Clerk Tingleff called the roll; President Caldwell led a brief meditation. Trustee Boynton moved that the minutes of the meeting of June 8, 1970, be approved as prepared; seconded by Trustee Saville and passed unanimously.

President Caldwell thanked the following individuals for service to the Village and presented to each one a plaque of appreciation: Charles M. Newgent, Grayce Scharfenberg, and C. Richard Anderson. Mr. Anderson then presented a plaque of appreciation to a former board member, Don J. Wangelin. President Caldwell read portions of letters of acknowledgement from Charles E. Parks and L. Gotsch, who received plaques by mail after last month's meeting.

TREASURER - Treasurer Gerry presented the Treasurer's Report for the seven week period ending July 27, 1970, showing balances as of July 27 as follows:

Trustee Davis moved adoption of the Treasurer's Report; seconded by Trustee Saville and passed unanimously.

Treasurer Gerry then discussed the Auditor's Report for the fiscal year ending March 31, 1970, prepared by Putta and Kelsey for the Village of North Barrington. Trustee Forrest moved acceptance of the Auditor's Report for filing; seconded by Trustee Davis and passed unanimously.

President Caldwell announced that the resignation of Treasurer Gerry was to become effective tonight and presented Resolution No. 321 appointing

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Bernard J. Ypelaar as Treasurer. Trustee Forrest moved adoption of Resolution No. 321; seconded by Trustee Boynton.

The President declared the motion carried, and Clerk Tingleff administered the oath of office to Bernard J. Ypelaar.

Trustee Forrest commended Harold Gerry for his work as Treasurer over the past five years and President Caldwell presented him with a plaque of appreciation.

<u>CLERK</u> - Clerk Tingleff presented vouchers for payment from the general corporate fund totaling \$9,366.37. Trustee Carlson moved to approve payment; seconded by Trustee Forrest.

The President declared the motion carried.

<u>POLICE</u> - Chief Svacha presented a report of Police activities through June, 1970; announced that copies of circulated Police reports were available to Trustees and Officers if they cared to receive them; and reported no further comments from Biltmore Country Club and that they were proceding with the patrol as requested.

Chief Svacha presented a written recommendation that an ordinance be enacted to authorize stop signs at: Osage Dr. and Signal Hill Rd.; Mohawk Dr. and

Signal Hill Rd.; and Seminole Dr. and Signal Hill Rd. It was agreed that this should be prepared for consideration at the August meeting. The question of an additional stop sign at the Woodland, Miller Road, Route 59 intersection was referred to the Committee on Police, Fire and Public Safety for further study.

Chief Svacha presented a written recommendation that Mrs. Helen Wileman be appointed as a policewoman in the Regular Division. The President stated that a resolution would be prepared for consideration at the August meeting.

<u>ROADS</u> - Superintendent Talbot requested formal confirmation of the award of the MFT contract to Liberty Asphalt. Trustee Boynton moved that since Liberty Asphalt had been the low bidder and their bid had been accepted at a previous meeting and subsequently certified by the state, they be awarded the contract in the amount of \$10,554.78; seconded by Trustee Saville.

The President declared the motion carried.

Superintendent Talbot announced he would get three bids on removal of the tree stump in the middle of Woodland; and that road surfacing is scheduled to begin around the first of August.

BUILDING AND ZONING - Officer Ray gave a brief report on Building and Zoning Office activity during June and July.

<u>PLAN COMMISSION</u> - Secretary Grayce Scharfenberg reported a Public Hearing is scheduled for 9:00 A. M. on August 22, 1970, at the North Barrington School on proposed Ordinances 88.1 and 88.2; reported the village map is being worked on and that we may need help from the county; and that the amendments to the electrical code had been submitted in preliminary form. These were discussed briefly and it was agreed that they should be developed into a formal amendment to the building code for consideration at a subsequent meeting.

<u>HEALTH AND SANITATION</u> - Trustee Saville reported that there has been one recent police complaint concerning a septic problem and that three other areas are being watched and tested at the present time; and that beginning in August, Health and Sanitation will be presenting a cumulative report each month in order to assure that all complaints are followed up promptly and to indicate to the Trustees the actions taken.

MOSQUITO ABATEMENT - Superintendent Cragg reported that six foggings had been completed, leaving three more which are budgeted; and that the insurance certificate expired July 26, 1970, and another one would be obtained prior to the next fogging.

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COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD

Police, Fire, and Public Safety - Trustee Boynton reported that the new Police Cruiser is now in service. He then presented Ordinance No. 108.1 amending the Firearms Ordinance. Trustee Saville moved adoption of Ordinance No. 108.1; seconded by Trustee Boynton.

The President declared the motion carried.

Parks - Trustee Carlson reported that the annual tree work was completed and that next year there would be as much necessary if not more; that they are working on plans to give the parks greater use; that help is needed in keeping up the parks, suggesting possibly some paid help; that they are planning to work on the creeks; and that possibly with all the tree removal taking place, we need to look into a program of re-foresting.

<u>Insurance</u> - Trustee Carlson reported they are investigating the possibility of consolidating all the Village policies with one broker, and that at least one proposal would be received.

Planning and Zoning - Trustee Forrest reported that a recommendation from the Cook County Zoning Board of Appeals might be received in early August on the proposed Winston Lakes development. Individual Cook County Commissioners would welcome all communications concerning this proposal. Trustee Boynton moved that President Caldwell be authorized to write opposing the proposal; seconded by Trustee Saville and passed unanimously.

Trustee Forrest reported briefly on the proposed Brandel development adjacent to Barrington, and suggested the necessity for making our community aware of the information we have concerning this and acquainting them with the facts. The Trustees agreed that the plan needs careful study.

Trustee Forrest reported that three Public Appraisals have been received on the Volo Bog Land that are well within the state budget.

OLD BUSINESS

President Caldwell announced that the next meeting of the Barrington Area Council of Governments will be July 28, 1970.

NEW BUSINESS

President Caldwell announced that the annual meeting of the Illinois Municipal League will be held in Springfield, October 3-6, 1970, and that the Annual Municipal Clerk Training Institute will be at the University of Illinois in Champaign, November 15-18, 1970. He suggested and the Trustees agreed that Clerk Tingleff should investigate these two events and perhaps attend one of them.

President Caldwell announced that he had received a copy of the Community Consolidated School District #4 Land-Use Enrollment Study, which would be available to interested Trustees or other citizens.

President Caldwell presented Resolution No. 322 designating Village depository and check signers and co-signers on checks drawn by the Village of North Barrington. Trustee Forrest moved adoption of Resolution No. 322; seconded by Trustee Saville and passed unanimously.

HEARING OF CITIZENS

It was suggested that a letter of appreciation be written to the Cuba Township Highway Commissioner for the excellent job done in cutting roadside weeds in our Village. President Caldwell instructed the Clerk to write a

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commendatory letter to the Township Highway Commissioner with the idea that its contents be relayed to Township personnel who had actually done the work.

At 10:32 P. M. Trustee Boynton moved that the meeting be adjourned; seconded by Trustee Saville and passed unanimously.
