TRUSTEES COMMITTEE REPORTS:

FINANCE & LAW

Trustee Urick presented for preliminary discussion the proposed 1967 tax levy - in amount \$21,535.00. The April 30, 1966 assessed valuation was \$6,472,620.

Trustee Urick advised that he and Trustee Krumlinde had examined the present insurance policies of the Village - have agreed as to what is wanted for the Police Department, and are now engaged in ascertaining if such coverage can be secured.

The President advised another hearing on the Landwer case is now scheduled for September 27 in Waukegan.

The President discussed the forthcoming audit to be made of Village accounts. After discussion Trustee Cutler moved that Putta and Kelsey, CPA's, be appointed to make the audit - seconded by Trustee Schulke and passed unanimously. Treasurer Harold Gerry will work out the arrangements.

PLANNING AND ZONING:

President Anderson reported M. J. Graft, builder, is arranging to provide a road performance bond for Concord Lane in the "Pembroke on Kimberly" Subdivision.

The President advised that a letter has been received from Mr. C. E. Parks Jr., tendering his resignation as a member of the Plan Commission and Board of Zoning Appeals because of transferring to another state. The Board reluctantly accepted Mr. Parks' resignation and commended him for the fine service he has rendered to the community for so many years.

President Anderson submitted Resolution No. 190 - appointing Mr. Max Eberli, chairman, Board of Zoning Appeals, to the Plan Commission as liaison member between the two Boards. After discussion Trustee Cutler moved the said appointment be confirmed and consented to and moved the adoption of Resolution No. 190 - seconded by Trustee Schulke and passed unanimously.

President Anderson submitted Resolution No. 191 - calling for reappointment of Boubene M. Jaremus to a 5-year term as member and secretary of the Plan Commission and Subdivision Enforcing Officer. President Anderson recommended that Mr. Jaremus as secretary of the Plan Commission be appointed to membership on the Trustees Committee on Planning and Zoning.
