Trustee Krumlinde moved to approve the minutes of the June 26, 1967 adjourned meeting - seconded by Trustee Schulke and passed unanimously.

Trustee Krumlinde moved to approve the minutes of the July 17 reconvened meeting - seconded by Trustee Schulke and passed unanimously.

Treasurer Gerry submitted his report for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1967 and statement of cash and security balances as of March 31, 1967. After discussion Trustee Schulke moved to accept the Treasurer's Report seconded by Trustee Krumlinde -

The President declared the motion carried.

Trustee Schulke then moved to approve the Annual Report as presented, which will be published and filed with the County Treasurer - seconded by Trustee Davis -

By roll call vote: AYES: Trustees Davis, Krumlinde and Schulke NAYS: None ABSENT: Trustees Cutler, Keagy and Forrest.

The President declared the motion carried.

<u>VILLAGE CLERK:</u> The clerk presented invoices for approval totaling \$6,184.82. Trustee Schulke moved to approve payment - seconded by Trustee Davis -

By roll call vote: AYES: Trustees Davis, Krumlinde and Schulke NAYS: None ABSENT: Trustees Cutler, Forrest and Keagy.

The President declared the motion carried.

The President advised that the SCM Coronastat 44 duplicator has been installed and is in use on a rental basis. After a trial period it is the intent to present a Lease Agreement to the board for consideration.

<u>POLICE:</u> Chief R. E. Svacha reported the following complaints and incidents processed -

Runaway horses.

Child bitten by cat.

Stray cat annoying a resident's family.

Two incidents regarding dogs - (1) annoying a family and (2) a dog lost.

Child (toddler) playing on a roadway.

Children playing outdoors at 2:00 A.M.

Egg and firecracker throwing at 2:00 A.M.

Automobile accident

Looting of home and property of home previously damaged by tornado.

Family trouble.

<u>HEALTH OFFICER:</u> President Anderson advised that the Lake County Health Department is performing a satisfactory service pending appointment of a Health Officer to succeed Dr. Barlow. In one instance legal action is pending on a faulty septic system after notice of violation. ROADS: Supt. Charles M. Newgent reported -

- 1. The guard rail on Biltmore Drive has been restored.
- 2. A catch basin and iron grate has been installed on Drury Lane to correct flooding condition and appears to be working well.
- First mowing of Village roadways has been substantially completed.
- 4. Cold patching work is proceeding and should be completed within the next week or two.
- 5. R. H. Freking has straightened some street signs and has repaired the guard posts on the bridge on Signal Hill Road.
- 6. Kimberly Road has been graded and oiled.
- 7. Gravel has been spread on Carriage Road.

In general, the roads are in fair shape pending sealcoating, which will be done later in the season.

Supt. Newgent advised he had met with Mr. George Wight of Wight Consulting Engineers, Barrington, relative to engaging their services. After a tour of the Village roads and inspection of bridges Mr. Wight submitted a proposal, which was the subject of a meeting of the Road Committee. After discussion Trustee Davis moved that Wight Consulting Engineers Inc., be engaged to handle the road maintenance program and such other work essential to the roads, using Motor Fuel Tax funds and corporate funds, for this fiscal year - - seconded by Trustee Schulke - - and passed unanimously.

Trustee Davis, chairman, Trustees Committee on Roads and Public Utilities, advised that it is the consensus of the Road Committee that the Road Superintendent needs a source of practical and professional advice concerning the maintenance and repair of roads. He further stated that Robert H. Freking has been very cooperative and helpful in providing such services and it is felt the Village should employ Mr. Freking on a retainer basis. After discussion Trustee Davis moved that Mr. R. H. Freking be employed at a monthly retainer fee of \$40.00, these funds to be from the Road Fund seconded by Trustee Schulke -

By roll call vote: AYES: Trustees Davis, Krumlinde, Schulke and President Anderson.

NAYS: None. ABSENT: Trustees Cutler, Forrest and Keagy.

The President declared the motion carried.

BUILDING OFFICER: No report.

PARKS & AUXILIARY SERVICES:

Mr. Frank Saville - 512 Miller Road - addressed the Board and inquired whether the Village has an ordinance relative to trees, either dying or dead as a result of Dutch Elm or Oak Wilt diseases. Mr. Saville introduced Mr. Otto Herman, a representative of the Davy Tree Service, who discussed the manifestations of the tree diseases. Mr. Saville is concerned about the trees along Biltmore Drive, north of the Club to Miller Road, which appear to be dead. Mr. Saville was informed the Village does have an ordinance and that immediate steps would be taken to investigate and enforce the ordinance.

MOSQUITO ABATEMENT: Supt. Lyle M. Palmer has advised that because of the wet season additional foggings will be needed.

<u>PLAN COMMISSION</u>: Chairman Richard E. Johnson advised that the changes suggested at the July 17, 1967 meeting have been reviewed with counsel and have been incorporated in the proposed Zoning Ordinance amendment. After discussion Mr. Johnson presented the proposed Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance Amendment, the Zoning Map of the Village and the Official Comprehensive Plan of the Village. After further discussion Trustee Schulke moved adoption of Zoning Ordinance No. 88, encompassing the Zoning Map of the Village of North Barrington and the Official Comprehensive Plan of the Village of North Barrington - seconded by Trustee Krumlinde -

By roll call vote: AYES: Trustees Davis, Krumlinde and Schulke President Anderson.

NAYS: None

ABSENT: Trustees Cutler, Forrest and Keagy.

The President declared the motion carried.

CIVIL DEFENSE: No report.

<u>PLANNING & ZONING</u>: The President discussed the petition of Russell C. Fifer to annex three acres of his property to the Village of North Barrington, acceptance of which has been recommended by the Plan Commission, and on which the Board indicated concurrence at the July 17, 1967 adjourned meeting. The President then submitted Ordinance No. 85. Trustee Krumlinde moved to adopt Annexation Ordinance No. 85, annexing three acres of the Fifer property seconded by Trustee Schulke - By roll call vote: AYES: Trustees Davis, Krumlinde and Schulke President Anderson.

NAYS: None

ABSENT: Trustees Cutler, Keagy and Forrest.

The President declared the motion carried.

President Anderson advised that Mr. J. W. Braithwaite's firm - King, Robin, Gale & Pillinger - has been engaged as legal consultants to the Village of Barrington. It is Mr. Braithwaite's opinion there would be no conflict of interests in representing both Villages. After discussion the matter was referred to the Trustees Committee on Finance and Law for recommendation at the next Board meeting.
