Clerk Tingleff called the roll. President Caldwell led a brief meditation.

Trustee Carlson moved that the minutes of the meeting of June 12, 1972, be approved as prepared; seconded by Trustee Talbot and passed unanimously.

President Caldwell presented plaques of appreciation for their service to the Village to former Trustees Frank Saville and Douglas Boynton.

Treasurer Ypelaar then presented a report showing the composition of cash balances as of June 30, 1972, a breakdown of builders' road indemnity deposits on hand on July 1, 1972, a comparison of first quarter receipts for the

corporate fund between fiscal year 1973 and 1972, a comparison of expenditures approved and paid vs. budget through June 30, 1972, and the auditors financial report of the Village as of March 31, 1972, as prepared by McGladrey, Hansen, Dunn & Company. Acceptance of the auditor's report was deferred pending Treasurer Ypelaar's analysis of two items.

<u>CLERK</u> - Clerk Tingleff presented three vouchers for payment from the general corporate fund totaling \$7,253.54. After discussion, Trustee Forrest moved to approve payment; seconded by Trustee Schulke.

The President declared the motion carried.

Clerk Tingleff presented one voucher for payment from the MFT fund totaling \$526.83. After discussion, Trustee Forrest moved to approve payment; seconded by Trustee Schulke.

The President declared the motion carried.

<u>PLAN COMMISSION</u> - President Caldwell read a letter from Chairman Clarke and reviewed the minutes of a public hearing and meeting of the Plan Commission held on July 15, 1972, noting that action on three matters, namely proposed Ordinances Nos. 88.3 and 88.4, and the rezoning of the Biltmore Country Club, was deferred until a special meeting of the Plan Commission to be held on September 6, 1972. Trustee Forrest noted two corrections in the minutes of the public hearing which should be made and of which he had notified the Secretary of the Plan Commission.

HEALTH - Health Officer Cameron presented a request for a variation from the Health and Sanitation Ordinance for repair of a septic system at the residence of Charles Stone, 479 East Oxford Road. It was proposed to encroach on the 25 foot setback as being preferable to running the field even or close to the lake as the ordinance permits. Health Officer Cameron stated that the variation had been approved by the Health and Sanitation Commission. After discussion, Trustee Schulke moved that the Board of Trustees concur with the recommendation of the Health and Sanitation Commission that a variation from the Health and Sanitation Ordinance for repair of a septic system at 479 East Oxford Road be allowed; seconded by Trustee Carlson.

The President declared the motion carried.

President Caldwell referred to a communication received from the Lake-McHenry Law enforcement Planning Commission with regard to a program called Operator Identification. Police Chief Svacha then explained that the program involved

the marking of valuables with your drivers license number by means of an electrical pencil and placing a decal in the window of a home or automobile stating that such valuables were so identified as an attempt to discourage burglaries. No specific action was requested on the matter. Village support of the program was to be given unless the trustees had any objection, but none was voiced.

President Caldwell read letters from the State Pollution Control Board and the Attorney General's office in answer to his letters of commendation in the recent Lake Zurich pollution situation.

#### COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD

Finance and Law - Trustee Cragg presented and explained proposed Resolution No. 370 relative to the Street and Bridge Tax. After discussion, Trustee Cragg moved adoption of Resolution No. 370; seconded by Trustee Carlson.

The President declared the motion carried.

Trustee Cragg then presented and after discussion, moved adoption of proposed Ordinance No. 144, the tax levy ordinance; seconded by Trustee Talbot.

The President declared the motion carried.

Planning and Zoning - Trustee Forrest reported that the Committee on Planning and Zoning was recommending full opposition to the unnecessary and expensive sewage and wastewater plant proposal by the Public Works Department of Lake County. After discussion, Trustee Forrest moved to authorize President Caldwell to transmit the following statement to the Northeastern Illinois Planning Commission regarding NIPC Project No. 72-110:

"It is the view of the Village of North Barrington that this project would lead rather than follow development at this time, and that it would lead in a direction which would be adverse to the long range planning of all villages in the area who are members of the Barrington Area Council of Governments (BACOG). The nature and magnitude of the proposal would do much more than serve presently developed areas. A major interceptor would traverse the Village of North Barrington, partly across countryside and partly along a major portion of the length of Miller Road that is within our municipal boundaries. Although it is indicated in the application that it is intended to serve several areas including this village, the authors of the project and grant application failed to consult this village by even so much as a telephone call. The application further fails to state that the Village of Lake Zurich, a portion of which is indicated as an area to be served, is nearing the completion of a major increase in the capacity of its treatment plant now serving

and the restating of the position of the Road Superintendent in recommending the street lights, Trustee Schulke moved to refer the matter of the installation of street lights at the intersections of Route 59 with Signal Hill Road, Golfview Drive, Eton Drive and Brookside Road to the Committee on Roads and Public Utilities for study and a report back within sixty days; seconded by Trustee Forrest and passed unanimously.

President Caldwell presented proposed Ordinance No. 143, an ordinance vacating a portion of Essex Lane and a portion of Mockingbird Lane, pointing out that payment had been received together with proof of the petitioners' ownership of the adjacent lots. After discussion, Trustee Schulke moved adoption of Ordinance No. 143; seconded by Trustee Talbot.

The President declared the motion carried.

#### NEW BUSINESS

President Caldwell explained briefly the amendment to Section 22.02 of the Illinois Soil and Water Conservation Districts Law which requires all requests for relief from our zoning ordinance to be submitted to the Lake County Soil and Water Conservation District and the procedure the Village of North Barrington would be following.

Clerk Tingleff announced that the August 28, 1972, Board of Trustees meeting will be held in the South Gym of the North Barrington School.

President Caldwell announced his intention of resigning as Village President within the next few weeks, as he and his family would be moving from the area. He then stated that the Municipal Code provides that in such cases the Trustees appoint an acting president to serve until the next regular election.

Attorney Braithwaite presented plats of vacation to accompany Ordinances Nos. 133 and 136 which he had obtained from a surveyor. Trustee Schulke moved to authorize the President and Clerk to execute these plats of vacation and that they be approved to accompany Ordinances Nos. 133 and 136 previously passed; seconded by Trustee Talbot and passed unanimously.

At 10:50 P. M. Trustee Cragg moved that the meeting be adjourned; seconded by Trustee Carlson and passed unanimously.
