration at the next meeting; seconded by Trustee Huning and passed unanimously.

<u>Finance and Law</u> - President Caldwell stated that since a thorough search has not produced the desired umbrella insurance package program, he was appointing Trustees Carlson and Boynton an ad hoc committee (with Trustee Carlson as Chairman) to consider consolidation of all village insurance policies with the same expiration dates and with one broker in order to simplify administration of village insurance. In the meantime, the Village is adequately insured.

President Caldwell announced that:

The Board will go into executive session at the conclusion of the public meeting to discuss current litigation.

The next regular meeting of the executive board of BACOG is scheduled for Tuesday, June 9, 1970 at the Barrington Village Hall.

The proposed tax levy ordinances could not be adopted tonight because one of them requires a vote of three-fourths of the elected trustees; all will be rescheduled for the July meeting.

OLD BUSINESS

Annexation to the Barrington Public Library District was discussed. Trustee Saville moved adoption of Resolution No. 318, recommending to citizens that they support and vote for annexation to the Barrington Public Library District; seconded by Trustee Carlson and passed unanimously.

President Caldwell reported that there is to be a public hearing on June 19 at the Ela Town Hall concerning rezoning of property on Highway 12 north of Miller Road, within the $1\frac{1}{2}$ mile perimeter of village boundary. After discussion, no action was taken on the matter.

President Caldwell presented Resolution No. 286.1, providing for the appointment of Nelson Forrest as president pro tem and George Davis as alternate in his absence to preside over meetings of the Board of Trustees when the President is out of the village. After discussion, Trustee Saville moved adoption of Resolution No. 286.1; seconded by Trustee Carlson and passed unanimously.

President Caldwell announced the resignation of Clerk Lora Lee Davis, stating that an ad hoc committee consisting of Trustees Boynton, Saville and himself had been appointed to recommend a replacement. He announced their recommendation that Helen W. Tingleff be appointed. Trustee Saville moved that Helen W. Tingleff be appointed as Acting Village Clerk effective 12:01 a.m. June 9, 1970, to fill the unexpired term to April, 1971; seconded by Trustee Carlson.
