MINUTES OF A PUBLIC MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF NORTH BARRINGTON, HELD ON AUGUST 30, 1971, AT THE NORTH BARRINGTON SCHOOL IN SAID VILLAGE

President Caldwell noted that this was the regular August meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of North Barrington, the date having been changed from August 23, 1971, with proper notice having been given by newspaper publication and posted at the meeting place and in the Clerk's office.

Clerk Tingleff called the roll; President Caldwell led a brief meditation.

President Caldwell announced that copies of the agenda were available for those in the audience and that a packet of additional material was also being circulated to be retained by the press at the close of the meeting.

Trustee Carlson moved that the minutes of the meeting of July 26, 1971, be approved as prepared; seconded by Trustee Saville and passed unanimously.

VILLAGE OFFICERS

TREASURER - Treasurer Ypelaar presented a Treasurer's Report for the period ending July 31, 1971, showing balances as follows:

Trustee Boynton moved adoption of the Treasurer's Report; seconded by Trustee Saville.

The President declared the motion carried.

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Treasurer Ypelaar then presented the "Flash Report" of receipts and expenditures for the period August 1 through August 25, and announced that the books were delivered to the auditors for the annual audit last week.

<u>CLERK</u> - Clerk Tingleff presented three vouchers for payment from the general corporate fund totaling \$6,279.75. Trustee Saville moved to approve payment; seconded by Trustee Forrest.

Nays: None

Absent: Trustees Cragg and Talbot

The President declared the motion carried.

President Caldwell presented proposed Resolution No. 348 confirming his appointment of John L. Ritchie as Superintendent of Mosquito Abatement of the Village of North Barrington. Trustee Forrest moved adoption of Resolution No. 348; seconded by Trustee Boynton and passed unanimously. Clerk Tingleff then administered the oath of office to Mr. Ritchie.

PLAN COMMISSION - Chairman Walter R. Clarke presented and explained the completed master Village Map and noted that copies will be printed from it for circulation. He stated that the Plan Commission had recommended adoption of the Village Map at their August 3, 1971, meeting. President Caldwell presented proposed Ordinance No. 131A, an ordinance to designate a Village Map, and after discussion Trustee Forrest moved to table Ordinance No. 131A until the next meeting in order that further corrections in the map could be made. There being no second, the motion failed.

After further discussion, Trustee Forrest moved adoption of Ordinance No. 131A subject to corrections being made, pointing out that an inaccuracy was made in showing his property on the map. After President Caldwell objected to the conditional passage of an ordinance and stated that corrections could easily be made in the future to the master map and adopted by ordinance amendment, Trustee Forrest moved adoption of Ordinance No. 131A; seconded by Trustee Boynton.

Absent: Trustees Cragg and Talbot

The President declared the motion carried.

After discussion, the Trustees were in general agreement that the Plan Commission should follow-up in obtaining bids for printing a quantity of maps in one-half size for public circulation.

Trustee Cragg arrived for the meeting.

Chairman Clarke then presented a plat for the subdivision of property on Kimberly Road owned by Mr. Al Eichsteadt, stating that the Plan Commission had approved the plat at their meeting on August 28, 1971, a continuation of the August 3, 1971, meeting, and was recommending its acceptance by the

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Village Board. After discussion, Trustee Saville moved to accept the plat for resubmission to the Plan Commission for final approval, having determined in accordance with the Subdivision Regulations as contained in Ordinance No. 13, that no improvements or installations to subdivide are required, but subject to the satisfactory resolution of any existing or suspected septic violations; seconded by Trustee Boynton.

The President declared the motion carried.

Chairman Clarke read the minutes of the meeting of the Plan Commission on August 3, 1971, with regard to a Lake County Highway Department map which had been studied by the Plan Commission. Trustee Forrest moved that the Village Board concur with the recommendations of the Plan Commission with regard to this matter as contained in their minutes of August 3, 1971, which indicated objection to a collector road which would bisect the Village, and also objection to the circulation of a misleading map; seconded by Trustee Saville and passed unanimously.

Chairman Clarke then read the minutes of the meeting of the Plan Commission on August 3, 1971, with regard to the BACOG Perimeter Zoning Map. After discussion, Trustee Forrest moved that the Village Board concur with recommended changes Nos. 1-3 of the Plan Commission with regard to this matter as contained in their minutes of August 3, 1971, and that the recommended changes Nos. 4-6, contained in the same minutes, be taken under advisement, since they are not in conformity with the present North Barrington plan, but North Barrington does desire to concur with the plans of Villages closer to these areas; seconded by Trustee Saville and passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

President Caldwell presented proposed Ordinance No. 128, an ordinance vacating a portion of Apex Court, and showed a map pointing out the area involved. Trustee Saville moved adoption of Ordinance No. 128; seconded by Trustee Boynton.

By roll: Ayes: Trustees Boynton, Carlson, Cragg, Forrest and Saville

Nays: None

Absent: Trustee Talbot

The President declared the motion carried.

President Caldwell then resubmitted Ordinance No.131A, an ordinance to designate a Village Map. After discussion, with Trustee Forrest again pointing out that an inaccuracy was made in showing his property on the map, Trustee Boynton moved adoption of Ordinance No.131A; seconded by Trustee Saville.

By roll: Ayes: Trustees Boynton, Carlson, Cragg and Saville

Nays: None

Pass: Trustee Forrest Absent: Trustee Talbot

The President declared the motion carried.

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At this point Trustee Cragg was excused and left the meeting.

COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD

Roads and Public Utilities - In the absence of Trustee Talbot, Road Superintendent Wileman reported on the matter of utility installation in the streets, which has been in the hands of the committee for study. After discussion with Wight Consulting Engineers, Trustee Talbot and Superintendent Wileman recommended that an insurance program, a bond system and a permit system would be desirable in order to regulate the work of utility companies in the Village. President Caldwell suggested these areas be incorporated in a proposed ordinance and be presented to the Village Board.

Planning and Zoning - Trustee Forrest reported that the Village of North Barrington was now included in a new legislative district, that he would have a report on trailer control within the Village at either the September or October meeting, and that he had received an interesting expression from the Northeastern Illinois Planning Commission on the BACOG Comprehensive Plan.

NEW BUSINESS

President Caldwell presented proposed Ordinance No. 129, an annexation ordinance for a portion of Illinois Route 59 and showed a map indicating the area involved. Trustee Saville moved adoption of Ordinance No. 129; seconded by Trustee Carlson.

By roll: Ayes: Trustees Boynton, Carlson, Forrest and Saville

Nays: None

Absent: Trustees Cragg and Talbot

The President declared the motion carried.

President Caldwell presented proposed Ordinance No. 130, accepting Lot 33 in East Oaksbury from School District #4, and explained the conditions surrounding the matter. Trustee Boynton moved adoption of Ordinance No. 130; seconded by Trustee Carlson.

By roll: Ayes: Trustees Boynton, Carlson, Forrest and Saville

Nays: None

Absent: Trustees Cragg and Talbot

The President declared the motion carried.

President Caldwell then brought up the matter of the need for some of the maps in the Barton-Aschman Comprehensive Plan to be printed larger on a fold-out page and perhaps in color. After discussion, the Trustees concurred that if this was possible, the added expenditure would be well worthwhile.

President Caldwell stated that he had received additional correspondence from BACOG with regard to the proposed rehabilitation center on Quentins Road. After discussion, Trustee Boynton moved that President Caldwell communicate with the Lake County Municipal League stating that North Barrington recognized the desirability of the establishment within the

county of this type of facility and had no special objection to the use of the abandoned Nike Site on Quentins Road for this purpose, but would withhold endorsement of this use for the site pending issuance of the county land use plan now being prepared; seconded by Trustee Forrest and passed unanimously.

President Caldwell reported that he had had a reply to his letter to the Illinois Pollution Control Board with regard to the Lake Zurich sewage pollution, stating that his letter was considered an informal complaint and that a formal complaint could be filed if desired. He stated that he would acknowledge the letter, but would not file a formal complaint since it appeared that Lake Zurich was aware of the problem and attempting to solve it. With the reply from the Illinois Pollution Control Board was also sent notice of public hearings to be held on September 17 and 21 at the Waukegan Public Library on the matter of sewer connection bans. Trustee Forrest moved that the Health Officer and/or Deputy Health Officer of the Village of North Barrington attend these hearings and aggressively state the position of the Village of North Barrington as opposing the addition of new waste sources, or the increase in discharges from existing sources, to sewer systems serving treatment plants that are overloaded or otherwise in violation of the law or regulations; seconded by Trustee Boynton and passed unanimously.

President Caldwell then announced that an invitation had been received from the Zion Ministerial Association to attend their Jubilee Days Celebration on September 6, 1971.

HEARING OF CITIZENS

Mr. B. J. Ypelaar commented that since President Caldwell had recently been honored in New York for his contribution to science, he felt the Village was also honored, and thanked President Caldwell.

At 10:38 P. M. Trustee Boynton moved that the meeting be adjourned; seconded by Trustee Carlson and passed unanimously.
