Clerk Tingleff called the roll. Acting President Schulke requested that if the Trustees wanted to continue the tradition of a meditation at the beginning of each meeting, they each contribute, and then suggested 30 seconds of silence while each person in the room think of their responsibilities to the community.

Trustee Carlson moved that the minutes of the meeting of August 28, 1972, be approved as prepared; seconded by Trustee Cragg and passed unanimously. Trustee Cragg stated that the minutes of the special meeting on September 2, 1972, had been sent to Village Attorney J. William Braithwaite for approval.

VILLAGE OFFICERS

- Treasurer Ypelaar presented a Treasurer's Report for the period ending August 31, 1972, showing balances as follows:

The Acting President declared the motion carried.

Treasurer Ypelaar then presented the "Flash Report" of receipts and expenditures for the period September 1 through 23, 1972, and a revised auditors financial report of the Village as of March 31, 1972, as prepared by McGladrey, Hansen, Dunn & Company. After discussion, Trustee Cragg moved that the auditors financial report of the Village as of March 31, 1972, be accepted and filed; seconded by Trustee Ofsthun.

The Acting President declared the motion carried.

Treasurer Ypelaar then announced that he had obtained new signature cards for the bank accounts and that the Employers Insurance Company of Wausau had recently conducted an audit of the Village records with regard to workman's compensation insurance. Discussion centered on the need for suppliers of village services to provide evidence of coverage of their employees. After discussion, Acting President Schulke referred the matter to the Committee on Finance and Law.

<u>CLERK</u> - Clerk Tingleff presented three vouchers for payment from the general corporate fund totaling \$6,675.82. After discussion, Trustee Carlson moved to approve payment; seconded by Trustee Cragg.

The Acting President declared the motion carried.

Clerk Tingleff then reported that the current lease on the copy machine was about to expire and that she had been in contact with the leasing company in an attempt to determine the exact expiration date and options open at the expiration. After discussion, Acting President Schulke referred the matter to the Committee on Finance and Law for a recommendation.

POLICE - Police Chief Svacha reported that a case had been prosecuted last week involving a dog complaint. Acting President Schulke reported that since the Village had not appointed a Village Prosecutor he had arranged for the office of the Village Attorney to handle this case. He asked the Board to confirm his action, which was done by unanimous vote. He then referred the selection of a prosecutor and the possible revision of Ordinances Nos. 67 and 67.1 to the Committee on Finance and Law.

Acting President Schulke reported that the Police Department had completed and filed a questionnaire with the Illinois Law Enforcement Commission.

ROADS - Superintendent Wileman reported that the MFT road work was now completed and that Trustee Forrest had requested that the question of street lights in the Village be deferred another 30 days. He then brought up the matter of the proposed extension of Rugby Road east of Kimberly Road by Mr. John A. Denker and reported that the proposed plans had been reviewed by Wight Consulting Engineers. He stated that the engineers indicated that the ordinance is inadequate in some respects for today's roads and that additional information was required to properly evaluate Mr. Denker's proposed road extension, particularly in consideration of drainage problems. After discussion, Acting President Schulke agreed to write to Mr. Denker and inform him of the additional information required by the Village Engineer.

PLAN COMMISSION - Plan Commission member Jack Tull presented copies of proposed Ordinances Nos. 88.3 and 88.4, changes in the zoning ordinance with respect to trailers, pickup coaches, motorized homes and boats and the raising and keeping of certain animals, which have been the subject of a Public Hearing and approved by the Plan Commission. Trustee Cragg moved to defer any action on proposed Ordinances Nos. 88.3 and 88.4 until a full Board is present at a meeting; seconded by Trustee Carlson and passed unanimously.

Mr. Tull then presented a new North Barrington zoning map which had been the subject of a Public Hearing and approved by the Plan Commission. After viewing the map and discussion, Trustee Ofsthun moved that the Board of Trustees accept the revised North Barrington Zoning Map, dated September 7, 1972, and direct that an ordinance be prepared designating it the official zoning map of the Village of North Barrington; seconded by Trustee Carlson and passed unanimously.

HEALTH - Health Officer Cameron reported that on September 16, 1972, she observed Lake Zurich pumping the lagoon and that the matter had now been turned over to Village Attorney J. William Braithwaite.

COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD

Police, Fire & Public Safety - Trustee Ofsthun read a few changes he would suggest in proposed Ordinances Nos. 139 and 140, relative to solicitors and trespassing. After discussion, Acting President Schulke suggested that Trustee Ofsthun look at any ordinances the Village of Barrington has on the matter, meet with Village Attorney J. William Braithwaite on various legal questions, and present a revised draft of the proposed ordinances at the next meeting.

OLD BUSINESS

Acting President Schulke presented proposed Ordinance No. 146, a zoning variation ordinance. After discussion, Trustee Ofsthun moved adoption of Ordinance No. 146; seconded by Trustee Cragg.

Acting President Schulke then announced that he had had a memorandum from Village Attorney J. William Braithwaite concerning two legal matters--annexation

had been upheld in the Winston Development Company suit and oral arguments were heard on September 12, 1972, in the Flynn Creek case. He further announced that a recent study had clarified the fact that the policemen are covered under Workman's Compensation Insurance.

NEW BUSINESS

Acting President Schulke brought up the matter that BACOG may be able to obtain an assistant manager under a federally funded program, who would be able to provide services to member villages. After discussion, the Trustees concurred that this would be a worthwhile program if developed. He then asked for the Trustees' concurrence in approving a Barton-Aschman suggestion to coordinate procedures for reviewing and processing Planned Unit Developments, which was given by consentees.

Acting President Schulke announced that his term of the Zoning Board of Appeals had expired and that he would have a candidate to introduce at the next meeting. He also informed the Board that notification had been received of a Public Hearing to be held on September 28, 1972, on the Illinois Commerce Commission's investigation to determine the practicability, reasonableness and public interest of establishing a uniform rate adjustment clause relating to costs incurred by electric and gas utilities in providing pollution and environmental control facilities and alternative gas supplies.

At 9:45 P.M. Trustee Cragg moved that the meeting be adjourned; seconded by Trustee Carlson and passed unanimously.
