Trustee Urick moved the minutes of the August 22, 1966 meeting be approved - seconded by Trustee Schulke -

By roll call vote: AYES: Trustees Urick, Schulke and Forrest NAYS: None ABSENT: Trustees Cutler, Keagy and Krumlinde

The President declared the motion carried.

OFFICERS' REPORTS:

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TREASURER: Treasurer Harold Gerry reported balances as of September 26, 1966 as follows:

Trustee Schulke moved to accept the Treasurer's report - seconded by Trustee Forrest -

By roll call vote: AYES: Trustees Forrest, Schulke and Urick President Anderson

NAYS: None

ABSENT: Trustees Cutler, Keagy and Krumlinde.

The President declared the motion carried.

<u>VILLAGE CLERK:</u> The clerk presented invoices for approval totaling \$5,348.95. (Copy attached.) Trustee Schulke moved to approve payment - seconded by Trustee Forrest. 9/26/66 - Page 2

By roll call vote: AYES: Messrs. Forrest, Schulke, Urick and Anderson NAYS: None ABSENT: Messrs. Cutler, Keagy and Krumlinde.

The President declared the motion carried.

The clerk presented for ratification - an expenditure of \$36.00 to cover recording fees of \$36.00 for annexation ordinances Nos. 73 through 78 and 45¢ certified mail postage - a total of \$36.45 - for which a check in amount of \$40.00 had been drawn. Cash in amount \$3.55 was refunded to the Treasurer. Trustee Forrest moved to approve and ratify the expenditure - seconded by Trustee Schulke -

> AYES: Messrs. Forrest, Schulke, Urick and Anderson MAYS: None ABSENT: Messrs. Cutler, Keagy and Krunlinde.

The President declared the motion carried.

The clerk presented school rental agreement for the period beginning September 1966 through November 1967, at the same rates as previously - i.e. \$3.00 for the faculty lounge - \$7.00 for the gymnasium if required - and \$3.60 hr. for the custodian. Trustee Urick moved to authorize the President to execute the rental agreement - seconded by Trustee Schulke and passed unanimously.

<u>POLICE</u>: Chief R. E. Swachs reported complaints and incidents processed as follows:

Lost child -Lost dog -Suspicious car at building site suspicious car parked on roadway suspicious telephone call dead dog on the highway -

Report of damage to home under construction (glass broken). Theft of golf cart from unlocked garage. Forced entry into residence - (no loss.) Forced entry into unoccupied home.

Several complaints about negligent/reckless driving.

Boat stolen from beach area. Malicious mischief at school.

HEALTH OFFICER - No report.

ROADS: Supt. G. E. Davis reported -

(1) - <u>Snow plowing</u> - Mr. Norman Schuldt has agreed to plow Village roads on the same basis as last year - i.e. \$12.50 per hour. After discussion Trustee Schulke moved that the contract be extended for another year - seconded by Trustee Forrest -

> AYES: Messrs Forrest, Schulke, Urick and Anderson NAYS: None ABSENT: Messrs. Cutler, Keegy and Krumlinde. Motion carried.

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(2) - Mr. Davis advised that approximagely \$6,300 of Village funds have been expended on the roads this year. He expressed surprise at the very reasonable cost figures charged by Skokie Valley Asphalt Products Company and gratification for the fine work performed.

The President advised that Treasurer Gerry will have ready for the next meeting comparison figures of expenditures with the operating budget.

The President advised that he had received a reply from the State about improving the state rights-of way abutting the Village roads, indicating it will be done immediately - and it has already been done.

The board discussed reinvesting the MFT funds for a short term pending state inspection and approval and receipt of final billing. Treasurer Gerry was authorized to make the arrangements.

BUILDING OFFICER: The President advised the Country Club has submitted application for permit to construct a pump house, which is part of their drainage improvement program for the golf course.

PARKS & AUXILIARY SERVICES: No report.

MOSQUITO ABATEMENT: No report.

<u>FIRE COMMISSIONER</u>: The President advised that the Fire Commissioner is arranging to work with the Deputy Building Officer to see that all fire numbers have been assigned and the Lake Zurich Fire District trustees notified.

BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS: Chairman Max Eberli advised a petition for zoning variation had been received from Mr. Erik E. Roos, to enlarge his home at 268 Brookside by adding on a recreation room and garage. The enlargement of the home will cross the property line onto adjoining property owned by Mr. Roos, One corner of the addition will extend 6 ft. over the front setback line, which is 60 ft. from the center line of the road. Mr. Eberli advised a public hearing was held by the Board of Zoning Appeals.

At the Board of Zoning Appeals meeting the Board made findings of facts and a motion was duly made, seconded and passed unanimously that the Board of Zoning Appeals recommends that the Board of Trustees grant the variation.

After discussion Trustee Forrest moved that the Board of Trustees concur with the recommendation of the Board of Zoning Appeals and that an appropriate ordinance be prepared - seconded by Trustee Urick -

By roll call vote: AYES: Messrs. Forrest, Schulke, Urick and Anderson NAYS: None ABSENT: Messrs. Cutler, Keagy and Krumlinde.

The President declared the motion carried.

LAW: The President advised hearing on the Landwer case is to be held on September 27, and certain Village officers are subpoened by Landwer's attorney to appear. The President advised that he was informed others also had been subpoened.

TRUSTEE COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Trustee Urick advised he had received applications for insurance policies covering the active police officers named.

POLICE, FIRE & PUBLIC SAFETY: No report.

<u>ROADS & PUBLIC UTILITIES:</u> Trustee Schulke advised that Mr. Brian Betsworth appeared before the Road Committee relative to request for permission to construct a road to provide access to his property on Sioux Drive. Trustee Schulke read Mr. Betsworth's petition in full -

After discussion Trustee Schulke moved that the Board allow the petition with the following provisions:

- 1 That Village rights to cul-de-sac not be waived;
- 2 That the road be for 11 feet width instead of 10 ft., as indicated in the contractor's letter;
- 3 That \$40.00 is to be deposited with the Willage for the cost of sealcoating the road next year when the Willage road work is done; and
- 4 That a Road Performance bond of \$300.00 be provided in the name of the Village.
- 5 The owner and his successors and assigns shall have a license, revocable by the Village at Will in the event of future improvements in Sioux Drive as to the portion of the driveway located within the right-of-way of Sioux Drive.

Seconded by Trustee Urick.

By roll call vote: AXES: Messrs. Schulke, Forrest, Urick and Anderson. NAYS: None ABSENT: Messrs. Cutler, Keagy and Krumlinde.

The President declared the motion carried.

Trustee Schulke discussed the proposed Ordinance No. 71 covering Driveways, and read the ordinance in full. After discussion Trustee Schulke moved for adoption of Ordinance No. 71 - seconded by Trustee Urick.

By roll call vote: AYES: Messrs. Schulke, Forrest, Urick and Anderson. NAYS: None ABSENT: Messrs. Cutler, Keagy and Krumlinde.

The President declared the motion carried.

CIVIL DEFENSE: No report.

<u>PLANNING AND ZONING:</u> Trustee Forrest advised that Lake County Supervisors approval has been given to a six months program of orderly review of the Lake County Zoning Ordinance Amendments, and procedures are being set up for matters to be brought before the County Zoning Appeals Board in an effort to upgrade the ordinance.

Trustee Forrest suggested that the Village Plan Commission look into the question of advising the County, either directly or through the Planning Commission, whether in its judgment the CR (Commercial Recreation) zoning on the east side of the Fox River should be modified to RR (Resort Recreational) and report to the Board of Trustees.

The President submitted for ratification the appointment of G. H. Bishop as member on the Board of Zoning Appeals upon the recommendation of Mr. Max Eberli, Chairman of the Board of Zoning Appeals, for the unexpired portion of a five year term which began November 4, 1964. After discussion Trustee Forrest moved the appointment be confirmed and consented to and moved adoption of Resolution No. 194 appointing Mr. Bishop seconded by Trustee Urick and passed unanimously.
